A BID FOR GLORY

Team Valor President Barry Irwin proved he could handle big-league bidding during yesterday's session of the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Yearling Sales, going to

\$1.85 million to get Hip 84, a colt by freshman sire Giant's Causeway from the consignment of Gainesway, Agent II. The purchase was a marked departure for Irwin, who usually plays in the middle market. "There are two reasons why I bought him," he explained. "First, you can't find a real racehorse in this country anymore. Today, I offered \$1.2 million for a horse who broke his maiden at Delaware and I couldn't get him. Second, he was the best yearling I've seen in five to 10 years." The bay, out of

Alaska Queen (Time for a Change), is a half brother to GSW Keats (Hennessy) and to GSP Grand Score (Grand Slam), who brought \$900,000 at this venue two years ago. **Saratoga Sales Coverage cont. p2**

LUCKY 13 FOR ARLINGTON MILLION

The starting gate will be near capacity for the 22nd running of the GI Arlington Million. The names of 13 horses were tossed into the hat for the 10-furlong event yesterday, with **Sweet Return (GB)** (Elmaamul) earning the role of 7-2 morning-line chalk. The winner of the GI Hollywood Derby at three and the GI Frank E. Kilroe Mile H. and GI San Marcos S. this year at four, he comes off a third-place finish in the July 25 GI Eddie

Read H. He faces last year's GI Secretariat S. winner **Kicken Kris** (Kris S.), who bounced back after two straight off-the-board finishes to take the July 17 GI Bowling Green H. at Belmont Park. The four-year-old will try to become the third horse to follow up on his Secretariat score with a victory in the Million. Awad boasted that achievement in 1993 and 1995, and Marlin got it done in 1996 and 1997. **Million Day fields, p6**

Testing His Limits...

Barry Irwin admitted he hadn't decided how high was too high for his seven-figure buy. "To be honest, I don't know what my limit was," he said. "I really liked the horse, so I never really thought about it. He's got great girth, his knees are flat, what else can I say?" Irwin may not have given a second thought to the hefty price tag, but the bidding on the colt was so frenetic, it caused one of the colt's suitors to leave the sales pavilion. Roger King, of King World Productions, was underbidder on the yearling. When the bidding got hot and heavy, King, who had been sitting with trainer Wesley Ward, walked outside, but stuck his head in the door seconds later to see how the bidding was progressing. As he leaned in and out of the door, he was pressed by auctioneers, "Are you in?" King snapped, "I don't know." Finally, King admitted defeat and Team Valor had themselves a "real racehorse."

Full Steam Ahead...

Stan Fulton of Fleetwood/N.W. Management enjoyed a busy night of bidding yesterday, capped by the \$900,000 purchase of hip number 92, a colt by Grand Slam out of Bisbee (Believe It). "We liked him," the understated Fulton explained. "We liked just about everything about him. My agents said he was a good one, so I bought him." Of the price tag, Fulton added, "They [his agents] thought he would be just a little bit less, but I thought they were low--so that's where we ended up. I think we were probably at the stretching point." The colt was consigned by Three Chimneys, agent. Fulton also purchased hip 88, a colt by Unbridled's Song, for \$500,000; and hip 130, a colt by Saint Ballado, for \$400,000. "Some you're under budget a little bit and some you're over budget a little bit," Fulton laughed.

Trainer John Servis, fresh off success on the Triple Crown trail with Smarty Jones, might have found his next star. Servis, bidding on behalf of Fox Hill Farm, paid \$460,000 for hip number 107, a colt by Unbridled's Song out of Clever Monique (Clever Trick). The May 5 foal is a half brother to Grade I winner and promising freshman sire Yes It's True (Is it True). "He's got a nice pedigree," Servis said. "He's just a really good-looking colt." But, he added, "He's not going to come along as fast as you might think because he's a May foal." The gray was consigned by Taylor Made as agent for ClassicStar, LLC. Servis also purchased hip 129, a colt by Maria's Mon, for Fox Hill Farm for \$140,000.

It's All in the Chace...

Never one to remain in the background, Buzz Chace enjoyed an active evening at yesterday's second session. Heading Chace's purchases was hip 102, a filly by Seeking the Gold out of the stakes- winning and graded stakes-placed mare Cedar Knolls (Broad Brush). Chace bought the filly for \$425,000 from Taylor Made Sales Agency, agent for ClassicStar LLC. He indicated that he doesn't have an owner for the filly yet, but that it is just a matter of time. "She is just a really nice filly and very racy," Chace said. The dust had barely settled before the agent, bidding on behalf of Aaron and Marie Jones, pulled the trigger again, this time for hip 111, a bay colt by Forestry out of the Copelan mare Copelan's Bid Gal. Also purchased for \$425,000 from the Taylor Made consignment, the May 13 foal is a half brother to Purge (Pulpit), winner of Sunday's GII Jim Dandy S. at Saratoga. "He is very athletic, overall a reall nice horse," said Chace. "It looks like he's going to be a very fast horse. He had a nice way about him and he showed himself well." Acting for West Point Thoroughbreds, Chace went to \$335,000 for hip 114. The colt, who was consigned by Bluegrass Thoroughbred Services, Inc., agent for Mueller Farms, Inc., will be sent to David McKathan in Ocala, Florida.

The Plight of the Pinhooker...

Mike Mulligan of Leprechaun Racing knows that this is not an easy game and yesterday's action did nothing to prove otherwise. But, despite being outbid on a couple of the higher-priced lots, including the session-topping Giant's Causeway colt, Mulligan managed to bring home five head on the evening. Topping his purchases was hip 120, a filly by Unbridled's Song from the family of champion Housebuster and Saturday's GI Beverly D. S. hopeful Quero Quero. Consigned by Gainesway, Agent I, she brought \$185,000. Leprechaun also purchased hip 109, a grey filly by Maria's Mon, out of the Two Punch mare Cloud's Amber that was picked up for \$165,000. Consigned by Gainesway, Agent VII, the filly is a full sister to stakes-placed Illusoria. She sold for \$115,000 as a Keeneland November weanling. Commenting on the overall health of the sale thus far, Mulligan said, "Competition was very strong. The horses who are at the upper echelon, physically, are really a special group, so naturally it is much harder to get them." Operating under the philosophy that, "always the physical first and pedigree second," Mulligan conceded that he has departed from that ideology on a few occasions during the sale. "If there is some residual value or pedigree involved, then we'll sometimes take a shot," he said, adding, "Generally we try an stay in the \$100,000 to \$200,000, but even that can be tough sometimes." Mulligan also bought hip 81, a colt by Dixieland Band out of SP Woodman's Dancer (Woodman) that brought \$120,000; hip 96, a filly from the second crop by GI Breeders' Cup Classic hero Cat Thief out of MSW California Style (Coastal) that went for the same price; and the penultimate horse through the ring, hip 141, a colt by Dynaformer from Bluegrass Thoroughbred Services, Inc., agent for Burning Daylights Farm, Inc. The half to Argentine Group 1 winner Speeding Star (Arg) (Fitzcarraldo {Arg}) sold for \$175,000.

"I thought the first session was a bit tight. Our vettings may have been down a little more than last year. I think people were a little less forgiving for veterinary flaws. Business As Usual...

Commenting on the final figures at the close of business last night, Fasig-Tipton President Walt Robertson said, "The buy-back rate was 23 percent--the same as yesterday and a tick better than a year ago." There was a decided decrease in the average, from \$355,918 in 2003 to \$290,200 this year, but, as Robertson explained, "We had three huge horses last year--I think \$5 million in three horses last year. This year, we had one at \$1.85 million. Last year, we had \$2.7 million, \$1.9 million and \$1.5 million, and all struck on the same night." Robertson is looking for another strong session at the sale tonight. "We have good horses selling [Thursday night] and we'll see how they do," he said. "I felt good going into every night and I feel good about tomorrow."

Where The Action Is...

Tuesday's opening session was off to a quiet start, but Terrence Collier, Fasig's director of marketing, saw improved action Wednesday night. "It seemed so much easier to meet the sellers expectations tonight," Collier said. "It didn't feel that way last night. We had to work much harder last night. I think it was a change in the quality of horses. I don't think people's expectations were down. The stars lined up with better horses to night."

Hip 148, c, Storm Cat--Gone to Venus, by Gone West
 Consigned by Three Chimneys Sales, agent
B-Beau Ravine Farm (Ky)

With all the star power brought to the table by this colt's illustrious sire, the chestnut packs a powerful punch from his maternal line as well. Out of the winning mare Gone to Venus, the colt is a full brother to Saudi Poetry, winner of the GII Louisville Breeders' Cup H. and the GIII Fleur de Lis H.; and a half sibling to MGSP Aeneas (Capote). The colt's second dam Rokeby Venus (Quadrangle), who is a half sister to Horse of the Year Arts and Letters, is the dam of eight winners, including GII Flower Bowl H. winner Rokeby Rose. Rokeby Rose in turn is the dam of champion Silverbulletday (Silver Deputy), winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies at two and the GI Ashland S., GI Kentucky Oaks, GI Alabama S. and GI Gazelle H. during her sophomore season.

Hip 149, f, Unbridled's Song--Gwenjinsky, by Seattle Dancer

Consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, Agent CIII
B-Cabotaba Partnership & Unbridled's Song Syndicate (Ky)

The chestnut filly is a half sister to multiple graded-stakes winner Lead Story (Editor's Note), stakes winner Capejinsky (Cape Town) and stakes-placed Glory Glory (Honour and Glory). "She's from the same family as [Breeders' Cup Distaff winner] Unbridled Elaine, who is obviously also by Unbridled's Song, so I think she's one of the best-bred fillies in the sale," commented Taylor Made's Mark Taylor. "She's a beautiful physical and I think she'll definitely be one of the highlights."

Hip 164, c, El Corredor--Inspired Hope, by Shadeed
 Consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, Agent CLXXXIX
B-Julius H Zolezzi (Ky)

The bay colt from the first crop of the speedy Grade I winner El Corredor sold for \$225,000 as a weanling at last year's Keeneland November sale. His dam is a half sister to multiple graded-stakes winner Big Jag (Kleven). "He's just gorgeous," said Mark Taylor. "He's one of the best yearlings I've seen all year and he just looks like a runner. El Corredor is fast, but he's out of a Shadeed mare, so [the yearling] has a nice scopey two-turn appearance about him. I think he could be the runner of the consignment."

Hip 166, f, Saint Ballado--Irish Linnet, by Seattle Song
 Consigned by ClassicStar LLC, Taylor Made Sales Agency, agent
B-ClassicStar LLC (Ky)

A late May 27 foal, she is nevertheless one of the last of the Saint Ballados out of a millionaire mare. The yearling is a half to stakes winner Blushing Irish (Rahy), and to a juvenile by Giant's Causeway that brought \$400,000 here last year.

Hip 170, c, Storm Cat--Jewel Princess, by Key to the Mint
 Consigned by Eaton Sales, agent
B-Barnett Enterprises (Ky)

The Feb. 18 foal is out of a champion who won four Grade I races, most notably the 1996 GI Breeders' Cup Distaff. Jewel Princess is the dam of four foals of racing age, including the Storm Cat filly One Nice Cat, third in the Mardi Gras H. earlier this year. "She is a very nice filly," said Eaton's Reiley McDonald. "There are a number of very good fillies on the grounds, and although I may be biased, I think she is far and away the best. Her three-year-old full sister was recently graded-stakes placed. She has a great pedigree and then you match the physical with it all. She is a Storm Cat with enough size and scope. Normally, I have found that the better Storm Cats are the ones with some extra scope."

Hip 207, f, A.P. Indy--Nany's Sweep, by End Sweep
 Consigned by Eaton Sales, agent
B-WinStar Farms, LLC (Ky)

The chestnut filly is the first foal of Grade I winner Nany's Sweep. "She is a little bit atypical for A.P. Indy," Reiley McDonald said. "She is extremely powerfully built, great boned, big quarters and plenty of strength behind. I think a bit of her grandfather, Valid Appeal, came out. I think we made a great cross."

Hip 208, c, Fusaichi Pegasus--Nemea, by The Minstrel
 Consigned by Denali Stud (Craig Bandoroff), agent
B-Strategy Bloodstock (Ky)

Nemea has already produced two winners to date, including the globe-trotting filly Lovers Knot (GB). By Groom Dancer, Lovers Knot won the G2 Falmouth S. in England during her sophomore season before scoring in the GIII De La Rose H. during her American campaign the following year. The Mar. 7 foal hails from the family of Horse of the Year Ferdinand, winner of the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Breeders' Cup Classic.

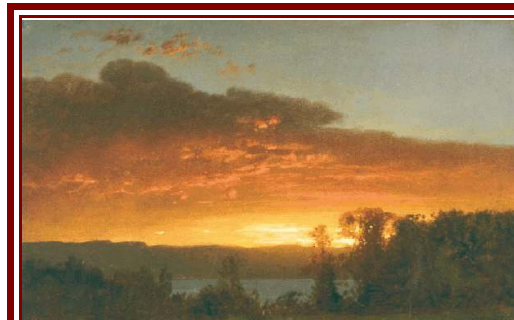
