KEENELAND REWRITES RECORD BOOKS

The 2004 Keeneland September Yearling Sale concluded yesterday after a 14-day run that resulted in world-record receipts of \$324,904,300. The gross, which eclipsed the mark of \$317,666,000 set at Keeneland November in 1999, were far above Keeneland's expectations. "This is beyond our wildest dreams," said Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "We never thought, going in, that we would become the largest grossing sale ever in the world. But, from start to finish, there was this great buzz. The sale had a great feel to it. It is a dream come true." Russell credited strength at the top and in the middle market with the sale's eye-catching stats. "We had worked it out that Book 1 would be the top of the market, but we had no idea what to expect," he said. "There was no comparison, so we didn't know where the prices were going to be. But the results were dramatic. The middle market has broadened tremendously over the last two years, so we were pretty confident that it would be strong again and it was, all the way through." He added, "We got the rotation of buyers we were looking for, and people stayed on through the sale. We saw that a little bit last year, but this year, Mr. [B. Wayne] Hughes and Mr. [John] Oxley, who usually top the buyers for Book 1, topped Book 2, and the buyers who didn't get a horse in Book 2 stayed for Book 3. There is that rollover effect, and everybody knows they are going to go home with a horse. We have become the global marketplace that can fulfill everyone's dreams." Keeneland Wrap-Up cont. p2

She is also from the family of champion Rockhill Native. Dr. Demi O'Byrne, bidding on behalf of Magnier, described his latest acquisition as "a beautiful filly with a lovely pedigree." Keeneland Wrap-Up cont. Looking Ahead...

While Geoffrey Russell did plan to put his feet up this afternoon and savor the success of September, he will not rest on his laurels for long. "We have to keep on working," he said. "This is not a fait accompli. We are the marketing arm, that is our job, and we'll be recruiting new buyers and identifying new areas for development. Our pet project is Mexico--over the last couple of years, the growth there has been tremendous. We want to find more emerging markets, such as Korea and the Russian Republics. We had buyers from those countries this year, those markets are opening up, and we need to investigate them. A lot of those buyers are looking at the middle and lower-middle end horses, which helps the consignors and breeders--it helps everybody." But not all marketing initiatives will be focused overseas. "We had buyers from all over the world this year--Australia and South Africa and Hong Kong and South America--but North America is a big continent and there is work to be done here, too," Russell said.

TOP COLT GOES TO GODOLPHIN There was a bit of a lull between the Goffs session topper vesterday and the yearling that brought the second-highest bid, but John Ferguson stepped up the tempo when going to €360,000 for hip 35, a son of Alhaarth (Ire) from the consignment of Croom House Stud. The bay is out of listed winner Castle Quest (Ire) (Grand Lodge), from the family of G1 Haydock Sprint Cup and G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest winner Cherokee Rose and G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains (French 2000 Guineas) third Bowman. "He is a very good individual by a very successful sire out a young stakes-winning mare," Ferguson said, adding that the colt would join the Godolphin fold in Newmarket. Howard Johnson, who was well known during his days as a national hunt trainer, has become a regular on this circuit in recent months. Johnson was again to the fore at Goffs, snapping up hip 92 for €260,000 towards the end of the session. From the draft of Lynn Lodge Stud, the Cape Cross (Ire) colt is out of a half sister to the smart sprinter Conroy and Godolphin's promising maiden winner Fen Shui (UAE). While the major format change that has taken place at the Kill venue made comparison with last year's Orby opener largely irrelevant, the median was up by over seven percent on 12 months ago. "He went off nice and steady and came home in :24 flat, which is exactly what we were looking for." The five-year-old, winless since taking the 2002 GI Belmont S., was fifth in the Aug. 22 GII Saratoga Breeders' Cup S. last time out. Three-year-old Love of Money (Not for Love), winner of the Sept. 6 GII Pennsylvania Derby last time out, went six furlongs in a rapid 1:10 4/5 at Aqueduct yesterday. "He worked really good," trainer Rick Dutrow Jr. said. "He galloped out seven furlongs in 1:24 and change. It was exactly what we wanted to see." Dutrow has not made a final decision on the colt's next start. "We're going to take a couple more days and think about it," he said. Can anyone explain to me how that great producer Bourtai failed to land the title of Broodmare of the Year sometime during her magnificent career?

She produced a total of five stakes winners, with her first three foals following her private purchase by Claiborne Farm in 1951 being those outstanding fillies Delta, Levee and Bayou. Between them this trio collected 14 stakes victories, including the CCA Oaks, Monmouth Oaks, Delaware Oaks, Acorn S., Beldame S., Arlington Lassie S., Arlington Matron H., Princess Pat S., Gazelle H. and the Selima S.

I suppose justice was belatedly done when Delta was named Broodmare of the Year for 1968, with her half-sister Levee taking the same honor two years later. Now the family has another possible Broodmare of the Year, this time in Britain, thanks to the achievements of the oddly spelt Magnificient Style--a grand-daughter of Delta's last living foal, Basin.

This daughter of Silver Hawk has been busily reviving the family fortunes this year, with three individual group winners. The first was Percussionist, a Sadler's Wells colt who ran away with the G3 Derby Trial at Lingfield before finishing an excellent fourth, beaten only a length, in the Derby.

Magnificient Style subsequently scored a notable group-race double at Doncaster's St Leger meeting. First came her Spinning World filly Echoes In Eternity, who showed remarkable versatility to win the G2 Park Hill S. over a distance of 14.6 furlongs--and this less than a year after her success in the G2 Sun Chariot S. over a mile.

A day later it was the turn of Percussionist's younger sister Playful Act, who took the G2 May Hill S. over a mile. This Robert Sangster-bred two-year-old gave another fine demonstration of her talents in winning Saturday's G1 Meon Valley Stud Fillies' Mile, when she confirmed Doncaster form almost to the ounce with Giant's Causeway's daughter Maids Causeway.

Magnificient Style was clearly very well bought at the \$410,000 she cost at Keeneland's 1997 November Sale. She had struggled on American racetracks in 1997, failing to reproduce the form that had brought her an all-the-way victory over the future French Oaks winner Sil Sila in the G3 Musidora S. over 10.4 furlongs. Perhaps racing on fast ground began to take its toll, as Timeform described her as having a pronounced knee action and recorded that she wore bandages and kept changing her legs when a disappointing favorite for the Ribblesdale S. on her last appearance in Britain.

Magnificient Style still had plenty to recommend her--not least the fact that her pedigree was free of Northern Dancer and Raise a Native blood. Her dam, the French mile winner Mia Karina, had done well for Mahmoud Fustok of Buckram Oak Farm, especially with two colts that carried Fustok's colors with distinction. In addition to producing Magnificient Style to Silver Hawk, she produced Siberian Summer, conqueror of Bertrando in the GI Charles H. Strub S., to the French 2000 Guineas winner Siberian Express.

Mia Karina first visited Silver Hawk in 1991, soon after Silver Ending--a Silver Hawk colt out of her half-sister Copperhead--had established himself as one of the leading three-year-olds of 1990 with victories in the GI Pegasus H. and GII Arkansas Derby.

It is a lesson to us all that Basin, the dam of Mia Karina and Copperhead, failed to pick up a single dollar in five appearances before embarking on a similarly disappointing broodmare career. None of Basin's 13 foals was good enough to earn black type, but the latent power of her illustrious bloodlines helped no fewer than three of her daughters produce Grade I winners, the third being L'Quiz. This daughter of L'Enjoleur produced two Group 1 winners to Zabeel, namely the top-class Australian filly Champagne and the New Zealand Derby winner St Reims. Yet another of Basin's daughters, Czaravina, produced a Group 1 performer in Australasia. Clearly, you write of any member of this exceptional female line at your peril.

Magnificient Style's first four foals are now stakes winners, the other being her Storm Cat filly Stylelistick, who collected a couple of stakes on turf. Watch out for Magnificient Style's next foal, a yearling filly by Danehill.

Playful Act now heads the betting for next year's Oaks and it is going to be interesting to see whether Godolphin try to buy her from the Sangster family. History suggests that they will, as Godolphin purchased her half-sister Echoes In Eternity and the future classic winners Balanchine and Cape Verdi from Robert Sangster.

Although Playful Act is inbred 3x4 to Nearctic, a horse who set track records over five, six and eight furlongs as a four-year-old, she looks sure to be very well suited by a mile and a half. She is also inbred 4x4 to Hail to Reason through Bold Reason, winner of the Travers S. after his third in the Belmont, and Roberto, winner of the Derby. Sligo Bay, winner of the GI Hollywood Turf Cup over a mile and a half, is another Sadler's Wells inbred to Hail to Reason, as are the Derby and St Leger second Dushyantor, the Oaks third Relish the Thought and the Arc hopeful Policy Maker.

Before I finish, it could be an eye-opening exercise for some readers if I were to list some of the important winners produced by the Bourtai female line.

Levee became the dam of that exceptional racemare Shuvee and numbers the likes of Meneval, Sacahuista, Strategic Choice, Geri, Ekraar and Raging Fever among her descendants. Silk Slippers, winner of the Fillies' Mile for Robert Sangster during its days as a Group 2 event, is out of a granddaughter of Levee. She was by Nureyev, Sadler's Wells' three-parts brother.

The Bayou branch has also provided a rich legacy which includes Anifa, Coastal, Slew o'Gold, River Flyer, Victory Ride, Sleep Easy and Aptitude.

And Bourtai's first stakes-winning daughter, the Some Chance filly Banta, is ancestress of such as Big Spruce, Talking Picture, Trusted Partner, Thirty Six Red, Corrazona and Dress To Thrill.

As for Delta, this daughter of Nasrullah bred five stakes winners from 10 foals, the pick of them being the Kentucky Derby third Dike. Delta's Round Table filly Moss produced two good but very different winners in the American stayer Peat Moss and the very fast Irish filly Polonia, winner of the Prix de l'Abbaye. Moss's sister Shore also left an indelible mark by producing Alligatrix. This daughter of Alleged became the dam of Croco Rouge (Prix Lupin, Prix d'Ispahan and third in the Arc) and Alidiva, who in turn produced the Group 1 winners Ali-Royal (Sussex S.), Sleepytime (1000 Guineas) and Taipan.

If Godolphin tries to buy Playful Act, the price is likely to reflect the fact that the game filly has the makings of an exceptional broodmare once her racing days are over.



Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe

Bago-ahead...

The Niarchos Family's **Bago** (**Fr**) (Nashwan) will run in Sunday's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe unless the ground rides heavy, connections announced yesterday. The three-time Group 1 winner's participation was put in question after he finished third when favorite for the G2 Prix Niel over course and distance Sept. 12, but the sophomore was confirmed on course for the race by racing manager Alan Cooper, "provided the ground is not soft to heavy." G1 Epsom Derby winner **North Light** (**Ire**) (Danehill) has also been given the green light. After overseeing the colt's work Sunday morning, trainer Sir Michael Stoute expressed himself, "very satisfied."

Arc Back on Tap...

It looked as if Yushun Horse's **Tap Dance City** (Pleasant Tap) would miss the Arc when engine trouble grounded his flight in Mexico, but shipping arrangements have been found and last year's G1 Japan Cup hero will make the race after all, *Racing Post* reports. "At one point I had lost all my hope, but fortunately we found an alternate flight," Yushun representative Mitsuhiro Shiori told the *Post*. "I believe that Tap will overcome the change in travel plans and I will do my best to keep him in perfect condition for the trip." The seven-year-old is due to arrive in Paris Friday afternoon. He will be based at John Hammond's yard in Chantilly.
