Makybe Diva was tucked away 12th of 24 on the fence, with Vinnie Roe on her outside. While Zazzman (Aus) (Distinctly North) and Caulfield Cup victor Elvstroem (Aus) (Danehill) set a solid pace, Boss crept stealthily forward and as the field swung for home, Boss let the mighty mare have her head and she accelerated on the rails to leave all but an extraordinarily dogged Vinnie Roe in her wake. Boss, renowned for his high-spirited jubilance returning to the winners' stall, had tears streaming down his face and broke down again during the presentation. "What a mighty mare, she gave me the ride of my life," he said. "At the half mile I felt like I was 'in the zone' again, it was a flashback to last year, I was so confident and relaxed, in a little world of my own. It was a walk in the park," he said.

Makybe Diva's the Boss

"I'm not a legend, don't go down that path," said Boss in response to a media question. "She's a legend. I'm just the lucky bastard who gets to sit on her back. There was a lot of pressure, she was the defending champion, the favorite. All the people who do all the work back at the stables, I get the accolades, but they are the ones...I just sit there and steer in the right direction." Makybe Diva, only the second horse in 143 years to win the Sydney-Melbourne Cup double in the same year, has earnings of A\$7,177,135, making her the second highest earning mare in Australasia after Sunline (NZ) (A\$11,690,679). Freedman has also won the Melbourne Cup with Tawrrific in 1989, Subzero in 1992 and Doriemus in 1995. Freedman's long-held dream to race a horse in the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe is fast crystalling, but he must convince laid-back owner Tony Santic. "It's been a dream of mine to race a horse in the Arc, but I've never had one good enough," Freedman said. "But this mare is right out of the box. She's the perfect horse for a race like the Arc."

Conditions Hamper Also Rans

While Media Puzzle (Theatrical {Ire}) struggled in the soft going to finish 12th, Vinnie Roe appeared as though he could have sustained the fight for several more furlongs. Trainer Dermot Weld said he would consider returning with Vinnie Roe in 2005. "He had everything in his favor today and he ran a superb race. I thought he might win a furlong out. We might even come back next year," he said. Distinction (Ire) (Danehill)'s rider Darren Beadman said the soft conditions were the undoing of his mount. "He's a big-striding horse and didn't let down on the track," Beadman commented. "It might have been a completely different story on a firmer track." Frankie Dettori said Mamool (Ire) (In the Wings {GB}), who sustained a fracture on a firm track in the race last year, failed to stay, while Godolphin stablemate Razkalla (Caerleon)'s rider Kerrin McEvoy said: "He tried to go with Vinnie Roe but didn't let down on the ground." Damien Oliver rode Distinction in trackwork before opting to stick with 12th placed Media Puzzle, but said: "He couldn't go in the ground. He copped a bump from Mamool on the turn when I tried to track behind Vinnie Roe. From there, his race was over."

Melbourne Cup Betting Sets Record

Makybe Diva, at 5-2, the shortest-priced favorite to win the Melbourne Cup in 50 years, inspired a record A\$126-million betting splurge at Australian TABs Tuesday, *Australian Associated Press* reported. The previous record was A\$117 million, set when the mare won the Cup last year.

AMERICAN POST RETIRED Khalid Abdullah's American Post (GB) (Bering {GB}--Wells Fargo {GB}, by Sadler's Wells) has been retired due to a problem with a hind hock, according to Racing Post. Last year's impressive G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere and G1 Racing Post Trophy winner won the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains (French 2000 Guineas) in dramatic circumstances at Longchamp May 16. Having looked booked for a place when Antonius Pius swept past inside the final eighth, he found himself back in front at the line after that rival collided with the rail in the final 25 yards. He subsequently finished sixth in the G1 Epsom Derby June 5 and disappointed when 10th on his return from a summer break in the G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp on his final start Sept. 5. "He was a very good horse and had rather a special, but appealing personality," conditioner Criquette Head-Maarek told the Post. Regular jockey Richard Hughes added, "He was a very versatile horse with a lot of speed. He didn't quite get home in the Derby and was an exceptional horse when he had his ground." It is yet to be decided where American Post, who won six of his nine starts and £495,759 in total prizemoney, will stand in 2005.

DAM OF WILKO TO SELL AT TATTERSALLS

Native Roots (Ire) (Indian Ridge {Ire}), the dam of Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner Wilko (Awesome Again) will sell at the upcoming Tattersalls December Sale. The seven-year-old mare is in foal to G1 Dubai World Cup winner Street Cry (Ire). Wilko, the first foal of Native Roots, was multiple group placed in England before his upset victory in Saturday's Juvenile. Trained in England by Jeremy Noseda, the colt will join the California stable of Craig Dollase for owners Paul Reddam and Paul and Susan Roy. Native Roots, who has a filly foal by Talk is Money (Deputy Minister), is one of 22 fillies and mares to be consigned to the December Sale by Jamie Railton. The Tattersalls December Sale will run from Nov. 22 through Dec. 2.

THIRD-CROP SIRES: AWESOME

The torch has been passed. The great sires of the last thirty years, now nearly all dead or retired; Sadler's Wells, 24 next year, the only one still left--and Storm Cat, from the next generation, will be 22. This isn't news: what is news is that a new group of Young Turks is emerging in Kentucky. They may well not dominate like the great sires of the Golden Age of the last thirty years--I don't see anybody about with 15%, 18% SW; these days, 10% SW is probably a seriously good sire. So the standards do appear to be changing, and the top sires probably won't be as dominant as the last group was--but new top sires there are, and at least five of them are the top five North American third-crop sires by cumulative progeny earnings.

This group of sires has two crops of three-year-olds, last year's and this year's, including both years' Kentucky Derby (and Preakness) winners. Here's a short synposis of what the top five have accomplished so far (ranked by cumulative progeny earnings, excluding Japan):

- 1. Elusive Quality: from 203 foals (3 crops) of racing age, 109 winners (54%), \$14 2/3-million in earnings, 16 SW (8%), 22 SH (11%), including 2004 Kentucky Derby and Preakness winner Smarty Jones. Entering stud fee: \$10,000; 2005 stud fee: \$100,000.
- 2. Grand Slam: from 322 foals (he and the other Ashford sire, Tale of the Cat, have over 300 foals in three crops; the other three top five sires have between 185-215), 135 winners (42%), \$12-million in progeny earnings, 15 SW (4.7%), 37 SH (11.5%), including 2003 BC Sprint winner Cajun Beat. Entering stud fee: \$30,000; 2005 stud fee: \$85,000.
- 3. <u>Tale Of The Cat</u>: from 316 foals, 149 winners (47%), \$11.4-million earnings, 13 SW (4%), 30 SH (9.5%); Champion Sire of 2-Year-Olds 2003. Entering stud fee: \$25,000; 2005 stud fee: \$65,000.

- 4. <u>Distorted Humor</u>: from 185 foals, 94 winners (51%), \$10.6-million in purses, 17 SW (9%), 24 SH (13%), including 2003 Kentucky Derby and Preakness winner Funny Cide. Entering stud fee: \$12,500; 2005 stud fee: \$50,000.
- 5. Awesome Again: from 215 foals, 67 winners (31%), now \$9.85-million in progeny earnings, 7 SW (3%), 13 SH (6%), two Breeders Cup winners Saturday, including Classic winner Ghostzapper, whose 124 Beyer is probably the most reliable top Beyer figure of the decade (he had run a 128 on a wet-fast track--which can sometimes lead to off-the-graph high figures--at Monmouth in the Iselin); that conservatively equates to a Timeform 136, in my view (which makes the Beyer 128 a Timeform 140 if you take it at face value).

As you'll see from the accompanying table, Awesome Again's fifth-place progeny earnings total of just under \$10-million is miles clear of the rest of the third-crop sires, led by now Japanese-based Wild Rush (\$7.1-million) and Ten Most Wanted's sire, Deputy Commander. The elite group has broken away from the pack, but it's worth remembering that this 'pack' also includes the likes of Touch Gold, the excellent young Stormy Atlantic, new Kentucky sire Northern Afleet, and the rapidly improving grass sire, Arch. As promising as they all are, though, it's the top five who have been responsible for two Kentucky Derby winners in two tries, and this year's probable Horse Of The Year, Ghostzapper, and likely Champion Three-Year-Old, Smarty Jones.

So, statistically, what these sires are scoring are what need to now be regarded as current industry standards, not what the greats of the past achieved. I'm not saying become totally relativist, but we must be practical. So far these five sires have notched up 68 SW and 126 SH from 1,241 foals -- 5.5% SW/foals, and 10.2% stakes horses/foals. I think these percentages will improve slightly, because two-year-old crops win and place in stakes at only half the rate of older crops; therefore, sires with fewer total crops have a higher percentage of two-year-olds, who have lower stakes percentages, among their total foals.

As they have more crops, their percentages of stakes horses therefore gradually increases. The same is true of the percentage of winners/foals statistic. This has traditionally been over 60% for Top 50 North American sires, though undoubtedly the increase in foal crop sizes is contributing to these lower percentages, too. But, at the end of the day, it's those handful of top-class performers who sell the seasons, which is why the stud fees of these top five sires are all at least 2 1/2 times what they started out at: it's none of those percentages, really. It's the names like Funny Cide, Smarty Jones, and Ghostzapper--that's what sells those seasons.

The Wilko Lesson...

Amid all this excitement, the forgotten horse of great significance is Wilko, Awesome Again's first winner on the day, author of a massive upset in the BC Juvenile. This needs to be looked at very closely. I read in yesterday's *Racing Post* that the European handicapper was going to promote him to equal second European two-year-old colt, along with G1 National S. winner Dubawi. Forget it. European champion two-year-old colt Shamardal hammered Wilko in the G3 Vintage S. at Goodwood at the end of July: he beat him 2 1/2 lengths that day, which is about 6 'pounds', though he won very easily--Raceform actually rated him 11 pounds above Wilko. But let's be conservative (just this once): the six pounds is about right, because Wilko spent most of the rest of his British campaign finishing right there with other horses Shamardal hammered in the Dewhurst.

But Wilko did establish two very important virtues during his campaign, which attracted the attention of bloodstock agent Jamie McCalmont, on the hunt for California owner Paul Reddam: Wilko had plenty of seasoning--always a very important ingredient in American racing--and, in the last of his ten British races for owner Susan Roy and trainer Jereny Noseda, he also demonstrated he could stay on. This was in the one-mile G2 Royal Lodge S. at Ascot, September 25. He got in a world of trouble in the straight, and when he finally extricated himself, Perfectperformance had flown and Scandinavia was chugging on by; nonetheless, a few observers noted Wilko was staying on again, quite determinedly.

The rest is now history. McCalmont thought the colt had shown enough to justify further action on his part, and the plan--to run in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile-began to take shape. Reddam bought majority interest, they enlisted jockey Dettori, and off they went to Texas. The colt was by a son of Deputy Minister, he had seasoning, he stayed on--all in all, they felt he justified his place in what turned out to be a small, eight-horse field, though they thought a placing was the best they could expect. But guess what? Nothing else stayed, jockey Dettori saw them all dying in front of him, and they just kept going. But Wilko's not all of a sudden the equal second-best colt in Europe: he's exactly what he was before he went. The race went in a Beyer 98 (= Timeform 110), and all that happened was that all the fancied American colts didn't get the trip. So we learn a lot from Wilko's win, in my view-including that American owners and trainers who are running scared over the BC Juvenile and are afraid of 'over-racing' their two-year-olds in general, are not doing themselves any favors. There are a lot of opportunities being missed, I don't doubt. Wilko's connections were smart, and lucky--but they were also brave, and sometimes that's what can make the difference, too. But don't let anybody tell you Wilko's a 122; not on this planet he's not; not yet, anyway. He was just a very well-placed horse who proved you've got to get the trip.

The Vocabulary Lesson...

Now it's time for the vocabulary lesson. This has to do with the word "accurate", as in, when John Ferguson released the Darley stud fees last week, his accompanying document began with the following assertion:

"Common perception is that the market is around 15% down on last year. This is not accurate."

Whoa, Nelly. This IS accurate. What John meant to say is "This isn't the whole story," or "But, if we break the overall figures down into deciles, they tell a somewhat different story," something like that. But the figures he was referring to WERE accurate: the gross for the 2,168 yearlings sold at Goffs and Tattersalls was down 15% from the corresponding sales in 2003. That is a fact, and it is accurate. By all means, break the figures down further, qualify them, whatever: but, please, as Mark Twain put it in his great essay, "Fenimore Cooper's Literary Offences"--"Use the right word, not its second cousin."
