BREEDERS' CUP BULLETIN

Five for Fighting

Trainer Aidan O'Brien was quietly confident about the chances for his quintet of Breeders' Cup runners after vesterday's draw. Powerscourt (GB) (Sadler's Wells) is the second choice at 3-1 in the Turf. "He's a horse who handles fast ground well, but we've found Sadler's Wells' offspring are very adaptable," said the Ballydoyle conditioner. "He's run on soft ground in Europe. He picks up well, so the short straight here won't hurt him." Yesterday (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), third in last year's F/M Turf, is back for another go despite getting very sick this summer. "She nearly died in the middle of the summer of colitis," O'Brien explained. "We were delighted with her run in France [fourth, G1 Prix de l'Opera Oct. 3], and we think she has come forward since then. She's an intelligent filly who handles fast ground, but is careful on it. She can be a little bit slow to 'go' when you ask her, and we think the visor [blinkers] will help her with that." O'Brien's charge in the Mile, Antonius Pius (Danzig), has proved a tricky ride this season. "He may not have grown up yet," he said. "He's not an easy ride, and you have to slightly miss it [the break] on him." According to O'Brien, "a fast pace on a tight track will suit him." Joining their older stablemates are the two-year-olds Scandinavia (Fusaichi Pegasus) and Mona Lisa (GB) (Giant's Causeway). A half brother to 2002 Juvenile Fillies runner-up Composure, Scandinavia will make his first start on dirt Saturday. "He's a good horse, very much on the upgrade," O'Brien said. "But he loves the dirt at home and has had only four races this year." Mona Lisa will be looking to make history as the first horse to break its maiden in the Breeders' Cup. "She was very unlucky at Ascot," O'Brien explained about the filly's close fourth in the G1 Fillies Mile. "She has a lot of tactical pace early and loves fast ground. The question is whether she knows enough."

Zakocity lulled the field to sleep through lackadaisical fractions before sprinting away to his first stakes success in the opening-day feature at the Big A. The welltraveled bay, on the board in a pair stakes in Florida in the spring, prevailed in a Saratoga second-level allowance Aug. 30 before running a staying-on third in the GIII Pegasus S. at the Meadowlands Oct. 1. Offered up at plump 6-1 odds in a field that contained only one stakes winner--Stolen Time--the Pat Reynolds trainee was hustled out to the front and promptly settled into a relaxed gallop, setting fractions of :24.42, :48.99 and 1:13.27. Edging clear of the tracking Stolen Time as they approached the lane, he kept his eye on the prize down the lane and scored easily. "He broke quick and I quess that took some of the guesswork out of things," said Reynolds. "He set even fractions for a decent horse to be left alone. He kept on motoring. We are tickled pink." Asked what was next for Zakocity, who was making his 13th start of the year, Reynolds said, "I will give him a little breather now. I'll talk to Mr. Pompa [owner Paul] and we'll figure out what is good for the horse." GI Haskell Invitational H. runner-up My Snookie's Boy (Crafty Friend), making his first start since finishing 10th in the GII Pennsylvania Derby Sept. 6, was sent off the 2-1 choice, but never fired and finished sixth. FIVE BC RUNNERS RACING FOR EDUCATION

Five Race for Education-nominated horses will take their places in the starting gate during the 2004 Breeders' Cup World Thoroughbred Championships at Lone Star Park Oct. 30. The owners of this guintet have promised to donate a percentage of their horses' earnings to the program, which funds scholarships for young people in the racing industry. The five are: Musical Chimes (In Excess {Ire}, owned by Gainsborough Farm/Maktoum al Maktoum, in the Mile; Heiligbrodt Racing Stables' Bwana Charlie (Indian Charlie) in the Sprint; Padua Stables and John and Joseph Iracane's Cajun Beat (Grand Slam), also in the Sprint; Padua Stables' Proud Accolade (Yes It's True) in the Juvenile; and Team Valor's Super Brand (SAf) (Royal Chalice {SAf}) in the F/M Turf. "A good education is the building block for the rest of your life, and the best education should be accessible to all children connected with our industry," said Padua's Anne Sanan, a former schoolteacher. "Padua is 100 percent behind The Race for Education."

CONCESSIONS WORK FOR FRANCE GALOP

France Galop's radical reforms to the French program took another step forward yesterday after concessions won over the majority of dissenters at a general assembly of racing representatives. While the plan to reduce the distance of the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club (French Derby) to 10 1/2 furlongs from its traditional mile and a half was rubber-stamped, France Galop's President Edouard de Rothschild had to back down from two proposed changes. It was announced that the G1 Grand Prix de Paris will remain at Longchamp instead of being switched to Saint-Cloud, but the distance will increase from 10 furlongs to a mile and a half. The date of the race has also been moved to the evening of July 14. Additionally, the body revealed that the G1 Prix Jean Prat will become a one-mile race run on the first Sunday in July, and will have its purse doubled to \in 400,000. All the proposals will be sent back to the European Pattern Race Committee for their review.



Mid-Atlantic Tracks, NYRA Reach Accord:

The 19 tracks of the MidAtlantic Cooperative have reached agreement with the New York Racing Association and began importing the Aqueduct signal yesterday. The MidAtlantic tracks did not carry the NYRA signal during the recently concluded Belmont meeting because of a disagreement over account wagering. While terms of the deal were not disclosed, it will permit telephone and Internet account wagering in Pennsylvania and New Jersey. In a statement, MidAtlantic's Executive Director Martin Lieberman stated that it was the "CoOp's intention to seek to work with NYRA to provide the best presentation of the races in the MidAtlantic region," while Lieberman also expressed regret "over the parties' interruption of simulcasts during the recent Belmont meeting." The settlement comes a week after MidAtlantic Cooperative member track Suffolk Downs broke rank and reached a separate agreement with NYRA.

Coolmore Stud's Fusaichi Pegasus (Mr. Prospector), who will be represented in Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile by favored Roman Ruler, is off to an equally impressive start in the Southern Hemisphere. Four of his sons and daughters have already made it to the races during the early part of the new season and three of those have earned black type, including Dr Green (Aus), the impressive winner on his debut of the Listed Wellesley S. in New Zealand last Saturday. The bay colt had been the subject of much discussion prior to Wellesley effort, having taken a pair of barrier trials in scintillating fashion. With the victory, Dr Green stamped himself a bonafide contender for the A\$3million G1 AAMI Golden Slipper S. next April. "It wouldn't matter if he had another race before he left for Australia," said his trainer Brian Jenkins. "But I'll probably run him at Pukehohe in the Cullen S. [Nov. 20] then give him a short break before heading to Australia." Dr Green was purchased for NZ\$480,000 at last year's New Zealand Bloodstock Premier Yearling Sale at Karaka by bloodstock agent Paul Beamish, who remarked that his purchase had developed into "a truly magnificent individual--not overly big, but very powerful and athletic."
