SANTA CATARINA SETS THE STANDARD

Santa Catarina (Unbridled), a four-year-old with all of the right ingredients--pedigree, appearance, performance and in foal to leading sire A.P. Indy--achieved the highest price of the Keeneland November Breeding

Stock Sale when Reiley McDonald, bidding on behalf of an undisclosed partnership, went to \$4.8 million to purchase the dark bay. McDonald said that he was acting for the same unnamed group of people who bought Take Charge Lady for \$4.2 million during Monday's opening session. He outbid a slew of would-be buyers, including Skara Glen Stables, and ultimately John Ferguson, who walked away and hung up the cell phone after making a final bid at \$4.7 million. "She's just a big, pretty, very correct daughter of Unbridled," Mc-

Donald said of the filly, who is carrying a foal by A.P. Indy. "There aren't going to be a whole lot more of those." McDonald said that he had the four-year-old daughter of the Storm Cat mare Purrfectly appraised "between \$4 and \$5 million." He added, "You just have to be willing to pay for that kind of mare." Purchased by Bob and Beverly Lewis for \$950,000 as a yearling, Santa Catarina developed into one of the best fillies of her generation, winning the GII Hollywood Breeders' Cup Oaks and placing in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, GI Frizette S., GI Del Mar Debutante and GI Kentucky Oaks. She went through the ring when the Lewises decided to reduce their bloodstock holdings. Bob Lewis was philosophical--and prophetic--ahead of yesterday's session. "Well, you can't help but wonder a little bit whether you're doing the right thing," he admitted. "But we have a number of fillies that will be coming along soon to take their place. We think we have some select mares for this market that should serve them well." **Keeneland cont. p2-12**

Santa Catarina Sells for \$4.8 Million cont.

Craig Bandoroff's Denali Stud consigned Santa Catarina on behalf of the dispersal of Bob and Beverly Lewis. "She's just a special mare," he commented. "It's not too often that you get to sell something that has no holes in it. She had no holes, she had it all. I've been saying this whole week that the bad part of this thing was that we aren't going to be able to see her again." Bandoroff was effusive in his praise for his clients. "The Lewises are special people," he said. "We are so appreciative of them and the trust that they have invested in us to take care of their horses. They are just great people."

Beauty in the Eye of the Beholder...

Continuing the trend of seven-figure mares from the Lewis dispersal, **Storm Beauty** (Storm Cat) sold for \$2.2 million to Betty Moran's Brushwood Stable. The nine-year-old mare, in foal to A.P. Indy, is the dam of Renaissance Lady (A.P. Indy), who sold for \$1.6 million earlier in the day (see p4). She is a half sister to champion Gold Beauty (Mr. Prospector)--the dam of Dayjur and Maplejinsky, and granddam of Sky Beauty. After securing the prized mare, Moran explained, "That was a mare from a very excellent family, with most of her fillies reproducing it in the family, and by the right sire. And she's in foal to the right sire, A.P. Indy." While Moran admitted she was "struggling" with the final bids, she added that the price might have gone much higher. "It's a good package in spite of the fact that she has a benign tumor--maybe that cut her price down," Moran said. Storm Beauty has a benign tumor under her chin; the growth has been there since her racing days and doesn't affect her, according to consignor Craig Bandoroff. David Plummer's ClassicStar was also involved in the bidding, dropping out after bidding \$2 million.

Gentle Breezes...

Gerald Ford's Diamond A Farms went to \$2.1 million to secure multiple graded stakes winner **Be Gentle** (Tale of the Cat), in foal to A.P. Indy. "She's a very correct horse," Ford said after the seven-figure purchase.

"[Trainer] Richard Mandella liked her, [farm manager] Ted Carr liked her. She's a great horse bred to a great stallion and we're really excited to have her." Ford has been active during the first two days of the Keeneland sale. He purchased a pair of mares from Monday's first session and expects to continue the shopping spree. "We bought a

couple earlier and we're looking at a couple more," Ford, who currently has 42 broodmares, admitted. Of the price tag, Ford said, "It's more than I expected to pay. That was about it--that was as high as I was planning on going." Tom VanMeter, who campaigned the filly to wins in the GII Darley Alcibiades S., GII Golden Rod S. and GIII Debutante S., consigned Be Gentle under his Eaton Sales banner and was obviously happy with the results of the sale. "That was good," Van Meter said. "I'm glad she's going to a good home." Be Gentle twice went through the sales ring before her racing career, but was led out unsold both times. She RNA'd for \$45,000 as a yearling, after which Van Meter purchased half of the filly from breeder Nellie Cox. Be Gentle failed to sell again as a two-year-old, failing to meet her reserve this time for \$220,000. But the third time was a charm, and the \$2.1-million final bid was more than enough for Ford to bring her home. "I was expecting about that," Van Meter said of the price. "I thought she'd bring a million five or a shade up from there." But Van Meter admitted to some nerves earlier in the session. "I was really worried when You went through there [unsold at \$2 million]. She was a better racemare than my filly."

You Fails to Meet Reserve...

Bidding on Edmund Gann's multiple Grade I winner **You** (You and I), consigned to the sale by Mill Ridge Sales, quickly reached \$2 million, but stalled out just as rapidly, and the five-year-old was led out of the ring unsold. "Mr. Gann had a price in mind and he wasn't going to deviate from that," said Bayne Welker Jr., in charge of the Mill Ridge consignment, adding that the mare was "relatively close" to meeting her reserve. "There's been good money for the good mares. In Mr. Gann's mind, she was the best racemare in the sale. He picked out a price and if it didn't reach it, he was going to hold on to her." You, a five-time Grade I winner of over \$2.1 million is carrying her first foal by A.P. Indy.

Hughes Declares War...

B. Wayne Hughes had his eye on several mares at Keeneland, but found bidding competitive before going to \$1.95 million to bring home **Words of War** (Lord at War {Arg}). The 15-year-old mare, dam of graded stakes winners No Matter What (Nureyev) and E Dubai (Mr. Prospector), is in foal to super sire Storm Cat. "That made a lot of difference," Hughes said of the covering stallion. "We like Storm Cat and we like the mare. We were the underbidder on the two-year-old colt, War Cry, that Satish [Sanan] got. So since we can't afford the yearlings, we thought we'd get the factory." Sanan's Padua Stables purchased War Cry (Unbridled) for \$2.7 million at last year's Fasig-Tipton Saratoga August sale. That unraced colt is one of three seven-figure yearlings out of Words of War. Hughes said no breeding plans have been made for his newest acquisition. "We haven't had a chance to talk about it," Hughes explained. "We didn't know we would get her. We've been outbid here all day long, both yesterday and today." Of the price tag, Hughes said, "I wasn't suprised because I didn't have any expectations, but I'm really glad to get the mare." Buying under the name of Malibu Farm, Hughes also purchased the six-year-old mare **Stylish** (Thunder Gulch) for \$1.5 million during Monday's first session of the Keeneland sale.

Summer Wind Keeps Blowin' In...

Bidding from inside the Keeneland sales pavilion, Frank and Laura Jane Lyon added to an already formidable broodmare band with their purchase of **Renaissance Lady** (A.P. Indy) for \$1.6 million. The couple, who operate Summer Wind Farm in Georgetown, Kentucky, outlasted all bidders to land the daughter of Storm Beauty. "We try to focus on mares who themselves were good runners and who have gone on to be good producers," Laura Jane Lyon commented. "She was one we were obviously very interested in." It has been a trying year for the Lyons family, who suffered through the loss of a trio of very prominent mares. Ingot Way, the dam of Horse of the Year Skip Away, died in March after giving birth to a foal by Awesome Again, while Carols Folly--the dam of Glitter Woman and Unbridled Elaine--was euthanized the following month after delivering a Storm Cat foal by caesarian section. The couple also owned Evil Elaine, the dam of Favorite Trick, who foundered in both feet and was also put down in March. Mrs. Lyon said that they were very interested in purchasing Unbridled Elaine on Monday, but bowed out of the bidding at the \$3.5-million level. The Breeders' Cup Distaff winner eventually sold for \$4.4 million. Other mares in the Summer Wind broodmare band include Alizea, the dam of Songandaplayer; La Paz, dam of Airdrie stallion Forest Camp; Fantastic Ways, the dam of MGSW Worldly Ways (GB) and SW Miss Fortunate; and Navarra, a full sister to Toussaud and the dam of GSW Indygo Shiner.

Bell Makes Quick Work for Blithe...

Bloodstock agent Reynolds Bell Jr. made just one bid yesterday on hip **445**, the three-year-old filly Blithe (Unbridled), but it was good enough to get the job done as the unraced half sister to 2000 Kentucky Derby winner Fusaichi Pegasus was purchased for unnamed clients for \$2 million. "She was a really athletic mare from a tremendous family and in foal to one of the best stallions in production," Bell commented. "I saw her as a yearling and I loved her then and I felt at that price, she was one I had to have." It's been tough sledding for Bell thus far at the sale. "I haven't had any luck so far. The market has been pretty strong," though he added that he thought the mare fell right where he thought she would. Blithe was bred by Stone Farm and Stonerside Stables, who are selling at Keeneland to dissolve the partnership. The decision to put the three-year-old filly in foal instead of sending her to the races was a result of the death earlier this year of her dam Angel Fever. Stone Farm's Arthur Hancock III was mostly pleased with the sale. "She's a lovely mare and she's going into good hands," he commented. "I think Reynolds has made a very good buy." As for the final price, Hancock said, "The world's here and the buyers are the final judges. I feel like I'm on trial. I honestly think she could have brought a little more than that. Her sisters brought more," referring to \$4-million purchases Blissful and Bless, both full sisters to Fusaichi Pegasus.

Claim to Fame...

Be Happy My Love (Formal Gold), a four-year-old half sister to dual Classic winner Smarty Jones, wasn't among the top sellers yesterday, but the story is a good one all the same. The first foal from I'll Get Along (Smile), she was unraced until 2003, breaking her maiden for a \$25,000 tag at Philadelphia Park for Someday Farm. Claimed for \$5,000 by Bella Brook Stable out of a third-place finish at that track last October, she raced just once more before retiring with \$15,435 in earnings. Enter Brereton Jones, who last October announced the addition of Proud Citizen to the stallion roster at his Airdrie Stud. Jones made a pitch to the owners of Be Happy My Love to purchase half of the filly, with the intent of breeding her to the son of Gone West. Yesterday, the bay filly was knocked down for a final bid of \$360,000 to David Plummer's Proud Citizen & D. Wayne Lukas ClassicStar. "That was good," Jones said. "We took a chance in buying her, and breeding her to our new stallion was a no-brainer."

Taylor Made Presentation Today...

Taylor Made Sales Agency, which surpassed the \$1-billion sales mark during Monday's session, will be honored during a presentation in the Keeneland sale's ring before the start of selling Wednesday. Participating in the presentation will be University of Kentucky basketball coach Tubby Smith, along with representatives of Taylor Made, Shadai Farm, WinStar Farm and Keeneland. During Monday's session, Taylor Made, on behalf of Kenny Troutt and Bill Casner's WinStar Farm, sold Carib Lady (Ire) to Shadai's Teruya Yoshida for \$900,000. That sale helped Taylor Made breach the \$1-billion threshold. The ceremony will begin at 9:45 a.m.

Lane's End's Big Daddy: A.P. Indy...

The influence of A.P. Indy, both in the sales ring and on the race track, has been evident for several years now, and Tuesday's session underlined the appeal of the Lane's End stallion as perhaps the world's most prominent sire of distance-loving dirt horses. For good measure, the Mr. Prospector mare Golden Sonata sold for \$1.9 million in foal to the son of Seattle Slew, ranking in the top 10 on the afternoon. "It's pretty amazing," said Lane's End's Bill Farish. "It shows you what kind of book he's been getting--just phenomenal mares, year after year. And that just comes through at the mare sales." Grand Slam Colt Tops Weanlings...

Glen Hill Farm manager Hap Proctor signed the ticket at \$650,000 on lot 553, a son of Grand Slam out of Heavenly Cat (Tabasco Cat). "He's just a nice colt," Proctor said of the weanling, who is a half brother to multiple graded stakes placed Capitano (Belong to Me). "His conformation was good and he vetted out well and it's a nice pedigree. He walked good and he's very well balanced. I thought he was one of the better colts." As for what the future will hold for the colt, Proctor said, "We buy mostly to race, so he'll go back to the farm and grow up." The colt, consigned yesterday by Viking Stud, Inc., as agent for Helen Andrews's Twin Hopes Farm, sold in utero for \$485,000 at last year's Keeneland November auction.

Family Matters...

A filly by Breeders' Cup Mile winner War Chant was the second highest-priced weanling yesterday with a final bid of \$625,000. Consigned by Indian Creek as agent, the bay was purchased by Texan Stewart Armstrong. She is out of Dissemble (GB) (Ahoonora {GB}), a half sister to Hasili (Ire) (Kahyasi {Ire}), the dam of champion Banks Hill (GB), Dansili (GB), Heat Haze (GB) and Intercontinental (GB). The weanling's catalog page was further boosted by the recent exploits of her half brother Leroidesanimaux (Brz) (Candy Stripes), winner of the Oct. 30 GIII Morvich H. Indian Creek's Shackelford Parrish confirmed the filly's family was a major factor in her sale price. "Pedigree is number one," Parrish said. "Leroidesanimaux is four for five in this country. He

set a track record and he nearly set another track record coming down the hill [at Santa Anita] and [trainer Bobby] Frankel is high on him. And her second dam is one of the best family's in the world and we're just lucky to have her. She was well-made." The \$625,000 tag took Parrish off guard. "It was a nice surprise," he admitted. "I was expecting \$250-300,000 after all the activity we had and the people that were on it. And we thought she was going abroad, but obviously that wasn't the case."

Strength in Numbers...

Keeneland's Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell was understandably pleased, and not very surprised, by the success of the sale so far. "We knew we had a lot of nice mares here," he said. "We thank our consignors for bringing so many nice mares. To have 33 million-dollar horses is phenomenal. It's close to a record. Hopefully tomorrow we'll have another [million-dollar horse]. We've seen a lot of activity from people who have bought farms here in Kentucky in the last three months --that's been a major push for the sale. The three new farm owners have been shopping very busily and we hope they will continue (Never Tell {Haisfields}, Malibu Farm {B. Wayne Hughes, owner of Spendthrift Farm} and Narvick on behalf of Jess Jackson). It's great for our local economy and it's great for everybody." Russell was quick to point out that a number of the catalogued mares fit the current fashion for a desired broodmare band member--young, attractive, well-performed--and thus made the sale a success. "We talked about it last year and it's continuation of last year--it's the young and the beautiful," he explained. "If you're young and beautiful, you're very popular. Also, the market has improved. The stability in our nation helps, people have more discretionary income at the moment. We've seen spending in other luxury items, and we are a luxury item and people are intent to spend their money, and we're very happy." Though the 2003 sale featured three broodmares who surpassed the \$5-million barrier, yesterday's session continued the momentum of Monday's strong opener. In all, 18 head brought seven-figure prices yesterday, which stacks up nicely to 12 at last year's session. There is the obvious difficulty of comparing breeding stock sales, due to the quality of dispersals in any given year, but the presence of the Lewis offerings and the Stonerside/Stone Farm representatives have offset last year's Thoroughbred Corporation standouts. Tuesday, 211 head were successfully sold for \$81,487,000, averaging \$386,194 and attaining a median price of \$210,000.

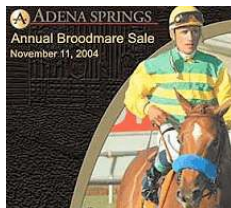

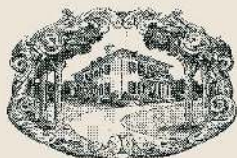

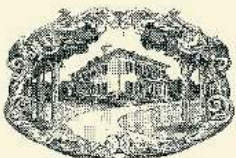
