STRONG HOPE RETIRED

Multiple graded stakes winner **Strong Hope** (Grand Slam--Shining Through, by Deputy Minister) has been retired from racing after wrenching an ankle in the stretch run of the Sept. 4 GI Forego H. The four-year-

old will enter stud next year at the Hancock family's Claiborne Farm in Paris, Kentucky. A stud fee has not yet been announced. "This is a horse that has it all," said Todd Pletcher, who trained Strong Hope for Eugene and Laura Melnyk. "He is grand looking and his tactical speed always made him a serious threat--he was very consistent and ran a

great race every time." Purchased for \$1.7 million at the 2001 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga August sale, Strong Hope won last summer's GII Dwyer S. before defeating Empire Maker to win the GII Jim Dandy. He ended his sophomore campaign with a third-place effort in the GI Travers S. This season, the handsome bay was second in the GI Carter H. and third in the GI Metropolitan H. On the board in nine of 11 starts, Strong Hope retires with six wins and earnings of \$767,460. "We are thrilled to have Strong Hope coming to Claiborne Farm," said farm president Seth Hancock. "He is an outstanding individual, an extremely talented racehorse-and he's from a female family that includes important sires EI Gran Senor and Try My Best."

ARCH FILLY TOPS KEENELAND MONDAY

A filly by GI Super Derby winner Arch topped yesterday's session of the Keeneland September Yearling Sale in Lexington. Consigned by Claiborne Farm, agent, the dark bay yearling sold for \$190,000 to bloodstock agent John McCormack. The filly is out of the graded stakes placed Kalosca (Fr) (Kaldoun). Through the first seven sessions of the September auction, Keeneland has sold 1,711 yearlings for a total of \$285,579,700. The average of \$166,908 is up 13.8 percent from a year ago, while the median is up 20 percent to \$90,000. The 14-day sale continues this morning at 10 a.m.



Elvstroem, winner of the G1 Victoria Derby, sat in sixth early before creeping up to take the lead, while Brad Rawiller aboard She's Archie launched a sustained attack from the 300 meters, but Elvstroem responded to his rider's strong urging to post a 1 1/4-length victory. "This was a very big task, given the circumstances, he has not settled in to Melbourne as well as I would have liked, and he is a touch on the fresh side. If he comes out the race safe and sound and in good order, I will be happy," said trainer Tony Vasil, who indicated that the G1 Caulfield Cup was Elvstroem's main goal, but he would not rule out a tilt at the G1 Cox Plate. Nine-time Group 1 winner Northerly (Aus) (Serheed), who finished fourth at his comeback race Sept. 11, failed to display his customary dominance this time, enduring a buffeting mid-race and holding his position to finish midfield. Wild Iris (Aus) (Spectrum {Ire}), who ran on late to grab sixth place, confirmed her position at the top of the market for the Caulfield Cup and, in turn, delighted her trainer Guy Walter, who said, "She has never shown much form until she gets to 2000 or 2400 metres, so to see her finish off like that was encouraging in such a high-class race."

Anyone lucky enough to have attended Darley's lavish stallion parade at Dalham Hall two years ago received a present as they left. This present, a book entitled "Dubai Millennium: the horse that made jockeys jump for joy," retold the story of Sheikh Mohammed's great favorite, who had been struck down by grass sickness at the end of April 2001.

In Lydia Hislop's review of Dubai Millennium's story, she commented that: "The prosaic can note the £30-million insurance payment on Dubai Millennium's death-second in size only to that for Alydar in bloodstock history--went to good use. Sheikh Mohammed funded a special research study in Dubai to investigate the causes and potential treatments for grass sickness.

"He also set about acquiring many of the 56 foals Dubai Millennium sired in his first and only season. Having already announced his determination to find 'another great horse,' his touchstone's first crop would seem the logical place to start."

The book included photographs of all 56 foals, while pointing out that 17 were out of Group 1 winners; that 11 were half brothers or half sisters to Group 1 winners; and that six were out of champions or classic winners. The final telling statistic was that 53 of the 56 were out of mares who either won a stakes race or had produced a stakes winner.

So how could this very well-bred horse fail to leave his mark as a stallion? Unfortunately bloodstock history is full of examples of champion racehorses who failed to make the grade despite being very strongly supported on their retirement. Indeed, Dalham Hall has been home to several of them, including the dazzling Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner Arazi, the Derby, King George and St Leger winner Reference Point and the Derby, King George and Arc winner Lammtarra.

I am pleased to say that Dubai Millennium is shaping up very well, to the extent that he now heads the freshman sires' table in Britain and Ireland. He notched up his sixth winner in Britain yesterday, when Quickfire landed a maiden race at Kempton, and the previous day saw his son Dubawi--already winner of the G3 Superlative S.--take the Dunnes Stores National S. to become his first Group 1 winner.

"To have a son of Dubai Millennium win a Group 1 is a great day for Godolphin and he is now very much a Classic prospect for next year," said Godolphin's racing manager, Simon Crisford.

Godolphin currently lists 28 of Dubai Millennium's juveniles among the horses in training with Saeed bin Suroor at Newmarket. Eighteen of them are colts and as many as 16 of these 18 have been entered for next year's Derby, along with seven of bin Suroor's Dubai Millennium fillies. Altogether, 29 Dubai Millenniums hold the Derby engagement, one particularly interesting colt being Echo of Light. This so-far-unraced colt, who holds Group 1 engagements this fall, was one of only three Dubai Millenniums to sell at auction as yearlings. John Ferguson paid €1,200,000 for this colt, whose dam Spirit of Tara is a sister to the triple classic winner Salsabil. Godolphin also snapped up Dubai Millennium's Cloelia filly who achieved the year's second-highest price--1,200,000gns--at the European yearling sales.

Of course it comes as no surprise that Dubai Millennium is doing well. He did, after all, win four Group 1 races by a total of over 22 lengths to earn a Timeform rating of 140. Then there's the fact that he is by <u>Seeking the Gold</u>, a stallion with a growing reputation as a sire of sires. *Cont. p. 5*

Seeking the Gold's reputation as a sire of sires is based largely on the achievements of Lady Tak's sire Mutakddim and Island Fashion's sire Petionville, both of whom have an Average Earnings Index well in advance of their Comparative Index. They may eventually be surpassed by another Seeking the Gold stallion, Cape Town, whose daughter Susan's Angel took Saturday's GIII Turfway Breders' Cup S. This filly follows Bird Town and Capeside Lady as her sire's third graded winner from his first two crops.

It is worth remembering that Dubai Millennium himself made only one appearance at two, when he ran away with a maiden race at Yarmouth at the end of October, and that he was at his best at four. The chances are that the best is also yet to come from many of his progeny, including Dubawi. The National S. winner is out of Zomaradah, another who raced only once at the back-end of her juvenile season, and his broodmare sire Deploy came into the same category.

A look at Zomaradah's background reveals why Frankie Dettori is hopeful that Dubawi will provide him with that very elusive first success in the Derby. Deploy ranks alongside the dual Derby winner Commander In Chief and the Derby second Dushyantor as one of the notable stayers produced by that exceptional broodmare Slightly Dangerous. Deploy would have won the 1990 Irish Derby but for the presence in the field of the filly Salsabil, who beat him by three-quarter lengths. Deploy might well have gone on to win the St Leger, had he not strained a tendon.

Deploy has proved a strong influence for stamina, with his mature stock having an average winning distance of 11.5 furlongs. Zomaradah became Deploy's only Group 1 winner when she won the Oaks d'Italia over 1 3/8 miles and she went on to further group-race successes in Canada (E.P. Taylor S.), Ireland and Italy. The fact that Deploy was a half brother to Commander In Chief encouraged breeders to send him a few mares by Commander In Chief's brilliant sire, Dancing Brave. One of them was Zomaradah's dam, Jawaher. Another incentive for sending Jawaher to Deploy was provided by the fact that Deploy's sire Shirley Heights had already sired a top-class filly from her family. It was Shirley Heights' mating with Zomaradah's third dam, Sunbittern, which resulted in High Hawk, a Group 1 winner who numbered the excellent In The Wings among her four group winners.

This strategy produced another major dividend when Zomaradah's second dam, the successful stayer High Tern, was mated to Shirley Heights' son High Estate. This time the outcome was High-Rise, who won the Derby 13 days after Zomaradah's classic success in Italy. There is also a Dubai Millennium colt called Bahar Shumaal out of High Spirited, a sister to High Hawk with two group winners to her credit. Trained by Clive Brittain, he's another with a Derby entry.

It was in the 1999 Derby, of course, that Dubai Millennium suffered the only defeat of his career and he was never again asked to tackle more than a mile and a quarter. As he was fast enough to win two of Europe's most competitive mile events, the Prix Jacques le Marois and Queen Elizabeth II S., there must be a good chance that Dubawi will also be effective over a mile early next year. But whatever he achieves in the 2000 Guineas, he can be expected to do even better once the distances lengthen. As Simon Crisford says, the dream lives on.

OUIJA WAITING Lord Derby's dual Oaks-winning Ouija Board (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}) remains a possible runner for the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp Oct. 3 although she may point to the GI Flower Bowl International at Belmont Park one day earlier if the ground in France is deemed unsuitable. "[The Arc] remains a possibility. The trials were inconclusive and the owner's keen to have a go, but it will depend on the ground," commented conditioner Ed Dunlop, who withdrew the sophomore from the G1 Yorkshire Oaks at York Aug. 18 due to the prevalent soft going. Dunlop continued, "There is another option, she's been entered in a race in America called the Flower Bowl, which we won with Lailani [in 2001]. If the ground came up very soft [in France] it's on the same weekend [as the Arc] and we would give that serious consideration as well. [In the case of] decent ground, we'll more than likely go for the Arc. If we chose not to go to America and stay on slow ground to run in France, we will then probably revert to the [G1] Prix de I'] Opera. I believe that in the next couple of days there's going to be some rain in Paris [and] then it's meant to be dry, let's hope it stays that way." Famed for being her owner's only horse in training, Ouija Board, who was supplemented for her G1 Epsom Oaks success at Epsom June 4, added the G1 Irish equivalent at The Curragh July 18. Regular partner Kieren Fallon may not be available for the Arc and the trainer added, "In the Opera [Fallon] may be available. Various jockeys have been ringing this morning, but if we run in the Arc we'll have to look elsewhere. No decision has been made yet, we've approached a few jockeys and I'll discuss it with the owner and see where we go."





This year's G1 Coronation S. runner-up Majestic Desert (GB) (Fraam {GB}) and last year's G2 Premio Regina Elena (Italian 1000 Guineas) scorer Golden Nepi (Ire) (Revoque {Ire}) are others to advertise the value on offer at this auction. All graduates are eligible for the €300,000 Tattersalls Breeders S. run at The Curragh in August. Stallions such as Cape Cross (Ire), Danehill Dancer (Ire), Fasliyev, Grand Lodge, Night Shift and Pivotal (GB) are represented alongside freshmans Bertolini, Kalanisi (Ire), Mozart (Ire) and Mull of Kintyre. The latter is responsible for hip 101, a half sister to this year's Tattersalls Breeders S. winner Beaver Patrol (Ire) from Corrin Stud. SINGING THE BLUES

Team Godolphin conditioner Saeed bin Suroor remains hopeful that recent G1 Juddmonte International winner Sulamani (Ire) (Hernando {Fr}) is still on target for Europe's end-of-season showpiece. The five-time Group 1 winner is quoted the 4-1 ante-post pick by British bookmakers William Hill. "The horse is back in training, he's trained well and I'm happy so far," said bin Suroor, adding, "We will need to see him before we decide [on plans]. I'll talk to Sheikh Mohammed, Simon [Crisford] and the team. If we're happy with the horse, then we'll take him to the Arc. He came back a little bit quiet [from the Juddmonte], but now he's well, he's a class horse. We'll see, we'll keep our options open between him and Doyen and Mamool [although] they are different horses. If we are happy with them we will send them. We'll keep our options for all our horses. It's a tough race, it is hard to win the Arc."

KEMPTON ABANDONED

Racing at Kempton was abandoned before the last race Monday due to unsafe track conditions. Jockeys Jamie Mackay and Francis Norton escaped injury when their mounts, Hasty Prince (GB) (Halling) and Larkwing (Ire) (Ela-Mana-Mou {Ire}), slipped and fell at the exit of the backstretch during the penultimate race of the day, a 12-furlong conditions event, and the closing 20-runner maiden was canceled after an inspection by course officials, trainers and jockeys. "We sanded all the bends before racing, but the [good-to-firm] ground became greasy after two millimeters of rain fell earlier in the day," explained Clerk of the Course Brian Clifford. "We did have concerns before racing but, in the interests of safety, you have got to be careful. There's nothing more we could do and it's very disappointing. When something like that happens, you have got to act on it and you have got to make the right decision."


