Stay Forever, Sarafan out of Cup...

The Breeders' Cup lost two runners Monday when Stay Forever (Stack) and Sarafan (Lear Fan) were withdrawn from the GI Filly and Mare Turf and GI Turf, respectively. Stay Forever's trainer, Marty Wolfson, said that the Breeders' Cup follows too closely on the heels of her victory in the Oct. 10, GII WinStar Galaxy S. at Keeneland. "I usually try to space her races anywhere from nine to 12 weeks. But her schedule was completely altered this year," he said. Sarafan, meanwhile, apparently injured himself over the weekend and won't make the trip to Texas. "He had some inflammation in his right front, but it has since left," said conditioner Neil Drysdale. Footstepsinthesand, who had been deeply impressive when recording a facile score on debut at Naas eight days previously, had to work harder to maintain his unbeaten record here. That was attributable to the testing ground and the quality of the runner-up Gaff, who also looked ill at ease on the rain-softened surface. Demonstrating the same early speed that he used to annihilate his rivals at Naas, the 4-5 pick raced in a stalking second and continued to respond to Jamie Spencer's urgings to take command with a quarter mile remaining. Chased all the way to the line by Gaff, who veered left when asked to quicken by Pat Smullen, he maintained the gallop to keep that rival safely at bay. "He's a serious horse," commented trainer Aidan O'Brien. "Jamie [Spencer] said he gave him an unbelievable feel and he has all the options open to him next year." Sandy Goldfarb's Sis City (Slew City Slew), who, according to reports over the weekend, had been removed from consideration for the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, will apparently contest the mile-and-asixteenth event. Goldfarb called Breeders' Cup officials and said that the one-time claimer, third in the Oct. 9, GI Frizette S. at Belmont, would be shipped to Lone Star despite rumors to the contrary. Trainer Rick Dutrow sent out the bay to a five-furlong move Monday morning at Aqueduct in 1:03 1/5, terming the work "basic" excercise. He said that he had yet to make final plans about flying from New York or who the jockey would be. "The owners all want to go and, if we can get these things worked out, I'll be excited to be there, too," said Dutrow. "I can't answer too many questions right now, but I'll know more on entry day."

As Saturday may well show, the Breeders' Cup sometimes represents too big a task for even the most talented European horses at the end of a hard season, as Montjeu showed in 2000. Starting favorite for the Turf, even though he was nursing an ankle problem, Montjeu could finish only seventh, which was a far from appropriate way to finish a glorious career. In 15 previous starts, this elegant son of Sadler's Wells had won 11 times, with the French and Irish Derbys, the Arc and the King George among his six Group 1 victories.

By modern standards, Montjeu was very stoutly bred, as his dam, Floripedes, had been a Group 3 winner over 1 7/8 miles and Floripedes' half brother Dadarissime had won two group races at around the same distance. Under the circumstances, Montjeu did extremely well to win both his juvenile starts.

Everything about Montjeu suggested that he would improve considerably from two to three, and the colt came to the notice of Michael Tabor. In a deal handled by John Warren, a consultant to the colt's owners Tsega Ltd, Tabor purchased a substantial interest in the colt bred by Sir James Goldsmith. Tabor, of course, has had his colors carried by numerous top-notch performers, but it is debatable whether any of them has shown more talent than Montjeu, who went on to be rated 137 by Timeform both at three and four years. The compilers of the International Classifications paid him the considerable compliment of rating him 135 at three, eight pounds ahead of Dubai Millennium, Sendawar and Stravinsky and 10 pounds ahead of Charismatic, the top-ranked American three-year-old. This means that Montjeu is officially rated Sadler's Wells' best son, better than such major winners as Galileo, High Chaparral, In the Wings, Barathea, Opera House, Old Vic and Carnegie.

Yet Montjeu had some prejudices to overcome when he joined the Coolmore team at the end of 2000, not least the fact that the bottom half of his pedigree could be deemed old-fashioned. It is packed with stamina and mainly comprises classic French bloodlines, with no American influences.

Yet these predominantly French bloodlines had been highly effective. Montjeu's dam Floripedes, who was second in French St Leger, is by Top Ville, who had won the French Derby 20 years before Montjeu ran away with the same Classic. Top Ville's sire High Top won the 2000 Guineas and Floripedes' other grandsire, Tennyson, was second in the 1973 French Derby prior to winning the Grand Prix de Paris over 1 15/16 miles.

Move on to Floripedes' eight great-grandparents and you'll find that they include Charlottesville (French Derby and Grand Prix de Paris), La Sega (French 1000 Guineas and French Oaks), Val de Loir (French Derby), Tidra (second in the French Oaks) and Zeddaan (French 2000 Guineas).

Incidentally, High Top has played a significant part in Sadler's Wells' success story, as have his sire Derring-Do and his son Top Ville. It was a Derring-Do mare which produced Old Vic, who completed the French and Irish Derby double. And it is High Top's Irish Oaks winner Colorspin who is the dam of those highly distinguished brothers Opera House (King George, Coronation Cup and Eclipse S.) and Kayf Tara (a dual winner of both the Irish St Leger and Ascot Gold Cup). Top Ville mares, for their part, have produced Montjeu, the Australian Group 1 winner Darazari and the Hong Kong Group 1 winner River Dancer to Sadler's Wells, plus the Irish Derby winner Winged Love to Sadler's Wells' son In the Wings.

Opera House was sold directly to Japan (where he sired the Horse of the Year T.M. Opera O), while Kayf Tara and Winged Love are now principally engaged in covering large numbers of jumping mares. This suggested that breeders weren't guaranteed to give Montjeu the level of support he so thoroughly deserved on the scores of ability, toughness, versatility and correctness--unless the price was right. Coolmore therefore started him at a fee of Ir30,000gns--roughly one-seventh the fee that Sadler's Wells commanded at that time--and Montjeu covered nearly 140 mares in his first season in 2001.

Many of the breeders who used Montjeu had reason to be pleased with their decision, as 16 of his first-crop yearlings sold for more than 100,000 guineas. Bearing in mind John Warren's earlier connections with Montjeu, it was no surprise that he was an active buyer of Montjeu's first yearlings at Tattersalls' October Sale. He bought three colts for 125,000, 85,000 and 75,000 guineas, and appears to have hit the jackpot with the 75,000-guinea colt Motivator.

Motivator had sprinted six lengths clear in a mile maiden at Newmarket in August and he was nearly as impressive when stepped up to Group 1 company in the Racing Post Futurity at Doncaster, quickening away to win by two and a half lengths.

Motivator's Group 1 victory completed an excellent few days for his sire, who had notched up winner number 14 when Hurricane Run won a newcomers' race at Longchamp on October 21 and winner number 15 when Walk in the Park scored at Saint-Cloud the following day. Alpine Gold also won for Montjeu, whose other previous winners include the Group 1-placed Dash to the Top, the Listed winner Kings Quay and the Group 3-placed Red Peony.

The scale of Montjeu's success has translated into some very good prices in the sales ring for his second crop, which is smaller than its predecessor. Three second-crop colts have sold for the equivalent of 320,000 guineas or more, with Michael Tabor paying 520,000 for a colt which shares the same broodmare sire, Gone West, as Motivator. Tabor is sending this colt to Michael Bell, trainer of Motivator.

It is quite easy to see why Montjeu would be seen as a good choice for daughters of Gone West. Whereas he is a rangy, fine-boned, quality individual who was a bit unfurnished in training, the Gone Wests are normally powerfully built with good bone. And, with an average winning distance of a mile for his mature stock in Britain and Ireland, Gone West has the speed to balance the stamina in Montjeu's pedigree.

Another incentive for the mating is Sadler's Wells' success with Raise A Native-line mares, which have produced King's Theatre, Galileo and the 2000 Guineas winners Entrepreneur and Refuse to Bend.

Motivator's Futurity win possibly raised more questions than it answered. For example, will he have enough speed to threaten Shamardal and Dubawi in the 2000 Guineas next May? And will he be as effective on much faster ground, of the type often found at Epsom on Derby Day?

You certainly couldn't rule him out of the 2000 Guineas. His dam, Out West, was a Listed winner over a mile and she is a 3/4 sister to that fast American horse Western Borders, who twice finished third in the G1 Carter H. over seven furlongs. Out West also has two grandparents (Mr. Prospector and Uncommitted) in common with Gervazy, another smart sprinter-miler.

It is harder to answer the question about fast ground, but Montjeu showed his brilliance on a wide variety of ground. It is worth quoting some of Timeform's assessment of Montjeu:

"Montjeu was usually held up to make the most of his tremendous turn of foot. Montjeu, who had a rather short, unimpressive action, was unsuited by firm going, but probably acted on any other. Montjeu was never more impressive than when winning the King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. on good-to-firm."

Motivator seems to have inherited the turn of foot and the short action, and he can also be expected to follow in his sire's footsteps by improving from two to three.

GATWICK HEADS DAY 1 AT TATTERSALLS

Three-year-old Gatwick (Ire) (Ali-Royal {Ire}) topped the opening day of Tattersalls Autumn Horse in Training Sale Monday with a 270,000gns final bid from agent Dwayne Woods. National Hunt trainer Howard Johnson was the immediate underbidder on the colt. Consigned by West IIsley Stables, the winner of four starts and earner of £138,576 will join Wood's brother, Hong Kong-based trainer Sean Woods. "He has plenty of potential and good tactical speed, so should be really suited to Hong Kong," said Dwayne Woods. The second highest price of the session was realized by lot 247, three-year-old Faasel (Ire) (Unfuwain). The Hamdan Al Maktoum homebred, who was consigned by Friarstown Stables on behalf of Shadwell Estate Co., was bought to go jumping by Cumbrian trainer Nicky Richards for 230,000gns. Among other highlights on the day, connections of GI Queen Elizabeth Challenge Cup and GI American Oaks heroine Ticker Tape (GB) (Royal Applause), who was purchased for 100,000gns at last year's sale, collected a juvenile by the same sire at yesterday's session. Moth Ball (GB) (Royal Applause), like Ticker Tape, sold from trainer Jamie Osborne's stable, and was originally bought back for 210,000gns. However, agent Gordian Troeller, who was the underbidder on the colt and acting on behalf of California trainer Jim Cassidy, would not take no for an answer and later purchased the colt privately for 205,000gns. "I thought he'd make 300,000gns and we couldn't have bought him for that, so I'm chuffed to have got him eventually," said Troeller. "I've liked him ever since I saw him at Jamie's yard three months ago. Hopefully, he might be a Kentucky Derby horse, time will tell." The sale continues today with a session starting at 10 a.m.
