It remains to be seen who is the perfect fit for the 14th running of the 10-furlong GI Pacific Classic at Del Mar this afternoon. Eight runners at level weights of 124 pounds will gather where the surf meets the turf, and it is Pleasantly Perfect who has earned the role of 6-5 morning-line favorite. The six-year-old lost the bob to Choctaw Nation last time out, but he was making his first

Pacific Classic cont. Better Than Perfect...

Trainer Richard Mandella believes his GI Breeders' Cup Classic hero will be tough to beat in his second start off the four-month layoff. "The [San Diego] did him good and tightened him up a little," Mandella told Daily Racing Form. "It took the edge off." Pleasantly Perfect was uncharacteristically close to the pace in his latest effort, dueling for the lead early and just failing to hold off the late charge of Choctaw Nation. "I jazzed him up--it was a mistake in training," Mandella continued. "[Pleasantly Perfect] needs to run his kind of race, sit back and make one run."

The Perfect Spot...

In his last two starts, Perfect Drift has faced Roses in May and come out on the losing end of the battle. The two first hooked up in the July 3 GIII Cornhusker Breeders' Cup H. at Prairie Meadows, with Perfect Drift sent

off the 4-5 favorite, but it was Roses

in May who hit the wire 1 1/2 lengths to the good. The fiveyear-old gelding made it closer in the Aug. 7 GI Whitney H. at Saratoga, but still was a nose shy at the wire. With Roses of May remaining on the East Coast, Perfect Drift is the second choice in the Pacific Classic. He shipped to Del Mar Tuesday and had his first look at the track Thursday morning. "He looked around a lot and took everything in," trainer Murray

Johnson said. "He liked the surface." Winless in five starts this year, Perfect Drift was also third behind Colonial Colony (Pleasant Colony) in the June 12 GI Stephen Foster H. and runner-up in the Apr. 30 Alysheba S., both at Churchill Downs. He bids for his first victory since taking the GII Hawthorne Gold Cup at a mile and a guarter last September.

A National Hero?

Claimed for \$40,000 from a maiden test at Santa Anita in February, Choctaw Nation guickly made his

way up the ladder, following his debut score with a tally over starter allowance company in March, then taking back-to-back optional claimers. Freshened after a 3/4-length success at Hollywood May 28, he was a 6-1 chance while making his stakes debut in the San Diego, but put in his patented late run

to take the photo from 3-5 Pleasantly Perfect, with During (Cherokee Run) another five lengths back in third. The four-year-old gelding stretches out to a mile and a quarter for the first time, but should handle the extra distance, as should Total Impact (Chi) (Stuka), who comes off a win in the July 10 GI Hollywood Gold Cup at the Classic route.

It's no surprise that **Society Selection** excels at Saratoga. Her sire, Coronado's Quest, captured the GI Travers S. in 1998, and she broke her maiden in her debut at the Spa last August. She made her second

start in the GI Frizette S. at
Belmont in October and won
again, but got a break after running 10th in the GI Breeders' Cup
Juvenile Fillies. The bay returned
to be third in the Feb. 7 GII
Davona Dale S. at Gulfstream

6 GII Bonnie Miss S. over that
track before returning to the winner's circle after the Apr. 9 GIII

"Horses with explosive runs going short usually don't get this far," trainer Allen Jerkens said. "She surprised me. Most of the things you do in this game turn out good by accident." Too much for the company at Delaware Park, Afleet Alex shipped to Saratoga after back to-back romps at his home base and made it three in a row with a 5 1/4length score in the July 29 GII Sanford S. Odds-on to remain undefeated yesterday, the bay was rated in the middle of the pack as Devils Disciple battled for the lead. Looking to get clear of the mud getting kicked back at them, jockey Jeremy Rose took his mount four wide on the far turn. The colt drifted wider still under a left-handed whip, but straightened it out in the final sixteenth and got up in the final jump. Looking ahead, trainer Tim Ritchey said, "We'll regroup to make sure he comes out of the race OK. The Futurity [GII at Belmont Park Sept. 19] is a possibility, but this race obviously took a lot out of him, so I might skip the Futurity and go for the Champagne [GI, Oct. 9]." A winner in two of her five starts while racing in France, Amorama closed willingly to be fourth in her U.S. debut, the GIII Miesque S. last November, then took a break. The dark bay came back to pick up checks in two stakes won by Ticker Tape at Santa Anita in March and April, then was third in the GIII Senorita S. at Hollywood, with Ticker Tape again ahead of her in second, in May. The French-bred miss followed that effort with a fifth in the June 5 GII Honeymoon Breeders' Cup S., where Ticker Tape was fourth, and filled that spot again as her nemesis captured the GI American Oaks as a 12-1 shot July 3. But Amorama finally managed to turn the tables with a faster pace here. The 19-1 shot trailed the field through six furlongs in 1:10.34 and had just one horse beaten at midstretch, but came flying in the final furlong to get her nose in front at the wire. "She's been an unlucky filly, but she's been working awesome in the mornings and I knew she was coming up to a big race," jockey David Flores said. Mister Monet has emerged as one of the season's major forces in a short span of time. Rated by trainer Mark Johnston as one of his best juveniles in 2003, the colt gave a glimpse of his ability when third behind One Cool Cat in a York maiden last June and broke through at Sandown the following month. Sidelined over a year thereafter, he was second in a Newmarket handicap July 8, took a Hamilton conditions event a week later and rattled over the fast ground to take a handicap at Ascot July 24. Well-supported to transfer that smart form to a higher level in the G3 Rose of Lancaster S. at Haydock Aug. 7, the bay defeated Mugbil by a deceptively easy 1 1/2-length margin and was favored to score his fourth straight victory. Always in control, he went right to the head of affairs, turned on the boosters approaching the final quarter and opened up lengths in a matter of strides. "He's a nice horse who couldn't make the Guineas this year because of problems with his fetlocks," Johnston said. "He is making up for lost time now. He will go for the G1 Champion S. She came back to win at that level, but raced erratically and was eased when trying the turf at Del Mar last August. The gray ended the season with a victory over open allowance company at Santa Anita in October, then disappeared for nearly eight months. An easy winner over optional claimers in her June 4 return, she was sent off at 9-1 in the July 10 GII A Gleam H. last time out and went gate to wire to score again. The evenmoney choice to run her record to six-for-seven on the dirt, Dream of Summer was head-and-head with Barbara Orr through the opening half, edged ahead at midstretch and dug in as that rival came back at her to take the photo. "She got a little hot in the paddock--she always does that," said 61-year-old trainer Juan Garcia, who was winning his first stakes at Del Mar. "It makes me nervous." But jockey Mike Smith was unconcerned. "She's like that every time--it's just her way," he said. "But she's game, and she's getting better and better. 





Birdstone (Grindstone), who has not been out since thwarting the Triple Crown bid of Smarty Jones in the June 5 GI Belmont S., had his final prep for the Midsummer Derby yesterday. The three-year-old went six furlongs in 1:13 4/5 over an Oklahoma training track labeled 'good' despite heavy overnight rains in Saratoga. Trainer Nick Zito was full of praise for track superintendent Jerry Porcelli. "Jerry did a great job," Zito said. "The track was in good shape and there was a nice cushion." As for Birdstone's breeze, he added, "He went in company with two horses. He needed that. Everything has gone well." He's run extremely well fresh all his life."

Also prepping for the Travers, **Suave** (A.P. Indy) went six furlongs in 1:18 4/5 over a sloppy strip at Churchill Downs. "We just wanted to pump some wind into him before sending him to Saratoga," trainer Paul McGee said. "At the same time, we didn't want to take anything out of him. I thought he did it nice and easy and galloped strong for the last quarter." The colt comes off a second-place finish in the July 10 GII Swaps Breeders' Cup S. at Hollywood Park.

Sanan, who recently launched the Alliance for Industry Reform in an attempt encourage regulation of the bloodstock industry, said that he is pleased that the major auction houses in Central Kentucky, Keeneland and Fasig-Tipton, have indicated their willingness to participate in a task force to develop a code of ethics. "I want to see what the next task force meeting is all about, who actually is in the task force, what the agenda and timeframes are and whether we are moving in the right direction," Sanan told the Form. "If we are, then I have no reason not to go to the sales."
