FALLON ARRESTED IN RACE-FIXING SCHEME

Six-time champion jockey Kieren Fallon was one of 16 people arrested yesterday as part of an investigation into alleged race fixing. Fallon, fellow riders Fergal Lynch and Darren Williams and trainer Karl Burke, were

the subject of nation-wide police raids for alleged conspiracy to defraud, revolving around corruption and fixing races, understood to involve more than 80 races over the last two years. Detective Chief Superintendent Steve Wilmott, representing the City of London Po-

lice, told the BBC yesterday, "We have amassed a large amount of information, including computer records and documentation seized today, and will now commence the detailed task of examining it all." The Jockey Club's Director of Public Relations John Maxse explained that the investigation was passed on to the police earlier this year. Fallon was facing a charge of bringing racing into disrepute as a result of an expose in the Sunday newspaper News of the World, which alleged in March that Fallon and John Egan had been involved in fixing races. Jockeys' Association Chief Executive John Blake told the BBC, "It appears very serious indeed. The police have amassed a huge amount of evidence which they will now go through. Of course it is very damaging to the reputation of racing, very damaging to the reputation of trainers and jockeys potentially and it's a great concern to us." Blake later told Sky News that the Association will offer full support to the three jockeys arrested yesterday. "We represent all the professional jockeys in the country and are offering support to the jockeys as we speak, although I don't actually know where two of them are being held." He revealed that it was a "surprise" that Fallon, who he described as "a very public figure," was involved. He added, "The betting landscape has changed in the last few years in terms of betting exchanges and I think that is the important point to make. But the headlines are not great for racing and we would be the first to admit that."

FAIR GROUNDS BOUGHT BY CHURCHILL

Churchill Downs Inc. (CDI), which owns racetracks in California, Florida, Illinois, Indiana and Kentucky, has finalized a deal to purchase the New Orleans Fair Grounds. The agreement, struck just minutes before a Tuesday midnight deadline, will allow Churchill to buy the track's assets for a reported \$47 million. On August 16, horse owner Mike Pegram and Fair Grounds struck a deal which was to give the Washington native an 86-percent interest in Fair Grounds, with the Krantz family, current owners of the facility, retaining an 11 percent share. Churchill

Downs had originally expressed an interest in purchasing the track, but withdrew their offer Aug. 14. But late last week, the Louisville company re-entered the fray and extended a new offer to purchase the historic oval. Pegram was

given the chance to make a new competitive bid, but declined the offer. "The board had an obligation to consider all offers and to accept the best and highest offer," said Bryan Krantz, president and general manager of the Fair Grounds. "In the end, the Churchill proposal, valued at \$47 million, is most favorable for our unsecured creditors and minority stockholders." Added CDI President and CEO Tom Meeker, "Fair Grounds, with its rich tradition and winter race schedule, is an excellent strategic fit for CDI. We look forward to working with Bryan Krantz and the Louisiana horsemen to deliver an outstanding meet in November and in the years to come. We are eager to become a part of the New Orleans community." The deal with CDI must still be approved by bankruptcy court. Upon closing, Fair Grounds will be required to pay all its debtors in full, including the Louisiana HBPA, which was originally owed \$89 million in purse shortages, but agreed last month to accept \$25 million to settle that debt.

He disappointed when only seventh in the G3 Holsten-Trophy at Hamburg July 3 before filling the fourth spot in the Listed Prix du Cercle at Deauville last time July 31. Racing in a stalking third early under Andreas Suborics, he tackled the long-time leader Lucky Strike inside the final quarter and had that rival's measure passing the eighth pole. Despite the late rattle of Key to Pleasure, the sophomore had done enough to capture the illustrious prize of the 'golden whip' for his jockey. Red Bloom was the long-time ante-post favorite for the G1 1000 Guineas based on her defeat of Sundrop (Jpn) and Punctilous (GB) in the G1 Fillies' Mile at Ascot in September. Fourth behind Attraction (GB) in the Newmarket Classic May 5, she was coaxed back to the track for a second crack at that rival, but again failed to land a serious blow when third in the G1 Coronation S. at Ascot June 18. Returning from a break to take on the colts in this contest, Red Bloom raced keenly in the hands of Kevin Darley off the tepid early tempo and looked temporarily flat-footed when wound up for her run at the top of the straight. Responding to her rider's urgings, she hit the front with 1 1/2 furlongs remaining before winning the bunch-finish from Salselon, who Frankie Dettori had failed to urge past the game filly in the closing stages. "She's a special filly," Cheveley Park Stud's Racing Manager Chris Richardson said of Red Bloom. "It was a muddling race today and she'd been off a while, but Kevin gave her a great ride and she enjoyed the ground, so hopefully we can get her back on track. There are options abroad and she might go for the G1 Prix de l'Opera [at Longchamp] Oct. 3]." Click for the Racing Post race chart.

while breezing at Saratoga yesterday and will be retired from racing. The eight-year-old grey is scheduled to undergo surgery tomorrow at Rood and Riddle in Lexington, Kentucky. "The vet told me this kind of fracture is extremely rare, and it is an unusual bone to break," said John Terranova, who trained the gelding for Gatsas Thorough-

breds. "The horse is in his stall and he's comfortable. Everyone's pretty devastated, but we're thankful that it wasn't worse." Acquired by Theodore Gatsas as a twoyear-old for \$50,000 at OBS March, Gander broke his maiden at Saratoga in his second start that season. At three, he captured two of the biggest races for New York-breds--the Albany H. and the Empire Classic H.-before making a name for himself during his four-yearold campaign in 2000 with a second in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup and thirds in the GI Woodward and the GII Saratoga Breeders' Cup H. He earned over \$500,000 at five, winning the GII Meadowlands Cup and finishing third in both the GI Donn H. and the GI Whitney H. Though the New York-bred had less success in the past two years, he still added scores the Empire Classic in 2002 and King's Point H. earlier this season, and ran fifth in what would be his final start in the Evan Shipman H. July 25. "He had a great career and I'm thankful for having had the opportunity to train him for most of it," Terranova added. Gander heads into retirement with a record of 60-15-10-9 and earnings of \$1,824,011.
