PANEL MEETS TO DISCUSS INSURANCE

The NTRA Jockeys' Medical Insurance Working Panel, established to resolve the recently contentious issue of insurance coverage for jockeys, met yesterday at Turfway Park in Florence, Kentucky. The panel listened to viewpoints on the issue from various breeders, owners, trainers and jockeys, among others, and heard detailed reports about workman's compensation from officials based in California, Maryland, New Jersey and New York. The panel, which appointed Keith Chamblin and D.G. Van Clief, Jr. as its official spokespersons, unanimously agreed that an increase in accidental and disability coverage is desirable. The panel also reached a consensus that, although jockeys are independent contractors, the issue of insurance coverage is a national one "deserving of a national solution." A technical sub-committee, consisting of Greg Avioli, Anthony Byergo, Jack Knowlton, John Milward, R. Andrew Staniusz and John Unick, was appointed and is set to report back to the full panel with recommendations and suggested next steps by Dec. 31.



When a stallion covers his first mares at three, it's a safe bet that injury has brought his career to a premature end. With the likes of Raise A Native, Hail To Reason, Sir Gaylord and <u>Fasliyev</u>, injury didn't intervene until they had some outstanding performances on the board, but it was a different story with Malibu Moon. This son of <u>A.P. Indy</u> was retired to the Pons family's Country Life Farm in Maryland before he had had a chance to tackle stakes company.

Malibu Moon's career had consisted of just two races, the first of them a four-furlong maiden at Hollywood Park on Apr. 30, 1999. It was surprising to see him in action so early, even though he comes from a female line noted for its ability to produce top-class European juveniles. His dam, Mr. Prospector's daughter Macoumba, had won the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac and his second dam, the Green Dancer mare Maximova, had won her first five juvenile starts including the G1 Prix de la Salamandre.


Malibu Moon's close relative Septieme Ciel--by A.P. Indy's sire Seattle Slew out of Maximova--had also shone at two, winning the G3 Prix Thomas Bryon and the G2 Criterium de Maisons-Laffitte, but he hadn't seen action until August. Neither had A.P. Indy, who scored for the first time on Oct. 27.

Malibu Moon had clearly been working well prior to his debut, as he started odds-on in a 10-runner field, but he found one too good for him after starting none too well. He was an even hotter favorite when he reappeared in a five-furlong maiden race at the end of May and this time his stretch run brought him victory. His time of :57.41 made one wonder what Malibu Moon might achieve once the distances started to lengthen. Unfortunately, he came out of that win with a knee chip which required surgery. It seems fair to assume that a return to the course was considered too risky, as an announcement was made early as October that his owner B. Wayne Hughes--who had bought Macoumba privately for \$2 million while she was carrying Malibu Moon--had formed a partnership with Country Life Farm to stand the colt at a fee of \$3,000.

It was a different era when Raise A Native and Hail To Reason made their stud debuts as three-year-olds and their first crops respectively numbered 11 and 13 named foals. Attitudes have changed since then, to the extent that the three-year-old Fasliyev was asked to cover around 140 mares in Ireland before moving on to Australia. Malibu Moon was also kept busy in his first season, with 101 mares producing 66 live foals. Demand for Malibu Moon's services increased in his second year, to 112 mares, but he then experienced the harder times we have come to expect in a stallion's third and fourth years--his 55 mares in 2002 produced 37 live foals and he apparently had a similar number of live foals this year from the 76 mares covered in 2003. Then his first crop--headed by Perfect Moon, a dual graded winner with an Experimental Free Handicap weight of 119--earned Malibu Moon promotion to Kentucky, where he attracted 149 mares at a fee of \$10,000 in his first season at Castleton Lyons.

His fee has increased again, to \$17,500 for 2005, now that Declan's Moon has shown that Perfect Moon wasn't a one-off. This gelding is now three-for-three, having added the GIII Hollywood Prevue S. to his shock victory in the GII Del Mar Futurity, which produced an impressive Beyer figure. It is going to be fascinating to see whether he can keep his unbeaten record intact when he steps up to Grade I company next month in the Hollywood Futurity.

While it is surprising to see a \$3,000 stallion sire juveniles as good as Perfect Moon and Declan's Moon in his first two crops, Malibu Moon certainly has the bloodlines to become a successful sire.

For a start, he represents A.P. Indy's potent partnership with Mr. Prospector mares. There are now around 70 foals of racing age representing this cross and as many as 13 of them have become stakes winners. Nine of these 13 have scored at graded level, which equates to around 13 percent of A.P. Indy's foals out of daughters of Mr. Prospector. No wonder Skara Glen was recently prepared to go to \$1.9 million to acquire Mr. Prospector's Grade 3-winning daughter Golden Sonata in foal to A.P. Indy.

Among those 13 graded winners are <u>Pulpit</u>, who already has the Grade I winners Sky Mesa, Tapit and Stroll representing him at stud. Then there's Mineshaft, the 2003 Horse of the Year who was highly popular as a covering sire at the recent sales. It looks as though this cross is destined to make a major impact.

I'd say the future looks bright for A.P. Indy as a sire of sires, and not just with his sons out of Mr. Prospector mares. The first crop by Old Trieste has done well enough to suggest that this four-time Grade II winner would have maintained his popularity had he not died young, while Golden Missile's first runners include the graded winner Inspiring and the graded-placed In The Gold. Next year will see the first runners by Aptitude face the racecourse test.

It's funny to think that A.P. Indy earned himself the reputation of being a "filly" sire by coming up with three Grade I-winning daughters in his first crop, but these sex biases often level out.

One interesting aspect of Declan's Moon's pedigree is that it features inbreeding to both Mr. Prospector and



Northern Dancer in the first four generations (his dam Vee Vee Star is inbred 3x3 to Northern Dancer). Combining inbreeding to these exceptional stallions seems to be one way of producing smart two-year-olds. Last year it cropped up in Carry On Katie (G1), Bachelor Blue (GII-CAN), Limehouse (GIII) and Read the

Benoit photo Limehouse (GIII) and Read Footnotes (GII), and the previous year there was the Prix Morny winner Elusive City.

The second line of Mr. Prospector in Declan's Moon's pedigree comes through Conquistador Cielo, who was responsible for Vee Vee Star's sire Norquestor. This winner of the GI Pegasus H. sired only one graded winner among his 339 foals, but Vee Vee Star was talented, as she showed when a remote third of seven behind Silverbulletday in the GII Black-Eyed Susan S. in 1999.

Declan's Moon's fourth dam, Radiant Beam, was an import from Europe and came from the same family as Meld, a triple Classic winner who produced the Derbywinning Charlottown. There are several other triple Classic winners in Declan's Moon's pedigree, including Seattle Slew, Secretariat and Nijinsky, so longer distances should hold no fear for him.


