

How can a stallion sire the magnificent total of 128 stakes winners--with roughly half of them scoring at group or graded level--yet still fail to establish a flourishing male line? This question came to mind after the GII Mrs Revere S. had fallen to River Belle, an ex-English filly by Riverman's son Lahib.

Lahib won the Queen Elizabeth II S., a highly prestigious mile contest that also fell to Bahri, another member of Riverman's impressive collection of Group 1 winners. This collection also features the top-class milers Irish River and Rousillon, with Dowsing, Hailsham, Latin American, Loup Sauvage, Pillaster, Policeman, River Flyer, River Special, Rivlia and Virginia Rapids also figuring among Riverman's Group 1-winning sons.

Lahib is still covering plenty of mares in Northern Ireland, but they are mainly by jumping sires rather than the quality flat mares he received when he embarked on his stallion career at Derrinstown Stud in 1993.

Like plenty of other Riverman stallions before him, Lahib failed to convince flat breeders of his merits. Even the unexpected victory of his Italian daughter Super Tassa in the 2001 Yorkshire Oaks wasn't enough to keep Lahib at Derrinstown. Super Tassa's win made her the second Group 1 winner for her sire, following Mus-If, winner of the 1998 National S. River Belle's win at Churchill Downs is her second important success, following her win in the G3 Princess Margaret S. at Ascot last year. As that Ascot triumph made her the seventh group winner to emerge from Lahib's first eight crops, Lahib can't be classified as a failure as a flat sire. But not being a failure isn't the same thing as being a success, and this could also be said of Rousillon, although he sired that remarkable stayer Vintage Crop and Fastness.

The one stallion son of Riverman who could be described as an unqualified success is Irish River, with a tally of nearly 90 stakes winners including Hatoof, Paradise Creek and Brief Truce. But you will search in vain for a stallion son of Irish River in the 2004 edition of the *Blood-Horse* Stallion Register. And the only son you'll find in Weatherbys Stallion Book, which covers Europe, is Exit To Nowhere, who has made the same transition as Lahib. The winner of the Prix Jacques le Marois has been switched from a career siring flat performers in France to covering large numbers of jump mares at Scarvagh House Stud in Northern Ireland.


In the long term, it doesn't matter how many stallion sons fail, so long as one of them proves capable of extending the line.

It's worth mentioning that Riverman (who was by Never Bend out of a Prince John mare) was bred along similar lines to the great Mill Reef (by Never Bend out of a mare by Prince John's sire Princequillo). Many of Mill Reef's stallion sons disappointed, the main exception being Shirley Heights, whose male line appears to depend on Darshaan's sons.

It is possible, though, that Mill Reef's line will survive because of his son Doyoun, who died in Turkey. Doyoun's worth hadn't been fully established at the time of his sale, but he salvaged his reputation through the exploits of Daylami and Kalanisi--both now resident at the Aga Khan's Gilltown Stud, which is something of a bastion of Never Bend blood. *(cont. p4)*

The key to the survival of the Riverman male line in the Northern Hemisphere could well be Bahri, who established himself as Europe's champion three-year-old miler of 1995.

Although his connections made a mistake in standing him in Kentucky, where he attracted an average of only 37 mares over a seven-year period, Bahri's time in America yielded that outstanding performer Sakhee, who so nearly added the Breeders' Cup Classic to his success in the 2001 Arc. Sakhee started his stallion career in England in 2003, so his first foals will soon be appearing at the sales. Bahri too is now at his owner's Irish Stud-Lahib's former home, Derrinstown--and he attracted around 70 mares in his first year in Ireland.

It is interesting to speculate on why Riverman has struggled to establish a thriving male line. Perhaps the significant factor is that his dam was by Prince John, who topped the broodmare sires' table no fewer than three times (in 1979, 1980 and 1986). Of course, Prince John's sire Princequillo was champion sire of broodmares as many as eight times, compared to only two titles as champion sire, and Prince John's son Speak John was also a champion sire of broodmares. These three generations of this male line could all be described as being most effective as sires of broodmares.

Bearing in mind that Riverman was responsible for such outstanding racemares as the Arc winners Detroit and Gold River and that extraordinary performer Triptych, it isn't surprising that his main value to the breed is proving to be as a sire of broodmares.

Among the many Group 1 winners produced by his daughters are winners of the Arc (Carnegie), Derby (Erhaab), French Derby (Anabaa Blue) and Breeders' Cup Mile (Spinning World and Six Perfections), while his daughters also enjoyed Classic success through Hector Protector, Shanghai, Bosra Sham, Silvermine, Baiser Vole and Helen Street. The latest star out of a Riverman mare is Makybe Diva, who recently collected her second Melbourne Cup.

To get back to River Belle, she has two lines of Princequillo in the fifth generation, the second line coming through her third dam, the Round Table mare Lady Parida.

River Belle's dam Dixie Favor is by Dixieland Band, who is also the broodmare sire of such standouts as Monarchos, Society Selection, Southern Image, Exotic Wood and Dream Supreme. Dixie Favor--a first foal-was a cheap yearling, but that didn't stop her winning three times at up to a mile during a busy career in Ireland.

Dixie Favor has kept up the good work as a broodmare. River Belle is her second stakes winner, following the Efisio filly Kiralik, who was third in the Italian 1000 Guineas.


