CANDY RIDE RETIRED TO HILL ' $\mathbf{N}$ ' DALE
Candy Ride (Arg) (Ride the Rails--Candy Girl \{Arg\}, by Candy Stripes), who set a track record when winning last year's Gl Pacific Classic at Del Mar, has been retired and will stand the upcoming breeding season at

Owned by Sid and Jenny Craig and trained by Ron McAnally during his U.S. stint, Candy Ride will stand for $\$ 10,000$ as the property of the Craigs and Hill ' $n$ ' Dale during his first season at stud. "I have been trying to buy Candy Ride for 2 1/2 years," said Sikura. "Every time this horse ran, he set a new standard [ $1: 59.11$ in the 2003 Pacific Classic]. From six furlongs to a mile and a quarter, on dirt and turf, this horse is sensational. He is reminiscent of the likes of Ribot and Forli, who were undefeated international champion racehorses who came to Kentucky and changed the breed." The five-year-old, who went undefeated in three starts in his native Argentina, including in the G1 Gran Premio San Isidro, marked his American debut with a win against $\$ 100,000$ optional claiming company on the dirt at Hollywood last June before narrowly defeating Special Ring, a subsequent Grade I winner, in the GII American H. over Hollywood's turf course. The bay left the most lasting impression, however, in the Pacific Classic, where he defeated the highly-regarded Medgalia d'Oro by three lengths. Initially considered for the 2003 Breeders' Cup Classic at Santa Anita, Candy Ride was forced out of action for the next 12 months because of lingering foot and ankle problems, and after attempts to bring him back to the track failed, it was decided to retire him instead of risk missing another breeding season. "He's a well made horse, and we expect a very enthusiastic response from breeders. An added plus in the equation is that the Craigs intend to support the horse with their best mares," added Sikura. Candy Ride retires undefeated in six starts, including three Grade I/Group 1 victories, and earnings of $\$ 749,149$.

Pepperstorm finished runner-up in the G3 Preis des Winterfavoriten at Cologne Oct. 19 before returning to finish third in the Listed Preis der Dreijahrigen at Dusseldorf Apr. 25. He followed that with a fourth placing in the G2 Mehl-Mulhens-Rennen (German 2000 Guineas) at Cologne May 16 and a second in the G3 Deutscher Herold-Preis at Hamburg June 26. He looked good last time when winning the G3 Globetrotter-Meile back at Cologne last time Aug. 1 and made light work of this step up in class under a confident Andreas Boschert. Held up in rear as his full sibling Peppershot (Ger) (Big Shuffle) cut out the early fractions, he was full of run at the top of the straight and his rider was forced to take a pull approaching the eighth pole, where Checkit was committed by Tony Culhane. Quickening soon after, he settled the result in a matter of strides before asserting for the facile score. The dash for the "golden whip" will be as furious as ever this year as a competitive international field line up. Lucky Strike could finish only third in this 12 months ago when trained by Jan Pubben, but the six-year-old has made giant strides since being switched from Denmark to the German base of Andreas Trybuhl. After a smooth score in the Listed Sprintpreis at Cologne May 2, he took the G3 Benazet-Rennen over course and distance May 28 and was not disgraced when sixth in the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest at Deauville last time Aug. 8. Golden Nun was one place behind on that occasion, having captured the G3 Ballyogan S. at Cork June 12. She is joined by stable companion Fayr Jag, winner of the G1 Golden Jubilee S. on a fast surface at Royal Ascot June 19, has disappointed since in the G1 July Cup at New market July 8 and G1 Nunthorpe S. at York last time out Aug. 19. He encounters his achilles heel of soft ground again here. Felicity warrants respect, having followed a third in the Listed Prix Amandine at Deauville July 8 with a defeat of Key to Pleasure in the G3
Grosser Preis von Berlin at Hoppegarten last time Aug. 8.

Saturday at Saratoga was a day of mixed fortune for the combination of trainer Patrick Biancone and owners Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith. Their middle-distance star, Lion Heart, suffered a career ending injury in the GI Travers S., but they did win another of the day's major contests when Pomeroy captured the GI King's Bishop S., the premier event for three-year-old sprinters. Earlier this season, Pomeroy had been considered a classic prospect after ending his two-year-old season by crossing the line first in the GIII Kentucky Cup Juvenile S. (although he was subsequently disqualified to third). Prior to that, he'd started three times for runaway wins in a Belmont Park maiden, and an allowance at Monmouth, and a second to Cuvee in the GII Saratoga Special S. This spring, Pomeroy started out with a second in the GII Gotham S. and a fourth in the GII Lexington S. These performances convinced his connections that Pomeroy would better showcase his talents in sprints. This proved to be the case, and next time out, Pomeroy led throughout to take the GIII Jersey Shore Breeders' Cup S. by four lengths. He prepped for the King's Bishop with a three-quarters length second to one of Saturday's beaten field, Bwana Charlie, in the GII Amsterdam S.

Pomeroy is the first U.S. Grade 1 winner for his sire, Boundary, a well-bred son of Danzig. Less precocious than Pomeroy, Boundary didn't run at two, and started only twice at three, winning on both occasions. At four, however, he developed into a high-class sprinter, winning four of six starts, including the GIII A Phenomenon H., a race he took at the chief expense of that year's champion sprinter, Cherokee Run, and GIII Roseben H. His sole defeats came when beaten a nose by Friendly Lover in the GII True North H., and third to Virginia Rapids and Cherokee Run in the seven furlong GII Tom Fool S., his only attempt beyond three-quarters of a mile.
Boundary has sired 17 stakes winners in his first six crops, including English Group 1 winner and juvenile champion Minardi, Japanese multiple graded stakes winner Saga Novel, and other U.S. graded scorers Conserve and Roxelana.

Pomeroy's success has revived what had been a quiet branch of a very strong tap-root family. Pomeroy is the third foal and third winner produced by his dam, Questress, a daughter of Seeking the Gold. His granddam, Nahema, a daughter of Believe It, won three times and placed second in the Azalea S., but the only horse to earn black type out of her nine winners, was Al's Dark Star, a hard-working son of Raise Socially, who finished second in the Great Lakes H . at Thistledown.

Pomeroy's third dam, Flickering Star, was also second in a minor stakes, but she did produce a black-type winner in the shape of the Dancing Count S. winner, Can't Be Denied. The family really explodes under the fourth dam, Winking Star. A daughter of Kentucky Derby winner Dark Star, and a sister to stakes winner Blinking Star, Winking Star was only a minor winner. However, she produced French group winner Wronsky (by In Reality) and his stakes placed three-parts sister Ethical (by Intentionally), as well as the Francis S. filly, Qui Blink.

Only a minor winner, Qui Blink appears as the dam of graded stakes winner Qui Native and graded-stakes placed Qui Royalty. Qui Royalty is the mare who really made the name for this family as she is dam of no less than seven stakes winners, including champion English two-year-old colt, Bakharoff; G2 Lockinge S. winner Emperor Jones; GIII Pucker Up S. winner Sum; and Majlood, a stakes winner who was also third in the G1 Middle Park S. Incidentally, both Emperor Jones and Majlood are by Pomeroy's grandsire, Danzig, out of Raise a Native line mares, so have a similar background to Pomeroy. Qui Royalty's family has continued to proliferate, and she is also ancestress of nine other stakes winners, including the Que Belle, a champion and dual classic winner in Germany, and a stakes winner in the U.S.

Since Boundary was a Northern Dancer/Danzig line horse free of Native Dancer, he was an obvious horse to try with Mr. Prospector line mares. This cross has now produced both of his Group/Grade 1 winners, Pomeroy and Minardi (out of a Mr. Prospector mare), and he has also sired stakes winners Padlock and Shake the Dice, and Grade I placed Total Limit out of mares by Mr. Prospector's son, Forty Niner. Overall, the Danzig/Mr. Prospector cross has produced more than 80 stakes winners, including, in addition to Pomeroy and Minardi, champions Dayjur and Pas de Reponse, and other Group/Grade 1 winners Brahms, Regal Rose, Landseer, Flying Spur, Miss Danehill and Honor Lap.

## YOUR UPCOMING MONTH IN LEXINGTON

Considering the Athens Olympics have only just finished (talk about a hay, oats, and water argument for the Ages), it would somehow be churlish to refer to the upcoming 14 days of selling as anything other than a Marathon, wouldn't it? I'll postpone until next year the search for the perfect synonym for the world's single biggest and most important horse sale: in this Olympic year, we'll just stick with Marathon.

It's hard to know what to expect. Book 1 has actually continued to get more selective, and this year has 492 catalogued, 8 percent fewer than last year--yet the overall catalogue is up 14 percent in number. Last year, Book 1 averaged $\$ 387,168$--almost exactly the same as in 2001, when the Book 1 average was $\$ 387,872$. In both years, the Book 1 gross was over the \$130-million mark. With a smaller catalogue, a Book 1 gross of $\$ 130$-million would probably mean a single-digit average increase. It seems a tall order, to expect more than 300 yearlings to average almost $\$ 400,000$ each, but, with the augmented crop sizes, in some ways the sire power is there. Numerically, the top five sires represented in Book 1 include the three best active sires in North America: Storm Cat (25), A.P. Indy (24), and Kingmambo (27), plus the Ashford freshman sire duo of Giant's Causeway (41) and Fusaichi Pegasus (26). Three of every ten yearlings in Book 1 are by one of these five sires.

## Top Five Sires Head Mid-year APEX Ratings

With so much data to sift through, anything up-to-date, accurate, and (hopefully) easy to use should come in handy when decision time approaches at the sales. With that in mind, we commissioned The Jockey Club Information Services (TJCIS) to run a set of the APEX stallion rating figures through August 15, so covering racing in North America, Britain, Ireland, France, Germany, and Japan since January 1, 1998. Published here are two tables: Table 1 (page 7) is the world's Top 40 sires by 'A Runner Index', which means the frequency with which they sire runners who are in the top 2 percent of money-earners in a year.

It sounds complicated, but it's not: if you look at number 3-ranked Danzig, you'll see that he's had 60 ' A Runners' (top 2 percent earners) from 600 'runners' (year-starters) since the beginning of 1998. That's 10 percent A Runners from starters. Since 2 percent A Runners from starters equals the average, which is an index figure of 1.00, we determine Danzig's index simply by dividing his 10 percent figure by the average 2 percent figure--which equals 5.00.
Though it does (by design) have that seven-year time limitation, one of the great virtues of the APEX stallion rating method is that it combines results from different countries for a meaningful result: it must do, because if you look at the top five sires since 1998, they probably really are the world's top five sires: Storm Cat (5.70), A.P. Indy (5.17), Danzig (5.00), Sadler's Wells (4.81), and Nureyev (4.55). Statistics can be distorted, but numbers don't lie, not if you understand what they're telling you, and how you arrived at them. So, yes, Distorted Humor has made a seriously big-time start, and youngish stallions Unbridled's Song and Pivotal are definitely hovering on the fringes of being World Top 10 sires.
Table 2 (page 8-10) goes into considerable detail about the 89 sires represented in Books 1 and 2 who have three-year-olds and up of 2004, therefore have runners old enough for APEX ratings to be computed. For paying Book 1-2 prices ( 1162 yearlings averaged about $\$ 170,000$ last year), you're bound to be looking for 'A Runners' (top 2 percent earners, for example $\$ 109,000$ in North America in 2003, about $€ 40,000$ in GB/Ire), rather than 'B Runners' (next 2 percent, about $\$ 75,000$ ) or 'C Runners' (next 4 percent, about $\$ 50,000)$. The first six columns of figures in Table 2 show each sire's number of runners, A Runners, and A Runner Index, in North America and Europe both. A.P. Indy, for example, has 747 runners in North America since 1998, of which 87 are A Runners, for an A Runner Index of 5.82; in Europe, he has just one A Runner from 65 runners, an A Runner Index of just 0.77. Conclusion: A.P. Indy has been a much better sire in North America, at least in this seven-year span.
The next four columns are 'age ratings,' which calculate how the sire's runners score at various ages.
Danzig, you will see, is a superior sire of two-year-olds (5.33); so, interestingly, is Storm Cat (4.51). Machiavellian, surprisingly, is a classic example of a sire whose runners got markedly better with age--so, for all their reputation as being hard-headed, as a group they must be very sound. The remaining seven columns then re-combine all regions (North America, Europe, and Japan, which is not published here) and all ages to show the sire's proficiency at all three class levels. For some of these Book 1-2 sires, as I say, buying an A Runner is the object of the exercise; but many of these sires don't stand for the moon, and will be well represented throughout the sale. If you can't afford an A Runner, your best bet is try and buy a B Runner, and so on. So these columns give you those ratings for these sires, at each of those class levels. There are another 180 sires with new APEX ratings who do not have yearlings in Books 1-2, but make their first appearances from Book 3 onwards; we are working on getting those made available for reference in the next few days. Stay tuned on that.

Since it is the first time they've been rated, the performance of sires whose first three-year-olds are racing this year (first foals 2001) is also of great interest. There are 58 sires with 48 or more year-starters so far, and 12 of the 58 have A Runner indices of $1.95+$, headed by Forestry (5.22), Verglas (3.92), and Cape Cross (3.28), who is tied for third with the deceased Canadian stallion, Archer's Bay; Old Trieste (3.03, also dead); and Victory Gallop (2.83). Then come: the surprising Shinko Forest ( 2.38 , much better as three-yearolds); the surprising Menifee (2.34, with an equally solid 2.15 ABC Index); Gold Away (2.05), Event Of The Year (2.00), Doneraile Court (1.98), and Tiger Hill (1.96). Fasliyev, plagued with 173 year-starters (Cape Cross has 122, by comparison, for eight A Runners), ranks 15th, his five A Runners resulting in a 1.45 A Runner Index. It is very early days for these sires, so their numbers will change a lot (l find the number of ABC runners a good thing to look at, at this stage), but all indicators, of course, are useful to look at--though it pays to be guarded about the interpretation at such an early stage.

Update on Euro Frosh, referring to last week's column ... King's Best jumped a few more places with a Group 3 winning filly at Goodwood... Lujain gained added respectability with two of his winners last week, a stakes winner in France, and an impressive first-time out winner for trainer Henry Candy. Another quite respectable sire son of Seeking the Gold...Dubai Millennium looks like he'd have been fine, too...not a freshman sire, Thunder Gulch, but did get those frequentflyer miles to Japan at just the wrong time, so his first truly well-bred crop are just two-year-olds this year. Among them is impressive Grade II Spinaway S. winner Sense of Style, the best juvenile filly seen out so far in America this year.

## STORM FLAG FLYING SET ON BELDAME Storm

Flag Flying (Storm Cat) will make her next start in the Gl Beldame H. at Belmont Park Oct. 9, according to trainer Shug McGaughey yesterday. A 1 1/4-length winner of Azeri in the GI Personal Ensign at Saratoga Race Course S., the Phipp's Stable homebred won two of six prior starts this term, including the GII Shuvee H. at Belmont May 15, but hasn't scored at the Grade I level since 2002, when she the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies en route to a juvenile championship. Her nemesis Azeri is being aimed at the GI Spinster S. at Keeneland Oct. 10.

Cooksey, Threewitt, Haskin Honored by Turf Writers: Jockey Patricia Cooksey, California trainer Noble Threewitt and The Blood-Horse writer Steve Haskin are set to be honored by the National Turf Writers Association at the organization's annual dinner, to be held Oct. 27 at the Belo Mansion in Dallas, Texas. The recently retired Cooksey, who at 46 ended her career as the second leading female rider of all time by wins, will be given the Mr. Fitz Award for typifying the spirit of racing. The 93 -year-old Threewitt, still an active trainer in Southern California and the conditioner of 1954 Florida Derby and Wood Memorial winner Correlation, oversees a health-care clinic named in his honor at Santa Anita that treats backstretch personnel who might otherwise not be able to afford medical and dental care. He will be honored for meritorious service to racing with the Joe Palmer Award. Haskin will be recognized by his peers with the Walter Haight Award for lifetime excellence in turf writing. The 57-year-old is the senior correspondent for The Blood-Horse and has written several books on racing. Haskin also is the editor of the Kentucky Derby and Breeders' Cup souvenir magazines.
