#### ROSEY OUTLOOK FOR KC CLASSIC

Undefeated in four starts this year, Roses in May (Devil His Due) will be the heavy favorite to run his



winning streak to five in the GII Kentucky Cup Classic H. at Turfway Park this afternoon. The four-year-old looked promising last season, winning a Saratoga allowance test by 10 1/2 lengths, but went to the bench after finishing sixth in the GII Jerome H. at Belmont. He Roses in May Adam Coglianese returned with a breath-taking

12-length triumph in a Keeneland allowance Apr. 17 and has been perfect since, wiring the field in an optional claimer at Churchill May 21 and in the GIII Cornhusker Breeders' Cup H. at Prairie Meadows July 3, where he bested Perfect Drift by 1 1/2 lengths. The dark bay stepped up to the Grade I level in his latest and, after dueling through furious fractions, outgamed Perfect Drift to the wire to take the Aug. 7 Whitney H. at Saratoga by a nose. "He's been doing real good," trainer Dale Romans reported. "He came out of the Whitney with no problems and he is ready to go." At 1-2 on the morning line, Roses in May looks a lock in the Classic, but trainer Cole Norman is hoping to pull off the upset with Pie N Burger (Twining). The six-year-old gelding has won three of his last four starts, including the Aug. 14 Evangeline Downs Mile H., but bids for his first graded success. "I know this race may be a notch or two above the caliber of races my horse is exiting, but he's been training great and we figured why not take a chance and see what happens?" trainer Cole Norman said.

#### FOUR IN A ROE?

Vinnie Roe (Ire) (Definite Article (GB)) rewrote the history books becoming the first horse to three-peat in the G1 Irish Field St Leger S. at The Curragh 12 months ago and looks a prime candidate to add a fourth tomorrow. The six-year-old shaped with promise when runnerup in the Listed Ballyroan S. over an inadequate mile and a half at Leopardstown last time Aug. 15 and will appreciate the extra quarter mile here. "Any rain we get will suit Vinnie Roe," trainer Dermot Weld, who guided Vintage Crop (GB) to two successes in this race in 1993-1994, told the Racing Post. "He has had an interrupted season, but I've been satisfied with him since his last run at Leopardstown last month." The admirable six-year-old, who also counts a G1 Prix Royal-Oak victory and placings in the G1 Ascot Gold Cup and G1 Melbourne Cup in his impressive resume, faces the largest field since 1966. #### FROM THE DESK OF ...

#### **MAJOR YEARLING SALES UP 15 PERCENT**

At the end of Thursday's Keeneland September session, there had been 1,386 yearlings sold (a healthy 76 percent of the 1,818 offered, and 6 percent more than last year) at the major North American yearling sales so far this year: Fasig July, Saratoga and Keeneland September Books 1-2. These sales all had six-figure averages--over \$100,000. This year's best 1,386 yearlings have grossed \$316,068,000, averaging \$228,043.

At the corresponding sales and sessions last year, the 1,313 yearlings grossed \$274,682,000 and averaged \$209,202. The number sold was up 6 percent, gross was up 15 percent and average rose 9 percent. Whichever figure you decide best represents the overall market, it is up, certainly around 10 percent from last year, and for that there are no doubt a lot of happy (and relieved) horse farmers. Interestingly, the number of seven-figure sales yearlings is down marginally, from 32 to 31, but the highest price of the century (\$8 million) was up 18 percent from the previous high of \$6.8 million (Tasmanian Tiger in 2000), and the number of '6 1/2-figure yearlings' (\$500,000-\$1 million) this year was also up 15 percent, from 86 to 99. All in all, I call the market up pretty close to 15 percent.

Of course, often things are not as good as they look, and a measurable rise in stud fees from the time these horses were produced shows us why the market just about has to go up every year. Take a look at the box comparing the stud fees paid with the average prices of the yearlings produced by those covers:

It shows that the average price paid for September 2004 yearlings has been 5.10 times their "production-cost" stud fees--those presumably really paid, i.e. their advertised 2002 fee. This 5.10 multiple is 16 percent higher than the comparative multiple for September 2003 yearlings, which on average sold for 4.41 times their stud fees. But look: when you made the comparison, last year, between "production-cost" stud fees (2001) and current-year stud fees (2003), they were almost the same: 4.41 vs. 4.50--stud fees had actually decreased by 2 percent.

But the fall from a 5.10 "production-cost" multiple to a 4.29 current-year stud fee actually means 2004 stud fees were 16 percent higher than in 2002--effectively cancelling out much of the 16 percent increase in the multiple from the 2003 sales to the 2004 sales. Yearlings sold for 16 percent higher, on average, this year than last year, but this statistic shows that stud fees had increased by 16 percent. If the stud fee is half the cost of production of the yearling, say, that halves the net profit increase from 16 percent to 8 percent.

This statistic tells us that half this year's increases were eaten up by stud fees--and that, by inference, when the market is static or falls, stud fee increases exacerbate the losses.

As far as sires were concerned, there weren't huge changes between the end of Book 1 and the end of Book 2, although, surprisingly perhaps, Monarchos snuck in ahead of Point Given and Tiznow as leading first-year sire on average. That was with 10 sold (of 11 offered), however, which have averaged \$218,400. Point Given has had 24 sell (of 26 offered), for an average of \$190,292, and Tiznow is at 26 sold from 35 offered, an average of \$177,962. Point Given has only 10 left to sell, whereas the other two still have 20-some left; the likelihood is they will finish: 1-Point Given; 2-Tiznow; 3-Monarchos.

The top seven sires, on average, after Tuesday are still the top seven today, though those with Book 2 yearlings (all but <u>A.P. Indy</u> and <u>Danzig</u>) experienced drops in their average. **Oppenheim cont p.10**

# RINGSIDE... with Alan Carasso

#### **MAGNIFICENT MIDDLE**

All the major players were here--from Demi O'Byrne, to Sheikh Mohammed, from Aaron Jones to Sheikh Hamdan, from Stan Fulton to the surprise participation in the upper reaches of the Japanese and trainer Hideyuki Mori bidding on behalf of who knows who. The \$8-million Storm Cat colt secured the fate of the top of the market, which posted gains in gross receipts of nearly 15 percent, 11.5 percent in the average and 13 percent for the median. Sensational any way you slice it.

As selective as that part of the market proved, several buyers used to playing at that level were squeezed out and looked to Book 2 to fill their coffers. The results were equally impressive. For days three and four of the marathon sale, 549 horses were sold for gross receipts of \$81,095,000, an increase of nearly 25 percent from last year. This year's Book 2 average price of \$147,714 improved on last year's figure by 17.5 percent. The list of buyers who were most active Wednesday and Thursday reads like a who's who of Thoroughbred racing--John Oxley, Jerry and Ann Moss, Gary and Mary West (Ben Glass, agent), Bob LaPenta (White Horse Stable) and B. Wayne Hughes. There was also new and newer money from people like Kendall-Jackson Winery owner Jess Jackson, the Castletop Stable of Mort and Bobbi Topfer and the My Meadowview Farm, owned by Barnes and Noble Bookstore founder Leonard Riggio. The attached chart is indicative of the depth of the middle market and the relative difficulty of buying horses at the top of that particular market.

#### Atlanta Equine Import-Export Complex to be Closed:

Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport will close the Atlanta Equine Complex Nov. 5, which has served as an export-import facility for horses, according to an American Horse Council press release. All exports that have been accepted at the facility through Oct. 30 will continue to be served and if a facility within 60 miles of the airport can be approved as an export inspection facility, exports through Atlanta could resume. "The Atlanta facility was granted temporary status allowing permanent entry horses to enter the U.S. through it," said Jay Hickey, American Horse Council president. "This was necessary to handle the overflow from USDA's quarantine stations in New York and Miami when import demand is very high."
