NOW IT'S PERSONAL

Azeri (Jade Hunter) has gone through a few rough patches this year, but looked like her old self in her most recent start and will go off the prohibitive favorite in this afternoon's GI Personal Ensign H. at Saratoga. After disappointing in the May 31 GI Metropolitan H. against the boys and finishing a languishing fourth in the GI Ogden Phipps H. June 19, the chestnut looked like a shell of the horse that was named 2002 Horse of the Year. But a compelling front-running victory over Sightseek--who trainer Bobby Frankel decided to leave out of this event--in the GI Go For Wand H. at the Spa Aug. 1 showed that the 'A-train' still has plenty of gas in the tank. She'll tote 122 pounds here, giving from six to 12 pounds to four rivals. Jockey Pat Day will be

in the irons once again. **Storm Flag Flying** (Storm Cat) is another who is trying to regain the glory of past triumphs, and the May 15 GII Shuvee H. winner has run admirably in her last two: a second to Sightseek in the Ogden Phipps and a third-place effort in the Go for Wand. But the dark bay would have to take a big step forward to hand Azeri a defeat this afternoon. **Summer Wind Dancer** (Siberian Summer), victress of the GII Delaware H., was not entered after a charter flight that was scheduled to bring her was grounded in Kentucky due to mechanical problems, reports *Daily Racing Form*.

TATTS RELEASES OCTOBER CATALOG

Tattersalls has released the catalog for its upcoming October yearling sale, which features a total of 2,093 horses. Part 1 of the sale, scheduled for Oct. 5 through Oct. 8, will see 791 youngsters go under the hammer while Part 2 will be the largest European yearling sale ever, with just over 1,300 yearlings selling Oct. 11 through Oct. 16. Commenting on Part 2 of the catalog, Tattersalls Chairman Edmond Mahony said, "Just as with Part 1, we have been overwhelmed by the demand for places in the new-look October Yearling Sale Part 2, and the strength in depth has exceeded all expectations." He added, "The quality of the stallions and consignors represented is outstanding and there is the considerable added incentive of the 1,302 yearlings being the only qualifiers for the £250,000 Tattersalls October Auction Stakes, which is the most valuable race of its kind in Europe." Of the current top 40 European stallions, no fewer than 34 will be represented at the sale, including Alhaarth (Ire), Cape Cross (Ire), Daylami (Ire), Dr Fong, [Fasliyev](#), [Hernando \(Fr\)](#), [Indian Ridge \(Ire\)](#), [Peintre Celebre](#), Rainbow Quest, [Selkirk](#) and Zafonic.

The first Grade I event of the year for juveniles, the GI Hopeful S., had an odds-on favorite in Afleet Alex. In the event, Afleet Alex had to work harder than the odds indicated, but he eventually got up on the line to maintain his undefeated record.

Bred in Florida, Afleet Alex is by the somewhat unheralded, but rather promising young stallion Northern Afleet. Unlike Afleet Alex, Northern Afleet took some time to show his true ability. A relatively lightly raced horse, he started just 21 times in four seasons. He showed promise in three outings at two, winning a maiden at Del Mar on his debut, then running second to Cobra King in the GII Balboa S. That promise wasn't really fulfilled in Northern Afleet's second season. In six starts he tallied just one win, an allowance race at Hollywood Park, as well as recording a second in the Jim Neuman S., at a mile on turf, and a third in the seven-furlong GI Malibu S. At four, however, Northern Afleet really got good. He captured three graded stakes, winning the GII San Carlos H. at seven furlongs; the GIII San Diego H. at 8 1/2 furlongs; and the GII San Fernando Breeders' Cup S. at nine furlongs. He also took third in three other graded stakes, most notably when filling that spot in Langfuhr's GI Metropolitan Mile.

Northern Afleet is a grandson of Mr. Prospector, which is not unusual for a sire of a precocious two-year-old, but there is a slightly unusual link in the chain, as his sire is Mr. Prospector's son, Afleet. Initially aimed at the Canadian classics, Afleet did take second in the 10-furlong Queen's Plate. Subsequent events proved him to be more effective over shorter distances, however, and he went on to take the GIII Pennsylvania Derby and GI Jerome H. at three. The following year Afleet was primarily campaigned in sprints, winning the GIII Toboggan H., finishing second in the GI Metropolitan Mile and GI Carter H., and third in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint.

Afleet retired to stand at stud in Kentucky for 1989, but by the end of the 1994 breeding season, he was on his way to Japan. His banishment was probably premature, as the record shows that he sired 43 stakes winners from 375 U.S. foals, and in addition to Northern Afleet, they included Canadian champion older mare A Fleets Dancer; Blu Tusmani, champion two-year-old in Italy, and winner of the GII Withers S. in the U.S.; Grade I winners Flat Fleet Feet and Twist Afleet; and graded stakes winners Top Secret, Zuno Star, Cat Be Nimble, Mysteriously, Brock Street, Mr. Shawklit, Rizzi, Pacific Fleet, Sea Ditty, Afleetaffair and Shrike.

Northern Afleet is a half brother to the Grade I-winning filly Tap to Music. His dam Nureyette didn't run, but she is extremely well-bred, as she is by Nureyev, and is a half sister to the Grade I-winning Cuddles. Her dam, Stellarette, is a graded-stakes-winning daughter of Canadian champion Square Angel, also dam of champion Kamar and ancestress of Grade I winners Gorgeous, Seaside Attraction, Fantastic Light, Golden Attraction, Cape Town and Swain.

So, when Northern Afleet retired to Double Diamond Farm, Ocala, Florida, to stand the 1999 season at a fee of \$5,000, he took to stud a more-than-useful race record and pedigree. Happily, he has parlayed those credentials into a very promising start to his stud career.

His first crop included stakes winners Native Hawk, G P Fleet, Northern Air and Teak Totem (a first time stakes winner on the same day that Afleet Alex took the Hopeful S.), as well as multiple graded stakes placed Unforgettable Max, a full brother to Afleet Alex.

This year's Sunshine Millions Dash winner, Saint Afleet, headlines Northern Afleet's second crop, and Afleet Alex is a member of his third, giving him a total of six stakes winners and six stakes-placed horses with his third crop only two. A very respectable effort for a horse at this level.

Obviously Afleet Alex is speedy and precocious, and his brother, Unforgettable Max has done his best work as a sprinter/miler, finishing second in the GII General George H., GIII Discovery H. and GIII Salvator Mile, and third in the GII Tom Fool H.

On the dam's side, there is quite a lot of stamina, however, and one wouldn't want to write off the prospects of Afleet Alex staying at least as far as the distance of the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. Afleet Alex's dam, Maggy Hawk, was a winner at two, but she is by the stoutly bred Hawkster. This son of Silver Hawk won the GI Norfolk S. at two, but subsequently showed his best form at extended distances on turf, adding the GI Oak Tree Invitational S. and GI Secretariat S. on that surface. Maggy Hawk is a half sister to the dam of Vale Mantovani, an Italian-trained daughter of the sprinter Wolfhound, who captured this year's G3 Premio Mario Incisa at 12 furlongs.

Afleet Alex's granddam, Qualique, was also precocious, scoring her only stakes victory in the GI Demoiselle S. at two, but she was a daughter of champion turf horse Hawaii, a horse who stayed a mile and a half well.

Afleet Alex represents the cross of a Mr. Prospector line stallion over a Roberto line mare. This combination brings together two important daughters of Nashua, Gold Digger, the dam of Mr. Prospector, and Bramalea, the dam of Roberto.

This pair have rather similar backgrounds, since in addition to being by Nashua, Gold Digger's second dam is by Bull Dog out of a Blue Larkspur mare, while Bramalea is out of a mare by a son of Bull Dog out of a Blue Larkspur mare. Other Group or Grade I winners bred on the Mr. Prospector/Roberto cross include Tweedside, Johar and Observatory, while the Roberto/Mr. Prospector cross has already produced Group and Grade I winners Hollywood Wildcat, Dr Fong, Riskaverse, Kicken Kris, Film Maker, You, Chokai Carol and No Reason.

MONARCHOS FILLY TOPS OBS FINALE

[Hip 1058](#), a filly by GI Kentucky Derby hero [Monarchos](#), went to M.S.T.S. for \$90,000 to top the final open session of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's 2004 August Yearling Sale Thursday. Consigned by Summerfield, the bay filly is out of Shop Here (Dehere), who is a half sister to SW Bought in Dixie. The session's highest priced colt, [Hip 1169](#), sold to Tony Bowling and Bobby Dodd for \$85,000. The Trippi colt out of Tarpon Princess (Image of Greatness), was consigned by Red Sunset Farm. Overall, the three open sessions saw 714 horses sell for a record total of \$9,109,400, breaking the previous record gross of \$7,430,700 set in 2000. The open sale average of \$12,758 was also a record, surpassing the average of \$10,736 set in 1998. For complete statistics, see tomorrow's *TDN*.

Sugar Punch, acquired privately by IEAH Stables after running second in an Aqueduct maiden last December, ran her record to a perfect four-for-four for her new connections while adding black type to her catalog page. The bay returned from a seven-month absence with a stylish six-length tally against New York-bred maidens at Belmont June 26, then aired by 4 3/4 lengths in a first-level allowance July 11. The winning margin was reduced to two when she took a NW2X at the Spa Aug. 5 and the filly was tested for the first time this year here. In a good spot just off the pacesetting Cologne up the backstretch, Sugar Punch wore down that rival in the stretch, angled in to lock horns with the rail-skimming Beautiful America and prevailed with a final game lunge at the wire. "She was comfortable sitting behind the leader," said winning jockey Edgar Prado. "I was just waiting for competition at the end. When I saw the horse come inside of me, she picked it up again. She's very game and just keeps improving." Trainer Richard Dutrow said he didn't have her next race mapped out, but indicated that he'd likely keep her sprinting for the time being.



The Gallant Bob H. winner stood his first two seasons at Walmac International near Lexington, Ky. Windmill Manor Farm purchased the handsome chestnut during his first year at stud and has elected to move him to New York. Philly Park Horsemen Inks Seven-Year Contract:

Philadelphia Park won't have slot machines up and running until the end of 2005, but the track and the horsemen have signed a seven-year deal that will begin instituting purse increases next week, the Harness Tracks of America's *Executive Newsletter* reports.
