A NEW MODEL

Much of the talk ahead of yesterday's GII Darley Alcibiades S. centered on Sense of Style (Thunder Gulch), but the 3-5 chalk fell victim to a poor trip as Runway Model (Petionville) came storming up the outside to take the \$400,000 feature on Keeneland's opening day. She had been second by a neck in the Bassinet S. Sept. 4 and was the runner-up once again in the GIII Arlington-Washington Lassie S. Sept. 19. Getting Lasix for the first time here, the dark bay settled near the back of the pack, with Sense of Style tucked in behind the leaders. The favorite had no running room approaching the stretch, while longshot Runway Model had clear sailing on the outside and just got up in the last jump. Sense of Style's loss crushed the bridgejumpers. "She handled everything beautifully, but that horse stopped in front of me, and that was that," said her rider Edgar Prado. Aug. 28, and he was let go at a generous 4-1 here. Gold Storm went up to set the pace shadowed by Hosco (Honour and Glory), with Champali stalking them while four wide. After turning for home, he put his head in front in midstretch, pinned his ears back and prevailed in a cavalry charge to the wire. Gold Storm held on for second over favored Clock Stopper. The top three finishers are set for a rematch in the Breeders' Cup, which will be held Oct. 30 at Lone Star Park in Texas.

A small yet select field goes postward for this year's renewal over Bois de Boulogne's sharp seven furlongs, with a home defence of two attempting to repel a strong cross-Channel raiding party. Tim Easterby's money-spinning gelding Somnus bids for his second Group 1 win of the season, having captured the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest at Deauville Aug. 8, but will have to overcome the possible disadvantage of going seven furlongs for only the second time in his life. He was just touched off last time by the recently retired Tante Rose (Ire) in Haydock's G1 Sprint Cup Sept. 4 and can bounce back here. Fellow British raider Monsieur Bond, making his final career start before retiring to Chris Harper's Whitsbury Manor Stud, will have his claims enhanced by any appreciable rain. "The wetter the better," explained owner Reg Bond. He will seek to boost his stud value by improving on a career-best success in the G2 Duke of York S. at York May 11. He was not disgraced last time, finishing fifth in the G1 Haydock Sprint Cup, and has proved an admirably consistent stakes performer all season. Last year's G1 Premio Vittorio di Capua victor Le Vie Dei Colori drops down to this trip for the first time since finishing runner-up over course and distance in the 2002 G1 Grand Criterium. He retains his ability, as proved when third to Soviet Song (Ire) in the G1 Sussex S. at Goodwood July 28 and again when just over two lengths away in eighth in a particularly hot G1 Prix du Moulin at this track last time Sept. 5. The Niarchos family's Denebola promised much when scooting to an impressive win in last season's G1 Prix Marcel Boussac, but has failed to hit the jackpot in four runs this term. She was even closer than Le Vie Dei Colori in the Moulin, however, and cannot be discounted. Nayyir, who has made seven of his last 12 starts at this level, continues to fall frustratingly short against top company. But he emerged with credit last time when fourth to the mighty Rakti (GB) in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot Sept. 25, illustrating why it would be folly to dismiss his claim. Pastoral Pursuits, the only contender reappearing off a victory, holds claims based on his track record-breaking defeat of useful yardstick Firebreak (GB) in the G2 Park S. at Doncaster Sept. 9

Three-for-four at a mile on the grass, Mr O'Brien looks to get back on track after a disappointing lastplace finish in the off-the-turf John D. Schapiro Memorial Breeders' Cup H. at Pimlico Sept. 18. The five-yearold gelding was 2-5 in that event, but faded badly after cutting out the opening fractions. He showed solid turf form earlier this season, however, winning the May 15 GII Dixie S., running second in the July 3 GI United Nations H. and third in the June 5 GI Manhattan H. In his latest try on the lawn, the chestnut was a troubled sixth in the Aug. 14 GI Arlington Million. "He was always expected to be a decent horse," trainer Robin Graham said. "I think the grass and maturity have brought it out." Stroll won five of six starts last season, but has not been as consistent this term. The dark bay took the GI Early Times Turf Classic at Churchill Downs in May, then went to the shelf after finishing sixth in the Manhattan. He made his return in the Sept. 18 GII

Belmont Breeders' Cup H. and raced evenly to be second. Three consecutive winners of this race--Silic (Fr) (1999), War Chant (2000) and Val Royal (Fr) (2001)-went on to capture the GI Breeders' Cup Mile in their next start. A good effort here could be the clincher for the Breeders' Cup hopes of Musical Chimes, who captured the nine-furlong GI John C. Mabee H. July 24 at Del Mar before finishing 3/4 of a length back when fourth in the GI Beverly D. Aug. 14. The four-year-old filly will be giving away two pounds to her male rivals. Singletary, first or second in each of his six starts over this course, has not raced since finishing a close second in the GI Shoemaker Breeders' Cup Mile at Hollywood on Memorial Day. "He's ready, but he's probably a work short of really being his best; we planned it that way," said trainer Don Chatlos Jr. "With the Breeders' Cup three weeks away, I want his best race to be on Oct. 30, not Oct. 9."

SCHWARTZ TO RESIGN FROM NYRA In a statement issued Friday afternoon, Barry K. Schwartz announced his intention to step down as the New York Racing Association's Chairman and Chief Executive Officer, effective Dec. 31, 2004. Schwartz, 62, came on board NYRA in 2000. "When I took the helm at NYRA four years ago, the future of the organization was very much in question," Schwartz said in his statement. "NYRA was facing investigations from the New York attorney general, the New York state comptroller, the New York State Racing and Wagering Board, and the United States Attorney's Office concerning allegations of general mismanagement and tax fraud by certain of its pari-mutuel employees. Moreover, NYRA's financial situation was seriously deteriorating, with operating costs spiraling out of control and revenues from on-track handle diminishing. Today, with the help of its federal monitor, NYRA has put the cloud of suspicion and investigation behind it. Moreover, NYRA has found new and innovative ways to operate more efficiently, by reducing its operating costs and deriving more revenue from its racing product. NYRA is well positioned to face the challenges that lay ahead, such as the implementation of a large-scale video lottery casino at Aqueduct and securing an extension of its franchise from the state to conduct pari-mutuel wagering on its races." NYRA is expected to announce a new President and CEO shortly.
