NINE TACKLE SUNDAY'S HASKELL

Sunday's \$1 million GI Haskell Invitational H. at Monmouth, the crown jewel of New Jersey racing, has attracted a field of nine with likely favorite **Lion Heart** (Tale of the Cat) highweighted at 121 pounds. The chestnut graced Saratoga's main track early Thursday morning, blazing a bullet four furlongs in :46 4/5. "I just wanted to give him a short work before we go into the Haskell," said trainer Patrick Biancone. Also set to line up for the mile-and-an-eighth event are a pair of colts by the late Kris S., Sir Barton S. winner **Royal Assault** and **Rock Hard Ten**. The

latter made a late arrival on the Triple Crown scene and just missed the earnings cut for the GI Kentucky Derby after he was disqualified from second to third in the GI Santa Anita Derby. The Jason Orman trainee returned to be second best to Smarty Jones in the GI Preakness S. before a lackluster fifth in the GI Belmont S., but an easy-as-you-please victory in the July 10 GI Swaps Breeders' Cup S. at Hollywood reaffirmed that the colt has the raw ability to be a serious player. "He came out of the Swaps very well," said Orman, who will be saddling his first starter at Monmouth. "He worked in :58 2/5 [at Del Mar July 31], but he did it pretty easy and seemed to come out of it well." Orman, whose charge has been notoriously difficult behind the gate in the past, believes that Sunday will be different. "Gary Brenson, the starter at Hollywood Park and Del Mar, has been working with him. We've had no problems with him since then." Rock Hard Ten will tote 120 pounds under jockey Corey Nakatani.

WHITNEY FIELDS NINE RUNNERS

Peace Rules (Jules) is a worthy highweight at 121 in Saturday's \$750,000 GI Whitney H. at Saratoga, but he will face numerous challenges early in an attempt to give trainer Bobby Frankel his third win in this race in the last four years, following Medaglia d'Oro last year and Lido Palace (Chi) in 2001. Aside from the presence of fellow frontrunners **Roses in May** (Devil His Due), **Seattle Fitz (Arg)** (Fitzcarraldo {Arg}) and **Yessirgeneralsir** (Patton), Peace Rules will also have to deal with **Newfoundland** (Storm Cat), who came up a neck short to the chestnut in the GI Suburban H. July 3. Trainer Todd Pletcher thinks his charge can turn the tables this time. "It looks like there is going to be a fairly honest pace scenario," he said. "Hopefully, we could settle just a touch off those other horses and let someone else do the dirty work. We're hoping the cutback in distance [from the Suburban's 10 furlongs] will help."

The enigmatic **Yell** shortens up for this contest, the first time in her career that she's been asked to tackle less than seven panels. "She's a good filly, but she's an in-between horse," trainer Shug McGaughey explained. "I don't think her best races are going a mile and a sixteenth and it may not be at three-quarters, either. I think she wants to be more of a come-from-behind sprinter than a router. She has a lot of speed to use. At six furlongs, she's going to use that speed." The dark bay won the GIII Raven Run S. at Keeneland last fall, but is winless in four 2004 efforts. Her latest saw her finish a non-threatening second to La Reason in the 8 1/2-furlong GII Molly Pitcher Breeders' Cup H. and McGaughey hopes the Claiborne Farm colorbearer can do one better here. "If she gets a pace in front of her and is able to stay back a little bit in the early stages here, she'll be a factor," he said.

LEWISES TO SELL 18 AT KEENELAND

NOVEMBER Eclipse Award-winning owners Bob and Beverly Lewis will sell the majority of their broodmare band at the 2004 Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale. The 18-horse Lewis consignment will include GII Hollywood Oaks winner **Santa Catarina** (Unbridled--Purrfectly, by Storm Cat), in foal to A.P. Indy; MSW **Storm Beauty** (Storm Cat--Stick to Beauty, by Illustrious), a half-sister to Eclipse winner Gold Beauty from the family of champions Sky Beauty and Dayjur and Grade/Group 1 winners Maplejinsky and Question (Arg), in foal to A.P. Indy; and Storm Beauty's daughter **Renaissance Lady** (A.P. Indy), a graded-stakes placed three-year-old in foal to Elusive Quality. "The broodmare band seems to multiply by leaps and bounds," Bob Lewis told *Daily Racing Form*. "I felt that I'm not in the breeding business, I'm in the racehorse business. But we have found ourselves with a lot of very nice fillies who have proved to be outstanding broodmares. We felt it was time to reduce the herd." Denali Stud and Taylor Made will handle the Lewis consignment.

DOLLAR BILL DEAD Six-year-old **Dollar Bill** (Peaks and Valleys--Saratoga Dame, by Saratoga Six), who was retired last fall due to chronic ankle problems, had to be euthanized Tuesday after suffering a bout of laminitis. The bay underwent ankle fusion surgery and had been at Rood and Riddle Equine Hospital near Lexington since October. He was expected to begin his stud career at Signature Stallions in Florida next season, but foundered Monday and, when the condition deteriorated, had to be put down. Owners Gary and Mary West sent Dollar Bill to Houstondale Farm near Paris, Kentucky to be euthanized. He was buried at the farm. The winner of the GII Brown & Williamson Kentucky Jockey Club S. at two and the Risen Star S. at three, the confirmed closer was also runner-up in the GI Stephen Foster H. and third in the GI Travers, GI Toyota Blue Grass, GI Oaklawn H. and GI Suburban H. He earned \$1,225,546 during four seasons on the track.

Jockey John Velazquez guided So Sweet A Cat to a victory in the Fifth Avenue S. at Aqueduct last November and ran his record aboard the filly to two-for-two with a romp in the yesterday's featured Statue of Liberty S. A 4 1/4-length winner of a Finger Lakes state-bred allowance May 31, the bay was fourth versus males in the Ontario County H. June 20, second by a nose against her peers in the July 4 Niagara S. and most recently returned to allowance company to register a nose victory at Finger Lakes July 18. Stretching out to two turns for the first time, So Sweet A Cat sat a perfect trip outside favored South Wing, turned up the heat on that one once straightened for home and motored clear. "[Jockey] John did a great job rating her off the speed and when he asked her to run, she just gave it all," said winning trainer Ralph D'Alessandro.

L'Oiseau d'Argent seems to be putting it altogether over America's firm courses and improved his record to three-for-four at a flat mile. The gelding began his career in England, where he managed a trio of stakes-placed efforts as a three-year-old, but after making just one 2003 start he was shipped stateside to continue on. He won a pair of Gulfstream allowances in his first two U.S. starts this past winter, was third against open allowance rivals at Keeneland in mid-April, then placed second in a nine-furlong Belmont optional claimer after making the pace June 4. He failed to handle the ascent into graded company in his latest, faltering to be fifth in the 11-furlong GII Bowling Green H. at Belmont July 17, and was looking to regroup dropping back into the allowance ranks. Allowed to run under a confident Richard Migliore, L'Oiseau d'Argent carved out 23.75, 46.31 and 1:09.36 fractions with favored He's Crafty allowing ample breathing room in second. Rounding the turn for home, L'Oiseau d'Argent responded gamely to a rousing ride and refused to let his rival get any closer.

Buzzy's Gold hit 99 on the Beyer scale when he took a second-level allowance by 4 1/2 lengths at Belmont Park May 21, but was outclassed in his most recent effort, an eighth to Speightstown in the GII True North Breeders' Cup H. June 5. Dropped back to this level for his latest, the chestnut pressed the pace before finishing a well-beaten third, with Savoy Special (Grand Slam) second, at Belmont July 1. The second longest shot in the field, Buzzy's Gold bided his time from third, overtook Formal Attire at the eighth pole and outgamed that one to the wire. Favored Savoy Special lunged at the start, then dueled on the front end before tiring late to be fourth.

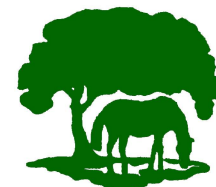

CHISELLING TO MISS BREEDING SEASON The regally bred **Chiselling** (Woodman) will be forced to miss his first breeding season in South Africa after suffering from equine protozoal myeloencephalitis (EPM), according to *sahorseracing.com*. Winner of the 2002 GI Secretariat S. in the colors of breeder Juddmonte Farm, the bay was produced by Broodmare of the Year Toussaud and is a half brother to Grade I winners Chester House, Empire Maker and Honest Lady as well as Grade II winner Decarchy. The five-year-old did not fly to Europe July 30 as scheduled after insurance underwriters requested that he not be moved due to treatment for EPM. Quarantine restrictions would not have permitted a later flight for the bay. He will remain in the U.S. until his recovery is complete and is scheduled to be in South Africa well in time for the 2005 breeding season. Chiselling's sale to South African interests had been announced earlier this year; he was to have entered stud at Maine Chance Farm in the Western Cape for a fee of R25,000. He had been booked to 90 mares.
