A MIDSUMMER NIGHT'S DREAM

Most trainers only dream of having a horse good enough to run in the GI Travers S. Nick Zito will saddle not one, not two, but three of the seven colts entered



in Saturday's 135th running of the Midsummer Derby, and he believes any one of them could stand in the Saratoga winner's circle. The trio is headed by Birdstone (Grindstone), who broke his maiden by 12 1/2 lengths at the Spa last year and

Adam Coglianese went on to win the GI Champagne S. The diminutive bay was

disappointing when running fifth in the Mar. 20 GII Lane's End S. and eighth in the May 1 GI Kentucky Derby, but he pulled it together in his latest appearance, sweeping past the valiant Smarty Jones to win the June 5 GI Belmont S. "He has lived up to our expectations," Zito said during the Travers draw at Saratoga yesterday. "He's a worthy horse. We call him 'Little Man' for obvious reasons, but he's got a big, big heart." Birdstone will be joined in the starting gate by The Cliff's Edge (Gulch), who bested fellow Travers hopeful Lion Heart (Tale of the Cat) in the GI Blue Grass S. in April, but had to settle for fifth on the first Saturday in May. Sidelined after the first leg of the Triple Crown with hoof problems, The Cliff's Edge returned to

be second in the July 11 GII Dwyer S. and again when 4 1/2 lengths behind Travers morning-line chalk Purge (Pulpit) in the Aug. 8 GII Jim Dandy S. But the Zito horse to watch for might turn out to be Sir Shackleton (Miswaki). The chestnut colt, a winner of four of his seven starts, was freshened after finishing sixth in the May 15 GI Preakness. He might have Four Footed Fotos

been short of his best when third in the Dwyer, but he closed from just off the pace to take the Aug. 7 GIII West Virginia Derby by three lengths. "He's a dangerous horse," Zito warned. "He's doing everything right, like a good three-year-old would. He's getting good at the right time." Travers field, p2

DEAUVILLE SALE CONCLUDES

The four-day Deauville August Yearling Sale concluded on a high note yesterday, with a final 186 horses going through the ring. The final figures of the sale showed a 10-percent increase in gross, from €25,917,000 a year ago to €28,491,000 this year. The total sale average was up by 3.4 percent to €76,383. The clearance rate for the four-day sale stood at 75.2 percent. For the first two sessions, held Sunday and Monday, compared with the first three days in 2003, the gross was up 4.5 percent and the average was up by 8 percent. For the final two sessions, the aggregate rose 32 percent and the average increased 12 percent. Yesterday's bidding was topped at €120,000 by lot 523, a colt by Pivotal (GB) consigned by Neustrian Associates (Haras du Buff), from the family of champion and leading sire Peintre Celebre. The yearling is out of Peony Girl (Fr) (Phantom Breeze {Ire}). He was knocked down to the Broadhurst Agency of Laurent Benoit. "He was a very attractive colt, not particularly precocious, but moving very well," Benoit said. "Pivotal is a sensation at this time and we hope this one will prove good also. He should be trained in England." During bidding on the colt, Benoit was standing next to Angus Gold, racing manager for Sheikh Hamdan al Maktoum's Shadwell. At the close of business yesterday, Philippe Augier, president of the Agence Francaise, said, "We are convinced that the new four-day format is a good option. The new format allowed us to offer high-quality yearlings throughout the four days of the sale, and the international investors were present right up to the end of the sale, with people like Anthony Stroud still very active. The selection process was very tough and all the horses offered here deserved to be presented at the August auction. The general figures are most satisfactory, but what is even more satisfactory are the figures for the last two days. That is the true proof that the four-day format worked." Deauville Stats, p2



PASS PLAY FOR A TOUCHDOWN by Lucas Marquardt

On paper, there wasn't much to indicate that the dark bay son of Pikepass would attract the sort of attention that would translate into a six-figure purchase price. But the folks at Kaizen Sales, who consigned the colt to the OBS August Yearling sale, knew better. Hip 546's impressive physique had attracted plenty of second and third looks at the barn prior to the sale and Kaizen fielded several substantial offers for the colt before he had even stepped into the ring.

"We had turned down three offers of a hundred thousand or better at the barn before the sale, so we were confident we'd get that," said Jeff Feins, barn foreman at Kaizen. "We expected somewhere in the range of \$125,000 to \$150,000."

What they got exceeded even that lofty goal. Bidding Tuesday quickly exceeded the hundred-thousand mark and climbed until John Moynihan, acting on behalf of owner Martin Cherry, offered \$220,000 for the yearling, who is out of the Roy mare Dutch's Duchess. The price was easily the highest of the session--it marked the lone six-figure lot--and was the second-highest priced horse at the sale through Wednesday behind Monday's select-session topper, a Halo's Image colt that went for \$235,000.

"It's just so infrequent that you get a horse like this," said Feins. "He is a magnificent animal, and probably the best looking horse at the sale. He doesn't have the best pedigree, and isn't by a name that a lot of people know, but as far as an individual, he is a standout. He is really well-balanced; he's big, scopey, and everything just fits. I've been doing this for 10 years, and he's as good an individual as I've seen."

The sale was a home run for newcomer Dr. Benedict Mohit, an Orlando veterinarian who had purchased the colt for just \$2,700 at least year's Keeneland November Sale from the consignment of Spendthrift Farm, where Pikepass stands for \$7,500. Remarkably, it was Mohit's first stab at pinhooking.

"He had always wanted to get into the horse business, and he got some very good advice at the November Sale from Bayne Welker, Jr., up at Mill Ridge in Kentucky," said Kaizen's President Richard Kent, who was quick to spread praise around. "The horse was prepped for the sale at Rainbow Rise Farm down here in Ocala and delivered to us right here on the grounds. But that's the joy of selling a very athletic colt."

Kaizen, the sales division of the Ocala-based Plumley Farms (www.plumleyfarms.com) that was founded five years ago, consigns about about 120-150 horses at year to several different sales. They're hoping to keep the momentum going at Keeneland September with Hip338, a Deputy Minister half brother to multiple graded stakes winner Dr. Kashnikow.
