WILD AGAIN PENSIONED

Three Chimneys has announced that Wild Again (Icecapade--Bushel-n-Peck, by *Khaled), the winner of the inaugural GI Breeders' Cup Classic in 1984 who

became one of the nation's top stallions, has been pensioned from stud duties due to declining fertility. "Wild Again has been a distinguished member of our stallion roster for the last 13 years," said syndicate manager Robert Clay. "His fertility has declined in the last two years, so that it is time he retire to the comfort he so richly deserves here at Three Chimneys." The

24-year-old will join pensioners Slew o' Gold and Capote at the Midway, Kentucky farm. As a four-year-old, Wild Again captured the GI Meadowlands Cup before finishing third in a Bay Meadows allowance race, then was supplemented for \$360,000 for the Breeders' Cup. His front-running victory, during which he was part of the bumping between favored Slew o' Gold and Gate Dancer, remains one of the highlights of the championship event. With earnings of over \$2.2 million in compiling a record of 28-8-7-4, Wild Again entered stud at Calumet Farm before moving to Three Chimneys in 1991. The nearly black horse established himself as one of the most dependable sires in the U.S., begetting the likes of Grade I winners A Wild Ride, Elmhurst, Milwaukee Brew, Sarava, Shine Again, Vicar, Wild Escapade, Wilderness Song, Wild Event and Wild Rush. From 16 crops of racing age, Wild Again has sired 84 stakes winners to date, 9 percent of his foals. Among his representatives in the current racing year are graded stakes winners Christine's Outlaw and Offlee Wild. "He's sired eight millionaires, four champions, and an incredible number of good, hard-trying racehorses," commented Clay. "His runners win races over all distances. Versatility and consistency have been the hallmarks of his stallion career."

The Alain de Royer-Dupre trainee secured his only previous stakes success in the 2002 renewal of the Listed Prix Edellic and he subsequently placed second in last year's G2 Prix d'Harcourt. Valentino returned from a short break to finish runner-up in the Listed Prix de Boulogne at Chantilly Sept. 6 and was back to near his best for a last-time fourth in the G2 Prix Dollar at Longchamp Oct. 2. Settled behind the leaders in sixth from the bell, the 23-10 favorite made smooth progress from the top of the straight and was pushed to the front with 150 yards to go. Nearly one quarter of the entries are Group or Grade I winners, including undefeated Silent Witness (Aus) (El Moxie), the defending champion in the G1 Hong Kong Sprint; Vallee Enchantee (Ire) (Peintre Celebre), winner of the 2003 G1 Hong Kong Vase; and G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. winner Rakti (GB) (Polish Precedent), who hold entries for both the G1 Hong Kong Mile and the G1 Hong Kong Cup, a race in which he finished second to Falbrav (Ire) last year. Other prominent names among the possibles include four-time Group 1 winner Attraction (GB) (Efisio {GB}); Epalo (Ger) (Lando {Ger}), currently atop the World Series Racing Championship standings; dual Oaks winner Ouija Board (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}); demoted GI Arlington Million hero Powerscourt (GB) (Sadler's Wells); and Var (Forest Wildcat), upset winner of the G1 Prix de l'Abbaye de Longchamp. A total of 51 horses from North America appear on the list, including Hard Buck (Brz) (Spend a Buck), second in the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S.; GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic victor Kitten's Joy (El Prado {Ire}); Perfect Soul (Ire) (Sadler's Wells); and Soaring Free (Smart Strike). Purse money for this year's International Races is in excess of \$7 million.

Thousand Guineas...

Trainer Lee Freedman had 327,000 reasons why Alinghi should start in the Thousand Guineas rather than the Caulfield Guineas against the colts on Saturday, and the formidable filly duly added A\$327,000 to her earnings of A\$2,380,125 with an improbable last-to-first effort in the fillies' race. Alinghi was last of 11 coming into the straight with Ballet Society (Stravinsky) appearing to have the face in her keeping, but Alinghi rocketed down the outside to win her fourth start in five appearances this spring. "This filly is amazing," Freedman, who celebrated his 100th Group 1 victory when Mummify won the Yalumba S. Saturday, said after the win. "She can turn defeat into victory in such a short space of time. It's almost like when she gets bottled up she is able to produce these unbelievable finishes. The key to her greatness is she switches off." Jockey Damien Oliver said of Alinghi, who cost just A\$85,000 as a yearling and was syndicated among 16 people: "What a ride we are having with this filly, she is amazing. She certainly speaks my language." Syndicate manager Rob Slade would not rule out the possibility of Alinghi, who has eight wins from 11 starts, venturing to North America and Freedman told The Age newspaper that he had started talks with trainer Bobby Frankel. The only other trainers in Australia to reach the 100 Group 1 winner mark are the late Tommy Smith, and Bart Cummings.



Trained by Mark Johnston as a juvenile, he progressed to be one of the leading German-trained colts of his generation for conditioner Erika Mader, winning last term's G2 Grosser Muller Brot-Preis at Munich, posting a gallant second to Dai Jin (GB) in the G1 German Derby at Hamburg and subsequently recorded a career-best effort when collecting the G1 Bayerisches Zuchtrennen back at Munich. In his only subsequent start, the W Lazy T-bred finished fourth to Mamool (Ire) in last season's G1 Grosser Preis von Baden. He retires with a career record of three wins from 12 starts, placing eight times, and amassed earnings of €335,616. His dam Sombreffe is a Polish Precedent three-parts sister to the Australasian sire Snaadee (by Danzig) and is closely related to top European sire Night Shift.
