He is untouchable in his own peer group, but the Niarchos Family's Bago (Fr) (Nashwan) has to do it against his elders when he faces the test of the generations in today's G1 Juddmonte International S. at York. Rated France's top juvenile by virtue of his easy scores

in the G3 Prix des Chenes at Longchamp in September and G1 Criterium International at Saint-Cloud in November, he was sidelined by a virus in the spring, but returned to beat Cacique (Ire) (Danehill) by three lengths in the G1 Prix Jean Prat at Chantilly June 6 before winning a stretchlong sprint against that

rival in the G1 Grand Prix de Paris at Longchamp last time June 27. "I'm very confident," jockey Thierry Gillet told PA Sport. "He worked well last Friday. My only hope is that we get a typically true-run British race. He's easy to ride. When you ask him to accelerate he accelerates--it's as simple as that." Despite his best form coming at a longer trip, Sulamani (Ire) (Hernando {Fr}) has always suggested he has the speed to cope with this trip, having shown impressive acceleration when promoted from second to first in the GI Arlington Million last year. More importantly, the rain has come in time for him as he struggled to cope with the prevalent fast ground when third in the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot last time July 24. He bids to provide Godolphin with their fourth renewal since 1995. Sir Michael Stoute has won this four times and relies on Kalaman (Ire) (Desert Prince {Ire}), who flopped when sent off the 15-8 pick in this race 12 months ago. He has been busy re-establishing his reputation with a troubled third in the G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown July 3 and success in the G2 Scottish Derby at Ayr last time July 19. His Highness the Aga Khan is also represented by Azamour (Ire) (Night Shift), who steps up in trip after placing in both the G1 English and Irish 2000 Guineas and winning the G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot last time June 15.

RULE OF LAW HEADS VOLTIGEUR

Rule of Law (Kingmambo) and Let the Lion Roar (GB) (Sadler's Wells) meet for the fourth time this term in today's G2 Great Voltigeur S. at York. The former has come out on top on all occasions, with 21/2 lengths separating the pair when second and third behind North Light (Ire) in the G2 Dante S. at this track May 12. They trailed that rival again when filling the same places in the G1 Epsom Derby S. June 5, when the margin shrunk to a head. They were fourth and fifth in the G1 Irish Derby at The Curragh last time June 27, where the fast ground played against Let the Lion Roar and connections will welcome the recent rain on the Knavesmire. While Rule of Law is looking to provide Godolphin with their third renewal since 1997, his chief rival will be attempting to end a 21-year drought for trainer John Dunlop after the exploits of Seymour Hicks (GB) in 1983. Sir Michael Stoute has won this race four times and relies on Always First (GB) (Barathea {Ire}), who finished third in a competitive Goodwood handicap last time July 28 and should appreciate this easier surface. Aidan O'Brien has saddled Milan (GB) and Powerscourt (GB) to win this since 2001 and his best chance may rest with Milan's half brother Go For Gold (Ire) (Machiavellian), runner-up to Maraahel (Ire) in the G3 Gordon S. at Goodwood last time July 27. 
When a new stallion achieves a yearling average of nearly \$330,000 and a median of \$255,000, expectations are bound to run high. But was it reasonable, I wondered, to expect instant success from this stallion, Fusaichi Pegasus?

Take a look at the facts. This magnificent Kentucky Derby winner--a big, rangy horse standing nearly 16.2 hands--made it to the track just once as a juvenile, on Dec. 11, when he was beaten a neck in a maiden special weight race at Hollywood. With only one juvenile start, Fusaichi Pegasus still did better than his sire Mr. Prospector, who suffered so badly from sore shins that his debut was delayed until the February of his sophomore season.

Admittedly, the first two generations of Fusaichi Pegasus' pedigree also contain some quicker-maturing individuals, but this precocity had often gone hand in hand with fragility. For example, the two-year-old careers of his grandsires Raise A Native and Danzig were over by midsummer. Raise A Native's was ended by a ruptured tendon sheath after he had blazed his way to four wins from as many starts, while Danzig came out of his impressive debut win in June with bone chips and didn't race again for over 10 months. Then there's Fusaichi Pegasus' dam Angel Fever. Described by her trainer Tony Reinstedler as "physically incorrect," this sister to the Preakness hero Pine Bluff easily won her debut June 27 but suffered a career-ending condylar fracture when second in the Colleen S. the following month.

The message to the trainers of Fusaichi Pegasus' first youngsters seemed to be "push them at your peril." To me, it seemed more sensible to follow the type of patient regime which Neil Drysdale employed with Fusaichi Pegasus himself. No doubt mindful that his colt had been the highest-priced yearling of 1998, at \$4,000,000, Drysdale gave him plenty of time to mature before asking him to race six times in the first five months of 2000.

The potential problem with this patient approach lies in the widespread tendency of trying to reach a verdict on a sire's ability well before all the evidence is in. It was consequently going to be very much in Fusaichi Pegasus' favor if several of his offspring could make their mark before the September Sales roll around. I'm pleased to say that this is happening and that my concerns appear to have been groundless. As many as 11 members of Fusaichi Pegasus' first crop have raced and no fewer than eight have won. (Pedigree Insights cont.)

Fusaichi Pegasus notched up his first stakes success at Woodbine at the end of July, when South Bay Cove collected nearly \$100,000 for trouncing her opponents in the Shady Well S. over five furlongs. Now his \$500,000 son Roman Ruler has become his first graded winner, thanks to his impressive display in the GII Best Pal S. over six furlongs. Interestingly, both these stakes winners are out of mares by quick-maturing sons of Deputy Minister, who packed nine starts and eight successes into his distinguished juvenile career. South Bay Cove is out of a Salt Lake mare, while Roman Ruler's dam Silvery Swan is by Silver Deputy. The other noteworthy trend among Fusaichi Pegasus' early winners is that two of them, the Irish winners In Excelsis and Wuthering Heights, are out of daughters of Seattle Slew, while the stakes-placed Killenaule is out of a mare by Seattle Slew's son Metfield.

Roman Ruler, who is now two for two, started his career as early as June. This isn't too surprising, as his broodmare sire Silver Deputy was another of those precociously talented performers whose constitution proved unequal to the associated strains and stresses. After easily winning his first start, he took the Swynford S. in early August, but wasn't able to race again. Silvery Swan's dam, the Quack mare Sociable Duck, was another talented two-year-old. She earned an Experimental Free Handicap rating of 110 through her second in the Spinaway S., but managed only two starts after the age of two.

Returning to the Well..

Fusaichi Pegasus must have been a reasonably easy choice as Silvery Swan's mate in 2001. She had already done very well with another stallion from the Mr. Prospector line, namely his grandson Mr. Greeley. Her first mating resulted in the eye-catching El Corredor, who lived up to his name, The Runner, by taking the Gl Cigar Mile H. in 2000 for Bob Baffert, who now trains Roman Ruler. Incidentally, it was El Corredor who chased home Fusaichi Pegasus when the Kentucky Derby winner returned to action in the Gll Jerome H. after a four-month layoff. That winning performance reads more impressively now than it probably did at the time, as he was giving seven pounds to El Corredor and four pounds to the third-placed Albert The Great, both of whom went on to Grade I success later in the year.

As Silver Deputy is out of a daughter of Mr. Prospector, El Corredor is inbred 3x4 to Mr. Prospector and Roman Ruler is inbred 2x4.

I don't know why Silvery Swan never raced. If she had a problem, it must have arisen early in her career, as she was covered in the April of her two-year-old season, conceiving El Corredor. She has built up a tremendous record, as she is still only 10 years old and Roman Ruler is her third graded winner, her second being Silver Tornado, a Grade III winner on turf by Maria's Mon. She now ranks as the most successful broodmare in recent generations of this family, but her stakes-winning half sister Seducer also has a 2004 graded winner to her credit in Seducer's Song. This Unbridled's Song filly took the GIII Lake George S. on turf earlier this month, so it could well pay to keep an eye on this family.



"Only the real good ones can overcome all those things," Baffert said of Roman Ruler. "He's one of the top horses I've had."

Millenary has to rate as one of the most consistent performers in training and he is emerging into one of the country's top stayers in the latter stages of his career. The 2000 G1 St Leger hero traded blows with the best in the business when going down by a short head to Persian Punch (Ire) in the G3 Jockey Club Cup at Newmarket in October on his first attempt at this trip. In the sad absence of that warrior, the staying division has opened up and Millenary was quick to stamp his authority when recording an impressive success in the G2 Yorkshire Cup at this track last time May 13. His main threat may come from the sole sophomore Duke Of Venice, who is let loose under a featherweight as he bids to return to the form which saw him run away with the two-mile G3 Queen's Vase at Royal Ascot June 18. He reportedly hated the undulations of Goodwood when a disappointing fifth in the G3 Gordon S. at Goodwood last time July 27 and should be more at home over this extended trip. First Charter may benefit from the step up from a mile and a half, having shaped like a stayer when taking the Listed Fred Archer S. at Newmarket June 26 and finished second in the Listed Glorious S. at Goodwood last time July 30.



These Days at The Jockey Club

Editor's Note: On Sunday, Aug. 15th, The Jockey Club hosted the 52nd annual Round Table Conference on Matters Pertaining to Racing in Saratoga Springs, NY. Following is a speech delivered by Alan Marzelli, the president of The Jockey Club, outlining the "Activities of The Jockey Club."

As always, we begin our report with the Registry...which is appropriate because maintaining the highest degree of integrity in the American Stud Book is our primary mission.

Given our August 1st deadline for submitting Reports of Mares Bred, we have traditionally announced the projected foal crop for the next year during this weekend. Keeping with that tradition, for 2005 we are projecting a North American registered foal crop of 37,200, the same as our 2004 foal crop estimate.

You've heard a lot about the technological advances we've instituted throughout our enterprise in recent years and none are more visible to owners and breeders than those in our registry.

Starting with the 2002 foal crop, all identification photographs of foals to be registered have been electronically stored. Although we encourage owners and breeders to submit digital photos, we also scan every printed photo we receive...to date, the database contains photographs of nearly 100,000 thoroughbred foals, allowing instantaneous access to their identification photographs.

The use of digital photos is just one feature of our internet-based Interactive Registration system, known as IR, that we unveiled in 1995. Over the years, IR has increasingly become the preferred medium for conducting business with the registry.

Today, more than half of all name claims, report of mares bred and live foal reports are submitted through IR.

The Jockey Club Information Systems continues to be one of our most successful commercial entities and one whose profits allow us to provide meaningful funding to so many industry initiatives—the most recent examples being the NTRA's Wagering Integrity Alliance and Racing Medication and Testing Consortium.

"equineline reports," which offers pedigree information, race records and sales reports, continues to be our flagship service, and in the past year we've added a number of new products and enhancements.

As one example, through an agreement we recently reached with racereplays.com, equineline customers will soon be able to watch video replays of races that have a hyperlink next to the past performance line we provide on individual race records...racereplays.com has current videos from every major racing circuit in the U.S., with archives for many tracks going back to '02.

Equibase Company, meanwhile, continues to host one of racing's most popular internet sites with traffic on *equibase.com* consistently enjoying double-digit growth year after year.

Interest in our two permission marketing-based programs, Virtual Stable and the Race Series Notification Service, also continue to experience double-digit growth, with subscriber lists that now total 98,000 and 51,000 respectively.

That's 98,000 fans who want to be notified immediately when the horses they are following have worked out, entered a race or run in a race...and 51,000 fans who want to follow the progress of the leading contenders on the Triple Crown trail or the Road to the Breeders' Cup World Thoroughbred Championships.

Earlier this year, when the Daily Racing Form changed ownership for the fourth time in the past 15 years, we were reminded of the importance of the decision we made in 1990: namely the creation an industry-owned database of racing information.

But rather than cause the TRA and its member racetracks to worry about the impact of a change in ownership on their ability to use their own information in support of their business, the sale of the Daily Racing Form to The Wicks Group was simply viewed by Equibase and its partners as an opportunity.

That's because in 1998, the previous owners and management team recognized that the industry should be the rightful owner of its racing data, and that a strong collaborative working relationship between Equibase and the Daily Racing Form was not only in the best interests of the two companies, but also in the best interest of the industry itself. The result was the license agreement that created, for the first time, a single, uniform, industry-owned database of racing information.



No one could have predicted a better outcome than the one we realized, best evidenced by the prominent placement of the Daily Racing Form logo on *equibase.com*, where fans can purchase electronic copies of "America's Turf Authority" tailored specifically to the tracks they are following.

A year ago, at this venue, we introduced the story of InCompass and the re-design of its legacy racing office systems into a suite of software applications that reside in a secure central server environment.

We began a gradual rollout of the new product line in the spring of '03 and estimated it would take three years to install the system across our entire customer base.

But the centralization approach was widely and quickly embraced and I'm happy to report that we now expect to complete the installation in just two years.

Meanwhile, our foundations continue to quietly serve the industry. The Jockey Club Foundation will provide approximately \$650,000 in assistance to needy individuals this year, and the Grayson-Jockey Club Research Foundation has approved more than \$850,000 to fund necessary ongoing research in 2004.

As always, The Jockey Club continues to be actively involved in a number of important industry initiatives...you'll hear presentations regarding two of them, the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium and the National Animal ID system, following this report. But I want to briefly mention two others...

In 1996, The Jockey Club was one of the leading organizations that helped to underwrite the cost of a National Economic Impact Study. The study estimated the total impact of the horse industry at \$112 billion annually and it has been a valuable tool in demonstrating the impact of the horse industry to our elected officials at both the state and federal level since then.

But that study is now severely outdated and an update is long overdue. So together with the American Horse Council, the NTRA, the American Quarter Horse Association and other organizations, we have recently commissioned Deloitte Consulting to do an even more in-depth study, including a breakout of the number of horses in each of the 50 states. This study will be released in February of 2005, and as with the previous study, we expect that the 2005 edition will prove to be a valuable resource for all industry stakeholders.

The Jockey Club has committed \$100,000 to the project and we are calling on others in the industry to step forward and join us. If you haven't done so already, we ask that you contact Jay Hickey at the American Horse Council and pledge your support.

The final industry initiative that I would like to briefly address was the focal point of last year's Round Table Conference. You may recall that in summarizing our views concerning the state of our wagering system, we said "the time has come for the industry to apply true virtual enterprise behavior using a centralized database methodology to racing's entire technology infrastructure, including our wagering systems."

Following that premise, a team of industry stake-holders, including representatives from Churchill Downs, Magna Entertainment, the New York Racing Association, The Jockey Club, the TRA, NTRA, AmTote, Scientific Games and United Tote have been working on this issue and have outlined a migration path toward a next-generation wagering system consisting of three basic concepts:

- The live host should control the wagering event
- Simulcast receiving sites should transmit wager details in real time to the live host...as opposed to the current practice of transmitting pool totals on a cycled delay; and
- Wagering transactions should be transmitted to-and stored in--a central database to provide the source data for real-time monitoring of suspicious activity and historical review.

As you can imagine, progress with issues this complex and a group this large comes slowly, as we strive to reach consensus on how best to achieve each of the three objectives outlined above.

While I am happy to report that every organization represented in our working group is committed to the project, I am also disappointed, for the sake of the industry, that progress has been slower than expected.

Yet the changing landscape in racing's overall business model that has caused us to experience the phenomenon of increasing revenues but decreasing contributions being paid back to the primary stakeholders—our horsemen and racetracks—has at its roots the same fundamental problem that surfaced on October 26, 2002...an aged technology infrastructure that prevents us from properly controlling and managing our business.

You will hear more about this subject in the second half of our program, but the message here is that the two issues—wagering security and the changing land-scape of our business are inextricably linked...and must be solved together.

If designed properly, the wagering system outlined above would not only provide enhanced security for the racing industry, it would also provide the necessary transparency that would ensure that host tracks know the source of all wagers being bet into their pools.

We appreciate the efforts extended thus far by each of the organizations working on this project, and ask them all to re-dedicate themselves in the months ahead to make our shared vision a reality.
