SINGSPIEL FILLY TOPS TATTS FINALE

Tattersall's December Sale finished its nine-day run Thursday night with cumulative gross receipts of 52.9 million guineas, down 10.2 million guineas, or over 19 percent, on 2003. The company's annual turnover was 149.35 million guineas, down 9.2 percent from the 163.1 million guineas achieved in 2003. Highlighting vesterday's action was the top price of 38,000gns, paid for Hip 2429, the Singspiel (Ire) filly Cumbria (GB). Purchased by agent Brian Grassick, the filly is out of G2 Prix de Pomone winner Whitehaven (Ire) (Top Ville {Ire}). The three-year-old, consigned by Darley, is a granddaughter of multiple Grade I stakes winner White Star Lane. "She's for a partnership including myself and will come to my stud. We'll put her in then resell her," said Grassick. "She was a nice family and comes from the family of Preseli, who my brother trained."

Strength in the Middle Market..

The four sessions of mares, topped by the sale of the International star racemare Ipi Tombe (Zim) for 850,000gns on Tuesday, closed with a 21.7-percent dip in gross receipts and a 13.3-percent decline in average. However, the middle market held up nicely over the course of the mares sale, increasing by 2.7 percent. "It is always a pleasure to end a year on a high note, but even more so when a sale dramatically exceeds expectation, and that has been the case at this year's December Sale," commented Tattersalls Chairman Edmond Mahony. "The figures will show that we have not matched last year's sale, but there are times when the bare figures do not tell the whole story. Last year's December Sale had two high-profile dispersals, was widely regarded as the best December catalogue for decades, and deservedly broke all previous records. This year's catalogue was far from a vintage one. We lost a couple of potential stars on the eve of the sale, but the consensus from both vendors and purchasers has been that this has been as strong a December Sale as any in recent years." Santa Anita to Begin Testing Carbon Dioxide Levels:

Santa Anita Park has announced that, starting with its 2004-2005 Winter/Spring Meeting, horses will be subject to blood tests for carbon dioxide levels. The new testing program was coordinated by Santa Anita, the Thoroughbred Owners of California and the California Thoroughbred Trainers. "Nothing is more important to us than maintaining the highest standards of integrity for California racing," said Santa Anita President Jack McDaniel. "This new testing program will bolster our commitment to provide a level playing field and fair competition within our gates." High levels of carbon dioxide have been linked to the banned practice of administering "milkshakes" to horses before they run. The trainer of a horse whose blood test reveals a carbon dioxide level of 37 millimoles or more per liter of plasma will be subject to disciplinary measures. The first offense will involve 45 days of surveillance, which may include the use of cameras in the barn and could subject the runners to confinement in a detention barn beginning at noon on the day before the horse is to race. Detention barn fees would be \$150 a day for security and \$25 a day for stall renovation. Trainers will be prohibited from entering horses for a period of 15 days following a second offense. A third positive will involve a one-year ban from Santa Anita.

NTRA Approves 2005 Budget:

The Board of Directors of the National Thoroughbred Racing Association met in New York City on Wednesday and Thursday, approving a preliminary budget for next year that includes \$66 million in revenue and \$65.8 million in expenses. The budget allots \$21.2 million for purses and awards, \$10.8 million for television, \$17.5 million for marketing and promotions and \$1.8 million for legislative and regulatory programs. It will be reviewed by the Breeders' Cup Board of Directors at its regular meeting in January before going back to the NTRA Board for final approval. The NTRA Board will hold its first quarter meeting for 2005 Mar. 3-4.

THREE RELEASED AFTER ARREST

The City of London Police investigation into alleged race fixing took another twist Wednesday when trainer Alan Berry, jockey Paul Bradley and farrier Steve O'Sullivan were arrested. The trio were taken to Lancaster police station for questioning and were later released on police bail until April. Before their release, a police spokesperson told *Racing Post*, "City of London police have arrested a further three men in connection with the ongoing horseracing corruption investigation. The men, from the northwest of England, have been arrested on suspicion of conspiracy to defraud." The number of arrests in the case, which has also seen jockey Kieren Fallon detained and released, has now risen to 25.
