

STILL ACTIVE AT DEAUVILLE AUGUST

The quality of the catalogue for Part II of the Deauville August Yearling Sale was not as strong as that of the first two days, but bidding was still very active yesterday, with an impressive 72.6 percent of the horses finding new homes. British bloodstock agent Charlie Gordon Watson, the leading buyer at the sale so far, secured the top lot on the day, going to \in 170,000 for a magnificent-looking chestnut son of Acatenango (Ger) from the consignment of Pegasus Farms Ltd. The colt's second dam is Dial Dream (Ire), a sister to the top racehorse and sire Al Nasr (Fr) (Lyphard) and to top miler Kingsalsa (Kingmambo). "I am very happy," said Pegasus Farms' Herve Barjot. "He was just outstanding and there has been a lot of interest surrounding him all day long. He has been bought by a great professional and that says it all." Barjot was also an active bidder, buying a colt by first-crop sire Galileo (Ire) for \in 130,000. The second best-selling lot on the evening, the grey, consigned by Haras d'Etreham, is out of winner Souvenir Souvenir (GB), herself a half sister to Group 3 winner Comillas (Fr) and to the dam of Group 1 winner Rouvres (Fr).

:46 4/5, the best of 45 at the distance. Biacone believes that his charge will relish the seven-furlong distance, having raced at six furlongs in his last two. "We have believed for a long time that he will be better at seven furlongs than six," said Biancone. "Last time, he ran a good race and he will be perfect Saturday."

What They're Saying At The Sales...

Herve Barjot of Pegasus Stud Farms Ltd:

"The market is more and more selective and it shows just how important it is to consign French-bred horses. Most of the horses sold here are to stay in training in France and people are really interested in the owners' premiums. When a horse is not French-bred and not perfect and bound to criticism, it is hard to sell. Personally, except for the horse that topped the sale today, I didn't have a great consignment and I cannot complain. We also need more domestic buyers, and I don't think that the new format is the best solution. I think it would work better if all the horses were mixed together and sold over three days. People would stay for the quality horse they wanted."

Philippe Augier, president of the Agence Francaise:

"We are very happy with the sale. It is a great satisfaction to see that the new format works well and that people from abroad are still here. We cannot compare really with the Tuesday session of last year, but the gross, the average and the clearance rate are excellent. Maybe next year we will think about selling on Monday morning, as we finished very late on Monday evening. We shall think about it."





Silverskaya defied a five-pound penalty to revive her fortunes after a disappointing effort in the G2 Prix de Malleret at Saint-Cloud last time July 4. She had entered that contest unbeaten on the back of a smooth success in the G3 Prix de Royaumont at Chantilly June 5, but could make no impression and finished seventh. Held up in rear by loritz Mendizabal throughout the early stages of this contest, she unleashed her potent turn of acceleration to head Reverie Solitaire with 100 yards remaining and assert for the score. "That was a really good performance considering the ground and the fact that she was giving weight away," commented trainer Jean-Claude Rouget. "Last time she was in season, which explains her poor run, so we will have to be careful with that in mind in future. This race had received a blow with the scratching of Latice (Ire) and the well-documented false start on Sunday, but Grey Lilas injected some class into proceedings in her easiest racecourse outing thus far. This emaciated affair was simply a picnic for the grey after her efforts when second in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches (French 1000 Guineas) at Longchamp May 16 and third in the G1 Prix de Diane Hermes (French Oaks) at Chantilly last time June 13. Taken straight to the front by Gary Stevens, she set a funereal crawl as her rivals were content to race in single file in her slipstream. That is where they remained as she quickened clear in the final quarter to win unextended. "She has already proven her class and she won nicely," commented Crispin de Moubray, representing Gestut Ammerland. STEVENS TO LEAVE FRANCE Jockey Gary Stevens has packed his tack and is due to return to the U.S. in the next few days. Stevens finished fourth



aboard Diamond Tango (Fr) to finish fourth in yesterday's G3 Prix Minerve at Deauville, then bade farewell to his colleagues in the weighing room. He had earlier been successful aboard Grey Lilas (Ire) in the rescheduled G3 Prix de la Nonette. Prior to leaving the track, he said, "I am leaving France on excellent terms with [trainer] Andre Fabre, [but] the results have been disappointing for both of us. Maybe it's Gary Stevens Benoit Photo my fault, I don't know, but it's the

decision I have made. I have agreed to take part in a talk show in America and I've also been contacted to act in a new movie by the end of the year. In the meantime, I will continue riding in California and my agent is already looking for rides. I'm also looking forward to picking up some rides at the Breeders' Cup." Stevens has ridden 55 winners in France this year during a campaign highlighted by the success of Somnus (GB) in the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest at Deauville.

BC CLASSIC A POSSIBILITY FOR AZERI Azeri

(Jade Hunter), who has been a powerful force on the racing scene over the past three seasons, will get another chance to prove her dominance over fillies and

But according to owner Michael Paulson, if everything goes right, the six-year-old will either try for a second victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff, which she won in 2002, or she may venture into unchartered territory and face the boys in the 10-

furlong Classic. Although Paulson indicated that the Classic remains an 'option' for the 2002 Horse of the Year, he was reluctant to confirm the plan until after the Personal Ensign, which will be contested over the Classic distance. "We will take it one race at a time, but for now, we have to wait and see how she takes to 1 1/4 miles." Azeri, who is the winner of 13 of 16 starts going further than a mile, has never tried Friday's distance, but according to Paulson, that won't pose a problem for the chestnut. "Obviously, at 1 1/8 miles she is a tiger, but we believe that she has the legs to go on and do 1 1/4 miles." Following the Personal Ensign, Azeri is likely to contest the GI Overbrook Spinster S. at Keeneland Oct. 10 before another appearance on Breeders' Cup day, which Paulson hopes will boost Azeri to even greater heights. "We hope to get her another championship this year," he admitted. "All the races that we are trying to pick from here until the Breeders' Cup, that is always at the back of our minds." If mare continues to dominate, as she did in her latest victory over Sightseek in the GI Go For Wand H. Aug. 1, will the champion make another go of it in 2005? "I don't want to close any doors," he said. "But I think after this year, she will be retired. If she races really well, maybe she will race in a couple of races early next year, but most likely she will be retired."

MARKET LEVELS

Not all sales companies have achieved as seamless a transition from a 'select' to a 'best available' marketplace as the Agence Francaise has done this week with their Deauville August yearling sale. In previous years that had been two select sessions, Saturday and Sunday evenings after racing, plus an all-day 'near-select' Monday session. This year it was all combined, once through the alphabet, beginning with an evening session Sunday night, and continuing through an even longer all-day session Monday. But it worked a treat, and by the end of Monday's session, the comparison made sense: last year, in the three sessions combined, 196 yearlings sold (78 percent of the 252 through the ring), for a total of \in 20,944,000, and an average of \in 106,857. This year, in the two sessions, 190 yearlings sold (80 percent of the 237 through the ring), grossing \in 21,910,000, and averaging \in 115,316. The number sold was down 3 percent, the gross up 5 percent, and the average up 8 percent. When you consider the two major Fasig sales, in Kentucky and Saratoga, saw 7 percent more horses sold for 10 percent more money and a 3 percent higher average, the Deauville results look very much in line. After the first \$100 million spent at the first three major sales, basically, it's single-digit increases after big gains last year--which is fine.

Dual Breeders' Cup Classic winner Tiznow and dual Classic winner Point Given head up the American sires whose first yearlings are appearing in the marketplace this year, and Deauville marked the yearling sale debut of Europe's big guns for 2004, Coolmore's dual Derby winner and European 3-year-old champion Galileo (Ire), and Darley's six-time G1 winner Fantastic Light. They were pretty close together as racehorses, and they started out pretty close together in yearling average, too--though from vastly different representation. Fantastic Light had just three yearlings presented in Deauville's two 'better' sessions; all three sold, averaging \in 180,667. Galileo, on the other hand, had 13 through the ring, of which 12 sold, averaging \in 181,250. So, after Round 1, Galileo's average is three-tenths of a percent higher than Fantastic Light's. That will be a commercial rivalry worth following.

The three major sales covered so far--Fasig July, Saratoga, and Deauville's first two days--have all had six-figure averages, and, as I say, the indications are that single-digit increases will likely be order of the day for the major yearling sales season. But, a little lower down the scale, there were big double-digit increases Monday in Ocala's opening select session. True, they sent 12 percent more through the ring, but even so, the number sold was up by 23 percent (144 to 177), the gross was up a whopping 45 percent, and the average increased 18 percent, from \$44,215 to \$52,271. If the top holds basically steady and the 'good' middle sells like this, it'll be a great sales season, because it will mean these types of horses will start to 'fill in' behind last year's big increases at the top. Results like Ocala's Monday session could be very good news if they're repeated in September in Keeneland's sessions of comparable levels. In other words, if Books 1-2 are up 10 percent, but the rest is up 20 percent, even better. Interestingly, too, all eight horses which sold for \$140,000 + at Ocala on Monday were by Florida sires.

Euro Frosh: Impact...

It's probably just enough to say that 10 of the top 20 European freshman sires thus far in 2004 have already thrown a stakes winner, and that each of the top 12, and 16 of the top 20, have already thrown at least one stakes horse. There are a lot of promising freshman sires in Europe this year--even allowing for the fact that current European number two, <u>Giant's Causeway</u>, has stood the last three years at Ashford in Kentucky, as has current Europe number 19, <u>Fusaichi Pegasus</u>.

Giant's Causeway, who now has three European stakes winners, including Europe's top-rated two-yearold, Shamardal, had reached the top of the European freshman sire list the last time we looked, at the beginning of the month. But he's been displaced, at least temporarily, by Xaar, whose Tony James got hold of the soft ground at York last week and powered away to win the G2 Gimcrack S. Considering he was Europe's champion two-year-old in 1997 himself, from his sire Zafonic's first crop, it's not a huge surprise to find Xaar among the freshman sire leaders. He has nine winners--three of them stakes horses, to date--and is one of nine first-crop sires who already have at least eight winners each. This seems to be quite a competitive bunch.

The biggest movers this month have been two sires--one Coolmore, one Maktoum--with more staying profiles who have had seven-furlong SW in the last couple of weeks. Montjeu (Ire), whose King's Quay won the Washington Singer S. at Newbury, consequently moved from 20th to 11th; he now has seven winners. King's Best went from 22nd to 12th, as his Elliot's World won the Acomb S. at York--he's now up to six winners. These two sires look like they're both heading right up the ladder. But here's a sobering thought for anyone thinking about getting in the stallion business in Europe: 13 of the top 20 European freshman sires this year belong either to the Maktoum family, or to Coolmore. To be precise, the current score is: Maktoums--9 (45 percent); Coolmore--4 (20 percent); Rest of World--7 (35 percent). The competition for mares must be intense, and it makes it tough on the 'independents.'
