RECORD EQUALLED AT TATTS THURSDAY

The Tattersalls Autumn Horses In Training Sale record price of 525,000gns was equalled at yesterday's final session of the 2004 auction when progressive handicapper **Kehaar (GB)** (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) was bought by John Ferguson on behalf of Godolphin. The

three-year-old, who has won three of his four starts, matched the price paid by Godolphin for Firebreak (GB) at this venue in 2001. Ferguson outbid California agent Emmanuel de Seroux as well as Irishman Hugo Merry for the colt. "Sheikh Mohammed has admired the horse through the course of the year so we were interested when he came up for sale," explained Ferguson. "He

will go out to Dubai and be campaigned in the Godolphin blue next season. Although it's not up to me, I doubt whether he will run in Dubai over the winter." Strong international demand helped the sale's 18.6-million guineas aggregate beat last year's record by 21 percent, while the 21,698gns average and 12,000gns median were up respectively by seven percent and nine percent. Tattersalls chairman Edmond Mahony commented: "Last year's Autumn Horses in Training Sale produced phenomenal figures, with turnover up nearly 30 percent, and the average up 25 percent. This looked to be a tough act to follow, but this has been a very strong sale with record figures across the board for the third consecutive year. Obviously the individual highlight was Mikael Magnusson's smashing colt Kehaar, but we have also had more lots sell for 200,000gns and above than ever before, and fierce competition from start to finish between the huge numbers of overseas buyers and the British and Irish buyers, both Flat and National Hunt. The real feature of the sale has been the consistency of the demand at every level of the market, top, middle and bottom. There have been no holes, and it is encouraging for owners that they can bring their horses in training to this sale and receive such good returns. Owners can have confidence that there is a good solid market for their horses which can only encourage continued participation in the sport." Stats and Toppers p5

IN THE GOLD OUT OF THE CUP

In the Gold (Golden Missile) has been withdrawn from the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies after coming down with a fever late Wednesday afternoon. "It's a drag," admitted trainer Nick Zito. "She was doing great." In the Gold was coming off a third-place effort in the Oct. 8 GII Darley Alcibiades S. at Keeneland. Originally part of the Breeders' Cup Head 2Head wager, the filly has been replaced by Play With Fire (Boundary). The three-way wager will now consist of Culinary (El Amante), Sharp Lisa (Dixieland Band) and Play With Fire.

Killer" Hall of Famer H. Allen Jerkens. "They've accused me of that before," Jerkens said of the moniker. "But I never have been all that comfortable with it. You work hard, try to get your horses in the right spots and try to get lucky." Among his historic upsets: Horse of the Year Kelso was defeated three times by the Jerkenstrained Beau Purple; Handsome Boy upset Buckpasser in the 1963 Widener H.; Secretariat was twice beaten by Jerkens trainees; and 34-1 outsider Wagon Limit defeated champion

Skip Away and Gentlemen (Arg) in the 1998 GI Jockey Club Gold Cup. "I look back on all that we've done and I feel good about it," Jerkens said. "But the thing about this game is that there is always something else to accomplish. For us, we've never won a Kentucky Derby or one of these Breeders' Cup races. It would be nice to do that now." Jerkens has a chance to earn that first Cup win with another longshot Saturday. "Bowman's Band is an old pro and he has been training right," he said. "So you're hoping to get a piece of the pie and maybe get lucky, too." *Breeders' Cup cont. p. 2*

lucky and proud to be associated with a horse like Afleet Alex. Horses make trainers."

Ouija Board (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}) was a solid thirdplace finisher against the boys in the Arc, but will be staying against her own sex for her follow-up in the Breeders' Cup. "We had been hearing how good Kitten's Joy was from you lot [the American press] and Lord Derby and I had a long chat about it and decided on running against her own sex," explained trainer Ed Dunlop. "Next year if she comes back, there's always [the Turf]." Dunlop added that Ouija Board was training well for the Breeders' Cup. "She came out of her race in the Arc better than any race this year because I think she is getting mentally stronger. She put all her weight back on in about eight days. She got a bit far back in the Arc and may have been a little unlucky, but she appears now to be as good as she's been all year."

The Kentucky native saddled Personal Ensign to a dramatic win in the 1988 Distaff. Personal Ensign is the dam of My Flag, who McGaughey sent out to a win in the 1995 Juvenile Fillies. Storm Flag Flying provided McGaughey with a third-generation Breeders' Cup tri-

umph in the 2002 Juvenile Fillies. "She ran two years ago as a hyped horse," McGaughey said yesterday at Lone Star Park. "She came here under the radar. I think standing here right now, she's the best horse in the race. What's going to happen, who knows?" The Distaff will be the final start of Storm Flag Flying's career. The four-year-old filly will be bred to A.P. Indy next year.

DARLEY ANNOUNCES STUD FEES Darley Stud, the breeding operation of Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid al Maktoum, has released its stud fees for 2005, which reflect the current state of the European bloodstock market. John Ferguson, the chief bloodstock advisor to Sheikh Mohammed, wrote a thorough analysis of the current European bloodstock market, which accompanied the release. In his opinion, supported by statistical evidence, to make a blanket statement that the market is down "around 15 percent" is misleading and that it is more accurate to report that the top 30 percent has seen decreases while the rest of the market has remained "largely static" versus 2003. With this in mind, Darley has announced that the stud fees for their "elitemarket" stallions--Dubai Destination, Red Ransom and Fantastic Light--will be reduced for the 2005 breeding season. Cape Cross, who has been represented by 11 stakes winners to date, will see his fee increased from €20,000 to €50,000. The majority of the stud fees remain unchanged. Darley is interested in demonstrating that their customer is their chief concern. "Our commitment is to helping breeders maximize their rewards from breeding racehorses--which means providing top-class stallions and minimizing their production costs," Ferguson commented. "The Darley deal starts with our stallion fees. There are all sorts of interesting terms for the right mares. Officials Pleased with Experimental Tracking System:

Officials from Keeneland Race Course and Equibase are pleased with initial results from an experimental tracking system that has been tested at the current meeting. The system uses a radio-frequency transmitter placed in a horse's saddle towel and multiple antennas around the track to compute the horse's speed at different points on the track and how far a horse actually travels in a race. The information was collected by TurfTrax, a British data collection company. "We believe it's Keeneland's responsibility to cooperate with our partners such as Equibase to test technology that ultimately will provide racing's customers with more complete precise information," said Keeneland president Nick Nicholson. Races were tracked on four different dates before an actual demonstration took place on Oct. 22. Data sets from the demonstration were received after the races were tracked Oct. 22 and analysis will take place over the next few weeks. "Equibase is determined to find a system that is not only capable of accurately capturing the positional data, but also is economically feasible for industry deployment," said Equibase President Phil O'Hara. "We will continue to study automated tracking and we will continue to keep the industry informed as we do."



MORE ARRESTS IN RACE-FIXING CASE

Six more individuals have been arrested in the last week as the City of London Police continue their investigation into allegations of race fixing. While none of the new arrests involve trainers and jockeys, Detective Chief Superintendent Steve Wilmott yesterday stated that more arrests are imminent and that those on bail would return to the police next April. They include jockeys Kieren Fallon, Fergal Lynch and Darren Williams, as well as trainer Karl Burke. "We have made a large number of arrests, and we expect to carry out more over the next few months," Wilmott said yesterday. "This has grown into a huge investigation and will require more time and resources to fully investigate. For this reason we have taken the decision to extend their bail to early next year."
