TITANS BATTLE AT KEENELAND

Always in the thick of things, John Ferguson, bidding on behalf of Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, outlasted Aaron Jones and bloodstock agent Buzz Chace and walked away with the top prize, a colt by A.P. Indy out of GSW Sahara Gold (Seeking the Gold),

at Monday's opening session of Keeneland's September Yearling Sale. Consigned by Lane's End, agent for Stonerside Stables, hip 136, a grandson of GI Breeders' Cup Sprint winner Desert Stormer, brought \$3.1 million. Coincidentally, Ferguson, who does the bulk of his work from the back ring, this

time was seated inside the sales pavilion with Sheikh Mohammed, his wife Haya and other Godolphin representatives, while Jones and Chace, who normally bid from the last row of the pavilion, were standing in the back near the chute where the horses exit the pavilion. "He's a wonderful horse," Ferguson said. "He's by a great sire and the mare was a top-class runner whose out of a Breeders' Cup winner. He's one of the best physicals in the sale and he's been bred by one of the leading breeders in Kentucky and one of the best farms in Kentucky. When you get down to it, when you're looking to buy the very best, he's a horse that has to be on your short list. Sheikh Mohammed just felt that he was an exceptional individual and was very keen to buy him." Stonerside's John Adger could well understand the Sheikh's enthusiasm. "We just always thought he was an absolutely wonderful individual," he remarked. "We've been very fortunate with him. Bobby Spalding and the guys at the farm did a tremendous job getting him ready for the sale and, of course, Lane's End did a wonderful job selling him. We're tickled to death that Sheikh Mohammed bought him and we wish him the very best with him." As for the eyecatching sales price, Adger said, "I'm not going to tell you the reserve, but it was much, much lower than what he brought. He was always a smooth, athletic individual from the time he was a foal. We love this family." (cont. p2)

SWAN SONG

By the time the final horse of the session walks into the ring at most sales, many buyers have already gone off in search of dinner. That was hardly the case as hip 241 strode into the arena yesterday evening. Consigned by Paramount Sales, the bay colt, who is by Unbridled's Song out of the unraced Shelter Half mare Cruising Haven, rounded out the session with a bang when he lured a \$2.8-million final bid from Demi O'Byrne, who outstayed Sheikh Mohammed for the prize. The Feb. 25 foal is a three-parts brother to Belterra, a daughter of Unbridled who won the GII Golden Rod S. at two and was third in the 2002 GI Ashland S. and GII Bonnie Miss S. "I thought we'd have to pay that much for him. He's a lovely horse," said O'Byrne. "I thought he was maybe one of the best horses in the sale. He had lovely quality and he's a great mover. 

Top Cat...

Hip 187, a filly by Storm Cat out of the winning mare Warm Mood (by Alydar) realized the top price of the session for her sex when John Ferguson, who signed the ticket for Sheikh Mohammed, went to \$1.7 million to acquire the bay. "She's just an attractive filly," said Ferguson. "She was one of the most outstanding fillies I've ever seen here. The mare has proven it. She had the winner of the [1999 G3] Norfolk at Royal Ascot and we were very keen to have this filly." In addition to her Group winning and Group 1 placed half brother Warm Heart, the Mar. 3 foal is a full sister to Royal Tigress, winner of this year's Leopardstown 1000 Guineas Trial. "That's just about what we thought she'd bring, between one and two [million]," said Bill Farish of Lane's End, who consigned the filly. "She's a very attractive filly with very good knees, which not all the Storm Cats have. We're just very thankful."

Gaines-Gentry, Rancho San Miguel and Twin Creeks bought Cruising Haven, carrying this foal, for \$600,000 at the 2002 Keeneland November sale and the mare dropped another colt by Unbridled's Song this winter. In addition to Belterra, the 16-year-old mare has produced Royal Haven (by Hail Emperor), winner of 19 starts, including the GII Fall Highweight H. and GII General George H. "I knew he was going to sell very well," said an emotional Olin Gentry of Gaines-Gentry, who bred the horse in partnership with Twin Creeks Farm and Rancho San Miguel. "It's extremely gratifying to raise a horse like that." According to Gentry, the colt is the highest-priced yearling he has ever sold. Also flush from the big score was Paramount Sales' Pat Costello. "Well, he was a lovely horse, wasn't he?" said Costello. When someone asked where Gentry was, Costello deadpanned, "I don't know--he's probably washed out completely by now. I'm not sure if he's still alive or not." Costello was high on the horse coming into the sale, but admitted that the figure was more than he expected. "I thought he'd bring over a million, but after that, you never know. He's a beautiful horse and didn't turn a hair all week."

Skara Glen Strikes Back...

Skara Glen Stable's Ira Gumberg, sitting beside his father Stanley and trainer Michael Matz, went to \$1.5 million to secure hip 39, a filly by 2000 Kentucky Derby winner and promising freshman sire of this year Fusaichi Pegasus. Consigned to the sale by Michael C. Byrne, agent, the dark bay filly had a busy morning yesterday as she was shown to several would-be buyers. A May 15 foal, she is a daughter of the 21-year-old mare Golden Oriole (Northern Dancer), who has had success when bred to Mr. Prospector-line stallions. She produced GISP Devonwood to the cover of Woodman in 1994 and more importantly Castle Gandolfo when mated with Gone West in 1999. Hip 39 is a three-parts sibling to the latter, who died last week in South America. "She's just beautiful," Ira Gumberg commented, adding that Matz, who advised on the purchase, will train the filly. "She's a very athletic filly and has a great pedigree." For the Gumbergs, victory yesterday was sweet. Skara Glen was the immediate underbidder on Windsharp, who sold at last year's November sale for \$6.1 million carrying a full sibling to Breeders' Cup Turf hero Johar. "It feels good to get one," Gumberg admitted. "Once in a while, you get one, sometimes you get outbid."

Evans Weathers the Storm...

On three previous occasions, Edward Evans bred his Pennant Fever (Seattle Slew) to Storm Cat and each time the results have been sensational. The offspring have included MGISW and millionaire Raging Fever, GSW Stormin Fever and MGSP Roaring Fever. Yesterday, Evans gave buyers the rare opportunity to buy into this tremendous family, but ultimately decided that it made more sense to hang on to hip 112, signing the winning ticket at \$850,000. The dark bay, consigned by Lane's End, is the last foal from Pennant Fever, who died this past March after a three-year battle with laminitis. "It's been great fun to breed and race this family and since the mother died this year, I thought I'd go ahead and keep her," said Evans, who explained that the filly was part of a foal share agreement with Overbrook Farm. "Hopefully she'll do as well as the others."

Off and Running...

Monday's opening session of the September Yearling Sale got off to a steady start with across the board increases in gross, average, median, while the number of yearlings which did not find takers decreased from 70 last year down to 49 this term. "I thought it was an exceedingly solid sale," said Geoff Russell, director of sales. "I thought the consignors went in with a very realistic mindset and set reserves that reflected the market very well. Having the median increase 17 percent is very positive and we're delighted that we increased the average. Having increases last year, we didn't expect that this session would increase that much, but we're delighted that it did." Eight yearlings realized over a \$1 million this year, while 10 surpassed that standard during the same session last term. According to Russell, things can only get better during the second session. "We might have a couple of more bigger items," explained Russell. "There are a couple of colts that might top [today]. We always go into it being more optimistic than [Monday], so we'll continue to do

"[The sale] looks good to me. It looks real good. The A.P. Indy, for example, was a really nice colt and I think the price they paid for him was indicative of the market for the nice horses. It feels like a good sale."

"I think Mr. Fulton is very happy with what he purchased today. I think we're getting good value for his dollars. I think the market is very spotty; the sale's got a lot of ups and downs. Doubly Blessed...

The mystique of the 2000 GI Kentucky Derby winner Fusaichi Pegasus has extended well past the track and into the auction ring, where kin to the striking dark bay have set the sales board alight. The story began with the Danzig mare Angel Fever, who Stone Farm and Stonerside Stable teamed up to buy for \$525,000 at the 1994 KEENOV sale. That turned out to be a bargain when her fourth foal, by Mr. Prospector, made \$4 million at the 1998 KEEJUL sale before going on to Derby glory as a horse known as Fusaichi Pegasus. A full sister, Blissfull, previously a \$1 million KEENOV weanling, subsequently sold for \$4 million at 2000 KEENOV, while another full, Bless, equaled that popular price tag in 2002, selling to ClassicStar in foal to Storm Cat. Hip 455, a bay colt selling this afternoon, is the resulting offspring. "He's a real strong-looking yearling," said consignor Taylor Made's Duncan Taylor of the Mar. 24 foal. That colt may play the closer to hip 442, a three-parts brother to Fusaichi Pegasus by Seeking the Gold selling just 13 lots earlier. The colt is consigned to the sale by Stone Farm, who also consigned Fusaichi Pegasus. "Well, we'll just wait and see," said a relaxed Hancock yesterday morning. "We've gotten a lot of looks so far. Physically, he is a lot like Fusaichi Pegasus. He's not as big as him, but they really resemble each other and this one's got a lot of presence." Hancock said the choice to go to Seeking the Gold, one of Mr. Prospector's prolific sons at stud, was an easy one. "That nick has worked, producing a Derby winner who looks like he's going to be a leading freshman sire," he said. "It's a classic 'If it ain't broke, don't fix it.'"

Blue Lightning...

The folks at Matagorda Farm don't consign many to the September sale, but they make it count when they decide to send a yearling over from their base in Georgetown, Kentucky. Last year, it was a striking, well-muscled chestnut son of Storm Cat out of Bluemamba (Kingmambo) from their draft that led the Tuesday session, drawing a \$2.6 million offer from bloodstock agent Demi O'Byrne. This year, they hope lighting strikes twice when they lead into the ring an A.P. Indy colt out Bluemamba, heroine of the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches [French 1000 Guineas] in 2000. Hip 456 is the second foal from the seven-year-old mare, who hails from the family of Irish champion and emerging sire Orpen and the ill-fated Jules, sire of Peace Rules. "He's a bit more racy looking than the Storm Cat, with nice bone," explained Matagorda's "Bootie" Young. "But they are both big, good-looking horses." Bluemamba didn't produce a foal in 2004 and is back in foal to Storm Cat.

Another Dandy Danehill...

It seems a match made in heaven. Danehill, one of the world's most important sires until his untimely demise in May 2003, bred to the late Prince Fahd Salman's Fiji (GB) (Rainbow Quest), who won five of her first six starts after her arrival in the United States, capped by a three-length success in the GI Gamely Breeders' Cup H. She would conclude her season with a score in the GI Yellow Ribbon S. and was named champion turf mare of 1998. Retired the following year, she was bred in 2000 to A.P. Indy and foaled a filly in 2001. She slipped her next foal before being mated to Danehill and was offered for sale at the 2002 Keeneland November Sale, where she was knocked down to Brushwood Stables' Betty Moran for \$3.1 million. The resulting foal, a colt consigned by Eaton Sales as hip 264 carries the high hopes of his owner and consignor into the ring this morning. "We raised this colt and everything about him says racehorse," said Eaton Sales' Reiley McDonald. Added Mrs. Moran, "He's a very, very nice colt and I think there's a lot of interest in him." Bred on the same cross that produced this year's G1 Epsom Derby winner North Light (Ire), the Apr. 7 foal is the lone offering for his sire in the sale. Danehill will be represented by his final crop of yearlings in 2005.



John McCririck, Britain's flamboyant betting authority, excitedly informed Channel 4 viewers that the dosage experts had assured him that Rule of Law simply could not win the St Leger. About 15 minutes later, Rule of Law stood triumphant in the winner's enclosure after turning in another of his doggedly determined efforts, this time over a distance of one mile six furlongs and 132 yards.

Rule of Law started co-favorite for the St Leger, so the betting public obviously weren't too worried that he would fail to last the extra 572 yards he had to tackle at Doncaster. Their faith in him was based on his strong-finishing second in the Derby and his all-the-way victory in the Great Voltigeur S.--performances which showed that this son of Kingmambo stayed much better than anyone could have predicted from his bloodlines. At the end of last year, the Timeform writers simply stated that Rule of Law "stays 1m," clearly reluctant to suggest that he would be suited by longer distances. (cont. p9)

And who could blame them for their reticence? Kingmambo never tackled more than a mile, while his brother Miesque's Son excelled at shorter distances, and their dam Miesque spent most of her career at a mile. Although Kingmambo's sire Mr. Prospector occasionally sired horses who stayed much better than he did, he normally needed more help from the mare than Miesque was able to give.

It is a similar story with the bottom half of Rule of Law's pedigree. His dam Crystal Crossing gained her only success over six furlongs at two in England before being switched to the U.S., where she raced creditably over 1 1/16 miles. She was followed two years later by her sister Circle of Gold, winner of the G3 Prestige S. over seven furlongs in England before scoring over 1 1/8 miles at Belmont.

What's more, Crystal Crossing is by Royal Academy, who gained his finest win in Europe in the July Cup over six furlongs, and her broodmare sire is Never So Bold, another July Cup winner.

Never So Bold was no doubt chosen as a mate for Rule of Law's third dam, the Irish 1000 Guineas winner Favoletta, because he was a son of Bold Lad (Ire). Favoletta had visited Bold Lad earlier in her career, to produce the spectacularly fast Amaranda, winner of the G2 Queen Mary S. over five furlongs at Royal Ascot. Amaranda's classic-placed half sister Favoridge also possessed plenty of speed, even though she was by the Kentucky Derby and Belmont S. winner Riva Ridge.

To sum up, none of the six horses in the first two generations of Rule of Law's pedigree stayed much beyond a mile and an eighth. And if you trace his female line back a few generations, you will find that his fifth dam is Urshalim, a very speedy filly who needed a downhill track to last six furlongs, and his sixth dam is Horama, who once held the track record for five furlongs on the sharp Chester track.

Defying the Law ..

So how come Rule of Law stays so well? My guess is that the explanation lies mainly in the fourth generation of his pedigree. This includes two lines of Northern Dancer, with one line notably coming through his St Leger-winning son Nijinsky II. Two of Nijinsky's sons, Niniski and Caerleon also sired St Leger winners, and so did Northern Dancer's sons Sadler's Wells (twice) and Northern Baby.

In addition to Northern Dancer's double presence, the 16 horses in this generation include Nashua and Prove Out, who between them collected three victories over two miles in the Jockey Club Gold Cup. Also present are Native Dancer, who lasted a mile and a half well enough to win the Belmont S., and Crimson Satan and Baldric, both winners over a mile and a quarter.

I suspect that we shouldn't underestimate the contribution of Kingmambo's second dam Pasadoble, who figures alongside Nijinsky II in the third generation of Rule of Law's pedigree. Although Pasadoble was a successful miler, she was bred to stay well. In addition to having a two-mile winner (Prove Out) as her sire, she was out of a mare by Sanctus, winner of the French Derby and the 15-furlong Grand Prix de Paris. Also, Pasadoble's dam Santa Quilla was a half sister to Comtesse de Loir, who twice reached the first three in the Arc.

Perhaps it is this latent stamina which has occasionally helped Kingmambo sire horses which stay a good deal further than he did--horses like Lemon Drop Kid, King Cugat and El Condor Pasa. Indeed his outstanding record this year shows that he is capable of siring just about everything from a fast two-year-old, such as the Prix Morny winner Divine Proportions, to a middle-distance stayer of Rule of Law's ability. In between these two extremes are Russian Rhythm (Juddmonte Lockinge S. over a mile) and King Kamehameha (Japanese Derby over a mile and a half).

Kingmambo's 2004 stakes winners also include the mile-and-a-half Listed winner Alkaased, who, like Rule of Law, has a son of Nijinsky II as his broodmare sire. Nijinsky himself is the broodmare sire of the exceptional Russian Rhythm and another Nijinsky mare, Far Beyond, ranks as the second dam of those talented brothers Parade Ground and Parade Leader. Parade Ground's wins included the GIII Lawrence Realization H. over a mile and a half, which shows again that blending Kingmambo with Nijinsky offers a good chance of a middle-distance performer.

With four Group 1 winners to his credit this year, Kingmambo is thoroughly justifying his 2004 fee of \$225,000, the only drawback from an American viewpoint being that so much of his recent success has come on turf. Will this turf bias effectively put a cap on how high his fee can rise? I rather doubt it, especially as Kingmambo looks sure to provide some of this week's highlights in the Keeneland ring.

STEADY AS SHE GOES

For the last five years in a row, John Ferguson Bloodstock has been the leading buyer at the Keeneland September Sale. After yesterday's opening session, in which Ferguson signed for 19 horses for a total of \$14,435,000 on behalf of Sheikh Mohammed-- 23 percent of the session's gross--there seems little danger that he will not emerge as the sale's leading buyer for the sixth consecutive year. Interestingly, though, for the last four years the top colt has been bought by Demi O'Byrne for the Coolmore crowd. At close of business yesterday, Ferguson had bought the highest colt--or male, should I say the \$3.1-million ridgeling (which the pros now dismiss as unimportant) by A.P. Indy. Demi paid \$2.8-million for the very last horse in the ring, a \$2.8-million colt by Unbridled's Song. Since the word on the street all along has been that today's session is better, expect some big fireworks--especially toward the second half of today's session, in the 400's. I'll be surprised if there isn't a \$5-million colt today.

Stars of tomorrow grabbing the spotlight today...

Four buyers--Europeans Ferguson, Demi, and Shadwell, and top American buyer Tim McMurry, for Stan Fulton, combined to buy 43 yearlings for \$29,535,000, an average of \$686,860. Together, they accounted for 47 percent--nearly half--of yesterday's gross. About a third of their buys were by five sires, who among them accounted for 44 percent--nearly half--of yesterday's gross. A total of 49 yearlings by Storm Cat, A.P. Indy, Kingmambo, Giant's Causeway, and Fusaichi Pegasus sold yesterday (29 percent of the 170 yearlings sold). Storm Cat was the session's leading sire, with six sold of eight offered, averaging \$966,667--but another four were scratched. A.P. Indy had 10 through the ring, but only six sold, averaging \$887,500. Kingmambo sold nine of 10 offered, averaging lowest of the five--\$322,778--well below the session average. But expect a big day from him today. Unbridled's Song, who ended the day on a high note with the second-highest priced yearling of the session, had seven of eight sold, averaging \$737,142. Giant's Causeway had 17 sold of 21 through the ring, grossing over \$8.5-million, and averaging \$501,176; seven of the 17 made \$500,000 + . Fusaichi Pegasus sold 11 of 12 and nearly matched Giant's Causeway's average; his was \$483,636. Top North American second-crop sire Forestry had an overall good day; just six of nine sold, but those that did averaged \$460,000, including two expensive colts bought by Ferguson, and another by Eugene Melnyk.


