FILLIES LEAD THE WAY AT FASIG-TIPTON

A filly with the best of credentials--by leading sire A.P. Indy out of the regally bred Seebe (Danzig)--was the star of the show at Tuesday's opening session of



Hip 26, the \$1.5 million session topper Horsephotos Fasig-Tipton's Saratoga Yearling Sale, which nonetheless failed to produce the fireworks that sale officials had hoped. W. S. Farish, who recently stepped down as the U.S. Ambassador to Great Britain, signed the ticket at \$1.5 million for the racy dark bay filly, the second foal from her MGSW dam. Derry Meeting Farm con-

signed the Pennsylvania-bred on behalf of breeder George Strawbridge, who conceded that it was difficult to part with a filly with such potential. "Well, I didn't want to sell because I love the filly, I love the mother, and I love the sire," Strawbridge said. "But my adviser, James Wigan, told me I could get a lot of money for her. Fasig-Tipton loved her as well and they persuaded me to bring her up here. I am so happy that Will Farish bought her. He's a good friend of mine and I know she will be in excellent care." The filly's dam, Seebe, carried Strawbridge's white and green colors with flair both in Europe and the U.S., winning the G3 Princess Margaret S. and the GIII Suwanee River H., as well as finishing second in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches. Seebe's dam, the good racemare Annie Edge (Ire) (Nebbiolo {GB}), produced three other stakes winners by Danzig--Rimrod, Skillington and Syncline--as well as Selkirk (Sharpen Up {GB}), a highweighted miler in England who has become one of the best sires in that country. Farish was pleased with his acquisition. "These kinds of fillies don't come up for sale very often," said the former Ambassador. "I thought she had one of the best pedigrees in the sale. And George Strawbridge breeds great horses." The second of three sessions begins tonight in the Humphrey S. Finney Pavilion at 7:30 p.m.

Sluggish Start at the Spa...

While big money was available for a yearling with the right package, Tuesday's session proved disappointing for Fasig-Tipton, with the gross, average and median taking a dip from last year's figures. "It took us by surprise, because we had been optimistic prior to the sale," said Terence Collier, director of marketing for the auction house. "The stars still aligned for the right horse. But it's such a sophisticated business now, there's so much information available to buyers that might not be available to us. We can all see the big lovely yearling with an excellent pedigree, but we don't always know the reason they don't sell as they should." Collier did retain faith that the sale could pick up through the next two sessions. "It was encouraging that the top of the market met expectations," he added.

Standing on the Shoulders of Giants...

The first splash of the sale came early Tuesday, when Irish veterinarian Demi O'Byrne bid \$700,000 for Hip 3, a colt by leading freshman sire Giant's Causeway (Storm Cat) out of the Wavering Monarch mare Overturned, a multiple graded stakes winner from the immediate family of millionaire Came Home. The 17-year-old Overturned is the dam of graded stakes winner Capsized (Summer Squall). The dark bay was bred in partnership by Glencrest Farm and Ashford Stud. "Demi O'Byrne signed the ticket for the horse, but he was not buying for Ashford, he was buying for Michael Tabor," said David Greathouse, owner of Glencrest. "You always hope they will go for more, and he is a very good horse, but he has a good home and we are happy with the sale."

Kingmambo Filly Second-Highest of the Session...

They were outgunned for Hip 26, but Yukiko Hosokawa, bidding for her father, Masuo Hosokawa, got the job done with Hip 57, a filly by Kingmambo out of graded stakes winner Sweet and Ready (El Prado



Hip 57 Horsephotos {Ire}). Consigned by Eldon Farm Equine, with Gainesway as agent, the chestnut brought a final bid of \$900,000, which was the second-highest price of the session. "My father is interested in Kingmambo, and he is always looking to buy good mares," said Hosokawa. Richard Cross of

Narvick International signed the ticket for the Hosokawas. "They were looking for well-bred fillies, and we looked at about a dozen at the sale," Cross said. "We tried to buy the filly that earlier went for \$1.5 million, but we got blown away. [Hip 26] had a slightly stronger pedigree, but [Hip 57] is a lovely filly, a lovely individual and she has a wonderful pedigree herself." Cross was not surprised at the price they had to pay for the yearling. "We were hoping she would go for less, but we knew she would be costly," he said. Sweet and Ready, winner of the GII Princess S. and second in the GII Hollywood Oaks, is a half-sister to stakes-placed winners Sweet and Firm (Peteski) and Proud and Steady (Proudest Romeo). It was the first trip to Saratoga for Hosokawa. Her father, who has been involved racing for 35 years, is a leading Japanese industrialist and owns a farm on the island of Hokkaido. "We thought she was a really top prospect," said Gainesway's Michael Hernon of Hip 57. "She was the only Kingmambo filly here, and he is one of the top horses at stud in the world. She is a top physical and she showed very well. We thought she'd bring something in the upper six-figure region."

colt consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, Agent CCLVII. Out of Thega (Conquistador Cielo), the bay is a half-brother to stakes winner Tiger Hunt (Kris S.). A filly from the consignment of Denali Stud, agent, brought a final bid of \$200,000 from Chester Broman. She is a half-sister to GII Arlington-Washington Futurity winner Trailthefox (Foxtrail). The

other Tiznow offered on opening night at Saratoga, a filly consigned by Woods Edge Farm, was purchased for \$380,000 by Peter Minikes. A daughter of stakesplaced Surprise Girl (Time for a Change), she is a halfsister to stakes winner Quick Draw (Tale of the Cat). It is also the family of champion Heartlight No. One and GISW Soul of the Matter. Bobby Barbara, who has been training for Minikes for four years, said, "I saw Tiznow when he came to Belmont Park [for the 2001 Classic] and he was the most impressive horse I'd seen in a long time. He galloped past me when I was on the pony and I said, 'who was that?' He was tremendous." As for Tiznow's daughter, the native New Yorker added, "She is very athletic and very correct. She has a beautiful head and is real racy looking. I thought she would bring a little more money." Minikes, who works for the New York investment company Newburger and Berman, has Grade I winners Indy Five Hundred and Buy the Sport, who are trained by Barbara, in addition to the Bobby Frankel-trained Master David.

MISWAKI PENSIONED Top sire **Miswaki** (Mr. Prospector--Hopespringseternal, by Buckpasser) has been pensioned from stud duties. The 26-year-old stallion, who stood at Walmac International in Lexington for



22 years, had suffered from declining fertility in recent years. As a two-year-old in 1980, Miswaki won the G1 Prix de la Salamandre and was second in the G1 Prix Morny and third in the G1 Dewhurst S. He retired to Walmac in 1982. To date, he has sired 96 stakes winners and 37 group/graded winners. He is

the sire of nine champions in five countries, including Horse of the Year and Breeders' Cup Classic winner Black Tie Affair (Ire), French champion Urban Sea and 2003 champion Etoile Montante. Among his five 2004 stakes winners is Irish 2000 Guineas winner Bachelor Duke and last weekend's GIII West Virginia Derby winner Sir Shackleton. Miswaki is the broodmare sire of 106 stakes winners, including Classic winners Galileo (Ire), Daylami (Ire) and Dalakhani (Ire). "Great sires like Alleged, Nureyev and Miswaki really put Walmac on the map," said Walmac President John T. L. Jones, Jr. "Salt Lake will continue to hold down the fort as an accomplished sire and we've got a lot to look forward to with leading freshman sire Successful Appeal and young stallions Minardi, Thunderello, Zavata and Castle Gandolfo, a son of Gone West, who is bred on the same Mr. Prospector/Buckpasser cross as Miswaki. At a time where the toughness and durability of the breed is frequently called into question, Devil His Due stands as a something of a throwback to the iron horses of earlier eras. He started in 41 races, 37 of which were stakes, running virtually free of medication (he started on bute once). In the course of his career, Devil His Due earned nearly \$4 million and his victories included the GI Wood Memorial S., GI Pimlico Special H., GI Gulfstream Park H., and two renewals of the GI Suburban H.

This impressive record didn't translate into instant fashion at stud, and Devil His Due has stood at modest fees throughout his career. He has, however, made the best of his opportunities, getting 20 stakes winners (seven in 2004) from his first six crops, including Roses in May, who became his sire's first Grade I winner with a victory in this weekend's GI Whitney H; She's A Devil Due, a graded stakes winner, who also finished third in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies; the GIII Withers S. victor Spite the Devil; Buckle Down Ben, winner of the GIII Laurel Futurity; and this year's smart Florida two-vear-old Devils Disciple.

Unlike his sire, who started 15 times as a two-yearold, and 11 the next season, Roses in May has been lightly raced. Untried at two, he started five times last year, for two wins and two seconds, his only unplaced effort coming when sixth in the GII Jerome H., his final outing of the year. This term, he's been perfect, his hard-fought Whitney victory giving him four wins in four starts. Alan Porter cont. p6

She's A Devil Due and Spite the Devil, Devil His Due's leading earners prior to Roses in May's Whitney triumph, are bred on similar lines, as the former is out of a mare by Fappiano, and the latter out of a mare by Fappiano's son <u>Cryptoclearance</u>. Since Devil His Due is out of a mare by Raise a Cup, a horse bred on the same Raise a Native/Nashua cross as Mr. Prospector, the sire of Fappiano, they have quite close inbreeding to genetic relatives.

Roses in May is bred on far more outcrossed lines. He is the 10th living foal produced by his dam, the Speak John mare Tell a Secret, and was produced when that mare was 23-years-old. Tell a Secret produced an earlier stakes winner in the shape of Lismore Lass (by Vigors), who took the Bayou H. at Fair Grounds. She is also granddam of the GIII Yerba Buena Breeders' Cup H. winner Gleefully, and of the stakes-winning Slew's Secret.

Tell a Secret was a more-than-useful performer in her own right. She never captured a stakes event, but she did win nine races and \$288,368, and finished second in two graded events and third in another. Tell a Secret's dam, Secret Retreat, won 12 of 30 races, including back-to-back renewals of the Scarlet Carnation S. There are some minor stakes winners in the next two dams, but the family hadn't produced anything of graded stakes class until the appearance of Roses in May and his "niece" Gleefully.

The closest duplication in the pedigree of Roses in May is that of Double Jay (the leading two-year-old of 1946 in some polls, and later a Leading Broodmare Sire), who appears 5x4, and is also doubled in other Devil His Due stakes winners Devils Disciple, Devil at the Wire, Banished Lover and Parkway Express. The most notable factor here, however, might be the combination of Halo, grandsire of Devil His Due, and Prince John, sire of Roses in May's maternal grandsire, Speak John as Halo's broodmare sire, Cosmic Bomb, is a half brother to the dam of Prince John. The pair appear with Halo in the sire and Prince John in the first four generations of the dam in at least 34 unrestricted stakes winners, including other Grade I winners Dispersal, Peace Rules (whose sire is out of a mare by Devil His Due's sire, Devil's Bag), Sister Act (by Saint Ballado, a brother to Devil's Bag), Ishino Sunday and Sound Action, as well as this year's filly sprint star, Bear Fan.

TRF GALA RAISES RECORD \$425.000 The Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation's sixth annual fund-raising party held Monday night at the Saratoga Golf and Polo Club exceeded all expectations as 450 guests attended for a chance to bid on unique experiences and stallion seasons. The event raised \$425,000, money the TRF will use to provide for its rapidly growing roster of retired Thoroughbreds. "At this time, with such heightened awareness about the need to provide retirement for all Thoroughbred horses who have no other options, it is a wonderful thing that so many fine and upstanding people in racing can come out and put on such a huge show of support for the TRF and have so much fun in the process," said TRF Executive Director Diana Pikulski. "We raised a record amount of money and every cent of it is needed to take care of our exploding population of horses and our on-going mission of providing homes for as many retirees as possible." Monday's sales topper was an option to breed to Elusive Quality, the sire of Smarty Jones, at the 2004 fee of \$50,000. It was purchased by ClassicStar Thoroughbreds for \$90,000. John Oxley was the underbidder. An option to breed to Successful Appeal at the 2004 fee of \$6,000 brought \$21,000 and was purchased by David Greathouse. A pair of live foal seasons to Congaree were sold for \$27,000 each to John Hettinger and Hansley Albina. The top selling experience was an all-expenses-paid trip to the 2005 Dubai World Cup. It was purchased by Mike Ryan for \$20,000. Chester Broman paid \$17,500 to have a portrait done of a horse of his choice by equine artist Leslie Priggen. Priggen also agreed to do a painting for underbidder, Dr. Charles Kidder, whose last bid was \$17,000. The right to throw out the first pitch at a Baltimore Orioles game during Preakness week went to famed chef Bobby Flay for \$13,000. The underbidder was former Duke basketball star Bobby Hurley. "This party gets bigger and better every year," said Pikulski. "I think that's because we go out of our way to show everyone a good time, but more so because there is a growing awareness of the importance of the work the TRF does and the industry's responsibility to care for its equine competitors when their racing days are done."
