STARS SHINING AT LONE STAR

Every year, Breeders' Cup day plays host to racing's greatest stars, and this year's edition at Lone Star Park in Grand Prairie, Texas, is no different. **Pleasantly Perfect** (Pleasant Colony) (Classic), **Six Perfections** (Celtic Swing {GB}) (Mile) and **Cajun Beat** (Grand Slam) (Sprint) will try and defend their respective titles, while



Storm Flag Flying (Storm Cat) and Azeri (Jade Hunter) are striking out into unchartered territory. Storm Flag Flying will attempt to become the first horse in Breeders' Cup history to take two different events on the card. and 2002 Horse of the Year Azeri will try and add the Classic to her victory in the Distaff two years ago. Two-time Breeders' Cup

champions are few and far in between, and only a handful of horses have accomplished that feat. Miesque (1987/88) and Lure (1992/93) both won back-to-back Miles, while Da Hoss bagged the race in 1996 and came back two years later to win again for trainer Michael Dickinson. Also responsible for the Breeders' Cup double is Argentine import Bayakoa, who won the Distaff in 1989 and '90, while High Chaparral (Ire) collected a Turf victory in 2002 before dead-heating for first with Johar in 2003. Tiznow, however, holds the distinction for most money earned on Breeders' Cup day, having scored in consecutive Classics in 2000 and 2001.

Second Time's the Charm ...

Numerous horses are returning to take another shot at racing's championship day, including **Elloluv** (Gilded Time) and **Ashado** (Saint Ballado), who finished runnerup in last year's Distaff and Juvenile Fillies, respectively. Both entered for this year's Distaff, Ashado is the winner of three of her last five starts, including the nine-furlong GI Kentucky Oaks, while Elloluv's most recent win was recorded in the mile Piedra Foundation H. at Del Mar Sept. 2. A pair of fillies, Life's Magic in 1984 and Lady's Secret in 1985, came back from second-place finishes in the contest for older fillies and mares to score in the race the following year, while no horse has yet to step up from the Juvenile Fillies and follow up with a Distaff win.

for trainer Bobby Frankel and his charge **Ghostzapper** (Awesome Again). Scheduled for a routine 1 1/2-mile gallop, exercise rider Nuno Santos misunderstood Frankel's instructions and only galloped the horse five-eighths. Frankel quickly realized the rider's error and sent the four-

an edge. "He won over the track, so obviously he likes it, but I don't think a race over the track is a big deal," he said. "He didn't ever run below form because of the racetrack--there was always some other explanation." But Clement doesn't believe his colt, third in the 2003 Classic at 15-1, will be looking for excuses after this year's running. "He is training well--I think he is doing at least as well as last year," he said. The majority of this year's contenders

Flaxman Holdings' Six Perfections (Fr) (Celtic Swing {GB}) had her final workout at Lone Star Friday in preparation for today's Mile. The defending champion covered three-eighths of a mile in :43 flat over the yielding turf course. According to trainer Pascal Bary, the move, which was required to satisfy Texas Racing Commission rules, was more of a strong gallop than an actual workout. Off since a second-place finish in the G1 Prix du Haras de Fresnay-le Buffard Jacques Le Marois Aug. 15, Six Perfections needed to record a work in the state of Texas before being given the go-ahead to race today. "It was just a nice blowout for her," said Bary. "I think the turf track has a good enough cushion and the turns are fairly cambered."

SILVER CHARM HEADED TO JAPAN Kentucky Derby winner Silver Charm (Silver Buck--Bonnie's Poker, by Poker) has been purchased by the Japanese Racing Association for an undisclosed price, according to syndicate manager Robert Clay Friday. "We received an offer that, at my stage in life, I could not turn down," said Bob Lewis, who campaigned the colt with his wife Beverly and retained a 75% interest in Silver Charm following his retirement. "The contract gives us the right of first refusal to purchase him if he is ever sold, so that we can ensure his well being. It provides that he may return to Three Chimneys upon his retirement [from stud duty]." Agent Rollin Baugh represented the JRA in the purchase of the 10-year-old. From two crops to race, the 10-year-old stallion has sired graded-stakes winner Consecrate and stakes performers Silver Impulse and Silver Indy. Over the course of four seasons on the track, the roan won 11 of 22 starts, including the Kentucky Derby and Preakness S. at three, and came back the following year to score in the G1 Dubai World Cup.

The graded stakes action gets off to an early start at the Big A to accommodate the Breeders' Cup. Bending Strings looks to capture consecutive starts for the first time this season, coming off a convincing victory over even-money chalk Smokey Glacken in the GIII Safely Kept Breeders' Cup S. at Pimlico Oct. 2. The three-yearold has had reasonable success this season knocking heads with the division's best fillies. She's finished second to Society Selection twice, including the GI Test S. at Saratoga in July. The lightly-raced Smokey Glacken, a half to successful sire Smoke Glacken, returned from a 5 1/2-month break to take a pair of minor stakes events at Monmouth and Saratoga in August, then failed to fend off Bending Strings in her latest going six panels. The bay is likely to be on the engine early and may find the added panel a hindrance as she attempts to turn the tables. The lone Grade I winner in the field, Passing Shot is reverting back to a sprint for the first time since June of 2003 while returning from breather. Last year's GI Personal Ensign H. upsetter finished third in the GI Ogden Phipps H. at Belmont June 19 before going to the shelf.

Speed hasn't done especially well in the opening days of the meet, but the fleet L'Oiseau d'Argent looms the one to run down this afternoon. The chestnut took a one-mile event over the Saratoga turf in 1:33 2/5 Aug. 5, but found the company in the GII Fourstardave H. too tough, finishing eighth to Nothing to Lose. He bounced back to wire the restricted Elusive Quality S. going a flat mile at Belmont Oct. 6, but must negotiate an extra furlong this afternoon. Host, the Chilean Horse of the Year in 2003, has yet to win in four U.S. starts, but most recently returned from a six-month absence to finish a troubled third in the GIII Cliff Hanger H. at the Meadowlands Oct. 15, a race won by Dr. Kashnikow. The latter is dangerous, but is unlikely to get the cut in the ground he prefers. **Denon** is the clear class of the field, but needs to improve off his fifth in the GIII Sycamore Breeders' Cup S. Oct. 9 and races today at a distance well short of his optimum.

Trainer Dale Romans had an inkling that he had a potential star on his hands before the colt even ran. "We knew he was a good horse when we started breezing him on the turf, but you never know if they are going to make it to this point," he said.

The Ramseys also have homebred Nothing to Lose (Mile) and Roses in May (Classic) running on Breeders' Cup Day, all with excellent chances, but Kitten's Joy could be the star of the show. "I think my best shot of winning is Kitten's Joy," Ken Ramsey said. "We ran him in the Joe Hirsch, and he ran :22 3/5 for the last quarter after already going a mile and a quarter on a yielding turf course. It almost brought tears to my eyes. That was so exceptional, and a horse to do that in my opinion, it takes a very good horse. So I think Kitten's Joy with his exceptional kick on the [tail end] is my choice if I had to pick one of the three."

Three-year-olds have won five of 20 runnings of the Turf, most recently High Chaparral (Ire) in 2002. And the Ramsey colorbearer is coming out of Turf Classic, a race which has produced five previous Turf winners.

It's hard to tell whether Roman Ruler is cut from the same cloth as Vindication, the winner of the 2002 Juvenile who was poised for greatness before injury ended his career, or from that of Officer, a good horse whose hype failed to carry him the distance of the 2001 Juvenile as the prohibitive 3-5 pick. What--or who, rather--links all three is the man that saddled them--trainer Bob Baffert. So can Silverbulletbob take his second Juvenile in three years? Let's see...

First, the positives: he showed poise side-stepping a fallen rival before romping by seven lengths in the Best Pal, and his second in the GII Del Mar Futurity yielded a 106 Bever that ranks as the field's best. And, with his victory in the Norfolk, he is just one of two stakes winners in the field that has been around two turns.

Now, the negatives: the dark bay had every chance to go by Futurity winner Declan's Moon and didn't,

refusing to overtake that foe even as they galloped out. Perhaps that's why Baffert added blinkers in the Norfolk--but jockey Corey Nakatani had trouble coaxing the headstrong colt into settling around the first turn that afternoon. If Roman Ruler can relax early and make one big run here, he should be able to negotiate the

distance with no problem; if not, he'll be crying Whywhywhy all the way home. Also, the Norfolk win, which came against just three wildy overmatched rivals, earned Roman Ruler a Beyer of 85--a 21-point plunge from his previous outing. Not exactly what you want to see in a horse's two-turn bow.

The verdict: there seem to be a few legitimate chinks in this guy's armor, but at what should be an honest price (5-2, possibly? Remember that Vindication paid \$10.20), it's worth betting that he can get owner Fog City Stable its first Breeders' Cup winner.




