will begin his stud career in 2005 at Lane's End Farm for a fee of \$40,000. The six-year-old bay is a leading contender for Horse of the Year honors and has already won this season's G1 Dubai World Cup, GI Pacific Classic and GII San Antonio H. On the board in 13 of 17 races to date, Pleasantly Perfect has won nine times and has earnings of \$7,349,880. Currently training for an Oct. 30 defense of his Classic title,

Indy) jumped from a third-place debut effort over the Woodbine turf to a runner-up effort in the Sept. 19 GII Summer S. and yesterday the well-bred colt made it to the winner's circle with a determined half-length victory in the GII Grey Breeders' Cup S. Trying a route and the main track for the first time in his young career, Dance With Ravens broke on top but settled into a stalking trip when

Accountforthegold (Successful Appeal) went to the lead. With a rail-skimming trip, Dance With Ravens steadily cut into the pacesetter's lead and outbattled that colt down the lane for the win. "I had to bide my time and that was my only opening," rider Todd Kabel said of his winning trip. "My horse fought a very game race and dug in very hard. Emile [Ramsammy on the runner-up] had a lot of horse underneath him and when I came up next to him, he was ready to battle down to the wire, but my horse prevailed." Fortunate Damsel, a maiden winner for \$50,000 in March, took the Fieldy S. over this course in July before third-place finishes over the Saratoga lawn in the Aug. 2 GIII Lake George and the Aug. 23 GII Lake Placid H. The dark bay filly, without blinkers for the first time in her career, was allowed to set pedestrian fractions of :25.72, :50.51, 1:13.85 and 1:36.97, carried a two-length lead into the stretch and just held off the late-closing favorite Venturi for a narrow score. Fortunate Damsel is the first winner for trainer Heriberto Cedano, longtime assistant to the late Hall of Fame trainer P.G. Johnson. Cedano took over the stable following Johnson's death on Aug. 6. "It is always nice to break your maiden in a stakes," said Cedano. "P.G.'s birthday was Oct. 9, so it is very nice to win the race after his birthday. He is smiling." Of the trip, winning rider Javier Castellano said, "She did it easy. She broke well out of the gate. She broke sharply and nobody wanted to go to the lead. Het her do whatever she wanted. The jockeys let me go easy in the first part. She settled down very good and when she saw the other horses coming on, she was fresh and took off again." John Velazquez, aboard the beaten favorite, said, "There was no pace. I should have put her up into the race, but that's not where they wanted her." Click for the brisnet.com chart.

That was a rather scary statistic that *TDN*'s Marie Kizenko unearthed after Consolidator's victory in the Lane's End Breeders' Futurity, that this powerful colt is the first son of <u>Storm Cat</u> to win an American Grade I race since <u>High Yield</u> took the Blue Grass S. in April 2000.

If that's the case, you might wonder why sons of Storm Cat achieved the two highest prices of \$8 million and \$3.4 million at last month's Keeneland Sale, which also saw Storm Cat supply the highest-priced filly.

The explanation, of course, is that the European Group 1 successes of <u>Giant's Causeway</u> and <u>Aljabr</u> in 1999 and 2000 led to many of Storm Cat's best prospects going into training in Europe, rather than the USA.

In 2000, three Storm Cat colts sold for more than \$1 million, with Demi O'Byrne signing for two of them and John Ferguson for another. O'Byrne also took the year's top-priced weanling colt, a \$1.1-million son of Storm Cat who went on to win the 2002 G1 Grand Criterium as Hold That Tiger.

After <u>Black Minnaloushe</u> had won both the Irish 2000 Guineas and St James's Palace S. in 2001, European demand for Storm Cat's sons turned into something of a feeding frenzy at the yearling sales. This time, eight sold for more than \$1 million, with O'Byrne taking four and Ferguson three. Although there wasn't a Group 1 winner among the O'Byrne quartet, all four went maddeningly close to hitting that elusive target. *Cont. p. 4*

Van Nistelrooy won a Group 2 in Ireland before finishing second, beaten under a length, to the formidable Refuse To Bend in the G1 National S. Newfoundland, who was sold after disappointing in Ireland, has found his form in the USA, recently failing by only a neck to beat Peace Rules in the GI Suburban H. and by threequarter lengths to withstand Funny Cide's rally in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup.

Marino Marini, who was beaten a half-length into second in the G1 Phoenix S. in Ireland, has also done well in the USA after being sold on, notably going down by only a head to Southern Image in the GI Malibu S. And the fourth son of Storm Cat, Statue of Liberty, is now at stud at Coolmore, having won the G2 Coventry S. and failing, by a head, to win the G1 Sussex S. Imagine what a difference it would have made to these four colts' value if those close finishes had gone the other way.

Moving on to the 2002 yearling sales, four more Storm Cat colts made seven-figure prices, with O'Byrne taking the top two and Ferguson one of the others. O'Byrne's pair, One Cool Cat and The Mighty Tiger, both showed good form last year, with the \$3.1-million One Cool Cat rewarding Coolmore's perseverance with Group 1 victories in the Phoenix S. and National S.

There were six Storm Cat colts who made more than \$1 million last year, with three of them falling to O'Byrne or Ferguson. However, there was some resistance offered by American owners, led by Eugene Melnyk, Robert and Beverly Lewis and Stan Fulton.

The Lewises had announced at Saratoga that they did not plan to buy at the 2003 yearling sales, but they clearly had a change of heart at Keeneland and ended up buying 18 head for over \$8 million. Their highestpriced colt was the \$1,250,000 Storm Cat colt out of Good Example, now known as Consolidator.

Although Consolidator was winning for only the second time in six starts, there is every chance that he is only just coming to his best. I was interested to see winning rider Rafael Bejarano quoted as saying "What a difference from the last time I rode him--he's much stronger."

Bejarano was referring to the time when Consolidator finished a neck second, receiving six pounds from the winner Lunarpal, in the GIII Kentucky Breeders' Cup S. at Churchill Downs. It is well worth pointing out that this race came less than three weeks after Consolidator's actual second birthday, on May 16, so he was entitled to make marked physical progress in the interim.

I mentioned earlier that the exodus of Storm Cat colts to Europe was partly fueled by the Group 1 successes of Giant's Causeway and Aljabr in 1999 and 2000. Their wins also, no doubt, contributed to Good Example being sent to Storm Cat for a fourth time in 2001. Giant's Causeway and Aljabr are both out of mares by sons of Blushing Groom, Giant's Causeway's broodmare sire being Rahy and Aljabr's being Baillamont. Good Example is also by a son of Blushing Groom, namely the French 2000 Guineas second Crys-

Crystal Glitters was a very good performer at two, three and four in France, where he twice won the G1 Prix d' Ispahan at around nine furlongs. He retired to stud in France but was sold to Japan before he had really had a chance to prove himself. His stock did well after his sale, with six of them winning at group level. Among them were Dear Doctor, the 1992 Arlington Million winner, and Consolidator's dam Good Example, who beat the future classic winner Lady In Silver in landing the G3 Prix des Reservoirs.

Good Example's best previous effort by Storm Cat was Mycatcandance, who became a graded-placed stakes winner over six furlongs at two in 1999, with an Experimental Free Handicap figure of 106. Mycatcandance's first foal is a two-year-old by Fusaichi Pegasus.

Of course Mycatcandance is just one of many stakes-winning daughters of Storm Cat. They have been hitting the Grade I target more often than their male counterparts in the four years or so since High Yield's Blue Grass victory, with Raging Fever, Sophisticat, Storm Flag Flying, Denebola, Dessert, Nebraska Tornado and Sweet Catomine all scoring at the top level. So it has hardly been the Grade I drought which that opening statistic suggests.

FOREIGN SALES CORPORATION BILL PASSES

SENATE The U.S. Senate yesterday passed a bill that will repeal the 30-percent withholding on foreign wagers. The bill now heads to the White House for the approval of President George W Bush. The primary focus of the Foreign Sales Corporation bill is to repeal subsidies for U.S. exports that the World Trade Organization has deemed illegal. But the bill also repeals the fee foreigners pay on winnings made on pari-mutuel wagers into U.S. pools. The withholding effectively precludes common pooling by foreign countries into U.S. wagering pools. "This is a significant step in expanding the international market for American Thoroughbred racing," said National Thoroughbred Racing Association Commissioner D.G. Van Clief, Jr. "We are grateful to the NTRA members who have helped make this possible by contributions to the NTRA's Legislative Action Campaign and Political Action Committee." NTRA president Greg Avioli added, "The elimination of the 30-percent withholding has been one of our main legislative priorities for the last two years. Opening new markets and increasing international common pooling will surely benefit NTRA member tracks and horsemen." The White House is expected to sign the bill.

weanling colt by Tale of the Cat attracted the highest price at yesterday's opening session of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's Fall Mixed Sale in Ocala, Florida. The chestnut (hip 192), consigned by Francis and Barbara Vanlangendonck's Summerfield, was purchased by Sabine Stable for \$120,000. The weanling is out of Delirium (Go for Gin), a half sister to graded stakes winner Move (Forty Niner) and to graded stakes placed Falling Sky (Star de Naskra) and Reforest (Forestry). The day's highest-priced broodmare was Wild Mistress (Forest Wildcat) (hip 193), who brought a final bid of \$90,000 from Kiki Courtelis. In foal to Trippi, the threeyear-old was consigned by Kelli Mitchell, agent for the estate of E.P. Robsham. Wild Mistress is out of the Deputy Minister mare Deputy's Mistress and is a half sister to stakes winner Backatem (Notebook) and to graded stakes placed Throwthebookatem (Notebook). During the opening session of the four-day sale, OBS sold 202 horses for \$4,401,000. The average rose 37 percent from a year ago, to \$21,787. The median increased 43 percent to \$15,000. The sale's second consignor preferred session gets underway today at 11 a.m. Open sessions follow Wednesday and Thursday.




