CRIMSON PALACE RETIRED

Godolphin Racing has announced that Crimson Palace (SAf) (Elliodor {Fr}--Perfect Guest {SAf}, by Northern

Guest) will miss the GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf and will now be retired. The five-yearold had not raced since winning the GI Beverly D. S. at Arlington Park Aug. 14. "Crimson Palace wasn't right after training at the weekend," said Racing Manager Simon Crisford. "Unfortunately, we have run out of time with her

and she will not run at the Breeders' Cup meeting." Breeding plans have not yet been decided. Produced by the Group 1-placed Perfect Guest, the bay was a toplevel performer in her native land, capturing the G1 Cape of Good Hope Paddock S. in winning four of her six starts there. She was purchased by Team Valor and sent to Dubai for two starts, winning a conditions race and running a close fourth in the G1 Dubai Duty Free. She was acquired by Godolphin shortly before the Duty Free and went to England afterwards, where she won the G3 Middleton S. In what would be her final career outing, Crimson Palace defeated an excellent field in the Beverly D. She heads to the paddocks with a record of seven wins in 11 starts and earnings of \$663,278.

BWANA CHARLIE BLAZES AT LONE STAR

GI Breeders' Cup Sprint hopeful Bwana Charlie (Indian Charlie) ripped through a bullet five furlongs yesterday at Lone Star Park in :59 2/5, easily the fastest the 14 who worked at the distance and a full second faster than the number-two horse. The Steve Asmussen trainee, hero of the GII Amsterdam S. at Saratoga in early August, galloped out in 1:12 1/5. "He worked awesome," said the three-year-old's exercise rider, Carlos Roses. "He was on the bit the whole way and he relaxed good. He galloped out very strong and, as I crossed the wire, my skin was like chicken skin, he was so impressive." Bwana Charlie finished second in his most recent, the Oct. 2 Alysheba Breeders' Cup S. over the Lone Star surface.

There is nothing particularly surprising about the fact that the Northern Dancer line accounted for five Group or Grade I events around the world this weekend. Nor is it unusual that two of those events were taken by horses descending from Northern Dancer through Danzig, and another by a grandson of Storm Cat. However, two other Group/Grade I winners, represent far less familiar, albeit fast-emerging, branches of the Northern Dancer sire line.

In England, the G1 Champion S. was captured by Haafhd, a son of the surprising Alhaarth. A top-class two-year-old and a high-class performer up to a mile and a quarter, Alhaarth is a son of the Northern Dancer stallion Unfuwain, himself a very useful sire, but scarcely a horse considered a likely extender of his male line. Haafhd, who also won the G1 2000 Guineas earlier this year, is one of 13 stakes winners from the first two crops sired by Alhaarth. Others included the GI Canadian International S. victor Phoenix Reach, the GII Mrs. Revere S. heroine Hoh Buzzard, and group winners Bandari, Dominica, Misterah and Maharib.

The other weekend Group/Grade I winner from a lesser known branch of the Northern Dancer line was Ticker Tape, who took the GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup S. With this triumph added to earlier wins in the China Doll S., Providencia S., GIII Pucker Up S. and GI American Invitational Oaks, Ticker Tape has clearly established herself as the top three-year-old turf filly in North America.

The English-bred distaffer is descends from El Gran Senor's older brother Try My Best. The champion two-year-old of his generation, Try My Best was undefeated in three starts at two, when his wins included the G3 Larkspur S, and GI Dewhurst S, Although he won the G3 Vauxhall Trial S. first time out at three, he was off the board in his only other start and turned out to be only a moderately successful sire. He's best known through his son Last Tycoon, a champion freshman sire in Europe and a champion sire in Australia, but Ticker Tape descends not from Last Tycoon, but through another Try My Best son, Waajib. Less precocious than his sire, Waajib was a late-maturing miler who captured the G3 Prix du Rond-Point at four, and the G3 Diomed Stakes and G3 Queen Anne Stakes at five. From his European crops, Waajib sired just four group winners. Best by far of his European runners was Royal Applause. A half brother to the blisteringly fast filly Lyric Fantasy and the G1 Dewhurst S. victor In Command, Royal Applause was a much more precocious and speedy individual than his sire. At two, Royal Applause went four-for-four, winning the G3 Coventry S., G2 Gimcrack S. and G1 Middle Park S. He found things tougher the following year, but bounced back at four when he added four more black-type events, including the G3 Duke of York S., G3 Cork and Orrery S. and G1 Haydock Park Sprint Cup.

The champion first season sire of 2001, Royal Applause has made a tremendous start to his stud career. His first crop has produced seven stakes winners, including the G2 Diadem S. winner Acclamation and the G2 Richmond S. victor Mister Cosmi. The second crop saw Royal Applause add two more stakes winners, and his third crop has already yielded Ticker Tape; the G2 July S. victor Nevisian Lad; Majestic Missile, who took the G3 Molecomb S. and G3 Cornwallis S.; and Peak to Creek, winner of the G3 Horris Hill S. He also has three stakes winners, including Tremar, winner of the G3 Prix Eclipse, in his current two-year-old crop.

Ticker Tape stays a lot further than most of Royal Applause's best offspring, which is probably because she is out of a mare by Silver Hawk. This son of Roberto never won beyond a mile, but he was second in the G1 Irish Derby and third in the G1English Derby, both at a mile and a half. Ticker Tape's grandam Wiener Wald failed to make the first three in five starts, but there was no knocking her pedigree. By Woodman, Wienar Wald is out of Chapel of Dreams, a three-time graded stakes winner who is not only by Northern Dancer, but is also out of Terlingua, dam of Chapel of Dreams' three-parts brother Storm Cat and half sister to Breeders' Cup Mile hero Royal Academy.

As well as a high-quality family, Ticker Tape also owns an intriguing pedigree pattern. She is inbred to Northern Dancer 4x4 at the top and bottom of the pedigree. In both cases the Northern Dancer is combined with Buckpasser and La Troienne inbreeding. Try My Best is by Northern Dancer out of a Buckpasser mare who has Buckpasser's dam Busanda and her three-parts brother Mr. Busher (both with La Troienne as their granddam) 2x3. Wiener Wald, the grandam of Ticker Tape, is by Woodman (dam by Buckpasser and inbred 2x3 to the three-parts sisters Busher and Striking) out of a Northern Dancer mare. This means that Ticker Tape's paternal great-grandsire, Try My Best, and his grandam, Wiener Wald, are close genetic relatives.

There is also another clever connection here. Silver Hawk is out of a mare by the classy, if tempermental, Amerigo. He was by Nearco out of mare by Precipitation. In the pedigree of Royal Applause's sire Waajib, we find the top-class stayer Sheshoon, who is by Precipitation out of a mare by Nearco, and thus is bred on a reverse cross to Amerigo.

EPC APPROVE FRENCH CHANGES France Galop moved forward significantly a set of radical changes-including shortening the distance of the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club (French Derby) to 10 1/2 furlongs--at a meeting of the European Pattern Race Committee yesterday. Edouard de Rothschild and Louis Romanet, president and director general of France's ruling body respectively, put the draft of alterations to the current domestic program to the EPC and received an approval in principle from the forum. In addition to reducing the distance of the Chantilly Classic from a mile and a half, the reform also calls for the reshaping of the race currently known as the G1 Grand Prix de Paris, suggesting that it take place over a mile and a half at Saint-Cloud in mid-July. That switch would coincide with the remodeling of the G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud, which would become a new event for three-year-olds staged at Longchamp at the end of that month. Also among the proposals is the scrapping of the G1 Prix Lupin, a noted trial for the Jockey-Club currently staged at Longchamp in May. "The European Pattern Committee approved the French proposals in principle, subject to further discussion about prize money levels for the proposed new Group 1 races," an EPC statement read yesterday.

O'BRIEN TO FIELD FIVE?

Trainer Aidan O'Brien has entered five runners for next Saturday's Breeders' Cup meeting, according to Racing Post. Powerscourt (GB) (Sadler's Wells), disqualified from first in the GI Arlington Million, will go for the \$2-million Turf; Yesterday (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), third last year in the \$1-million F/M Turf, is set for another attempt in that race; and Antonius Pius (Danzig) has been entered in the \$1.5-million Mile. O'Brien withdrew Oratorio (Ire) from consideration for the \$1.5-million Juvenile, but has entered Scandinavia (Fusaichi Pegasus) in his stead. They are joined by the two-year-old filly Mona Lisa (GB) (Giant's Causeway), still a maiden, but most recently an excellent fourth in the G1 Meon Valley Stud Fillies Mile at Ascot Sept. 25.

MIXED MESSAGES

Here's what we've all been up to. There have been nine major yearling sales in North America (three) and Europe (six) since mid-July, and in fact six of the nine sales have been in the last six weeks. These are just the major sales, too: these figures don't include a number of American regional sales, and even this week, I am reminded, there is a yearling sale underway at Doncaster today, as well as the final day of Deauville October. Next week Fasig Kentucky has 800 more yearlings catalogued on Monday and Tuesday. But the major sales define the market and establish the trends. There are conflicting signals this year: Keeneland September broke the all-time record for a horse sale anywhere in the known universe, yet problems associated with overproduction surfaced the last three weeks in Europe, which resulted in a 15 percent downturn there.

We are not talking peanuts here: 7,304 yearlings sold in the nine sales this year, for a total of \$634,072,600, and an average of \$86,812. This was about 360 more, for \$44 million more, than in the corresponding sales last year. Truthfully, though, just about the entire increase appeared to have come at Keeneland September, where 401 more horses sold for \$50 million more than last year. In fact, last year's 6,943 yearlings averaged exactly (that's using a few conversions, naturally) \$85,000, so the average this year was up only two percent, though the overall market sustained that average while absorbing five percent more yearlings

It was very much a case of it all ending up that way, though different sectors of the yearling market displayed distinct characteristics. The American market showed sustained strength: Keeneland September accounted for 51 percent of the nine-sale total this year, versus 46 perent last year--a combination of Keeneland's strength and other sales' weakness. One of the features of this year's sales was how certain sectors of the middle-to-lower price ranges showed marked strength, and this happened both in America and in Europe. On Sept. 10, the weekend before Keeneland started, Doncaster wrapped up a record-breaking St. Leger sale, in which 467 yearlings averaged the equivalent of about \$43,300--a 33 percent increase in average (and gross) from the previous year. Eleven days later, at the eighth session of Keeneland's sale, on Sept. 21, the 'second Tuesday' and the second half of Book 4, a total of 276 yearlings averaged \$42,343--a whopping 40 percent increase on the corresponding session's \$30,288 average the previous year. So there was big demand, on both sides of the Pond, at that level of the market.

Stars and Stripes...

Here are the staggering dimensions of the American yearling market: after eight sessions of the September Sale, a total of 1,987 yearlings had sold for over \$297 million, and averaged over \$149,000. That's some pretty big business when you consider owning racehorses is a luxury pursuit: almost \$300 million just to buy them, plus another \$50 million to train them. That's the size of the business in America: it absorbed those 2,000 yearlings, and still had another \$28 million or so left over to buy another 1,400 horses for an average of around \$20,000 for another six days. Unfortunately, as has now been well-documented, the European market proved this year dramatically unable to absorb similar numbers. Over 1,200 yearlings in Europe had already averaged around \$50,000 before Goffs kicked off the afternoon of Sept. 27, and another 2,168 yearlings had sold there and at Tattersalls' October 1 and 2 sales by close of business last Saturday. But whereas these three sales (their 2003 equivalents, really) had comprised 31percebt of the nine-sale gross in 2003, they dropped to a 25 percent market share this year. Stated in Euros, the three sales grossed 152 million last year, but just over 130 million in 2004, a 22.6 million drop, or 15 percent. The gross at the three major American sales had been up 18 percent; the gross at the first three major European sales was up 13 percent; but the gross at the final three--the biggest three--European sales, was down by 15 percent. We've discussed some of the reasons we think this is happening: overproduction of yearlings by 'better' sires, too much new money getting a buzz by selling rather than buying, and so on. But it does all come down to the one truest Rule of the Road in this industry where a basically free, unfettered market truly prevails: Supply and Demand. In America, huge supply, enough demand; in Europe, too much supply (especially by so-called 'better' stallions), not enough demand.

Champions Day...

Giant's Causeway, as you know, made himself Europe's number one freshman sire with a gritty double on atrocious ground last Saturday at Newmarket, but it looks as though he will be staying in Kentucky for next season--especially in light of what we've been discussing about the relative ability of the respective markets to absorb big numbers of yearlings by top young sires. But you could be excused for not noticing the other sire double at Newmarket Saturday: Charnwood Forest, sire of Saturday group winners Firebreak and Autumn Glory. Talk about a footnote to history (and therefore a great quiz question): who was the other sire, besides Giant's Causeway, to have a group-race double at Newmarket on Champions Day, 2004? Voila. And what vindication for Haafhd, that bonny colt by Alhaarth out of the great Blushing Groom racemare, Al Bahathri: he was always cantering in the Champion S., and would have won it no matter what the conditions on the day. Interestingly, Azamour, who had been third to Haafhd in the 2000 Guineas, was again third on Saturday. In between he had won two Group 1s, the St. James's Palace S. and the Irish Champion S. It won't pay to take the form too literally, because Azamour is patently much better on good or firm ground. But now Haafhd, along with Azamour and Arc winner Bago, are three-year-olds from this generation who have beaten older horses in top Group 1 races since the beginning of September. All three had two-year-old and/or Guineas form.


