ONE GUESS: OUIJA BOARD STARS AT CARTIER

Lord Derby's **Ouija Board (GB)** (Cape Cross {Ire}) was the star of the show at the 14th Cartier Awards, carry-

ing off the Horse of the Year and Three-Year-Old Filly titles at the ceremony, which took place at the Four Seasons Hotel in London's West End Wednesday evening. Trained by Ed Dunlop at Newmarket, the bay had a successful international campaign in which she captured the G1 Ep-

som Oaks, the G1 Irish Oaks and the GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf. She also was a fast-finishing third in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe to **Bago (Fr)** (Nashwan), winner of the Cartier Award for Three-Year-Old Colt. That colt, a homebred for the Niarchos Family, also landed the G1 Grand Prix de Paris and the G1 Prix Jean Prat. The connections of both Oujia Board and Bago have announced that they will remain in training for 2005.

Older Brigade

Elite Racing Club's homebred **Soviet Song (Ire)** (Marju {Ire}) put together a three-race skein which landed her the Older Horse prize. The four-year-old won the G1 Falmouth S., G1 Sussex S. and the G1 Matron S., defeating dual Classic heroine Attraction (GB) twice. Another homebred, Ecurie Wildenstein's **Westerner (GB)** (Danehill), carried off the Stayer Award with victories in the G1 Prix du Cadran and G1 Prix Royal-Oak. Lady Legard's G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest and G1 Prix de la Foret winner **Somnus (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}) picked up the Cartier Sprinter Award.

Red Merit

David & Patricia Thompson, owners of Cheveley Park Stud in Newmarket, were honored with the Daily Telegraph Award of Merit after a highly successful season highlighted by the exploits of G1 Lockinge S. winner Russian Rhythm (Kingmambo), G1 Pretty Polly S. heroine Chorist (GB) (Pivotal {GB}), G2 Celebration Mile victress Chic (GB) (Machiavellian), and the Group 2-winning juveniles Soar (GB) (Danzero {Aus}) and Iceman (GB) (Polar Falcon).

Youth Gone Wild

The Niarchos Family earned their second award of the evening when **Divine Proportions** (Kingmambo) was deemed the top Two-Year-Old Filly. The Kentucky-bred

was unbeaten in five starts, including a win against colts in the G1 Prix Morny before concluding her season in the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac. The undefeated **Shamardal** (Giant's Causeway) finished up the year with a victory in the G1 Dewhurst S. He has since been purchased by Godolphin.
