The Keeneland September sale reached new heights yesterday, when a colt by leading sire Storm Cat out of a half sister to another top stallion, A.P. Indy, realized a final bid \$8 million from leading Japanese trainer

Hideyuki Mori. Bidding on behalf of an undisclosed client or clients from the back ring, Mori went toe to toe with the heavyweights from Coolmore Stud through nearly 50 individual bids for the better part of 10 minutes and the two camps had the bidding to themselves after the final offering from

pavilion came at the \$3.7-million mark. "I've never heard it so quiet in here in my whole life," mused Cris Caldwell from the auctioneer stand. Bidding continued, at times in intervals of \$300,000, through the \$5-million plateau and then in \$100,000 increments. The bidding slowed appreciably as the \$7-million mark was eclipsed and, after Mori made his final winning bid a few minutes later, Caldwell announced that the competition was "walking away."

\$8-Million Keeneland Topper (cont. from p1)

The hammer fell and the \$8-million yearling left the ring to a richly deserved round of applause. The price tag was the richest in the history of the September sale and the fourth highest for any Keeneland sale. The last horse to bring more was Seattle Dancer, who sold for \$13.1 million at the July sale in 1985. "We didn't expect it to go that high," admitted Lane's End's Will Farish. "We knew the reception was phenomenal. We've probably never had a horse scoped so often. I was worried about his poor throat. But we knew he was going to do well. We thought he'd bring maybe four or five million dollars, but I certainly didn't think eight million. You never do think that. Any horse that you think is a million-dollar horse, I mean, how much more is he worth? Sometimes you hit a home run."

Record Colt is Bred in the Purple...

Hip 426 is a son of Storm Cat and is the first foal from Grade III winner Welcome Surprise (Seeking the Gold). The winner of the GIII Dogwood S. in 2000, Welcome Surprise is a daughter of the spectacular broodmare Weekend Surprise, making her a half sister to champion A.P. Indy, Summer Squall, GISP Weekend in Seattle and Honor Grades. Farish bred the colt in partnership with his long-time associate W.S. Kilroy. Of the sale's record colt, Farish said, "He had everything going for him. It's a wonderful sire line and it's a great individual. He's always looked like a good horse. He never went through a stage where he was gangly, like a lot of horses do." Welcome Surprise is again in foal to leading sire Storm Cat, and Farish said it was a match made in heaven. "If another stallion had fit her, I would have gone that way, but Storm Cat just fit her to a T--conformation-wise, pedigree-wise, crosses--we could go into that for hours. The mare was a medium-sized mare, very correct with wonderful knees--all the things that maybe go wrong with a Storm Cat from time to time. It was just one of those things that worked--she helped him and he helped her. He gave her a lot of scope and a lot of muscle. It all came together. Fortunately, she's back in foal to him."

Purchaser Cloaked in Mystery...

After making the winning bid, Mori promptly left the ring and sought solace in one of the Keeneland conference rooms, pursued by a gaggle of press. Several minutes later, officials from Keeneland reported that Mori did not wish to make public comment on the horse, nor did he wish to divulge the identity of the buyer. Mori took out his trainer's license in 1993 after being tutored by the late Tameo Toyama. After taking over a string of horses following his mentor's death, he saddled Legacy World to victory in the G1 Japan Cup. Mori has also trained the likes of Seeking the Pearl, who became the first Japanese-trained horse to win a European Group 1 event in the Prix Maurice de Gheest in 1998. He also trained the good sprinter Agnes World, winner of the G1 Darley July Cup in 2000, for owners Takao Watanabe and Teruya Yoshida.

(More from Keeneland) Mori Strikes Again...

Trainer Hideyuki Mori was back to work for hip 455, yet another well-bred son of Storm Cat. The bay colt is the first foal out of Bless (Mr. Prospector), an unraced full sister to Kentucky Derby winner Fusaichi Pegasus, who made her mark on this pavilion two years ago when she was purchased by David Plummer's ClassicStar LLC for \$4 million carrying this foal. Mori, bidding while on the cell phone from the identical location as he was for the sales-topper, was able to hold off the opposition, securing the colt for \$3.4 million from the consignment of Taylor Made Sales Agency. Showing an affinity for the family, as well as deep pockets, Mori also took home hip 442, a three-quarter brother to Fusaichi Pegasus, for \$1.8 million. By Seeking the Gold (Mr. Prospector), the bay colt is out of Angel Fever (Danzig), the dam of FuPeg and a full sister to Preakness winner Pine Bluff. The yearling was consigned by Stone Farm, as agent for Stone Farm and Stonerside Stable.

Dancin' the Mambo...

A Kingmambo full brother to the talented race mare and GISW Voodoo Dancer was hammered down to Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum to the tune of \$3.1 million, making him the third-highest priced lot on the afternoon. Hip 436, from the consignment of Dromoland Farm, agent for breeder Peter Blum, had drawn the attention of Sheikh Mohammed's bloodstock advisor, John Ferguson, well before the crowds flocked to the consignors' barns at Keeneland. "We had seen him a few times throughout the year at the farm," said Ferguson. "He was a very nice horse and was always going to be one of the most popular horses of this sale, and his sire has had tremendous success in Europe. He's an outstanding physical." Asked if the colt reminded him of Voodoo Dancer, Ferguson said, "No, not particularly. She was a smaller sort." Ferguson said the colt would likely be campaigned in Europe.

A Towering Success... (Keeneland September cont.)

Led into the ring as Hip 412, a dark bay daughter of Unbridled's Song attracted the top bid for a filly on the afternoon when Betty Moran's Brushwood Stable bid \$1.25 million for the Paramount Sales consignee. Bred by Gaines-Gentry Thoroughbreds and Thomas VanMeter in Kentucky, the filly is a half sister to top sprinter and \$2.1-million earner Affirmed Success, who counted the GI Carter H., GI Cigar Mile H. and GI Vosburgh S. among his 17 wins. Hip 412 is also a half to SP Rapunzell (Miswaki) and GSP Truman's Raider (Capote). Dam Towering Success (Irish Tower), a \$750,000 KEENOV purchase in 1998 by John R. Gaines Thoroughbreds, also produced Pasketty, a winning son of Storm Cat who made \$600,000 at the 2000 KEENOV sale.

Out of this World...

Bidding from the rear of the sales pavilion, bloodstock agent Demi O'Byrne went to \$1.9 million for hip 361, a British-bred colt from the first crop of the brilliant multiple Group 1 winner Galileo (Ire) (Sadler's Wells). "He's got a great walk, the same as the sire," said O'Byrne, who purchased the colt on behalf of John Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith. O'Byrne confirmed that the strapping British-bred bay would be returned to Europe to compete. Hip 361 is the third foal from the unraced Regina Maria (Unbridled), a half sister to MGSW Tejano Run. Runnymede Farm's Martin O'Dowd explained the rationale in choosing Galileo. "He was a tremendous racehorse and maybe the best conformed horse running in Europe for many years," he said. "We thought physically he would work well with the mare, that they would complement one another and it turns out that it did." Of the final price, O'Dowd added, "We liked the horse so much ourselves that we were not going to give him away. We were so high on this colt that we were willing to train and race it ourselves if we had to. I think it's the best horse we've ever brought to a sale." Regina Maria has a filly by Fantastic Light at her side and was bred this year to Singspiel prior to returning to the U.S. Her second foal, an Irish-bred colt by Giant's Causeway named Maillol, was knocked down at last year's September sale for \$875,000. The winning bidder that day? Dr. Demi O'Byrne.

Slew Fillies Prove Popular...

The pair of Book 1 fillies by the legendary Seattle Slew performed well during yesterday's second day of bidding. Hip 346, the second registered foal from MGSW Pleasant Temper (Storm Cat), was knocked down for \$950,000 to Roy and Gretchen Jackson's Lael Stables from the consignment of Eaton Sales, acting as agent for WinStar Farm. It was the third purchase for the Jacksons, who also bought the Storm Cat three-quarter sister to Habibti on Monday and a filly by War Chant--Little Sister (Valid Appeal) yesterday. The husband and wife team, based in Unionville, Pennsylvania, were especially pleased with the Seattle Slew filly. "For some reason we seem to have a lot of horses that run on the grass, so hopefully we have one here that can do it on the main track," Roy Jackson commented. "We hope she'll join the broodmare band and we'll have some nice foals down the road. She's very nice physically and she didn't have any problems vetting-wise and we thought she was a very nice individual. We probably paid a premium for her, being one of the last Seattle Slews, but we're happy to have her." B. Wayne Hughes, surprisingly quiet during the select sessions, secured hip 391, for \$800,000 from the Lane's End consignment. The bay is a daughter of Ski Dancer (Baldski), a two-time graded stakes winner and twice placed in Grade I company. She was bred by Frank and Laura Jane Lyons' Summerwind Farm, which also saw its colt by Pulpit--Mountain Girl (Mountain Cat) sell earlier in the day for \$900,000. The final Seattle Slew filly, a daughter of Plaintiff (Seeking the Gold) sells today as hip 687.

Fiji Colt to Coolmore...

Bidding on behalf of the team of Michael Tabor and John Magnier, Demi O'Byrne signed the ticket on the first seven-figure offering on the second day of selling. Hip 264, the colt by the late Danehill out of champion U.S. turf mare Fiji (GB) (Rainbow Quest), was consigned by Eaton Sales on behalf of Betty Moran, who acquired the mare carrying this foal for \$3.1 million at the 2002 Keeneland November sale. The bay colt fell to Team Coolmore for \$1.5 million. "A lovely horse and he's by my favorite stallion," said O'Byrne of the colt. "He's a very good example of his sire." The consignor of the colt was equally pleased with the results. "He's a nice horse and anytime a horse makes over a million, you have to be happy," said Eaton Sales' Reiley Mc-Donald. "We raised him at Eaton Farms here in Kentucky, he's always been solid as a rock and has a great attitude. He was a farm favorite." Fiji has a colt by Storm Cat for 2004 and is back in foal to the Overbrook stallion.

Close....But Not Quite a Sale...

The bidding was lively on hip 405, the full brother to One Cool Cat, who topped the 2002 Keeneland July sale at \$3.1 million. Accelerating quickly to the \$1million level and beyond, the bidding stalled out at \$1.6 million and the dark bay was led out of the sales pavilion unsold, having failed to meet his reserve. "We were close [to selling]," said Doug Cauthen of WinStar Farm, which bred the colt, "but when you believe in a horse, you have to back that horse and put a number on him. We like to sell our horses and we certainly liked him as much as we did his brother. The market determines what the value is and we made a decision about what we were looking for. He was one of the top horses in the sale, so we'll just have to regroup." Cauthen indicated that it was likely that he'd try to put together a partnership to race the colt.

Sale Exceeds Expectations...

"What has happened this year is indescribable," admitted Keeneland's Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell after a day of very brisk business. "It's way past any high expectations we had. It didn't look, going into the sale, the top end would increase by the 19.6 percent it did today, or 11 percent over the first two days. There were no indicators that would happen. But we're very pleased it happened here at Keeneland. There was a Japanese successful bidder, an Irish underbidder--we're the global world economy to buy yearlings." During yesterday's session, Keeneland sold 18 yearlings for seven figures. Through two days of the marathon 14-day auction, 349 yearlings have sold for \$150,648,000. The twoday average is \$431,656--up 11.5 percent from a year ago--and the median is up 13 percent to \$260,000. The sale continues today at 10 a.m.

What They're Saying At The Sales...

Geoffrey Russell, Director of Sales:

"I think that Lane's End brought a very strong group of horses here, highlighted by an exceptional individual. I mean, he was the horse. He was the stallion pedigree. Physically, he was superior. And he proved the point. It was the highest price we've sold since we sold the world record yearling for \$13.1 million. When all the stars align, when a consignor brings a good horse to the market, with a pedigree that everybody wants, you can't guess what it's going to bring. Some years, it doesn't bring as much as this, but this year, that's what two people wish it to bring. That's why we come to the market place."

NEW YORK

MidAtlantic Co-Op/NYRA Fail to Reach Accord:

The MidAtlantic Cooperative has announced that it will cease to offer simulcasts of Belmont Park fall racing meeting, effective today after the group, which represents 19 racetracks and their off-track facilities and account wagering services, failed to reach an agreement with the New York Racing Association. In a statement, Martin Lieberman, Mid-Atlantic's executive director, said that NYRA refused to permit the Cooperative's member tracks to continue account wagering on the NYRA signal, except on a limited basis in Pennsylvania and New Jersey, because NYRA had conveyed the rights to account wagering on its signal in other states to TVG. "This is not an economic dispute," Lieberman said. "We want all of our members to be able to offer their fans account wagering on the NYRA races in the MidAtlantic region. NYRA, through its deal with TVG, has acted to limit wagering opportunities. Our members are in agreement, this is unacceptable and not in the best interests of racing fans in the region." The MidAtlantic Cooperative tracks include Pimlico, Laurel, Philadelphia Park, Charles Town, Delaware Park, Meadowlands, Monmouth Park and Suffolk Downs.

Seattle Fitz Seeking Rebound:

West Point Thoroughbred's Seattle Fitz (Arg) (Fitzcarraldo {Arg}) breezed a half-mile in :49 4/5 over the Oklahoma training track at Saratoga yesterday. Winner of the GII Brooklyn H., the five-year-old was a disappointing ninth in the GI Whitney H. last out Aug. 7, but will be looking to make amends in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup Oct. 2 at Belmont. "[The workout] was beautiful, he seems to be back to where he was this spring," said trainer Kiaran McLaughlin. "We are going to take dead aim on the Jockey Club."
