### HALL OF FAMER P.G. JOHNSON DIES

Hall of Fame trainer P.G. Johnson passed away Friday morning at his home in Rockville Centre, New York.



He was 78. Johnson was stabled at Saratoga at the time of his death, but had gone home to undergo a minor surgical procedure Thursday. He was scheduled to return to upstate New York vesterday. Born in Chicago in 1925, Johnson bought his first race horse for \$75 at an auction in 1942. That purchase, named Song Master, became his first winner at Hawthorne Park in 1944. The veteran horseman relo-

P.G. Johnson Horsephotos cated from the Midwest to Florida in 1950 before moving to New York in

1962. Over the years, he led the standings at Belmont four times, at Aqueduct three times and at Saratoga once. He trained such top horses as Dismasted, High Schemes, Kiri's Clown, Maplejinsky, Naskra's Breeze, Possible Mate and Quiet Little Table, who beat Forego in the 1977 Suburban H. But his crowning achievement was saddling Volponi to a 6 1/2-length score in 2002 Breeders' Cup Classic at odds of 43-1 in front of his hometown crowd at Arlington Park. "He was a classy trainer," said retired jockey Robbie Davis, who rode regularly for Johnson. "They don't make guys like him any more. P.G. was great for New York and it's a big loss for us. There's no way you can replace him." The story of Johnson and Volponi was the subject of "The Big Horse," a book by John McGuiness. Johnson is survived by daughters Kathy and Karen and granddaughter Emma Brockway. His wife, Mary Kay, died May 25. The funeral will be private, but there will be a memorial service at a later date. In lieu of flowers, the family has requested that donations be made to the Grayson-Jockey Club Equine Research Center.

### **EVERYTHING'S COMING UP ROSES**

Roses in May (Devil His Due) first drew attention with a 10 1/2-length score in a Saratoga allowance race last August. The four-year-old returns to the scene of that triumph for today's GI Whitney H. A lackluster sixth in the GII Jerome H. at Belmont Park in September, the dark bay colt returned to post a front-running 12-length victory in a Keeneland allowance Apr. 17. He made it two in a row with a wire-to-wire score at Churchill

Downs May 21 and was again in front every step in the July 3 GIII Cornhusker Breeders' Cup H. at Prairie Meadows. The colt will have company on the front end from favorites Peace Rules and Seattle Fitz (Arg)



(Fitzcarraldo {Arg}), but trainer Dale Romans told Daily Racing Form, "If he goes to the front, I

don't think anybody wants to go with him. He's a pretty fast horse and he keeps on going." Jockey Jerry Bailey, who will be aboard Peace Rules once again, is not looking to get caught up in a speed duel. "He doesn't necessarily have to be on the lead, but he won't be far off it," Bailey said. "He can rate off suicidal fractions." Making his first start after undergoing surgery to correct a breathing problem, **Perfect Drift** (Dynaformer) tried to get past Roses in May in Iowa, but had to settle for second, a length behind the winner. Trainer Murray Johnson thinks he can turn the tables this time. "I feel way more comfortable going into the Whitney than I did the Cornhusker," he said.

My Trusty Cat came back after a seven-week layoff to finish second in an allowance test in the slop at Churchill on Derby Day. She went up against the talented Lady Tak in the Winning Colors H. May 22 and was fourth, beaten just three lengths by that filly as a 28-1 outsider. Off at 9-2 in the June 19 GIII Chicago Breeders' Cup H. going seven furlongs at Arlington Park, the bay closed from between horses to win it by 1 3/4 lengths. The four-year-old was a well-backed 5-2 in her latest, the July 10 HBPA H. at Ellis Park, but failed to fire and finished fifth. A double-digit longshot again here, she was last after the opening quarter, but closed while saving ground on the far turn, then switched to the outside and just got up to best Ebony Breeze in the final jump. "She's a good come-frombehind sprinter," trainer David Vance said. "She has a very good punch." As for what's next, he said, "We came up here with the Honorable Miss and the Ballerina [GI, Aug. 29] in mind. She got this part done, but the next race will be tougher." Runner-up in the GII Saratoga Special S. last year, Pomeroy flirted with the Triple Crown trail this past spring, finishing second in the GIII Gotham S. and fourth in the GII Coolmore Lexington S. Apr. 17. The bay didn't see afternoon action for a while, but was a resounding winner of his return, the GIII Jersey Shore Breeders' Cup S. June 26 at Monmouth. "That was an easy race," said trainer Patrick Biancone. "He'll be running against tougher horses [in the Amsterdam], but we're trying to get to the King's Bishop [GI, Aug. 28]." Biancone opted to make sprinting the colt's focus. "There's a good chance you're going to be a sprinter when you win your first two starts at five and 5 1/2 furlongs," Biancone said about the beginning of Pomeroy's career. "We tried to go long, but I think we're rewarded now because of all the work and preparation he had to go long gave him a good foundation for sprinting." Weigelia earned a 108 Beyer Speed Figure for his half-length defeat of Classy Migration in the GIII Carry Back S. July 10 at Calder, but this will be the first start outside of Florida for both three-year-olds. Mass Media came back from a lengthy layoff to prove a game winner of a Belmont allowance June 23 and could be dangerous for trainer Bobby Frankel.

There were shockwaves around Kempton when Beneventa beat Soviet Song (Ire) and Monturani (Ire) in the Listed Snowdrop S. at Kempton Apr. 10, but she proved to be more than a one-hit wonder when beating Silence Is Golden (GB) in the May 2 G3 Dahlia S. at Newmarket. She may have faced an impossible task in trying to give Crimson Palace (SAf) three pounds in the G3 Middleton S. at York 10 days later, but acquitted herself with credit when going down by only 3/4 of a length to that smart rival. She found the going too fast when a disappointing eighth in the G2 Windsor Forest S. at Royal Ascot June 16, but bounced back to defy a hefty penalty and record an impressive success in the Listed Aphrodite S. at Newmarket last time July 17. Visorama finished runner-up in the G2 Prix Corrida at Saint-Cloud May 31 and is closely matched with last year's G2 Premio Lydia Tesio winner Whortleberry on that form. The former shaped as if she was still progressing when third behind Gamut (Ire) in the G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud last time July 4 and that form was boosted by the winner's strong showing in the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. Of the three-year-olds, Lune d'Or impressed when winning the G2 Prix de Malleret at Saint-Cloud last time July 4, but may find it tough attempting to defy a four-pound penalty as a result.

GLOWING TRIBUTE DIES The 1993 Broodmare of the Year Glowing Tribute (Graustark--Admiring, by Hail to Reason) died Aug. 5 of colic, according to a press release. Owned by John R. Gaines, the 31-year-old had been boarded at Waggoner Farm near Lexington. "I [was] very privileged to have purchased Glowing Tribute from the Paul Mellon consignment at the Keeneland breeding stock sale in 1992," said Gaines. "She was a foundation mare of Mr. Mellon's famous Rokeby Stables, was certainly one of the premier broodmares of her time and was voted Broodmare of the Year in 1993." Bred in Virginia by Mellon, the bay carried the famed sportsman's grey and yellow colors to victory nine times, taking back-to-back renewals of the GII Sheepshead Bay H. and the GII Diana H. She quickly established herself as an outstanding producer with MGISW Hero's Honor (Northern Dancer) and MGSW Wild Applause (Northern Dancer) as her first two foals. The latter followed in her dam's hoofprints by winning the Diana, as did Glowing Tribute's 1985 Seattle Slew filly Glowing Honor. But her most famous offspring was Sea Hero (Polish Navy), whose triumph in the 1993 GI Kentucky Derby gave Mellon his only victory in the Classic. Glowing Tribute later produced GSWs Coronation Cup (Chief's Crown) and Mackie (Summer Squall). Part of Mellon's dispersal at Keeneland November in 1992, Glowing Tribute sold with Mackie in utero for \$460,000; that filly sold as a weanling for \$550,000 and went on to be a \$5-million broodmare when selling in foal to Mr. Prospector in 2000. Among the daughters to follow Glowing Tribute through the ring at the Mellon dispersal were Glowing Honor, who sold for \$1.1 million; Wild Applause, \$1.025 million; and Victoria Cross (Spectacular Bid), \$550,000. The last-named daughter failed to win, but produced champion European sprinter Mozart (Ire) as well as GSW England Expects (Topsider). Wild Applause has produced GISW Eastern Echo (Damascus), MGSWs Roar (Forty Niner) and Yell (A.P. Indy) and GSW Blare of Trumpets (Fit to Fight). Glowing Tribute's final named foal was Dearest, a 1994 filly by Riverman.

### BAILEY CELEBRATES SPA RECORD WITH

'TAITTINGER' Jockey Jerry Bailey yesterday surpassed Angel Cordero as the all-time leading rider at Saratoga Race Course when he piloted Taittinger Rose to victory in the third race for trainer Bill Mott. It was his 641st career win at the Spa. "It's quite a compliment to top what Angel did," Bailey said. "As good as he was everywhere else, he was that much better and that much tougher [at Saratoga]." The Hall of Famer thanked his agents over the years--Chuck Sherman, Bill Shuman, Jesse Parsons, Doc Danner, John Dale, Bob Frieze and Ron Anderson--his wife Suzee and his son Justin, and also credited the many trainers that helped him reach the milestone. "You have to start with good horses, and I have been fortunate to ride for trainers that won a lot," Bailey said. "I think it is probably fitting that I won on [Mott's] horse, because he has been responsible for a huge portion of my wins up here."

### BREEDERS' CUP ANNOUNCEMENT SET FOR

SUNDAY There will be a press conference at Monmouth Park Sunday afternoon to announce the track as the official host of the Breeders' Cup in 2007. President D.G. Van Clief Jr. had informed Monmouth officials back on June 11 that the Breeders' Cup was prepared to negotiate a contract for the event with the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority, which operates that track and the Meadowlands. ### Valenzuela Out for Remainder of 2004, Maybe for Life:

The Del Mar stewards yesterday banned jockey Patrick Valenzuela through Dec. 31, 2004 and recommended that he not be considered for future licensing by the California Horse Racing Board. Valenzuela was suspended July 2, pending a formal hearing, for failing to provide a hair sample for drug testing as required by his conditional license. The jockey had shaved his body, making it impossible for him to come up with the amount of hair necessary for the test. Last week, seven witnesses gave six hours of testimony on the matter over a three-day period. Valenzuela claimed that he was unaware of the provision ordering him to provide a hair sample, but Deputy Attorney General James Ahern, representing the CHRB, provided proof that a certified copy of the added requirements of his license had been sent to the rider's home. In a statement, stewards Ingrid Fermin, George Slender and Tom Ward wrote that "rather than make every effort to comply with the hair follicle test process, [Valenzuela] found another way to evade testing and thereby violated [the license agreement]." They added, "[Valenzuela] has been a talented jockey for many years, but it is evident that he has failed to learn that he must be held accountable for the consequences of his behavior."

### **TVG Posts Record Handle:**

Television Games Network has announced that it has posted a record handle for the second quarter of 2004, \$88,552,031, a 45-percent increase from the same quarter the previous year. "Throughout this year, we have seen a steady increase in consumer acceptance of TVG's products and services in the marketplace, which is a positive sign for the entire horse racing industry," said Ryan O'Hara, TVG president. "Enhanced programming, an extremely compelling Triple Crown...increased cable and satellite distribution of TVG programming and the addition of the state of Washington to the markets in which we accept wagering all played a role in the encouraging second quarter results."

### **TOBA** to Spearhead Formation of Sales Task Force:

The Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders' Association will assume a "lead role" in the formation of a task force which will examine issues involving Thoroughbred sales, it said in a release yesterday. Satish Sanan, the owner of Padua Stables, launched the Alliance for Industry Reform last month, which called for the implementation of a code of ethics as it regards sales. Sanan responded with praise for yesterday's TOBA decision. "I am very encouraged by how the industry has rallied around this cause," he commented. "Serious discussions and research will be conducted and I am very hopeful that a consensus can be reached to improve the Thoroughbred industry." According to the release, TOBA will be joined in their efforts by Fasig-Tipton, Keeneland, the National Thoroughbred Racing Association and The Jockey Club. "We welcome the opportunity to participate in discussions to address these issues facing our industry," said Dan Metzger, president of TOBA. "It is important that we have a thorough and careful dialogue." The task force will be comprised of 15-20 individuals representing sales companies, owners, breeders, trainers and veterinarians. Sanan plans on being an active participant in the discussions. "Creating AIR was only meant to serve as a catalyst for change and we were always hopeful that the national ownership body, TOBA, would take charge and really commit to the project since it is the owners who are most affected by the problems being addressed," Sanan added. The release said that the task force would aim to hold its first meeting by early September.



# WRITERS UP

### HOPING FOR THE HAMBO By Bill Finley

Joseph Taylor may no longer be with us, but the spirit of a kind-hearted and generous man lives on in a 3-year-old trotter named Eilean Donon. He will race Saturday in the famed Hambletonian at the Meadowlands, with the dual purpose of trying to win one of harness racing's greatest events and earning \$165,000 for Taylor's favorite charity.

The Taylors, though best known as the family behind

Taylor Made Farm and Sales Agency, one of thoroughbred racing's leading consignment operations, have roots in harness racing, as well. The interest in standardbreds was fostered by Joe Taylor, who was the long-time farm manager for Clarence and John Gaines, who raised both breeds. Gainesway bred

two Hambletonian winners in the mid-60s while Joe Taylor was employed there.

Joe Taylor and Steve Stewart bred Eilean Donon, who is named after a castle in Scotland, with the intention of selling him. When the horse went through the sales ring at the Tattersalls sales, Taylor's son, Ben, started bidding, in part because he wanted the reserve to be met. The younger Taylor kept bidding and eventually bought the colt for \$23,000. After the sale, Joe Taylor and Stewart said they wanted back in. A partnership was formed with each individual owning one-third of the horse.

Joe Taylor, already believing the trotter could turn out to be something special, decided he would donate his share of the horse's earnings to ConQuest, a national network of clubs and camps for Catholic boys age five to 16. Joe Taylor founded the Lexington chapter of the organization in 1998.

"We were confident before this colt even started that he had a lot of ability," Ben Taylor said. "My father thought this could be a way to help those who needed it. He wasn't a materialistic person. He felt he had been very lucky in life and wanted to share what he had with others."

The Taylors weren't wrong about Eilean Donon. He made 11 starts as a two-year-old, won six and earned \$235,469. Among the leaders of his division, it was clear that he belonged on the trail to the Hambletonian. Tragically, Joe Taylor never got to see any of his three-year-old races.

Taylor, performing still another act of kindness and generosity, died late last year in an automobile accident.

He was delivering Christmas presents to friends, neighbors and employees at the time of the crash.

The Taylor family knew that their father would have wanted his share of Eilean Donon's future earnings to continue to go to ConQuest and have continued to send payments to the charity. Eileen Donon has earned another \$101,719 this year, increasing his career earnings to \$337,188. The charity has received \$111,272 all told.

"Joe got involved when his son Duncan sent his son to our camp," said Father Matthew Smwoorenburg, who helps run the ConQuest program. "He really enjoyed the camps and he would always make sure that he was the one to bring the kids. The first time he came, he just watched. He loved our balance of talks and sports. We have talks on virtues and then we have a lot of sports activities. The sports help the kids rest between the talks."

Father Matthew said the contributions from Eilean Donon have been a blessing that have made for a better organization.

"Frankly, we really needed this money," he said.
"We put our focus on putting our resources into people who are good leaders and teachers. That's what the money has gone toward, to hire people who can do the best possible job in this role and teach the dads who run the clubs how our program works."

For a while, it looked like Eilean Donon wouldn't make it to the Hambletonian. He was forced to undergo emergency surgery for a scrotal hernia and the removal of a testicle July 7, exactly one month before the race. The surgery was performed at the same New Jersey clinic that worked on Smarty Jones after his starting gate accident as a two-year-old.

Remarkably, Eilean Donon bounced right back, won an open race July 23 and then an elimination heat for the \$1 million Hambletonian.

"They are a durable breed," said trainer Bob Stewart, the son of co-owner Steve Stewart. "It's amazing what they can overcome."

It's a wide-open race, but just about everyone gives Eilean Donon, who is 9-2 in the morning line, a chance. Should he win, ConQuest will receive an additional \$165,000. Nothing would have made Joe Taylor more proud.

"Before my father died, we used to talk about the Hambletonian," Ben Taylor said. "But it seemed like wishful thinking. After all, this is the horse business. But I know how much it would have meant to him. All his life he's wanted to help young people. He found an organization with a good track record, that gives kids discipline and teaches them respect for the parents and leadership qualities."
