

Christy Grassick, bidding on behalf of Ireland's Coolmore Stud, outdueled Ben Walden in a protracted

bidding war to land Helsinki (GB) (Machiavellian), the prized jewel on the third day of the Keeneland November Sale. Grassick signed the ticket at \$3.9 million for the 11-year-old mare, a full sister to G1 Dubai World Cup winner Street Cry (Ire). But her real claim to fame is that she is the dam of G1 Dewhurst S. winner and probable champion Shamardal (Giant's Causeway). John Magnier, speaking for the winning bidders, was rather nonchalant about the final price. "I guess she was expensive, wasn't she," he said. "We bought her mostly to breed her back to Giant's Causeway." The

dark bay mare sold carrying a foal by Cherokee Run. According to Magnier, Shamardal's perfect three-forthree record spoke for itself. "It's all there on the board," he said. "It's there on the racetrack. We've been beaten by that horse a few times." Walden bid courageously and went toe-to-toe with the Coolmore conglomerate, who only entered the fray just short of the \$3-million mark. Walden made his final bid at \$3.8 million before declining to exceed the final bid. "He's a tough man to beat," Walden said of Magnier.

"Pedigree updates always help and [Shamardal] is obviously the champion-elect horse in Europe and that makes Helsinki a special horse. We're honored to have sold the package today and the sale continues to roll on. As we've seen in previous sales, people who have been unable to buy on day one and day two come into day three and we hope that rolls on. We see people buying for their stallions they're retiring, like Mr. LaPenta bought a mare today [hip 716, who sold for \$375,000] and she will be bred to The Cliff's Edge. You have new people coming into this part of the market, that you don't expect, to support their stallions. You have major breeders regrouping, selling some mares, replenishing them, which is a process that all successful operations do."

Helsinki's Daughter Holds Her Own...

Just moments after Helsinki (GB) caused multi-million fireworks in the Keeneland pavillion, her weanling daughter by Unbridled's Song kept things going with a

flashy price tag of her own. "The story is she's a half sister to a champion and the mare just sold well," John Sikura said after fending off all challenges to secure the gray filly for \$1.15 million. "She's a nice filly and hopefully she'll grow into something. Hopefully she'll grow into more money." Sikura would not discuss the filly's new ownership, but, asked whether the weanling was bought to race or to re-sell, he said, "Both options are open." Sikura wasn't surprised by the seven-figure price tag. "I thought she was a \$1.5-million filly, based on what we have

here. We could breed her to Giant's Causeway...that's a long-term option with the way fillies are selling, winners or non-winners, from real active families." Still basking in the glow of back-to-back seven-figure sales, Duncan Taylor of Taylor Made Sales admitted, "We weren't expecting that much, but we knew they were really top horses. And when you get a female family and you have Shamardal and Street Cry in the pedigree in the first dam in the produce record, it's just one of those pedigrees that you'd do anything to have one like that. And Shamardal, nobody knows how good he is. He might be one of the best horses in the last 25-50 years. We knew it had the potential, but you just never know until it happens. So we were very excited." Taylor knows today's million-dollar purchase can provide even more dividends tomorrow. "It looks like a lot of money today," Taylor said. "But I remember when the same people, Coolmore, bought Mariah's Storm from us, that actually topped the sale at \$2.6 million [in 1996] and now they have Giant's Causeway, so we hope the same thing happens."

to secure the day's secondhighest-priced weanling. The daughter of Dixie Union out of Be a Prospector (Mr. Prospector) fell to a final bid of \$400,000. "We bought for racing, not to resell, so she'll go back to the farm," Courtney said. "We've had a lot of luck buying weanlings to race. We just won the third race at Aqueduct [Wednes-

day] with a High Yield [Stormy Jim] we bought for \$160,000. We're looking mostly for fillies for our broodmare band. It was a hell of a pedigree. I thought she was the ticket. My man likes big fillies, and I think she'll be a big filly." Of the price, Courtney added, "We were extended, but we'll pay for good horses." Courtney bought Stormy Jim at last year's January sale. The Dixie Union filly, a consignee of Brookdale Sales, is a three-quarter sister to multiple graded stakes placed Away (Dixieland Band). Be a Prospector is a half sister to Lane's End stallion Belong to Me (Danzig). "She's by a hot young sire and she's a gorgeous individual," said Brookdale Sales' Joe Seitz. "She's a great mover, very correct out of a classic family that's very active under the first dam. She's a great package for someone who wants to race and retire or looking for broodmare residual." Brookdale consigned the filly on behalf of Joseph and William Stavola, residents of New Jersey who raced Belong to Me.

Bow Down to Buddha...

The first weanling by Hill 'n' Dale stallion Buddha to go through the Keeneland sales ring was well received, attracting a final bid of \$200,000, more than 13 times his 2003 stud fee of \$15,000. "He was nice alright," commented pinhooker Peter O'Callaghan, who signed the ticket for hip 791 on behalf of an entity called

Bloodstock Services. "He's a very simple horse. A very good mover and nicely bred by an 'in' stallion son of Unbridled's Song. He was the pick of the Buddhas that I've seen." A Mar. 16 foal, the chestnut colt is a son of Barbed Wire (Affirmed), winner of the 1996 Mazarine Breeders' Cup S. in Canada. Trained by H. James Bond for owners Gary and Mary West, Buddha scored

his most important victory in the 2001 GI Wood Memorial and was the early favorite for that year's Kentucky Derby before being withdrawn on the eve of the race. Bloodstock agent Ben Glass, who buys horses for the Wests, was the immediate underbidder on the Ontariobred colt. "Maybe you'll come back and buy him next year," O'Callaghan told Glass after accepting his congratulations.



FROM THE DESK OF... Bill Oppenheim



THREE DAYS: \$200-MILLION

After the Keeneland September sale set a new world record for a horse sale (\$324.9 million), those of us attending the flagship British and Irish yearling sales got served a dose of overproduction-spurred, supply-and-demand reality--a 15 percent decline in prices over there (yeah, don't believe that website propaganda, it really was 15 percent). So, in spite of the last sale over here having set an all-time record for a horse sale, we managed to make ourselves nervous about what might happen here in November.

No worries. Fasig-Tipton's day definitely wasn't like-to-like, since they sold 201 horses, versus 59 in 2003; but a \$15-million jump in gross on Sunday got the sales off to a big start, headlined of course by Smarty Jones' dam, I'll Get Along, at \$5 million, and Toccet, who went to Castleton Lyons for \$3.3 million. With Keeneland up \$37 million after three days, the November sales through Wednesday were up 30 percent in gross over last year, from \$170 million in 2003, to \$223 million so far this year (that's \$20.6 million at Fasig, and \$202.5 million at Keeneland). Ironically, the average is almost dead level, or maybe even down about two percent, from \$255,000 at this stage last year to \$250,000 this year. But a third more horses have sold (892 this year, 665 last year), for about 31 percent more money. One thing for absolutely certain--this market is not down 15 percent. At its highest tier, comparing last year to this year, Book 1 averaged \$382,768 last year, and \$383,169 this year; the average was up one-tenth of one percent, while the number sold and gross were up 16 percent each.

What it probably means for the overall sale: after Keeneland's first three days last year, the \$165 million in sales represented 70 percent of the sale's eventual total of \$236 million. If that ratio holds, which it roughly should, the \$202 million in sales at Keeneland so far should then translate into a final sale total of around \$290 million. But, interestingly, yesterday's session was up even more than Book 1. Compared with last year, the Wednesday gross jumped almost \$15-million--57 percent--while yesterday's \$150,075 average was a 42 percent jump over last year's Wednesday session average of \$106,033. If those kinds of increases are sustained in the sale's middle days (especially Books 3-4), the overall sale total could edge over the \$300-million mark. This has become, really, the bar that a Keeneland sale has to top to be considered one of the modern greats: November grossed \$317.6 million, then \$302 million, in 1999 and 2000, respectively, and of course this year's September sale grossed just under \$325 million. If this year's November sale doesn't hit the \$300-million mark, it won't miss by much.

In terms of new sires, things have pretty much gone as expected so far. The three leading first-year sires of weanlings, through Book 1, were Orientate, Johannesburg, and Came Home, who had all averaged between \$133,000 and \$160,000 through Tuesday. They represent really one of the last years where the high stud fees on the new sires were in the lower five-figure range: Orientate was lowest of the three at \$25,000, Came Home highest, at \$40,000. The top sires who covered for the first time in 2004 represent that higher bracket, Empire Maker and Mineshaft at \$100,000, Vindication at \$50,000. Covering sire averages really only tell you the quality of some of the mares bred to the horse, and this crop's top three definitely attracted the good mares. Through Book 1, five mares in foal to Empire Maker averaged \$700,000; seven in foal to Mineshaft averaged \$663,571; and the very popular Vindication had 15 mares go through the ring. All 15 sold, average an impressive \$619,000.
