# FROM THE DESK OF... Bill Oppenheim



## THE BILLION-DOLLAR BUSINESS

Sometime on Monday afternoon--probably about the time Adrian Nicoll was waving his catalogue in the air to buy Airwave for \$1.1 million for John Magnier--the major Northern Hemisphere Thoroughbred auction sales, for the six months beginning July 1, passed the \$1-billion mark. It was only the second time that figure has been reached in at least the last 20 years. Over \$600 million of that total was generated by two Keeneland sales (the yearling sale in September and the Mixed sale in November)--so there's not too much question about who is the world leader in Thoroughbred auction sales. Fasig-Tipton added \$107 million from their yearling sales in Kentucky in July and Saratoga in August and their mixed sale in November. Between them, just the flagship second-half sales of the two leading North American auction houses totalled over \$710 million this year. The fact that the last three major British and Irish yearling sales were down 15 percent didn't really slow down the momentum built up in America, plus the near-collapse of the dollar does mean dollar transactions become more valuable: your pounds are worth more. So, even though the British and Irish sales did drop, they didn't drop as much in dollar terms as they ordinarily would have.

Though the catalogue for mare sales can vary considerably from year to year--and this year the consensus is that top pedigrees are markedly down at the December sale--it is notable that the first two days of the mare sale, taken together, almost exactly mirror the results from last week's foal sale. After two days of mares, the number sold is down 6 percent, the gross is down 14 percent and the average is down 8 percent. Last week, the number of foals sold (689) was down 7 percent from last year, the gross was down 14 percent and the average was down 8 percent! If we didn't know better, we'd almost certainly conclude the market in Europe is down somewhere in the region of 8 to 14 percent.

But it is true that top pedigrees appear less and less in the marketplace these days. Partially this is because the best pedigrees are in 'private' (non-commercial) hands, but also it is because we really are in the middle of a pedigree revolution. It's not just that the old guard of great stallions are gone, and we are now waiting to see whether this vaunted '2000 Crop' of sires is going to, in some way, fill their shoes. I've spoken before about the 'democritization' of pedigrees by the commercial market, spurred by traders who do not keep groups of mares for enough generations for families to develop; so new families are not developing (though 'blue hens' will always emerge, and some of them will have daughters who produce). Generally, in the absence of what used to be called great pedigrees, breeders are still paying good money for good form. That's why Airwave brings \$1.1 million and Ipi Tombe \$1.7 million. They are very good-looking young mares who were top-class racehorses. Between them they don't have a pedigree, but Airwave was a 120 Timeform who beat Russian Rhythm in the G1 Cheveley Park as a two-year-old, and lpi Tombe was rated as high as Timeform 126--that's about in the stratosphere for a racemare. Let's not underestimate the value of pedigree: these two mares would have made two to three times what they did if they'd had pedigrees. The point is, they are the best available, and the top breeders are undoubtedly right to be paying between \$1 and \$2 million for them.

As I mentioned, last week's foal sale followed the trend set at the British and Irish yearling sales, and was down 14 percent in gross, and 8 percent in average. But the sale did still gross 18.2-million guineas (over \$36.5 million), over 1-million guineas more than in 2002. The sale saw the first serious commercial emergence of the world's number-one prospect whose first foals were born this year, <u>Rock of Gibraltar</u>. Counting one in America, plus Ireland and England, nine foals by Rock of Gibraltar averaged \$218,648 (using the equivalent 1 guinea = 2 dollars), more than double the average for the American leader, <u>Johannesburg</u>.

The latter, of course, had the distinction of being the undisputed world champion two-year-old of 2001, when he won four Group 1 races in four different countries. But Rock of Gibraltar topped that: he won seven consecutive Group 1 races at two and three, beginning with the seven-furlong double of the Grand Criterium at Longchamp, followed by the Dewhurst. He then came back at three to win five straight Group 1s: the British and Irish 2000 Guineas, the St. James's Palace S., the Sussex and the Prix du Moulin, before he was stopped behind stablemate Landseer breaking down in the Breeders' Cup Mile, just failing to catch Domedriver. He finished up with 10 wins and two seconds in 13 career starts, out of the first two only once, when an unlucky sixth in the Coventry at Royal Ascot. Sakhee and Noverre were the other two European stallions whose first foals averaged the equivalent of \$75,000 + .

The weekend was a good one for old rivals Sunday Silence and Alydar. Sunday Silence's son Zenno Rob Roy claimed the G1 Japan Cup, while Easy Goer's grandson Lion Tamer captured the Cigar Mile. Sunday Silence and Easy Goer met four times, with Easy Goer winning the GI Belmont S., but finishing second to Sunday Silence in the GI Kentucky Derby, the GI Preakness S. and GI Breeders' Cup Classic in his only defeats as a three-year-old. Had it not been for Sunday Silence, there is little doubt that Easy Goer, who was a champion at two, would have been remembered as one of the great ones. Ironically, Easy Goer's sire Alydar had found a similar stumbling block between him and posterity in Affirmed in the 1978 Triple Crown.

Alydar subsequently gained a measure of revenge at stud, becoming a far more successful sire than Affirmed, but there was to be no such redemption for Easy Goer, whose career in the breeding shed is well and truly overshadowed by that of Sunday Silence. It's true that Easy Goer died prematurely after siring just four crops, but from 132 foals, he was represented by only nine stakes winners. He did get three Grade I winners: My Flag (out of the great Personal Ensign), Furlough and Will's Way. One of the best of his generation, Will's Way took the Travers over Louis Quatorze, <u>Skip Away</u> and <u>Editor's Note</u> at three, and the GI Whitney H. over Formal Gold and Skip Away at four.

Ist weanlings bring \$100,000, \$97,000, \$77,000 etc. GSW by STORM CAT Out of a Champion Derby-G1 Dube Prize STORM CAT - HEAVENLY PRIZE \$7,500 live foal



Despite his race record, breeders haven't exactly rushed to breed to Will's Way. His first three crops have produced just 123 foals, and he was advertised at a fee of \$5,000 in 2004. Still, in the shape of first-crop representative Lion Tamer, Will's Way has got a very high-class performer. Runner-up to Zavata over 5 1/2 furlongs on his two-year-old debut, Lion Tamer turned heads when breaking his maiden next out in 1:08.35 for six furlongs. At three, following an allowance win and a six-length romp in the GII Hutcheson S., Lion Tamer's connections had Classic aspirations, understandable in the light of Will's Way's proven stamina. These hopes were promptly ended by decisive defeats in the GII Lane's End S. and GI Blue Grass S., and since then, Lion Tamer has been primarily campaigned as a sprinter. This year he'd taken the GII Richter Scale BC H. and GII Commonwealth BC H. (both over seven furlongs), and, against less testing opposition, captured the 8 1/2-furlong Formal Gold S. In Saturday's Cigar Mile, an early pace battle between Lion Tamer's stable companion Purge and Pico Central set the race up perfectly for Lion Tamer to come from the rear of the field and claim his first Grade I triumph.

At \$180,000 Lion Tamer was the most expensive yearling from the first crop of his sire, and glancing at the catalog page, one has to suspect that price was based on looks rather than on pedigree. Lion Tamer is the first foal of his dam Tippecanoe Creek, a daughter of Olympio. Tippecanoe Creek did earn black type, but she is the only stakes performer from the 10 starters for her dam Country Delight. By the In Reality stallion Real Value, Country Delight earned just \$14,693 from her four victories, although she placed in a minor stakes. Country Delight had a better half sister in Amalie, who began her career in Puerto Rico, but returned to the U.S. to become a stakes winner at four. One of Amalie's daughters, the Meadowlake filly Amalake, subsequently catpured three stakes events, and another, Amavalidhope--a daughter of Valid Appeal (In Reality) and bred on very similar lines to Country Delight-- produced GSW Vesta. Lion Tamer and Vesta apart, however, this female line has not produced a high-class horse for many generations.

Oddly enough, the cross which produced Lion Tamer--Alydar over Naskra--is something of a minor nick, as it's responsible for four other stakes winners. Lion Tamer's own pedigree is a fairly outcrossed one, with only one duplication in the first five generations, a double of Intentionally. Interestingly, the Intentionally strain in Will's Way's pedigree is situated between inbreeding to Tom Fool and linebreeding to the mare Two Lea (the pair appeaing together in Tim Tam, broodmare sire of Will's Way's maternal grandsire Tentam). When a sire or a dam has such inbreeding, it often pays dividends to mate the sire or dam with a horse which duplicates one of the individuals sitting between the inbreeding. In this case Lion Tamer's dam duplicated the Intentionally strain sitting between the Tom Fool and Two Lea in Will's Way. Perhaps, since Intentionally equalled the world record for a mile and took such important eight-furlong contests as the Jerome H., Withers S. and Equipoise Mile, we shouldn't be surprised that the distance turned out to be perfect for Lion Tamer.
