With a spell of rain affecting the chances of many of the leading contenders in today's G1 Emirates Airline Champion S. at Newmarket, there is a window of opportunity for up-and-coming Mister Monet (Ire) (Peintre Celebre) to stake his position in the big league. The three-year-old has already made giant strides since being beaten in a handicap on the July Course, winning the G3 Rose of Lancaster S. at Haydock Aug. 7 before powering through the Deauville mud to record a four-

length success in the Aug. 21 G2 Prix Guillaume d'Ornano last time out. "He ran very well on heavy ground at Deauville, so the rain might be an advantage," his trainer Mark Johnston said yesterday. But rain may work against Azamour (Ire) (Night Shift), who could be scratched at the 11th hour if the ground gets even deeper. He showed his best form on a quick surface when winning the G1 St James's Palace S.

"Refuse to Bend is a tough horse and I think stepping up to a mile and a quarter again will suit him." Haafhd (GB) (Alhaarth {Ire}), who beat a stellar line-up in the G1 2000 Guineas S. May 1, is also on a mission to restore his reputation. He disappointed when fourth in the St James's Palace and ninth in the G1 Sussex S. last time July 28.



Etlaala will put his unbeaten record on the line when he faces a deep field of juvenile colts in today's Dewhurst S. He did not see another rival when wiring a Newbury maiden at first asking Aug. 14 and saw nearly too much of the field when defying a troubled run to win the G1 Champagne S. at Doncaster last time Sept. 10. "When he won first time out at Newbury he gave me a very good feel," said jockey Richard Hills. "We went to Doncaster thinking we would win and he overcame a lot of traffic problems, which proved that he was a good horse. He's got a good turn of foot and we'll be using that." Iceman, who took the G2 Coventry S. at Royal Ascot June 15, was giving five pounds to Etlaala when beaten a half length at Doncaster before finishing third in the G1 Middle Park S. over six furlongs at this track Oct. 1. He is one of a number of worthy opponents to Etlaala including Oratorio, who followed up his Curragh successes in the G3 Anglesey S. July 18 and G2 Futurity S. 




