SUN SHINING ON SARATOGA

The yearling sale action shifts to upstate New York for Fasig-Tipton's Saratoga Yearling Sales, a three-day auction which gets underway tonight at 7:30 p.m. at the Humphrey S. Finney Pavilion in Saratoga Springs. The market for racing prospects has been buoyant thus far in 2004, and Fasig-Tipton President Walt Robertson expects much of the same over the next three days. "I felt like we had a great sale [July in Kentucky]," he said. "It's been good all through this year and the second half of last year. You'd have to be feeling pretty good after the way the two-year-olds and, so far, the yearlings have sold this year. I don't see one thing that has changed here. I've looked at all of the horses in this

sale and we've got as many quality horses as we've ever had, and that's the bottom line; I don't care how the market is, if you've got the right horses, they will sell well." Fasig-Tipton has put together another strong catalogue, which includes sons and daughters of leading sires A.P. Indy, Carson City, Danzig, Deputy Minister, Dynaformer, El Prado (Ire), Gone West, Kingmambo, Kris S., Machiavellian, Pulpit, Saint Ballado, Seattle Slew, Seeking the Gold, Storm Cat and Unbridled's Song. Those established stallions--some of whom are now deceased--are

bolstered by a group of young horses whose stars are ascendant, such as Distorted Humor, Elusive Quality, Grand Slam, Tale of the Cat and Wild Rush. Yearling buyers, always receptive to first-crop stallions, will also have a chance to acquire offspring by Aptitude, El Corredor, Monarchos, Point Given and Tiznow. "There are a lot of exciting young horses out there," Robertson noted. "There's Tiznow, and we sold a Point Given real well in Kentucky. We've also got some horses that are really exciting second-year horses--FuPeg and Giant's Causeway. We have several really nice horses by both those sires. And then of course there's Grand Slam." ARTIE'S TOO MUCH IN HALL OF FAME

Already recognized as a top member of a deep threeyear-old turf division, Artie Schiller (El Prado {Ire}) continued to impress yesterday while winning the GII National Museum of Racing Hall of Fame H. at Saratoga. Stakes-placed on the grass as a two-year-old, the bay didn't really step forward until May, when he came off a 3 1/2-month breather to win an Aqueduct allowance May 1. A victory in the Woodlawn S. May 15 earned him a shot in the June 6 GIII Hill Prince S., where he won wire-to-wire. A hiccup in the name of Kitten's Joy broke the three-race skein, as Artie Schiller finished second to that foe in the July 10 GIII Virginia Derby, but the Jimmy Jerkens trainee was back to his winning ways here. Well-placed in third as Icy Atlantic (Stormy Atlantic) and Street Theatre (Theatrical {Ire}) laid down honest fractions, 'Artie' swept past that pair in upper stretch when Street Theatre nearly went down after appearing to clip heels with Icy Atlantic, then unleashed a devastating turn of foot to win it by open lengths. "I knew once he saw daylight, it was all over," said jockey Richard Migliore. "He was the real deal today, but I don't think we've seen the best of him yet." Several announcements in recent weeks may change things on both the buying and selling sides. Lane's End, always among the leading consignors, announced that they would not be sending yearlings to Saratoga, while Padua Stables' Satish Sanan--whose purchases at this sale in recent years include \$2.15-million champion Vindication--revealed that he would in effect be boycotting public auctions in 2004 in an effort to raise awareness of his initiative, the Alliance for Industry Reform. "As far as Lane's End goes, it wasn't expected," Robertson admitted. "We certainly wish they were here this year and hope they'll be back [in the future]. But, as I've said, we've got as many top-level horses as I've ever seen on these sale grounds." Sanan's announcement was also unexpected. "It was a total surprise," Robertson added. "You always miss a buyer. He was a good buyer in Kentucky and here last year. We had a great sale in Kentucky [last month]. I wish he'd show up here, and there's still time." But Robertson is quietly confident that buyers will be active. "So far, everybody is accounted for," he said. "I'm sure we'll see some more over the next two days. All the people that we were expecting are in town." Consignors are also expecting good business in the coming days. "We started showing on Saturday and had about 25 shows per horse," said Meg Levy of Bluewater Sales. "On Sunday, there were about 50 shows per horse. I've been selling up here for five years. There aren't necessarily any new buyers, but there are people based on the East Coast who just come to Saratoga. There's so much tradition here. The mornings are so busy, and the afternoons are much less so, since there's the racing and so much else to do socially." Levy has a draft of 12 yearlings to sell at the Spa. "Our group this year is very consistent," she said. "They're all good physicals, and I think they're going to be real racehorses. We have one of the last Saint Ballado colts and I really like him." That chestnut colt, slated to sell as hip 130, is out of Eye Catching (Alydar), making him a half brother to SW Lady Melesi. "We had a good sale in Kentucky and hope that continues," Levy added.

Taylor Made for Success...

Sunday's GII Jim Dandy S. saw a major catalogue update for a pair of colts from Taylor Made's consignment. The winner Purge has a half brother by Forestry, hip 111, to sell Wednesday, while runner-up The Cliff's Edge has a Coronado's Quest half brother who will go through the ring earlier in that session as hip 83. "The Jim Dandy was a good result for us," said Duncan Taylor. "We've got a really athletic group of horses. They're well-conformed and they look like racehorses." Taylor expects the status quo to continue at this sale. "[Buyer traffic] at the barns has been steady but not overwhelming, same as last year," he noted. "There aren't really any new faces, but maybe some of the agents I've seen have some new buyers. There are still a few days, maybe more people will show up."



Thoroughbred Charities of America, which helps fund several equine charities, has donated \$7,000 to the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation, money that will be spent on the construction of a new TRF farm at the Wateree River Correctional Institute in Rembert, South Carolina. "We know Donna Freyer and Kip Elser and they are wonderful people and they are doing wonderful things for horses," said TCOA President Herb Moelis, speaking of the two TRF committee members who have spearheaded the project to open the farm at Wateree. "We felt it was important to help get them started. We generally support a lot of rescue and retirement organizations and this is certainly a good program. The Wateree River Farm, which will be the latest TRF retirement farm based at a correctional facility, is expected to open by November, 2004. "We are getting ready to start construction and the sooner we can get that done the sooner we can start helping some horses and some of the inmates. Donations such as these are certainly a big help."

INDIGENOUS DIES IN HONG KONG Hong Kong Horse of the Year Indigenous (Ire) (Marju {Ire}--Sea Port {GB}, by Averof {GB}), who recently collapsed and was placed into veterinary care at Tuen Mun Public Riding School in Hong Kong, died Sunday, according to farm sources. The cause of death has yet to be confirmed. Horse of the Year in 1999, Indigenous also collected champion middle-distance and champion stayer titles. Trained by Ivan Allan, the 11-year-old won the 1998 G2 Hong Kong International Vase, Hong Kong Gold Cup in 1998 and 1999 and consecutive editions of the Hong Kong Champions & Chater Cup (1997 & 98). "Indigenous was one of the classiest, toughest and most reliable horses that we will ever see and he is one of the first horses to really put Hong Kong on the international racing map," said Winfried Engelbrecht-Bresges, Hong Kong Jockey Club's Executive Director of Racing. "He will be greatly missed at Tuen Mun, where he enjoyed a happy retirement and gave many of his visitors great enjoyment as part of the Hong Kong Racing Hall of Fame." The highest earning horse in Hong Kong history, the gelding raced 62 times, winning on 12 occasions, before being retired last year with HK\$45,125,289 in earnings.
