"She is all class," trainer Pascal Bary said. "She is guite exceptional and can quicken on all types of ground. She has such a fluent action that she travels with great ease and that makes it easy for her." Officials at Deauville were forced to declare yesterday's G3 Prix de la Nonette void after three riders raced on despite a false start. **Shapira (Ger)** (Kornado {GB}) led home **Polyfirst (Fr)** (Poliglote {GB}) and **Green Swallow (Fr)** (Green Tune), but, after the race, jockeys Jiri Palik, Olivier Peslier and Jamie Spencer discovered that the remainder of the field had pulled up because one on the stalls had opened slower than the others. The race has been rescheduled for either Friday or Sunday of next week's meeting. France Galop's General Manager Louis Romanet explained, "We had no choice than to cancel, as we had to take into account the betting interests of the public." The three jockeys who continued to race in were suspended for four days and fined €1,000 each.

Stepping out onto the national stage in a big way last fall, Pleasantly Perfect built off a victory in the GII Goodwood Breeders' Cup H. to stage the 14-1 upset in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. A three-month break did nothing to dull his edge and he came back to win the GII San Antonio H. by four lengths in late January, then



shipped to Dubai to win the World Cup in impressive fashion. Off until the Aug. 1 GII San Diego H., he placed second there, a result that didn't sit well with trainer Richard Mandella. "I've been eating my heart out for the last three weeks because

The six-year-old veteran Evening Attire proved he still has what it takes to compete at the top level with a compelling five-length victory over the popular Funny Cide in yesterday's feature at Saratoga. The gray, winner of the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup in 2002, finished second to last year's Kentucky Derby winner in the Apr. 3 GIII Excelsior Breeders' Cup H. at the Big A, then was a well-beaten second to Midway Road in the GIII Ben Ali S. at Keeneland 19 days later. A fourth in the May 14 Pimlico Special and a fifth in the June 19 GII Massachusetts H. ensured healthy 7-1 odds this time, but Evening Attire looked the consummate pro winning for the first time since taking a Saratoga allowance last August. The gelding was content to sit off the leaders as crowd's choice Funny Cide pressed the pace wide into the first turn, then swept into contention on the far turn. A dead-game Funny Cide locked horns with Bowman's Band turning for home, but neither could mount a challenge to the hard-charging Evening Attire. "It's been kind of a dry spell with him, but he's always run hard and he's had some trips that have been unbelievable." said winning trainer Pat Kelly. "We won't run in the [Sept. 11, GI] Woodward S. I guess we'll think about the [Oct. 2, GI] Jockey Club Gold Cup again if we can get it cold or rainy or snowy or something." Whortleberry gained the rewards for all her hard work in competitive fillies' contests when winning the G3 Prix Minerve at this track last August. She finished fifth in the G1 Prix Vermeille at Longchamp the following month before going down by a nose when runner-up in the G2 Prix de Royallieu back at that track in October. She rounded off her campaign by taking the G2 Premio Lydia Tesio in Rome and may have needed her return outing when fourth in the G3 Prix d'Hedouville at Longchamp May 6. She performed with credit under a penalty when fourth in the G2 Prix Corrida at Saint-Cloud May 31 before a disappointing sixth in the G2 Prix de Pomone at this venue last time Aug. 7. A 10-1 shot this time, she was settled in a stalking third throughout the early stages of this contest, quickened through the mud at the top of the straight to head Chorist at the eight pole and asserted in the closing stages. "Last time, she couldn't keep up with the pace, so we worked her in blinkers and she worked well," trainer Francois Rohaut explained. "The softer ground was the key factor. Given a 4-1 chance to take in his graded debut, the big son of the late Kris S. was off slowly and had only one horse beaten after the first quarter. As Metatron (Silver Ghost) continued to zip along on the front end over a sloppy surface, Adreamisborn employed his long stride to move into contention. Consigned by Patrick Chedeville's Haras du Petit Tellier, the Irish-bred halfbrother to dual Group 1 winner Vespone (Ire) and Group 3 winner La Sylphide (Swi) was purchased by Demi O'Byrne, agent for Coolmore. He is from the family of Group 1 winners Vallee Enchantee (Ire), Volga (Ire) and Vin de France. David O'Loughlin, representing Coolmore, said, "He was the big, scopey type of horse we like to buy, with a lovely pedigree, and he should be a nice three-year- old. The fact that he is by Galileo is important to us, as he is one of our most promising young stallions, so we want to buy the best products. It won't be decided until November, but in all probability he'll go to Ireland and will be trained by either Aidan O'Brien or David Wachman." Consignor Chedeville was more than pleased with the sale. "I am very happy," he said. "The horse's owner was very realistic about the reserve price and the colt's quality has made the difference. This was not a foal sharing and it shows how well Coolmore supports its stallions." He added, "The market seems to be very sane, there are buyers with money to spend. It might be that the market will rise again and that is probably good news for the French breeders who make big efforts and deserve it." Galileo was also responsible for the day's co-top selling filly, which brought €400,000. The Coolmore resident had seven go through the ring, bringing an aggregate of €1,395,000 and an average of €199,285.

English agent Hubie de Burgh went to €450,000 for the evening's second-best selling yearling, a son of Anabaa--Style for Life (Ire) (Law Society) consigned by Haras de la Reboursiere et de Montaigu. A half-brother to Group 1 winner Night Style (Fr), he is from the family of 2004 G1 Irish Derby winner Grey Swallow (Ire). "First of all, this was a very good looking individual with a sire pedigree from a very active family, and he is by Anabaa, a sire that I rate very highly," de Burgh said. "I bought the horse for Richard Barnes of the Bahamas--he campaigned Group 3 winner Steel Princess (Ire) this year in France with trainer Richard Gibson, who will also handle that colt. Mr Barnes has recently established Grangecon Stud in Ireland and he intends to build an elite broodmare band." Aliette Forien of Haras de La Reboursiere et de Montaigu, remarked, "This was an exceptional animal and I am happy with the price. His sister sold for €420,000 last year at the same sale." Forein added, "The sale has started quite well, there are no holes in the market and it is most encouraging. You can see that the potential buyers are there and that they really want to buy."

Two for the Home Team...

A filly by the great Sadler's Wells out of Sister Dot (Secretariat) was the first to warm up the crowd at Deauville, bringing a bid of €400,000 from French agent Frederique Sauque. Consigned by Haras d'Etreham, the bay is a half-sister to American champion Dehere (Deputy Minister). Her full brother, now named Winter Palace (Ire), topped last year's Deauville sale at \in 900,000. Saugue was back later in the evening, securing a filly by Galileo (Ire) for €400,000. From the Pegasus Farms Ltd consignment, the yearling is out of Altana (Mountain Cat), a half-sister to GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner Arcangues from the family of Aquarelliste (Fr) and Cape Verdi (Ire). "I have bought both for the same man, a Swiss client of mine," Saque said. "Both were bought for the same reasons, a great female family, and both are good individuals. The first one is by Sadler's Wells and there is no risk there, and I believe strongly in Galileo as a sire, he has all the right credentials. Both will race in France and will be bred after their racing career, but it has not yet been decided who will train. At this time, they head to the Haras de Victot to spend six weeks in the paddocks."

A Solid Start...

With the Agence Francaise conducting its traditional August yearling sale under a new four-day format for the first time, it was difficult to compare yesterday's first session with the 2003 opener. The complete results will tell the story when the sale comes to a conclusion on Wednesday. But, with 80 yearlings catalogued yesterday, compared to only 60 on the first day last year, the market looked quite solid. There was a lot of international activity Sunday evening, with active buyers from England, Ireland, Japan, Italy, Germany, Hong Kong and the U.S. But domestic demand was also very strong, with French agents or trainers buying 31 lots, almost half of the horses selling."It has been a very active and consistent market throughout the evening," said Philippe Augier, president of Agence Francaise de Vente du Pur Sang. "I noticed that a lot of different buyers have been active, foreign and domestic." He added, "It is too early to say what the influence of the new format is. Let's wait until [Monday evening's] session, when the figures will then be comparable to last year's first three days."



Philly Park's Cotillion next for Ashado?

Trainer Todd Pletcher, whose Ashado (Saint Ballado) was in fine fettle following her third-place effort in Saturday's GI Alabama S., is considering the Oct. 2 GII Cotillion H. at Philadelphia Park for his star sophomore. Though the race, restricted to three-year-old fillies, may not be considered a typical stepping stone toward the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff--Ashado's ultimate target this season--Pletcher likes where the event falls on the calendar. "When you are looking at the Breeders' Cup, you want to put your horse on a nice schedule," explained Pletcher. "For the three-year-old fillies, it leaves you in a bad spot. If you come back in the [Sept. 11, GI] Gazelle H., it's too close to the Alabama and too far away from the Breeders' Cup. The [Sept. 18, GI] Ruffian H. is a week later and you're stuck in the middle, again. If you wait for the [Oct. 9, GI] Beldame S., it's 21 days before the Breeders' Cup and that's not an ideal spot, either. The Cotillion is the only thing I see. It's four weeks before the Breeders' Cup. It's the only race for three-year-old fillies that is in the right spot."

Midas Eyes Returns:

Midas Eyes (Touch Gold) makes his return in the seventh race at Saratoga Wednesday. The four-year-old faces five rivals as the 4-5 morning-line favorite in the \$51,000 allowance test at 6 1/2 furlongs. He captured the GIII Swale S. by 9 1/4 lengths at Gulfstream last March, but has not visited the winner's circle since taking the GIII Derby Trial last May. Eighth in the Oct. 25 GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, the Florida-bred bay finished second in the GI Cigar Mile H. in November and third in the GI Malibu S. in December, but has not been out since running fourth in the Feb. 7 GII Strub S. at Santa Anita.


