LION HEART REIGNS IN HASKELL

Seven years ago, a lightly raced colt by the name of Tale of the Cat finished a respectable fourth in the GI Haskell Invitational. Yesterday his son, **Lion Heart**, came back to avenge his sire's loss with a one-length tally in this year's renewal of the Monmouth centerpiece. Despite a win over the track last time out in the GIII Long

Branch Breeders' Cup H. July 17, Lion Heart was made the second choice in the betting this time around, with Gll Swaps S. winner Hard Rock Ten (Kris S.) getting backed down to 4-5 favoritism. In command from the start, Lion Heart broke alertly and was allowed to carve out a sensible opening quarter in :23

and an equally modest half mile: 46.81, giving trainer Patrick Biancone reason to celebrate early. "After a quarter in :23, I knew the others were done," said Biancone, explaining his reaction to the soft opening fractions. "Three months ago, it would have been 22 and change, but he is a more sensible horse now." In front by two lengths with a furlong left to travel, Lion Heart was put to task by Joe Bravo and the colt responded with a game victory over My Snookie's Boy (Crafty Friend), who finished second behind Lion Heart in the Long Branch. "Patrick told me I'd have more horse today than I did in [the Long Branch] and he was right," said Bravo. "He broke so sharp, right out of the gate. I just didn't want to get in his way. Every furlong he came to, he just got stronger and stronger. When I called upon him, he had plenty left." Rock Hard Ten, who finished sixth as the 4-5 choice, appeared to run out of gas after pressing the early pace. "We were just asking too much of him," said trainer Jason Orman. We should've given him some time off. We've shipped him across the country four times now, and that's too much." Trainer Rick Violette Jr. also was left at a loss following Swingforthefences (Boston Harbor)'s dull fifthplace finish. "He was travelling well, but when [jockey Shaun Bridgmohan] asked him, he didn't have anything. I really don't know what happened. We'll go home and try and figure it out." (cont. p2)

Lion Heart aspired to greatness even before he set foot on the track. Purchased for \$1.4 million at last year's Fasig-Tipton February Sale for juveniles in training, Lion Heart showed that he was worth every penny with three straight wins at two, including an easy score in the GI Hollywood Futurity. A model of consistency at three, he reeled off a trio of second-place finishes in the GII San Rafael S., the GI Blue Grass S. and the GI Kentucky Derby before failing to fire and coming home fourth in the GI Preakness S. May 15. Put to the side for a brief breather, Lion Heart returned with a narrow win in the Long Branch, but Biancone was quick to point out that the Long Branch was merely a rehearsal for yesterday's Haskell. "He needed to be really fit for this race," said Biancone. "This is a Grade I, so he needed to be ready for a big effort."

Purge broke his maiden by four lengths in a Saratoga sprint last term, but didn't reappear until a three-length tally at Gulfstream Feb. 22. Second and fifth, respectively, to Smarty Jones in the Rebel S. and the GII Arkansas Derby earlier this spring, Purge came back to win by six lengths two back in the GII Peter Pan S. at Belmont May 22. Poised for another big effort in the Belmont S., the 1 1/2 Classic proved too much for the colt and he trailed home a well-beaten ninth. According to Pletcher, Purge remains on the fence regarding a start in the 1 1/4-mile GI Travers S. Aug. 28. "My only concern is the 20 days time. The Belmont was back too soon and he got shook up in the paddock that day," said Pletcher, explaining the colt's poor showing last time. "This time, we let him settle into Saratoga. He's been up here since the week after the Belmont." The punters assembled at Deauville who allowed Somnus to be sent off at generous odds of 14-1 must have forgotten that he overhauled Oasis Dream (GB) in the soft in last year's G1 Haydock Sprint Cup, but he relished the ease in the ground here and a positive ride to belie that price. Things had gone against him so far this term, as he was buried underneath a huge penalty when seventh in the G2 Duke of York S. at York May 11 and when second in the G3 Chipchase S. at Newcastle June 26. He had performed better than his finishing position suggests when fifth in the G1 July Cup at Newmarket last time July 8 and met no trouble from his low draw here, racing across to join the main group before halfway and leading passing the quarter pole. Pressed by Whipper and Christophe Soumillon in the final 100 yards, he dug deep to repel that challenge and provide his rider with the ultimate wedding gift. "I'm thrilled," the Hall of Famer commented. "I had a wonderful trip and he stayed on really well." Connections confirmed that he will return to Haydock to attempt to win back-to-back renewals of the Sprint Cup Sept. 4. "We had this race mapped out for him for some time," commented trainer Robert Collet. "It is disappointing, but he will be back soon as I want to train him for the GI Breeders' Cup Mile [at Lone Star Park Oct. 30]." Solskjaer reportedly tore ligaments off a hock before he got a chance to set foot on a racecourse at two, but the fact that he was pitched into the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas on his debut at The Curragh last May spoke volumes. In the event, he aggravated that old injury and was soundly beaten and connections had to wait until a Naas conditions event on his return June 7 to see him in the winner's enclosure. Taken to the front in the early stages by Jamie Spencer, that proved the best place to be as Mick Kinane became wedged against the rail in behind on Tropical Lady, who was extricated too late to catch the gallant front runner. "Ninety-nine percent of horses don't come back from horrific injuries like that," said winning trainer Aidan O'Brien. "He's getting better with every race and we'll train him for the G1 Irish Champion S. [at Leopardstown Sept. 11]."

Using the festivities surrounding the GI Haskell Invitational and the Breeders' Cup announcement, New Jersey Governor James McGreevey signed four pro-racing bills into law Sunday afternoon. They include:

- Leasing of Monmouth Park and Meadowlands
 Racetracks--bill permits the New Jersey Sports
 Exposition Authority to lease its racetracks and to
 assign off-track wagering and account wagering
 licenses.
- Workmen's Compensation Coverage for Exercise Riders--bill extends workers' compensation coverage to exercise riders.
- Out-of-State Breeders' Awards--bill would extend eligibility for Thoroughbred breeder awards to breeders of New Jersey horses that win purse money in out-of-state races.
- Expanding the Duties of the Racing Commission-bill expands the duties of the racing commission to include advocacy of growth, development and promotion of horse racing.
