New York cont. Bailey Eyes Return:

Jockey Jerry Bailey had the cast removed from his broken wrist Friday and has targeted either the weekend of Oct. 16 or Oct. 23 to make his return to the saddle. He last rode Aug. 29 at Saratoga before falling off a ladder at his South Florida home when attempting to shore up the house for the impending Hurricane Frances. Following the accident, Bailey was hopeful he could return in time to ride in the Oct. 2 Jockey Club Gold Cup. "I thought I might be out only four weeks, but I had nothing to go on," Bailey said. "The doctor had told me that the sooner I got screws put in my wrist, the sooner I could get back. Because of the hurricanes, we lost a week waiting to get the screws in." Bailey said he is undergoing rehabilitation therapy seven days a week. "I talked to the doctor after the cast came off and said I had to be back a week before the Breeders' Cup, if not two weeks before," Bailey said. "He said he didn't see any problem with that. If there's nothing important going on the weekend of the 16th, I might just wait for the following weekend." Should he return around Oct. 23, Bailey will either ride in New York or at Calder. He then will head to Lone Star Park and ride there during Breeders' Cup week as another tune-up for the Oct. 30 Breeders' Cup. Bailey's attempts to protect his house from the onslaught of Florida hurricanes were largely a wasted effort. "We dodged every bullet," he said. "One time, we got 60 mile-per-hour winds, but that was the worst of it."


