ARRESTED JOCKEYS RETURN

Jockeys Kieren Fallon, Darren Williams and Fergal Lynch returned to racecourse action yesterday after their arrest and subsequent release on police bail Wednesday. Fallon and Williams were out of luck, at Salisbury and Carlisle, respectively, but Lynch did make a winning return aboard Caitlin (Ire) in a nursery handicap at Redcar. As expected, a number of television crews were in attendance for Fallon's return at Salisbury and Christopher Stewart-Moore, Fallon's solicitor, advised his client not to give any interviews, but did issue a joint-statement for the benefit of viewers of Racing UK. It read, "[Kieren Fallon] was taken by Police to Bury St Edmunds at 4 a.m. [Wednesday morning] and spent a total of approximately 14 hours at the station, most of that time spent in a cell. He was questioned for between four and five hours. During that time not one specific horse or race was mentioned." Stewart-Moore also indicated that Fallon was repeatedly asked the question "Can you stop a horse by pulling its reins?" and also said one officer asked Fallon "You are renowned for riding a horse very hard. If you didn't ride a horse very hard from the beginning to the end of a race you are not doing your job properly, are you?" At this point Stewart-Moore said he told the questioning officer "You clearly don't know anything about horse racing by saying that. If you don't mind me saying, I find your questions naive." To which the officer was said to have given the reply, "I'm sorry, I don't know anything about horse racing so you will have to bear with me." Stewart-Moore continued, "During the police interview, the interviewee and his solicitor are given an information pack designed as the basis for the questions and answers. I have never seen a pack with so little information in it." Fallon added: "I felt like I was being treated like a terrorist. The officers who searched [my property] took the home computer away. I can't even work it, it's there for the kids if they want to use it but it's broken anyway." Fallon, under the terms of his bail, is due to appear at a London police station Nov. 2.



Atswhatimtalknbout (A.P. Indy--Lucinda K, by Red Ransom), one of the top three-year-olds of 2003, was euthanized Sept. 1 after suffering an apparent internal rupture following intestinal surgery, the *Blood-Horse*

reports. Trainer Ron Ellis told the publication that the four-year-old colt was sent to San Luis Rey Equine Hospital two weeks ago to be treated for what he thought might have been ulcers. Pronounced ulcerfree, the colt later underwent exploratory surgery which indicated a displaced sacrum.

Atswhatimtalknbout was said to have improved following the surgery, but Ellis received a phone call indicating that the horse's condition was deteriorating and that there was likely irreparable internal injuries. "I had a lot of people ask me about him," Ellis said. "Even now, there were a lot of people who wanted to know how he was doing." Purchased by B. Wayne Hughes for \$900,000 at the 2002 Fasig-Tipton Calder Sale, the handsome bay colt won two of his first three starts following which a 10-percent interest was sold to a group including movie directors Steven Spielberg and Gary Ross. In his first start for the new partnership, he was second by a nose to Buddy Gil in the GII San Felipe S. before finishing fourth in the GI Santa Anita Derby and GI Kentucky Derby. Plagued by foot problems, Atswhatimtalknbout was forced to miss the Belmont S., and those same ailments kept him on the sidelines this year. Connections were pointing for a five-year-old campaign. "I always felt he never really got to show what kind of a horse he really was. It wasn't meant to be," Ellis said.
