SHARP START FOR KEENELAND NOVEMBER

It's going to be hard to measure up to last year's blockbuster event, but the 2004 Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale got off on the right foot in Lexington yesterday. There were no records set, but while the 2003 opener saw nine broodmares break the \$1 million barrier, the first session of this year's auction saw no less than 15 mares sell for seven figures. The gross and the median also showed gains. "Last year, there were a couple of superstar jewels that led the way," said Keeneland Director of Sales Geoff Russell. "To surpass last year's gross is great. I was surprised we were able to do that." Topping the opening-day festivities was the 2001 GI Breeders' Cup Distaff heroine **Unbridled Elaine** (Unbridled's Song), in foal to Forestry. The gray, a half sister to Grade I winner Glitter Woman (Glitterman) and to the dam of MGSW Lead Story (Editor's Note), also captured the GI Monmouth Breeders' Cup Oaks and the Iowa Oaks and earned \$1,770,740. The six-year-old was consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, agent for the dispersal of the estate of Betty Devenport, and purchased by John Ferguson Bloodstock. Her first foal is a yearling filly by Rahy, but she has no foal of 2004. "She's an outstanding mare...the winner of the Breeders' Cup Distaff and a half sister to another Grade I winner," Ferguson said. "She is a beautiful mare. If you want to be racing and breeding horses at the highest level, being able to have a mare like that is a huge asset." Ferguson added that it is likely that Unbridled Elaine will join the Sheikh Mohammed's broodmare band in Kentucky. Taylor Made's Duncan Taylor was not surprised that Unbridled Elaine elicited such strong bidding. "She's one of the best mares I've ever seen," he said. "You can't get any better looking than that. She's just a gorgeous mare and she's going to a good home. I thought the price was just about right. We're very pleased." Overbrook the underbidder on the session topper.

Gone West Filly Heads Weanlings...


Maurice Miller is best known for shopping for horses he can turn around and resell, but yesterday, the Florida-based horseman saw an opportunity he couldn't pass up. He went to \$700,000 to acquire a filly by Gone West--Dance Swiftly (Danzig) from the consignment of Taylor Made Sales Agency, agent. A Feb. 9 foal, the bay is out of a full sister to champion Dance Smartly and a half to Smart Strike (Mr. Prospector) who sold for \$2.4 million while in foal to Gone West at the 1999 Keeneland November sale. "It was such a quality family and obviously it's a little too much money to try to pinhook," Miller commented. "I thought she was a very good physical and Gone West over that type of family, why not take a chance?" Miller plans to put together a racing partnership.

Large and in Charge...

Saying only that he had bought the mare for "a partnership," Reiley McDonald signed the \$4.2-million ticket for **Take Charge Lady** (Dehere). Consigned by Three Chimneys Sales, agent, the five-year-old was a Grade II winner at two, counted the GI Ashland S. and GI Overbrook Spinster S. among her six stakes wins at three and defended her title in the Spinster at four. Overall, the bay won 11 races and \$2,480,377. Retired at the end of last year, she is in foal to Seeking the Gold. "She's a nice mare," McDonald. "I thought she was as nice a mare as there is in the sale. She raced so many times at so many distances and she looked like she could go out and race again today." While admitting he was reaching his limit, McDonald said his expectation of the price tag was "right on." As for the partnership's plan for Take Charge Lady, the bloodstock agent said, "The options are open." Overbrook Farm was once again the underbidder

ClassicStar Lands Day's First Blow...

David Plummer of ClassicStar added another mare to his expanding broodmare band when he bought **Profit Column** (Private Account) for \$1.6 million. The 11-year-old mare, in foal to Storm Cat, is carrying a full brother to her graded stakes winner Final Round. "We liked her," admitted Plummer. "She's nice and young and she's in foal to a top horse." Plummer struck early in the day, envisioning brisk bidding during Monday's session. "We believe the market is going to be real strong, so we want to try and buy some while we can," he explained. "We see all the people here... they're all trying to buy the very best one, so it's going to be kind of a competitive battle today." Of Profit Column's seven-figure price tag, Plummer said, "We're very happy with that price," while adding he was prepared to go higher for the pretty chestnut mare. ClassicStar, which currently has about 125 mares, is focused mainly on re-selling, but several of the fillies are finding their way to the racetrack. "We're really market breeders so we're buying to sell," Plummer said. "But now we have about 25 head in training, so I don't know how much market breeders we really are. We're keeping a lot of our fillies to send to the racetrack because we're finding the market so strong that we can race them and race our own and do well. We've been very fortunate doing that in the last couple of months with some of the winners we've had, but we're always interested in buying young good mares in foal."

A Stellar Performance...

It was a season that saw her turn in one shining performance after another, but **Stellar Jayne** (Wild Rush) was not just a star on the track. The three-year-old sold yesterday for \$3.6 million to the bid of John Ferguson. Raced by a partnership including Nancy Cole, Nick Strong, Chuck Kidder and Bruce Kline/Spendthrift Farm, the gray filly blossomed this year, defeating likely champion Ashado in the GI Mother Goose S. before finishing second in the GI CCA Oaks and GI Alabama S. She bounced back in determined fashion to win the GI Gazelle S. by a length and was a troubled third in the GIII Indiana Breeders' Cup Oaks prior to her third-place effort in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff, where she raced wide throughout. "She was just a lovely filly," Nancy Cole commented. "All we wanted to do was break her maiden and take her home and breed her. We're breeders. But we did a little more than that." The winning bidder was equally impressed by her on-track ability and her looks. "She's a good Grade I winner and what's more, she's beautiful," Ferguson commented. "She's got a lovely pedigree and she's a mare where you have so many choices and options as far as matings go. As to whether she stays in training or not, that's a decision that Sheikh Mohamed will make. Obviously it's something we've discussed and it's just something that he will decide now that she's ours." Eric Hamelback, bidding on behalf of Charlotte Weber's Live Oak Stud, was the immediate underbidder, making his final bid at \$3.5 million. "She was one of the top four of the sale and we tried very hard," he explained. "I think the world of Dr. Cole and the partnership--they've done well with that mare. Obviously she went to the best. We really wanted her, wanted to race her, so we'll just have to keep trying."

Smoke'n Frolic...

Cot Campbell purchased **Smok'n Frolic** (Smoke Glacken) for \$85,000 as a two-year-old and the gray mare went on to become a multiple graded stakes winner and earner of over \$1.5 million for Campbell's Dogwood Stables. But the partnership came to an end yesterday when the five-year-old broodmare prospect sold for \$1.25 million to Frank Stronach. She was consigned by Three Chimneys Sales. Campbell admitted it was a bittersweet parting. "We won stakes with her four straight years," Campbell said. "She's been the mainstay of our stable. I bought her as a two-year-old and she's been a great success story. She has a great personality. She'll be sadly missed, but we'll be consoled with \$1.25 million." Asked about the price tag, Campbell said, "We were very happy. We thought she'd bring about \$1 million, but thinking and doing are two different things. We thought the top would be \$1.5 million, so we were right in between. But we'll take this with appreciation."

Shadwell Orders Up Dessert...

While most of the horses owned by The Thoroughbred Corporation were being sold at last year's November sale, **Dessert** (Storm Cat) was busy establishing her reputation at the races. Repatriated after a pair of off-the-board efforts overseas, the daughter of MGISW and champion Windsharp (Lear Fan) came to hand late last summer for trainer Richard Mandella with a pair of victories over the Del Mar turf course, including the GI Del Mar Oaks. Yesterday, the half sister to GI Breeders' Cup Turf hero Johar (Gone West) got the chance to strut her stuff in the ring, eliciting a final bid of \$3.6 million from Rick Nichols on behalf of Shadwell Farm. "She's got a great pedigree," he commented. "Her mother's a Grade I winner, she's a Grade I winner, her brother's a Grade I winner. She's got Storm Cat knees, but other than that, she's a nice mare." Dessert was consigned to the sale by Lane's End Farm and sold in foal to Kingmambo. "That was a good sale for us," said Lane's End's Bill Farish. "It's a very, very strong market. It's very competitive and we're very pleased with her." While Nichols indicated that a decision on who the mare would be bred back to was pending, he suggested that she could return to Kingmambo. "Sheikh Hamdan really likes Kingmambo," he added. "He's done well for him."

Cat's Meow...

At The Thoroughbred Corporation's dispersal during the Barretts March Sale, **Cat Fighter** (Storm Cat) sold for \$1.35 million to John Sikura. Since then, the filly has made three starts, hitting the board in three stakes. The four-year-old filly returned to the sale's ring yesterday at Keeneland and sold for \$2.3 million, this time to Charlotte Weber's Live Oak Stud. "We are going to retire her," Live Oak general manager Eric Hamelback said of the broodmare prospect, adding, "Plans for mating have not been decided." Earlier in the session, Hamelback was underbidder on the three-year-old Stellar Jayne, but he didn't miss out on his number two pick Cat Fighter, who bankrolled \$277,860. "She was, pedigree-wise, our favorite choice from any mare in the sale," Hamelback said of the Grade II winner. "We tried hard for Stellar Jayne because we felt like we could race her on and do quite well. But [Cat Fighter] is four and coming five." The price tag did not surprise Hamelback. "With the family, actually, we were very happy with the price," he explained. "And the depth of the family is very strong." Just 128 lots of the marathon sale were in the history books when Hamelback's job at Keeneland was finished. "We pick three or four horses and we get one of those and we're done," he said.

Taylor Made Reaches Milestone...

When **Carib Lady (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) was knocked down for \$900,000 to Shadai Farm, Taylor Made Sales Agency surpassed the \$1-billion mark in public auction sales. A perennial consignor of sales-topping horses, the Nicholasville, Kentucky-based operation is owned by the sons of the late Joe Taylor, the former farm manager at Gainesway Farm while it was owned by John Gaines. Taylor Made originally opened for business in 1976 and sold its first horse three years later. In a brief statement yesterday, Duncan Taylor expressed his appreciation to their customers and praised the hard work of their employees over the years.

A Banner Day for Keeneland...

The first day of the 2003 Keeneland November sale saw Cash Run set a new mark for a broodmare, realizing \$7.1 million, but 28 percent of the horses through the ring on opening day last year left unsold. That figure was down significantly this year, with just 19 percent of the hips offered yesterday failing to find new homes. "We knew going in that we had a number of very nice mares," said Keeneland Director of Sales Geoff Russell. "The top was also spread out a little bit. I thought we'd sell more horses, which we did. [Nineteen percent] is as low as I think you can see an RNA rate at a sale at this moment. It shows that horses are here to sell. There were a couple of runs where I was surprised that horses were being bought back, but the gross number and the percentage of RNAs are down this year, so that's very positive. It shows that consignors have read the market very well and adjusted accordingly for their reserves."

ON TAP FOR TUESDAY...

More Than a Ghost of a Chance...

Frankie O'Connor watched the Breeders' Cup Classic with great interest. Not because he'd made the biggest bet of his life on Ghostzapper...on second thought, maybe he had. O'Connor, who manages Kildare Stud in Athens-Boonesboro, just south of Lexington, purchased Rachel's Halo (Sunny's Halo) at the 2000 KEENOV sale for \$80,000 carrying a colt by Wild Rush. The mare is out of the Tri Jet mare Thirty Zip, making her a half to Baby Zip (Relaunch), the dam of Grade I-winning sprinter City Zip as well as Ghostzapper.

"I was familiar with City Zip from his days in New York--I was a big fan of his," said O'Connor, who consigns the mare in partnership with the Stills family's Crescent Hill. "When I got to see the mare personally at the sale, I liked what I saw. She was a very good-looking mare and we thought she'd be a good investment."

That leap of faith could pay off this morning when hip [322](#), carrying a colt by 2000 Kentucky Derby winner Fusaichi Pegasus, strides into the ring.

"When I saw his foals and yearlings at previous sales, they were all very athletic and I think he's going to do very well as a sire," O'Connor said, explaining the decision to put the mare in foal to the Ashford stallion.

"He's gotten off to a great start with his two-year-olds and I imagine his three-year-olds will be even better."

And so, while he wasn't getting ready to head back to the mutual windows to collect on a wager, O'Connor was cheering loudest of all for Ghostzapper.

"I have followed him from the day he broke his maiden because I had this mare--I followed him with close interest," he commented. "I think he's an amazing horse and we've haven't seen anything like him in a number of years. It's very exciting to see him beat the best of the best on the biggest day of the year."

Like many others on the grounds, O'Connor is bullish on his chances today.

"All the right people have been here, the stock market is good, business has been good here all year, so I think it bodes well for the sale," he said.

Hip 319, Punch Appeal, f, 2, Successful Appeal--Okanagan Dawn, by Two Punch
 B-Rosebrook Farms (FL)
Consigned by Four Star Sales

Currently second on the leading freshman sires list, Successful Appeal inched closer to the top when this filly dug in gamely in the stretch to win the \$100,000-added Pocahontas S. at Churchill last Saturday. One of 13 winners for her sire, Punch Appeal has posted five wins from eight trips to the post for earnings of \$239,840. She sells today as a racing or broodmare prospect.

Hip 337, Santa Catarina, f, 4, Unbridled--Purrfectly, by Storm Cat (i/f A.P. Indy)
Consigned by Denali Stud (C Bandoroff), agent for Robert and Beverly Lewis

A \$950,000 graduate of the 2001 Keeneland September sale, Santa Catarina registered the most important victory of her career in the GII Hollywood Breeders' Cup Oaks in 2003, but also put up some excellent performances in defeat, including runner-up finishes in the GI Del Mar Debutante at two and the GI Kentucky Oaks last year. Her dam was sold carrying a filly by Unbridled's Song for \$3.15 million at last year's November sale. Santa Catarina sells in foal to A.P. Indy.

Hip 377, Sunlit Silence, m, 13, Trempolino--Tuesday Evening, by Nodouble (i/f Empire Maker)
Consigned by Lakland LLC, agent

A stakes winner of \$213,771, Sunlit Silence is the dam of Greek Sun (Danzig), one of the leading three-year-old turf runners in the U.S. Trained by Bobby Frankel for Peter Angelos, the dark bay won his first three trips to the post, including the GIII Cinema Breeders' Cup H. this past May. Second to Kitten's Joy in the GI Secretariat S., he was unplaced in the GI Man o' War S., but atoned for that defeat with a 3/4-length score in the GII Oak Tree Derby Oct. 17. Sunlit Silence sells in foal to Belmont S. winner Empire Maker.

Hip 409, f, Rock of Gibraltar (Ire)--Western Reel, by Gone West

B-John D Gunther & Cudney Stables (ON)
Consigned by Glennwood Farm Inc, agent

This is the lone representative for Rock of Gibraltar (Danehill), who strung together seven victories in Group 1 company and lost the streak only after a rough-trip second in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile in October 2002. An Ontario-bred filly, she is out of a full sister to Dance Parade, a five-time graded/group stakes winner in the U.S. and England.

Hip 416, You, m, 5, You and I--Our Dani, by Homebuilder (i/f A.P. Indy)

Consigned by Mill Ridge Sales, agent

A five-time Grade I winner of over \$2.1 million, You was scheduled to sell at the Keeneland January sale, but was withdrawn at the 11th hour. Raced during her career by Edmund Gann, the dark bay was bred early last spring and sells carrying her first foal by A.P. Indy.

Hip 444, Be Gentle, f, 3, Tale of the Cat--Gentlelilstar, by Risen Star (i/f A.P. Indy)

Consigned by Eaton Sales, agent

Raced during her two-year-old season by Eaton principle Tom Van Meter, Be Gentle registered four victories from seven starts, including the GII Darley Alcibiades S. and the GII Golden Rod S. before being retired due to a fractured right front ankle. Virtually everyone involved in today's Thoroughbred industry must be familiar with the enormous legacy left by Special. This once-raced daughter of Forli and Thong found lasting fame as the dam of one spectacular stallion, Nureyev, and as the second dam of another, Sadler's Wells (plus his highly effective brother Fairy King).

But what about Lisadell, Thong's other daughter by Forli? Although not nearly as well known as Special, this mare has also left a rich legacy.

Of course, Lisadell had every right to become a major force. Not only was she a sister to Thatch, a sprinter-miler who retired with a Timeform rating of 136, but she was also a half-sister to two other colts who distinguished themselves during their time with Vincent O'Brien, namely King Pellinore (Timeform 127) and Marinsky (130). Lisadell didn't let the side down. After winning the G3 Athasi S. in Ireland, she travelled to the 1974 Royal Ascot meeting, where she won the G2 Coronation S. without being seriously challenged.

During a lengthy career as a producer, Lisadell produced five sons and seven daughters. Although three of the sons became stakes winners, none of the fillies achieved that distinction.

However, four of these seven daughters now have a Group 1-winning descendant, the latest being Lisadell's unraced Hoist The Flag filly Inisfree, who ranks as the third dam of Soldier Hollow. This German-trained son of the much-missed In The Wings was recording his fifth Group success when he proved too good for the British raiders in Sunday's Premio Roma.

The interesting aspect of the success of this Lisadell line is the way the family's ability keeps re-emerging, just as it looks to be fading away.

The first of the line's Group 1 winners was El Condor Pasa, the Japanese star who earned a Timeform rating of 136 in 1999, when he won the Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud and made Montjeu work hard for his Arc success. Lisadell is the third dam of this son of Kingmambo, the connecting links being her unraced Seattle Slew filly Glenveagh (who failed to produce a winner among her three foals) and Glenveagh's moderate Sadler's Wells filly Saddlers Gal.

Saddlers Gal's visit to the yearling sales suggested that her prospects were poor. The bidding stopped at only IR22,000gns in a year when Sadler's Wells' yearlings averaged 225,817gns, so it came as no surprise when she failed to reach the first four in any of her nine appearances. Her rating from Turform, the Irish counterpart of Timeform, was a mere 45.

The family's next Group 1 success came in 2000, when the English-trained Endless Hall was much too good for the opposition in the Gran Premio di Milano. Endless Hall's talent wasn't so surprising, as he traced to Lisadell through Endless Joy, a two-year-old Group 3 winner; La Joyeuse, a useful daughter of Northern Dancer; and Rosa Mundi, Lisadell's Listed-placed Secretariat filly best known as the dam of the Grade II winner Sword Dance and the champion American steeplechaser Correggio.

The other branch of the family to produce a Group 1 winner is the one descending from Lisadell's daughter Lisaleen.

This Northern Dancer filly did pretty well on the track, winning two of her three starts for O'Brien and finishing third at Group 3 level in the other. However, Lisaleen produced only one Group winner--her Forty Niner filly Miss Tobacco, who won a German Group 3--before dying at 18. Lisaleen's Seattle Slew filly Gossamer didn't manage to win until she was four and earned less than \$50,000 in 15 starts, but her powerful bloodlines asserted themselves this year, with her Miswaki colt Bachelor Duke defeating top-class colts Azamour and Grey Swallow to win the Irish 2,000 Guineas.

Soldier Hollow's third dam, Inisfree, never raced and failed to cut much ice as a broodmare, producing only minor winners despite being mated to such successful stallions as Caerleon, Alzao and Fairy King.

Her Caerleon filly Lake Isle won a seven-furlong maiden race at Gowran Park. Despite being a winning grand-daughter of Lisadell, Lake Isle made no more than 33,000gns as an in-foal four-year-old and was later sold to Japan, leaving three minor winners behind her in England. One of those winners, the speedy Island Race, has produced Soldier Hollow as her first foal.

One recurring theme in this family history is the success enjoyed with Sadler's Wells and his sons, with the matings all producing two lines of Forli and Thong.

Soldier Hollow (who is inbred 3x5x5 to Northern Dancer) is by In The Wings, whereas Endless Hall (who is inbred 3x3 to Northern Dancer) is by Saddlers' Hall. Sadler's Wells also crops up as the sire of El Condor Pasa's dam Saddlers Gal, who is inbred 4x3 to both Forli and Thong. Mating Saddlers Gal to Kingmambo, whose broodmare sire is Nureyev, produced 4x3 to Northern Dancer, plus 4x4 to Special and 5x5x4 to both Forli and Thong.

Lisadell herself had two foals by Sadler's Wells and another by Fairy King, easily the best of the three being her Sadler's Wells colt Fatherland. Fatherland became a Group 1 winner when he caught Maroof in the National S. and he very nearly caught Barathea in the following year's Irish 2000 Guineas. Sadly he later broke a pastern in the Hollywood Derby. I have always wondered what Fatherland might have achieved as a stallion, had he lived. He was inbred 4x2 to both Forli and Thong, and he surely couldn't have failed to make his mark.

His three-parts brother Yeats, by Nijinsky, sired numerous stakes winners in Australia, headed by the multiple Group 1 winners Our Poetic Prince and Poetic King, but he didn't have the close inbreeding to Forli and Thong that made Fatherland so unusual.

Jockeys Evicted after Dispute with Churchill Officials:

Several riders who threatened to boycott the Nov. 11 program at Churchill Downs because of a dispute over medical insurance coverage were escorted off the grounds by officials Sunday and are banned from participating for the remainder of the meeting, which concludes Nov. 27. Three of the leading jockeys at the meet--Robby Albarado, Rafael Bejarano and Mark Guidry--were among those banned. Shane Sellers and Craig Perret were also ejected from the track. According to sources, riders who refused to accept mounts for Wednesday's card were informed by President Steve Sexton that they had to "pack their stuff in the jocks' room and take it off the property." Sexton confirmed that quote, adding, "They will not be allowed in the stable area. They will not be allowed on the track." According to Sexton, Churchill provides health coverage of up to \$100,000 to all riders during each racing day as well as contributing \$2.2 million each year to the Jockeys' Guild for health coverage. "We believe the concern expressed by the jockeys over insurance coverage is legitimate, but we do not agree with their approach to addressing that concern," said Sexton. "We are eager to participate in the effort to address the problem, but it would not be responsible for Churchill Downs to agree to any knee-jerk attempt to achieve a solution over the space of a few days." This is not just an issue at Churchill, but on the national front as well. The NTRA announced yesterday that it was forming a panel, to be chaired by Terry Meyocks, to examine jockeys' medical insurance coverage.
