GRAND LODGE COLT TOPS DEAUVILLE

A son of Grand Lodge attracted a sales-topping final bid of €700,000 from bloodstock agent Richard O'Gorman during yesterday's second session of L'Agence Française's Deauville August Yearling sale. The beautiful chestnut yearling, sold as lot 220, was consigned by his breeder, Le Haras de Bois Carrouges. He is out of Native Twine (GB) (Be My Native) and is a half brother to the good three-year-old Tahreeb (Fr) (Indian Ridge {Ire}), who won the Listed Heron S. at Newmarket, as well as the G3 Grosser Preis Der Dortmunder Wirtschaft. O'Gorman was standing next to English trainer John Gosden during a furious bidding battle with eventual underbidder Robert Nataf. O'Gorman would not reveal who he had bought the yearling for. "I cannot say at this time who I bought the horse for, nor have we decided who will train him, but it will be in Newmarket," O'Gorman explained. "He was my pick of the sale and I didn't bid on any other, I just concentrated on trying to buy him. He is a precocious type and the spitting image of Superlative (Ire), a top horse that my brother trained. I really liked him and I really wanted him." The sale-topping price tag was just what consigner Florent Couturier had been expecting. "I knew this horse had the looks and the potential to sell well," Couturier said. "He is a great mover, by a top sire and the brother to a useful group performer and, with two parties really keen to buy the horse, the sale turned out to be exceptional. I own the mare and I have been breeding for 40 years with more downs than ups and it is a great reward to our passion and dedication to the horses for me and everyone working on the farm. I had a foal-sharing with Coolmore and they did bid on the horse, but I think that Sheikh Mohammed has bought the horse." Cont. p. 2

Peter Doyle was in action on lot 89, a Red Ransom colt out of Bielska (Deposit Ticket), and a three-parts brother to GII E.P. Taylor winner Wandering Star, from the family of top sire Silver Hawk. The yearling fetched €320,000, the joint second best price on the day for a colt. The Irish bloodstock agent was also responsible for the top filly on the day, lot 227, a Danehill half sister to Group 1 winner Owington (GB) purchased for €480,000. The yearling filly was consigned by Eric Puerari's Haras des Capucines. "I am very happy with the sale of the Danehill filly in particular and with all my sales in general," Puerari said. "She was beautiful and her pedigree matched her looks."

Over the Moon...

Anthony Stroud took center stage when buying the third top filly on the day, lot 98, by Anabaa out of the unraced mare China Moon (Gone West), herself a sister to multiple Group 1 winner Matiara and to Group 2 winner Marathon. The English bloodstock agent was quite keen on his purchase. "She is a very attractive filly with nice conformation and by a top proven sire," Stroud explained. "Her family is also very nice and she is a racey type. She goes in training with Andre Fabre."

Anabaa Again...

Lot 109 was another star during Monday's second session. The colt, by Anabaa, is a half brother to this year's French Derby winner Blue Canari (Fr). Trainer Robert Collet had the last word on the yearling at €320,000, making the bay the co-second top-priced colt on the day. Collet hopes his new purchase follows in the footsteps of dual Group 1 winner Whipper, who the trainer bought at this sale in 2002. "This is a real nice colt that I liked a lot and from a great family," Collet said. "I have orders and I buy even though I find it sometimes difficult as some horses are expensive in a strong market. I don't train jumpers any more and I want to concentrate on upgrading the quality of my flat runners, even though I cannot complain this year. I feel Deauville is a good place to buy quality horses, and once my shopping is finished here, I will attend other sales."

(More from Deauville) Quick to Invest Again...

Owner Jean-Louis Bouchard, who won his fourth French Derby in 10 years in June with Blue Canari, whom he purchased at this sale in 2002 through bloodstock agent Gerard Larrieu, was quick to reinvest the money. Larrieu has bought Bouchard six yearlings so far in the sale's first two days for a total of €775 000 and explains, "Mr. Bouchard loves racing and loves Deauville. He wanted some juveniles for next season. This sale is strong, there is a large choice of horses and the market is selective. Mr. Bouchard had a lot of success with horses he bought in Deauville, including two French Derby winners, and he is keen to buy here. We have been fortunate enough to get the horses we really liked. I feared to have to buy others than our first choice as Mr. Bouchard really wanted horses from the Deauville Sale and I don't think we would have attended an other sale in Europe to buy."

Figures After Day Two...

L'Agence Française has sold 190 yearlings over the first two days of this year's auction, for a total of €21,910,000. The average rose by eight percent from €106,857 in 2003 to €115,316 this year. The clearance rate rose to 80.17 percent against 77.78 percent a year ago. According to L'Agence Française President Phillippe Augier, "We can be most satisfied with the figures and the new format of the sale which seems to be a good option at this time. Our target was for all major international buyers to remain in Deauville and they have done so. Never in the past would you have seen the sale topper on the Monday. The market has been very active, especially on a long day of sale. The percentage of horses sold remains high and that is another satisfactory point." The Deauville sale, one day shorter than in previous years, continues today at 5:30 p.m. with a final session on Wednesday.

"It went well and it was pretty much what we were looking for," trainer Todd Pletcher said after the work. "His race in the Jim Dandy was an exceptional race. In a perfect world, we would have another couple of weeks. But I'm not the only one feeling that way. It looks like all the main players are coming back under similar rest."

I'm hoping the race sets up like this workout, where he has something to run at. If he runs the last half-mile like he did this morning, he'll be fine for the mile and a quarter."

All three of these stallions succeeded in siring winners of the Arc and they collectively have so many descendants throughout Europe that breeders have every opportunity to inbreed to Northern Dancer and Special, if they so wish.

There has already been a trickle of group winners with Sadler's Wells in the top half of their pedigree and Nureyev in the bottom, including Well Being, La Sylphide, Trumbaka and Puppeteer. The reverse cross, Nureyev on top and Sadler's Wells on the bottom, is also showing up, a good example being Carry On Katie, last year's winner of the G1 Cheveley Park S. She has a Sadler's Wells mare as her second dam and her sire is Nureyev's son Fasliyev, who has also sired a stakes winner from a Fairy King mare. However, the biggest incentive for doubling up on Northern Dancer and Special is being provided by Kingmambo and his brother Miesque's Son, who are out of Nureyev's magnificent daughter Miesque.

A poorly performed daughter of Sadler's Wells visited Kingmambo in his first year at Lane's End Farm and highlighted the potential of this cross by producing the exceptional Japanese horse El Condor Pasa, who earned a very high Timeform rating of 136 after his transfer to France in 1999.

Inevitably, plenty of other Sadler's Wells mares have since headed to Kingmambo's door, including the Niarchos Family's Myth To Reality. She visited the French 2000 Guineas winner in 2001, with a foal at foot by Miesque's Son. Bearing in mind that the Miesque's Son colt, Whipper, sold for only \$4,000 as a weanling, it is almost unbelievable that these visits resulted in foals which, in the space of eight days, have collected two Group 1 contests at the highly competitive Deauville meeting. Whipper took the Prix Jacques le Marois almost a year after his shock success in the Prix Morny and now this year's Prix Morny has extended the unbeaten run of Myth To Reality's Kingmambo filly Divine Proportions. This pair are inbred 4x3 to Northern Dancer and 4x4 to Special.

Incidentally, Miesque suffered one of her rare defeats in the 1986 Prix Morny, but went on to win two runnings of the Jacques le Marois, a race which has also been won by her daughter East of the Moon. Kingmambo was beaten only a head and a neck in the 1993 contest and last year's winner Six Perfections is out of Miesque's half sister Yogya. No wonder the Niarchos family is happy to sponsor this contest in the name of their French stud, Haras de Fresnay-Le-Buffard.

As a group winner over five, 5 1/2 and six furlongs, Divine Proportions obviously possesses plenty of speed, but there is no reason why she shouldn't stay well enough to become a contender for next year's Jacques le Marois.

For a start, Kingmambo has been represented this year by King Kamehameha, winner of the Japanese Derby, and Rule Of Law, whose victory in last week's G2 Great Voltigeur S. made him one of the favorites for the St Leger.

Then there's Myth To Reality's stamina-packed background. She gained two of her three stakes wins over a 1 1/2 miles and her brother Casamasa stayed even better, being group-placed at up to 1 7/8 miles. Myth to Reality's earlier visits to Kingmambo resulted in Indigo Myth, a talented performer at up to 1 1/2 miles, and Mambo Jambo, whose daughter Ocean Silk was Group 1-placed at 1 1/2 miles.

As you might expect of a filly bred by Flaxman Holdings, Divine Proportions comes from a family which has done very well in recent generations. It was a rather different story 30 years ago, when her third dam Hardiemma visited the brilliant Mill Reef. Hardiemma had been an ordinary racemare, a winner of two small races in Scotland, and it cost only 9,000gns to buy this daughter of the none-too-successful Hardicanute at the end of her racing career. Her price rose to 12,000gns a year later when Lord Halifax, a shareholder in Mill Reef, bought her as an in-foal four-year-old. Her main distinction was that her second dam, Blue Cross, was a three-parts sister to a high-class miler called King's Bench.

Lord Halifax used his Mill Reef season on the seemingly undeserving Hardiemma and his boldness was rewarded with the dual 1978 Derby winner Shirley Heights, who was to prove a major asset to Britain's breeding industry. Lord Halifax had sold Hardiemma, again in foal to Mill Reef, for only 15,000gns in 1976. This time she produced a filly, Millieme, who was recruited to the Niarchos empire at a cost of 250,000gns after Shirley Heights' classic victories.

Mill Reef has also played his part in some of this family's other major successes. Um Lardaff, a sister to Millieme and Shirley Heights, is the second dam of the Group 2 winners Miletrian and Mr Combustible. Mill Reef also did well when he was mated with Hardiemma's slow daughter Bempton, siring the G2 Ribblesdale S. winner Gull Nook, who in turn produced Pentire, winner of the 1996 King George.

Divine Proportions' dam Myth To Reality is a reminder that by no means all good broodmares are at their most effective in the first flush of youth. Whipper and Divine Proportions are comfortably her best representatives (although she has also produced the useful Assos) and she produced them at the ages of 15 and 16.

She is the main contributor to Sadler's Wells' fine 2004 record as a broodmare sire. Other daughters of the Coolmore champion have produced American Post, winner of the French 2000 Guineas, and Musical Chimes, winner of the GI John C. Mabee H. It was another Sadler's Wells mare who produced the outstanding Arc winner Sakhee for Sheikh Hamdan. Needless to say, Sheikh Hamdan is now testing the water by sending him a few mares with Nureyev blood, including two winning daughters of Nureyev's Irish 1000 Guineas winner Mehthaaf.

As I said earlier, be prepared for plenty more good winners inbred to both Northern Dancer and Special.
