SAARLAND TO HILL 'N' DALE GSW Saarland (Unbridled--Versailles Treaty, by Danzig) has been retired from racing and will stand the 2005 breeding season at John Sikura's Hill 'n' Dale Farm near Lexington, Kentucky. Bloodstock agent Emmanuel de Seroux purchased an 80-percent interest in the fiveyear-old on behalf of Jess Jackson, owner of Kendall-Jackson wineries. Cynthia Phipps, who raced the bay through four seasons, will retain a 20-percent interest in the horse. A winner of two of five starts at two, including the GII Remsen S. at Agueduct, Saarland placed in the GIII Gotham S. over that same track at three. Second to champion Aldebaran in last year's GI Metropolitan H., Saarland also finished in the money in the GII Brooklyn H. and the GIII Westchester H. Second again in this term's Westchester, Saarland rounded out his career with a runner-up finish in a Belmont allowance June 27. Trained by Shug McGaughey, Saarland retires with five wins and five seconds from 21 starts and earnings of \$595,250.



ALEC STEWART DIES Newmarket conditioner Alec Stewart died yesterday morning after a long illness, aged 49. Stewart was famed for his training of dual G1 Eclipse S. scorer Mtoto (GB) and GI Canadian International hero Mutamam (GB) from his base at Clarehaven Stables. "It's very sad," jockey Richard Hills told PA Sport yesterday. "I have known him all my racing career. He was a great friend, a greater trainer and will be sadly missed." Stewart acted as assistant to Harry Thomson-Jones from 1978 to 1982 before taking up his licence the following year. He enjoyed major success with Sheikh Ahmed bin Rashid al Maktoum's Mtoto in the 1987 Eclipse when that colt beat Epsom Derby winner Reference Point (GB). He returned the following year to record back-to-back successes in that race before beating Unfuwain in the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. and finishing runnerup in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. He also saddled Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid al Maktoum's Wagon Master (Fr) (Rainbow Quest) to finish third in the King George in 1994 and in 2001 captured the Woodbine feature with that same owner's Mutamam in an incidentpacked renewal.

SULAMANI HAS YORK DATE Godolphin will point **Sulamani (Ire)** (Hernando {Fr}) at the G1 Juddmonte International S. at York Aug. 17. By BILL FINLEY The Big Horse By Joe McGinniss Simon and Schuster \$22.95

When the renowned author Joe McGinniss headed to Saratoga for the 2003 season, in part to write a racing book, in part to rekindle his love affair with horse racing, an old flame, there were plenty of intriguing and provocative subjects that he could have tackled. Funny Cide, as popular a horse as the country has seen in a couple of decades, was bedded down in Barclay Tagg's barn. Wayne Lukas always makes for good copy. Never can enough be written about the track itself, with its history, mystique and panache.

Instead, McGinniss chose trainer Phil Johnson and his 2002 Breeders' Cup Classic winner Volponi. On the surface, it didn't appear that the author gave himself much to work with. Johnson has had a long and solid career, one good enough to land him in the Hall of Fame, but he's hardly a household name and even within the sport he's never quite reached star status. And while Volponi had his two minutes of fame when winning the Breeders' Cup, he's regarded as one of the least accomplished horses to have ever won the Classic. Seabiscuit material this is not.

But McGinniss manages to pull it off. The Big Horse isn't particularly gripping or dramatic, but it nonetheless entertains and pleases. It is a breezy, bittersweet narrative that captures the ups and downs of the racetrack while following around a trainer who is more interesting than we could have guessed.

Johnson is an amiable but crusty fellow who still has the passion for the sport at age 74 and after nearly 60 years in the game. One of the reasons is Volponi. Though Volponi may not be special to others, to Johnson he represents his greatest career accomplishment: winning the Breeders' Cup Classic outside his home town of Chicago at Arlington Park. Though Johnson has won numerous stakes races over his many years, Volponi is the first horse he's had who has shown the talent to thrust the trainer onto racing's main stage, thus his depiction as "The Big Horse."

McGinniss doesn't get there in time to chronicle Volponi's stunning victory in the Classic. He is there for the fall, a frustrating O-for-8 season in which Volponi runs second five times, his value as a sire dropping with each defeat. The majority of the book revolves around the Saratoga meet, where Volponi is second behind Medaglia D'oro in the Whitney and then can't beat a weak group of competitors in the Saratoga Breeders' Cup. But the story can't end there. The disappointments continue through the fall, culminating in a dismal 10th-place finish in the 2003 Classic at Santa Anita.

But the veteran racetracker remains unbowed. He has suffered enough setbacks that he's immune to the sting of failure. "This has always been a funny game," he says, knowing racing's unpredictability plays both ways. After all, didn't a seemingly overmatched Volponi win the 2002 Classic at odds of 43-1, unearthing the biggest betting scandal in racing history in the process?

P.G. Johnson and Volponi may be the stars of the book, but McGinniss is certainly the co-star. He writes of a long lost passion for the sport that got sidetracked once his writing career took off. He seems lonely and lost after his 25-year marriage ends in divorce and seems to hope the racetrack will revive his spirit. It does. McGinniss find such comfort in the sport that after Saratoga is over and he returns to California he finds himself aimlessly watching races on TVG hour after hour, not even making bets but getting a needed racing fix.

McGinniss, the best-selling author of the Miracle of Castel di Sangro, Fatal Vision and Going to Extremes, probably hoped that he'd be writing the story of Volponi's stellar 2004 season and triumphant return to the Breeders' Cup, a season so good that Johnson would have been able to savor every sweet, lucrative, fulfilling moment of a championship season. What he gets instead is a story of hope, disappointment and the wisdom of a trainer who has spent seven decades on the racetrack. That works, too.
