Roger King was feeling the sting of defeat Wednesday after he lost out on the prized \$1.85-million sale topping Giant's Causeway colt, but he came back in a



big way Thursday when he won the battle for hip 170, a dark bay filly by Storm Cat out of Jewel Princess (Key to the Mint). Consigned by Eaton Sales, the filly was purchased for \$1.4 million, which was the highest price at Thursday's final session. Trainer Wesley Ward signed the ticket for the Feb. 18 foal. "I think this horse will be a champion," King professed. "I just loved her momma." Jewel Princess, who won four grade I races during a

championship season in 1996 that culminated with a victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff, is the dam of stakes-placed One Nice Cat (Storm Cat). The price was right, according to consignor Eaton Sales' Reiley Mc-Donald. "Any time you get over a million dollars, you really never how far they are going to go," he said. "We thought we would get something between a million to 1.5 million. We had about six or seven people interested in the horse prior to the sale, so we knew she would bring a good price." Jewel Princess, in foal to Storm Cat, sold for \$4.9 million at the 2000 Keeneland November sale. Harmony Cottage, a two-year-old full sister to the yearling, sold for \$1.1 million at last year's Saratoga auction.

Business As Usual

One of three seven-figure yearlings Thursday, the Storm Cat filly led the way at a rebounding final session, in which gross and average rose from last year's figures, while the median remained unchanged. At the conclusion of business Thursday, Fasig-Tipton chairman D.G. Van Clief, Jr. considered himself pleased with the three-day auction. "For three nights, we're down just a wee bit against the same three nights last year," Van Clief said. "After significant increases in all indicators from '02 to '03, it looks like we plateaued a little bit here this year. It was a very solid night here tonight."

By the Numbers

Commenting on the night's figures, Fasig-Tipton President Walt Robertson, said, "We sold 50 horses tonight, 11 were bought back against 51 sold last year with 15 bought back, so that number is a lot better. All in all it was a good sale and we sure hoped that tonight would do just exactly what it did and that would get us over \$300,000 [in average]. It felt pretty solid clear through." Although figures were down from last year's sale, Robertson added, "You get through the sale and you're under 25-percent charge backs--that part's terrific. I've never been to a sale that I didn't want it to average more than it did, and I never sold a horse I didn't want more money for, but looking back, you've got 21 percent buybacks and people sold their horses. If that's what they're worth, that's what they're worth."

Satish Sanan, 2003's leading buyer with \$4 million in sales, was notably absent from this year's auction. "That \$4 million--there's your difference and when someone spends \$4 million, how much do they bid?" Robertson asked. "So yes, we missed that \$4 million and we missed him as an underbidder. Which will happen. The year before last we missed another big man in the Thoroughbred Corp., but things roll and I thought it was a good sale."

Lukas Back on Top

In years past, trainer D. Wayne Lukas had usually been at the forefront of the bidding action, but heading into the final night of Fasig-Tipton's summer sale, Lukas kept a much lower profile than previously, with only



one purchase prior to tonight. Last night, however, Lukas got things rolling quickly when he went up to \$1 million to secure hip 148, a chestnut by Storm Cat out of the winning mare Gone to Venus (Gone West). Consigned by Three Chimneys Sales, agent, the colt is a full brother to multiple graded stakes winner Saudi Poetry and a

half to Aeneas (Capote). "I looked at a lot of Storm Cats and this one has the body I like, and he had a very good pedigree," explained Lukas. "I think he could be anything. He's a very athletic, good-looking colt. The cross has worked and [it's one] I had good luck with. I'm thrilled to bits to get him." It didn't take long for Lukas to jump back in the spotlight when he lit up the board with a \$665,000 final bid for hip 181. A bay colt by Silver Deputy out of champion Life's Magic (Cox's Ridge), the April 4 foal was consigned by Tom Evan's Trackside Farm. It was a bit of a reunion for Lukas, who trained Life's Magic to a pair of championship seasons in 1984 and 1985.

Zoning In

Signing the ticket at \$1.15 million for hip 192 was William Haines of Woodward, Oklahoma. The bay yearling is out of Mesmerized (Dehere), a half sister to stakes winner Joyous Melody (Phone Trick). The colt was consigned by Paramount Sales, as agent. "He's a beautiful colt," admitted Paramount's Pat Castello. "He didn't turn a hair all week. And that's a great price."

All the Tools

Trainer Ron Ellis, bidding on behalf of B. Wayne Hughes, went to \$800,000 to bring home hip 158, a son of Deputy Minister out of Horsafire (Hold Your Peace). The yearling is a half to graded stakes winners Incinerate (Groovy) and Fan the Flame (Island Whirl). "Pretty much everthing," Ellis said when asked what he liked about the yearling. "He's a big strong colt and strong pedigree, so he's the type of horse we're looking for." Of the price tag, Ellis added, "That was about what we wanted to go to. I've seen horses like that sell for a lot more." The New York-bred colt was a \$500,000 weanling purchase at Keeneland November.

Always an abundant source of first-crop sires, this year's Saratoga Yearling sale proved no different. Leading the fray with six yearlings on offer through three sessions, Breeders' Cup Classic winner Tiznow realized the highest price for a first-crop sire during the intial session when hip 61 weighed in with a hefty \$500,000 bid from Hoby Knight, agent. Not to be outdone on Wednesday, a yearling by Tiznow again reeled in a tidy return when hip 93 brought \$250,000 from Stephen Carr. "The Tiznows that I've seen earlier this spring and here at Saratoga are really really nice," said Reiley Mc-Donald of Eaton Sales. "As a sire, he really stands out. I think his yearlings are very athletic and smooth, and they appear to be very nice horses. I think that Tiznow will be among the top first-crop sires." On the final evening, hip 202--out of multiple stakes winning and graded stakes placed Morning Sun (Dehere)--brought \$250,000, representing a significant increase over Tiznow's 2002 stud fee of \$35,000. Also generating a lot of buzz at this year's venue is GI Cigar Mile hero El Corredor. The top price for an El Corredor yearling at the first session was the \$300,000 for hip 25, which sold to Buzz Chace on behalf of Barry K. Schwartz.

Coolmore Continues to Roll

Fresh off the success of Lion Heart (Tale of the Cat)'s victory in Sunday's GI Haskell Invitational, bloodstock agent Demi O'Byrne went to \$750,000 to collar another Tale of the Cat youngster for Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith. Hip 172, a chestnut yearling from the consignment of Mill Ridge Sales, agent, is out of the placed mare Jurisprudence (by Seeking the Gold). "He's very good-looking," said O'Byrne. "He's a very typical Tale of the Cat and of course, he's my favorite stallion." Team Coolmore was still swinging nearing the end of the session with a \$700,000 purchase of hip 208, a colt by freshman sire Fusaichi Pegasus out of the Minstrel mare Nemea, the dam of group winner Lovers Knot (GB). Fleetwood Management's Stan Fulton was the immediate under bidder on the colt.

"He was a very nice horse," said Denali Stud's Craig Bandoroff, who consigned the colt. "We had the right people on him and he sold well." Waiting until the very last horse of the night strode into the ring, O'Byrne dished out another \$650,000 to secure hip 212. The chestnut colt, who is by Tale of the Cat out of multiple stakes winner Nurse Dopey (Dr. Blum), was consigned by Ben Walden's fledgling operation Gracefield. The colt sold for \$250,000 at Keeneland November. "We thought he could bring \$300-400,000 up to \$1.2 million," explained Walden. "The fact of the matter is that we are very happy with what we got, and we are even happier with the fact the Coolmore bought him. They really wanted him. Patrick Biancone, who trains Lion Heart, loved him. Demi O'Byrne who is one of the greatest judges in the business absolutely loved him the minute he saw him. He didn't have to look at him more than two seconds."

Family Matters

Asked what he liked most about his newest acquisition, hip 149, Stan Fulton admitted, "What we really liked about her was the price we paid for her." Fulton went to \$550,000 to bring home hip 149, a daughter of Unbridled's Song out of the Seattle Dancer mare Gwenjinsky. "We thought she'd bring more." Fulton added, "She's a May 18 foal, but we looked at her a said, 'She's going to be quite some lady.'" Fulton, who got serious about buying race horses just two years ago, bought the filly to race, but also has some mares in foal and may keep this filly to breed when her racing career is over. "I'm not really a breeder, so we'll race her and when she's finished, we'll see." Consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, the chestnut yearling is a half sister to multiple graded stakes winner Lead Story (Editor's Note) and to stakes winner Capejinsky (Cape Town). Gwenjinsky is a half sister to Breeders' Cup Distaff winner Unbridled Elaine (Unbridled's Song) and to Grade I winner Glitter Woman (Glitterman).

Saratoga Breezes:

The 2002 Horse of the Year Azeri (Jade Hunter), a determined winner of the GI Go for Wand H., cruised through a half in :49 3/5 over the Oklahoma track yesterday and remains on course for the GI Personal Ensign H. Aug. 27. "It was just a little maintenance breeze for her," said trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "Her energy level has been good since the Go for Wand." Lukas has not yet decided where Azeri will head after the 10-furlong Personal Ensign. "I don't know what's going to happen," he said when asked how the six-year-old would prepare for the Breeders' Cup. "I'm going to run her in the Personal Ensign and go from there. If we need one, we'll run, and if not, we won't."

Champion Funny Cide (Distorted Humor) zipped through a mile in 1:37 4/5 yesterday in preparation for next weekend's GII Saratoga Breeders' Cup H. Jockey Edgar Prado was aboard for the move. "I liked this work...with him very much," Prado said. "I wasn't looking at how fast he went--I was looking at the way he did it. He gets away well and is very relaxed. I let him come back to me and take me for the ride." Prado will likely sub for regular rider Jose Santos, who is sidelined with a hairline fracture in his right arm. Trainer Barclay Tagg was satisfied with the chestnut's breeze. "My goal was to have him work a mile in 1:40," he said. "Edgar let him do his own thing out there. Having Funny Cide finish the way he did this morning gives me an indication of where he's at -- he looked very good doing it."

Top Sprinters Face Off at the Spa:

Today's feature may be the \$65,000 Waya S. for turf distaffers, but the seventh race on the Saratoga card has drawn a graded-stakes caliber field. Badge of Silver (Silver Deputy) makes his first start since sustaining a foot injury when fifth as the 3-5 favorite in the GII General George H. Feb. 16. He will face Alke (Grand Slam), conqueror of Cajun Beat in the GIII Deputy Minister H. Feb. 7 before finishing second in the G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen. A quarter crack kept the four-year-old out of the GIII Smile Sprint H., but he's back on track now. "It took a couple of weeks before we got it straightened away," trainer Todd Pletcher told Daily Racing Form. Also in the field are graded stakes winner Multiple Choice (Mt. Livermore), claimed for \$100,000 in his last start July 24; the swift Midwestern sprinter Mountain General (Mountain Cat); and graded stakes winner New York Hero (Partner's Hero).

Quantum Merit Sidelined:

Perfect in three 2004 outings, including the GII Firecracker Breeders' Cup H. July 3, **Quantum Merit** (Hansel) has been sidelined with a minor tendon injury. "He doesn't know it's there," said trainer David Carroll, who had been hoping to run the five-year-old in the GI Arlington Million this weekend. "It's very minute." Carroll is trying alternative treatments for his charge. "We're investigating the stem-cell and a-cell treatments," he said. "That's progressive thinking. We have a one-week window to do it. You want to do it while the injury is still fresh."

Pleasant Breeze Back for Different Action:

Pleasant Breeze (Pleasant Tap) is back in trainer Jim Bond's barn, but is a stable pony these days after being retired from racing in the spring of 2003. Now nine, the dark bay earned over \$1.2 million and numbered the 2000 GII Saratoga Breeders' Cup H. among his 10 career victories for owner William Clifton. "He ran his last race in March of 2003," Bond said. "He had a tiny suspensory injury and Mr. Clifton said to me, 'Just give him a good home and I'll pay for him the rest of his life." But the gelding did not enjoy life on the farm. "He was kind of looking at the sky dazed, but you could tell he really wasn't happy," explained Bond, who went to check up on his charge after last year's Saratoga meet. "I was heading to Keeneland, and I spoke with Mr. Clifton and told him I'd like to make Pleasant Breeze a pony. He always had a good disposition. This horse will bow down for a person to get on his back."

The recent success of Peintre Celebre (Nureyev) in Europe has precluded the European Horse of the Year from shuttling to Coolmore Australia for a planned sixth Southern Hemisphere season. A late bloomer in Australia, where he is the sire of this year's G1 Western Australia Derby winner Mr. Sandrgroper (Aus) and G2 Silver Slipper S. winner Ballybleue (Aus), Peintre Celebre has gained momentum on the other side of the equator as the sire of G1 German Derby winner Dai Jin (GB), G1 Hong Kong International Vase winner Vallee Enchantee (Ire), GI Santa Anita Derby hero Castledale (Ire) and G1 Gran Criterium winner Pearl of Love (Ire). Coolmore Australia Manager Michael Kirwan told The Sydney Morning Herald, "Peintre Celebre has paid the price for siring four individual Group 1 winners in Europe during 2003. As a result, he served his biggest book of mares at Coolmore in Ireland earlier this year and it was decided that we give him a year off shuttling to Australia so as he can enjoy a well-earned rest." Kirwan said Peintre Celebre would definitely return to Australia in 2005. He joins High Chapparral (Ire) on the list of Coolmore's shuttle scratchings, but the stud still has the largest Australian roster with 17 stallions.

Australasian Report cont. A COMEBACK IN THE CARDS FOR NORTHERLY?

A tilt at a third G1 Cox Plate is not out of reach for nine-time Group 1 winner Northerly (Aus) (Serheed), who passed a critical fitness test at Belmont Park in Western Australia Wednesday. The eight-year-old gelding is nominated for the A\$3 million Cox Plate, set for Oct. 23, and may make a comeback to racing in Perth Aug. 28, more than a year after a tendon injury forced his retirement. Northerly has not been seen since finishing second to Freemason (Aus) in the G1 BMW S. at Rosehill in April 2003. He has A\$9.3 million in earnings with 19 wins and nine placings from 34 attempts, including victories in the 2001 and 2002 editions of the Cox Plate at Moonee Valley -- a track at which he is unbeaten. The Australian newspaper reported that Northerly trialed to the satisfaction of stewards on a track rated slow, clocking :49.50 for his last 800 meters and getting his final 600 meters in :37.45. "So far, so good; we are on a wing and a prayer," said trainer Fred Kersley. "He's got a few weeks to go before he is fit enough to go to the races." Northerly injured a near-fore tendon in training, but veterinarians said they detected no problems in the leg following his trial.
