#### RUSSIAN RHYTHM RETIRED

Cheveley Park Stud's brilliant Russian Rhythm (Kingmambo--Balistroika, by Nijinsky II) has been retired after a series of setbacks which have kept her out of

action since May. Her connections made the retirement decision when the four-yearold failed to satisfy in her recent work ahead of a possible tilt at next Saturday's G1 Sun Chariot S. at Newmarket. That was due to be her first run since winning the G1 Lockinge S. at Newbury May 15, after which she had strained a suspensory liga-

ment. "We have been fortunate enough to have been associated with such a talented filly who, of late, has experienced some stiffness," explained the Newmarket Stud's Managing Director Chris Richardson yesterday. "All those involved with her played a significant role in her success." At two, Russian Rhythm captured the G3 Princess Margaret S. and G2 Lowther S. before finishing runner-up to Airwave (GB) in the G1 Cheveley Park S. She returned to beat Six Perfections (Fr) in the G1 1000 Guineas and Soviet Song (Ire) in the G1 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot. She also took the G1 Nassau S. and finished second to Falbrav (Ire) in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S., but had just one outing in 2004, her victorious run in the Lockinge. Her record stands at 10-7-2-0, with earnings of \$1,260,634. Jockey Kieren Fallon yesterday described her as "one of the best fillies I have ever ridden." He added, "She had bags of class, and look what she did to Soviet Song when they met." Trainer Sir Michael Stoute described her as "a wonderful specimen," adding that "we will miss her." Bred in Pennsylvania by Brushwood Stable, the chestnut sold for \$370,000 as a weanling at Keeneland November and went through the ring the following year at the Tattersalls Houghton Sale, selling for 440,000gns. Her second dam Balidaress (Ire) (Balidar {Ire}) is the ancestress of numerous top performes, including Group 1 winners Desirable (Ire), Shadayid, Park Appeal (Ire), Diktat (GB), Cape Cross (Ire) and Alydaress.

## KEENELAND BREAKS RECORD ON DAY EIGHT

It took just eight sessions for the Keeneland September sale to surpass its all-time record for gross receipts, as lively action in the ring yesterday helped set a new standard of \$297,266,400. The previous record was set in 2000, when 3,313 horses were sold through 12 sessions for a gross of \$291,827,100. A total of 1,987 horses have been sold during the current stand. Explaining the auction's success, Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell said, "We believe the middle of the sale has widened. People are just breeding to the middle more than they are to the top. There is a lot of money, but people are comfortable spending money in this range." Leading the way Tuesday was hip 2859, who was knocked down to Gulf Coast Farm for \$350,000 from the consignment of agent John Williams. The son of Maria's Mon is the first foal out of the unraced Carson City mare City Gold, a half sister to top sire Storm Cat. Action resumes today at 10 a.m. Keeneland Stats, p2

Trainer James Fanshawe confirmed he was "looking forward" to the mile contest, which has drawn a stellar field including Godolphin's G1 Queen Anne S. and G1 Eclipse S. winner Refuse to Bend (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid al Maktoum's G1 2000 Guineas hero Haafhd (GB) (Alhaarth {Ire}) and Gary Tanaka's G1 Prince of Wales's S. victor Rakti (GB) (Polish Precedent). "She did a piece of work on Tuesday morning and she seems fine after that," Fanshawe said of the filly, who will be looking to add to her three successes in the G1 Falmouth S. at Newmarket July 6, G1 Sussex S. at Goodwood July 28 and last Saturday's G1 Matron S. at Leopardstown. "She has come out of the race well and the only worry is that it comes quite quick," he added.

He could fare no better than sixth on heavy ground in the G2 Grand Prix de Deauville last time Aug. 29, but showed he retained his ability back on his favored conditions here. Reserved in rear throughout the early stages, he made steady progress to challenge inside the final three furlongs and hit the front with 11/2 furlongs remaining. He was made to battle by Marshall in the closing stages, but dug deep in customary fashion to hold sway at the line. "He could go for the G1 Gran Premio del Jockey Club [in Milan Oct. 17] and G1 Premio Roma [Nov. 7], before going back to Hong Kong for the G1 Cup [Dec. 12]," commented trainer Marc Rolland. It was around 17 years ago, in his book "Quest For A Classic Winner," that author Ken McLean suggested that combining Storm Bird and Nijinsky II would be a very effective technique in years to come. The logic was that these two sons of Northern Dancer were bred on the same cross; Storm Bird out of a mare by New Providence, and Nijinsky II out of mare by New Providence's sire Bull Page.

The prophecy took some time to outwork itself, and it wasn't until 1996--nearly 10 years later--when Chalee (by Storm Bird and with a third dam by Nijinsky II) captured a two-year-old Listed race in Australia, that the cross produced a stakes winner in a major racing country. *Alan Porter cont. p5*

There were two more stakes winners with the combination the following year, and with Storm Bird's son Storm Cat becoming a prolific sire and sire of sires, the trickle soon turned into a flood. Now there are at least 56 unrestricted stakes winners, 26 of them group or grade, and 10 Group or Grade I winners with Storm Bird and Nijinsky II combined in their pedigrees, including such well-known runners as Black Minnaloushe, High Yield, Madcap Escapade, Nebraska Tornado, Golden Ballet and Tale of the Cat.

While the Storm Cat line has benefited particularly well from the presence of Nijinsky II, the cross has also worked very well through a Storm Bird daughter, Line of Thunder, the dam of Thunder Gulch. Spain, heroine of the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff and the one-time leading earning U.S. filly or mare, was a member of Thunder Gulch's first crop and had a third dam by Nijinsky II. From Thunder Gulch's first Australian crop came Shot of Thunder, a Grade I winner out of a mare by Nijinsky II's son, Copper Kingdom. Shop Till You Drop, a Grade I placed stakes winner from Thunder Gulch's third crop has a second dam by a son of Nijinsky II, and stakes winner Delta Sensation, who is from his fifth crop, is out of a mare by Baldski. Now Thunder Gulch has another extremely impressive runner bred on the pattern in the shape of Sense of Style, undefeated winner of the GII Spinaway S. and GI Matron S., who is out of a mare by Nijinsky II's son, King's Lake.

Incidentally, while Thunder Gulch may have benefited from the Storm Bird/Nijinsky II combination, it should not be inferred that he is reliant on it. In addition to Spain, his first crop also contained graded scorers C'Est I'Amour and Veil of Avalon; his second crop included Horse of the Year Point Given, GI CCA Oaks heroine Tweedside and graded winners Thunder Bertie, Mystic Lady and Stylish. His current four-year-old crop was conceived in Japan, and Sense of Style is from the first crop of mares whom he covered following Spain's triumphant three-year-old campaign.

Sense of Style's victory gave her dam the distinction of being first or second dam of group/graded stakes winners on three different continents. Save Me the

Waltz became a classic producer when her Be My Guest daughter, Valentine Waltz, captured the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches-the French 1000 Guineas after finishing third in the G1 English 1000 Guineas, and Save Me the Waltz's daughter Bal des Sirenes (by Warning) won once in France at two, before being exported to Australia, where she extended the family's fame by producing Britt's Best, a Danehill gelding whose victories included the G3 Frederick Clissold S.

Save Me the Waltz herself raced in France. She only started four times, winning once at two, and earning black-type with a third in the Prix Amandine, but she is half sister to another horse with a cosmopolitan reputation in the shape of Last Tycoon. Champion sprinter in England and France, Last Tycoon caused a surprise when capturing the GI Breeders' Cup Mile on his only U.S. outing. Last Tycoon has subsequently enjoyed a distinguished stud career in Europe, Australia and Japan, getting at least 17 Group and Grade I winners.

Mill Princess, the dam of Save Me the Waltz and Last Tycoon, has produced several other notable winners, including The Perfect Life, a group-winning sister to Last Tycoon; Astronef, the co-highweighted sprinter in Germany; as well as the listed winning Sadler's Wells fillies Side of Paradise and Flowerdrum. Her Caerleon filly, Zelda, a three-parts sister to Save Me the Waltz, was only a minor winner in France, but is dam of the group-winning two-year-olds Zipping and Zelding. Zipping is by Zafonic, like Thunder Gulch, by a son of Mr. Prospector out of a mare by a son of Northern Dancer, and so bred rather like Sense of Style.

Although the most notable descendents of Mill Princess have been speedy, she owns a classic mile-and-a-half pedigree. She is by G1 English Derby winner Mill Reef, is half sister to G1 Irish Derby winner Irish Ball and is out of a sister to Irish Oaks winner Lynchris. Another half sister is Irish Bird, who owns a remarkable breeding record, as she is dam of G1 Irish and G1 French Derby winner Assert; G1 French Derby winner Bikala; and Eurobird, heroine of the G1 Irish St. Leger. With a GI Kentucky Derby and GI Belmont S. winner as a sire, this background should see Sense of Style continue to improve as she stretches out.

#### **DUBAWI HAS GUINEAS DATE**

Godolphin's impressive G1 National S. winner **Dubawi** (Ire) (Dubai Millennium {GB}) will now head to Dubai in preparation for his three-year-old campaign, it was confirmed yesterday. Racing Manager Simon Crisford described the juvenile as "very well indeed" after his three-length defeat of Berenson (Ire) in Sunday's sevenfurlong contest at The Curragh. He revealed that the G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket next May will be his first target before he is prepared for the G1 Epsom Derby. "We believe he is a top-notch prospect for next year and he will go to winter in Dubai," he explained. "We'll run him in the Guineas straight off the plane."

#### **GODOLPHIN BUY PEPPERSTORM**

Godolphin have purchased Germany's leading three-year-old miler **Pepperstorm (Ger)** (Big Shuffle) from Manfred Hellwig in a deal brokered by agent Börje Olsson. Campaigned by Uwe Ostmann, the colt counts the G3 Globetrotter-Meile at Cologne Aug. 1 and G2 Oettingen-Rennen at Baden Baden Aug. 31 among his five career successes from nine starts.

#### **DEPORTIVO TO THE NATIONAL STUD**

Khalid Abdullah has sold the sprinter **Deportivo (GB)** (Night Shift--Valencia {GB}, by Kenmare {Fr}) to stand at the National Stud in Newmarket. Trained by Roger Charlton to win last year's Listed Richard H Faught S. and G2 Flying Five at The Curragh, the four-year-old made an unsuccessful trip to Sha Tin for the G1 Hong Kong Sprint and has not raced since that December outing. The National Stud's General Manager Reid Coulter described Deportivo as "a strikingly good-looking horse with size, scope, bone and depth." His stud fee will be £3,500.

FREEDMAN STARS OUT Melbourne trainer Lee Freedman is chasing his 100th Group 1 win this spring, but the elusive benchmark won't come from dual Oaks winner Special Harmony (Aus) (Spinning World), who will undergo surgery after chipping her right knee. Special Harmony, who has amassed \$A1.8-million in prizemoney with 10 wins from 20 starts, was third in the G1 Underwood S. won by Elvstroem (Aus) at Caulfield on Sunday. "Her spring is over," said Freedman. "The diagnosis confirmed suspicions that something had to be wrong." Freedman is also concerned that Caulfield Cup winner Mummify (Aus) (Jeune {GB}) has not returned to top form. "We're battling with him," the conditioner added. "It might be that he hasn't come up after the tough campaigns he had last spring and in the autumn." But the trainer still has stable standouts Makybe Diva (GB) (Desert King {Ire}) and Alinghi (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}) to lead his spring charge. Melbourne Cup victress Makybe Diva will target the A\$500,000 Turnbull S. at Flemington Oct. 2, while Alinghi, third in Sunday's Dubai Racing Club Cup, will be set for either the A\$1-million Caulfield Guineas Oct. 9 or the A\$500,000 Thousand Guineas Oct. 13.

**DIRT TRACK FOR RANDWICK?** Australian Jockey Club chief executive Tony King is calling for a dirt track to replace the inner track at Randwick, which has been criticized as a sub-standard racing surface. Randwick has an all-weather training track, and King believes that the inner "Kensington" track should be torn up and combined with the dirt track to create a new racing surface. "I am of the view, and it is not shared by my committee and my critics, that the Kensington track should be dug up," King told Sydney Morning Herald. "No doubt that will attract enormous criticism from the purists, but the only surface that is proven is a dirt track. You could run your best races, say, four at a meeting, on the Randwick course proper and have the rest on dirt." Spring race meetings have been transferred to Warwick Farm in hopes that the Randwick course will be fit for use Oct. 2, a day which features four Group 1 events.

RAMBO DANCER DIES South African stallion Rambo Dancer (Northern Dancer--Fair Arabella, by Chateaugay) died Monday evening after covering a mare at Summerhill Stud. He was 20 years old. "He was one of the country's most reliable stallions, and was one of the principal factors behind the recent success of Summerhill in the Breeding Premiership," said Greig Muir, the stud's manager. "With Rambo, you always knew what you were getting--a bay horse with good legs, plenty of quality and tons of courage. [His offspring] were precocious at two and had the ability to train on well beyond the expectations of ordinary horses." Bred in Canada, the bay sold for \$2.6 million as a yearling at Keeneland July and began his racing career in England, where he was stakes-placed. He then returned to the U.S. and annexed the GII Red Smith H. As a sire, he has been represented by group stakes winners Rambo's Jewel (SAf), His Lordship (SAf), Bianconi (SAf), Ramooz, Royal Mariner (SAf) and Major Hero (Saf).
