TURNING THE TIDE?

There has been much water under the bridge since Airwave (GB) (Air Express {Ire}) swept aside Russian Rhythm in the G1 Cheveley Park S. two years ago, but her time may have come around again as she lines up in the G1 Victor Chandler Nunthorpe S. at York today. Despite the fact that she proved herself to be one of the best sprinters around with placings in the G1 Golden Jubilee S., G1 July Cup and G1 Haydock Sprint Cup last term, she needed a confidence boost after that string of defeats. She got just that when taking the Listed Land o'Burns S. at Ayr last time July 19, where more positive tactics may have made the difference. "While we will still be looking to ride a bit of a waiting race, it will be from a handy position, and I think that's the best way to play it with her, especially over five furlongs." trainer Henry Candy told PA Sport. Soft ground conditions may be her undoing here, with Candy adding that he "would like the rain to stay away." That also applies to One Cool Cat (Storm Cat), who re-established his dented reputation with an impressive last-to-first success in the G3 Phoenix Sprint S. at The Curragh last Sunday. He has to overcome the most testing ground he has encountered and a drop back to five furlongs as he bids to provide Aidan O'Brien with his third success in this since 1999. Milton Bradley has similar concerns for last year's runner-up The Tatling (Ire) (Perugino), who has confirmed his liking for a fast surface this term when winning the G2 King's Stand S. at Royal Ascot June 15 and when third under a penalty behind Ringmoor Down (GB) in the G3 King George S. at Goodwood last time July 29. "The horse is really well, but I don't think the ground's going to suit," the conditioner told PA Sport. "If the ground had been on the fast side I would be very confident, but the going has put doubts in my mind." In contrast, Orientor (GB) (Inchinor {GB}) loves ease in the ground and proved what a smart performer he is when there is rain around when beating Ringmoor Down in impressive fashion in the G3 Sprint S. at Sandown July 3.

She took another giant leap forward here, traveling easily on the testing ground in mid-division before sweeping to the front outside the three-furlong marker and opening up. She may be bound for the G1 St Leger at Doncaster Sept. 11 now. "She didn't enjoy the fast ground in the Ribblesdale, but had worked nicely since. She is in the St Leger and also the G1 Prix Vermeille [at Longchamp Sept. 12] and the decision will be ground-driven." Luca Cumani was delighted with the performance of Pongee, who denied Hazarista (Ire) (Barathea {Ire}) the runner'sup spot in the closing stages. "She's very, very brave and has done nothing but improve," he said. The G2 Park Hill S. [at Doncaster Sept. 8] will be a consideration providing its not too soft."

Vermeille Target for Ouija...

Lord Derby's **Ouija Board (GB)** (Cape Cross {Ire}) was yesterday scratched from the G1 Yorkshire Oaks after overnight rain turned the ground to soft. After walking the track and absorbing the evidence from the first race, conditioner Ed Dunlop made the decision to withdraw the G1 English and Irish Oaks winner. "The jockeys are saying that it's heavy, so it's a risk we don't need to take," he explained. "The G1 Prix Vermeille [at Longchamp Sept. 12] is the next option."

The former chased home subsequent G1 Phoenix S. winner Damson (Ire) when second in the G2 Queen Mary S. at Royal Ascot June 16 before taking the G3 Princess Margaret S. back at that venue last time July 24. As a result, she has to give three pounds to Salsa Brava, who displayed a potent turn of acceleration on fast ground when a head runner-up to Jewel in the Sand (Ire) in the G2 Cherry Hinton S. at Newmarket July 6. Suez also gets the concession from Soar, but she has to cope with vastly different ground to that which she encountered on her debut when she was an impressive winner at Goodwood July 28.

Tony James had looked a smart prospect when winning a conditions event on his debut at Pontefract May 28 and performed with credit when attempting to make all before fading to fourth in the G2 Coventry S. at Royal Ascot June 15. He may have resented the fast ground when only fifth in the G2 Richmond S. at Goodwood last time July 7, but made the most of these easier conditions to cause the upset. Despite having to be niggled by Seb Sanders to keep tabs throughout the early stages, he soon worked his way to the heels of the leading group where he traveled with more comfort. Asked to lengthen approaching the final quarter, he responded in game fashion to head Abraxas Antelope with 250 yards remaining before asserting in the closing stages. "Mr. [trainer Clive] Brittain said 'if he acts on it, he'll win' and he did act better than the rest," Sanders explained. "They were all struggling on it at halfway and I was probably the only one that was really traveling." Brittain has ambitious plans for Tony James, which include a trip to Churchill Downs on the first Saturday in May 2005 for a tilt at the GI Kentucky Derby. AN EMBARRASSMENT OF RICHES

I don't know if this is what the Founding Fathers really had in mind. The Keeneland founding fathers, I mean, or at least the ones who founded the yearling sales. No fewer than 26 stallions have more yearlings catalogued (40 +) to Keeneland September than the size of a sire's entire foal crop back when Keeneland was founded. Twelve sires have 50 or more catalogued, and three Ashford sires have more than 60. You might remark, offhandedly, "a fellow can't have too many Grand Slams". One hopes not, because there are 80 of them catalogued for the September sale: that's surely a record. Giant's Causeway is not far behind, with 76, while High Yield has 65. That's not their whole foal crops, mind (at least, I don't think so), that's just the number they have selling in September. There will be hordes by many popular stallions, so one thing for certain is that the standard of first dams bred to all these horses cannot be that high.

Five of the 12 stallions with 50+ catalogued are in fact second-crop sires, meaning their first crops are two-year-olds this year. It's a myth that support for sires drops off immediately, after they've stood their first season; in fact, it happens after their second season. They are usually nearly as well supported in their second season as their first, as these listings demonstrate. Ashford's Fusaichi Pegasus (55) joins stablemates Giant's Causeway and High Yield in this particular over-50 club; Vinery's More Than Ready (53) and Lane's End's Lemon Drop Kid (52) are the other second-crop sires with 50 + catalogued in September. <u>Tiznow</u> has been making a big impression at the sales so far, and he'll have 52 more chances in September, less outs. His main market rival among sires with their first yearlings selling, Point Given, has 35 catalogued.

The three other \$20,000-plus (stud fee) stallions in this group are: Monarchos (27 catalogued); Aptitude (50); and El Corredor (49). El Corredor's sire, Mr. Greeley, has his first well-bred crop at the sales this year, and he is actually the leading non-Ashford sire, with 59 catalogued. The other sires with 50+ catalogued are a fifth Ashford representative, Tale of the Cat (52), along with Maria's Mon (the year after Monarchos, from his first crop, won the Kentucky Derby) and Silver Deputy, with 50 each.

But these 12 sires are just the tip of the iceberg. A phenomenal 158 stallions have 10 or more yearlings each catalogued to the September sale. Among them they account for 4,154 yearlings (about 26.3 yearlings each), over 80 percent of the catalogue. You would expect that sires with their first yearlings would have the biggest representation, but, surprisingly, they don't: 16 sires with first yearlings are among the 158, ranking this sire group behind sires with first two-year-olds (24), first four-year-olds (22), and first three-year-olds (17). That suggests there are actually quite a few promising young sires who have been coming along lately.

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a will denote a first-time Grade/Group 1 winner, a + will first-time starters.

The accompanying table lists the 158 sires with 10+ catalogued, plus a bit of pertinent data about each. It does just all seem a little staggering. Besides the 89 stallions from the last four sire crops just mentioned, there are an average of nine sires with 10+ catalogued from the three previous sire crops (first foals 1997, 1998, 1999); and, going back to sires whose first foals were born in 1985 (so they're 19, and these sires are all well into their twenties), there are an average of more than four sires per crop on this list for twelve consecutive sire crops, from 1985-1996. So the likes of Crafty Prospector (30), Deputy Minister (35), Diesis (15), and Runaway Groom (17) are all still well represented.

Here are two thought-provoking statistics: including 13 yearlings sired by Danzig (8), Kris S. (2), and Seattle Slew (3), 95 percent of the yearlings in Books 1 and 2 (the first four days) are sired by these 158 sires (161 counting the three just mentioned). Yet, as a group, only two of every seven yearlings catalogued by the 158 sires sells in Books 1 & 2. Even if you do have a yearling to sell by one of the 160 'right' sires, the odds are 5-2 against it selling before the first Saturday. I wonder what the multiple of sale price to stud fee is going to be from Book 3 on, compared to Books 1 and 2. I'll bet that particular gap is wider than ever this year. Text continues p7

One of the messages here is that there are surely going to be a lot of yearlings by perfectly respectable sires going begging in September. I pointed out how poorly <u>Gulch</u> sold at Saratoga; there are 38 by him catalogued in September. Deciding about stallions is going to be a very big part of the filtering process for most buyers, so there could well be some very shrewd buys made by those who unearth the perfectly good sires without a following right now.

One who will not fall into that category is <u>Dixie Union</u>. I saw three two-year-olds by him run in hot maiden races at Saratoga last week, for two wins and a third. There are 39 yearlings by him catalogued in September, and if he keeps going at this rate, they are going to be on everybody's list.

SOTO RETIRED Baron Georg von Ullman's Soto (Dehere--Subtle Fragrance, by Crafty Prospector), winner of the 2003 GIII West Virginia Derby, has been retired from racing. A \$50,000 Keeneland September yearling purchase, the chestnut was perfect in three starts as a two-year-old, capped by a victory in the GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. at Churchill Downs. Off nearly eight months thereafter, Soto returned to take a sixfurlong allowance at Philadelphia Park in 1:08 three weeks ahead of his neck victory over Dynever in the West Virginia Derby, in which Soto set a new track record of 1:46 1/5 for the nine-furlong distance. In what would become his final appearance, he was second, a half length behind Ten Most Wanted in the GII Super Derby last Sept. 20. A decision on his future is pending. "We have had a few offers for Soto to stand stud and a decision will be made by the end of the month," his trainer Michael Dickinson said yesterday. Soto retires with a record of 6-5-1-0 and earnings of \$666,164.

Veterinary surgeon Les Walters said the prognosis for such operations was generally poor. "It's very serious and quite often there can be ongoing problems after surgery. But he's a tough horse and we're confident with him," he said. Might And Power was on his way from NSW to make a guest appearance on Saturday at a Queensland country meeting. Might And Power won the 1997 Caulfield and Melbourne Cups before taking out the Cox Plate the following year earning him back-to-back Horse of the Year titles.
