#### HKIS CELEBRATES TENTH ANNIVERSARY

The Hong Kong International Sale, featuring horses purchased by the Hong Kong Jockey Club at yearling sales all over the world, celebrates its 10th anniversary when it kicks off this morning at 11 a.m. "As sales go, the Hong Kong International Sale is the most unique in that we have horses from six countries in the sales ring," said Paul Williams of auctioneer Magic Millions. "The uniqueness of this sale makes it something special and we are proud to be associated with it." For the first time in the history of the event, horses will not need to be transported from Sha Tin Racecourse to the Convention Center on Hong Kong Island, as this year's sale will take place in the newly opened enclosed parade ring at the racetrack. A total of 20 two-year-olds have been prepared by the HKJC and catalogued for the auction, which includes three geldings from the third-last crop of the late Danehill. The former Coolmore stallion, who died in May 2003, has always been a popular commodity in Hong Kong, having sired the likes of Hong Kong Sprint winner Fairy King Prawn (Aus) and last year's G1 Hong Kong Mile hero Lucky Owners (NZ) as well as Scintillation (Aus) and The Duke (Aus), both HKIS graduates and candidates for tomorrow's G1 Hong Kong

Mile. Danehill has also excelled at this sale, accounting for five of the six highest prices during its first nine years of the sale. The most expensive of his progeny set to go under the hammer this afternoon is <u>hip 17</u>, a son of Escape To Victory (GB) (Salse), purchased for  $\notin$  240,000 at last year's Goffs Orby sale. A half

sister to GI Breeders' Cup Mile runner-up Hawksley Hill (GB), Escape To Victory is already the dam of Benbaun (Ire) (Stravinsky), group stakes placed in England and Italy. Other sires represented in the sale include Cape Cross (Ire), Daylami (Ire), <u>Gone West</u>, <u>Miswaki</u>, and <u>Montjeu (Ire)</u>. As is the custom with this sale, the Hong Kong Jockey Club will offer a HK\$1 million bonus to the connections of a 2004 HKIS graduate who accumulates the most prize money at the end of the 2005-06 racing season in Hong Kong.

# At the Symposium on Racing ...with RTIP Student Joe Pulli

#### **THE \$900 BILLION MARKET**

"We didn't do it for us, we did it because we thought it was good for the industry," reiterated Jim McAlpine, president and chief executive officer of Magna Entertainment Corp., throughout his presentation on the final day of the University of Arizona's Symposium on Racing. McAlpine was referring to MEC's acquisition of an interest in Amtote, the creation and implementation of Horse Wizard, and other company initiatives. Although optimistic, McAlpine was very clear on what he believes the racing industry needs to do to continue growth in the future.

A slide projected during his presentation indicated that horse racing currently is a \$15-billion market. However, the overall U.S. sporting/gaming industry is a \$900-billion market. McAlpine challenged industry members to stop competing against each other for that \$15 billion. Instead, he said the industry should be focused on growing business by targeting the entire U.S. sporting/gaming dollar. As he indicated, this market is the industry's biggest opportunity. He suggested a plan focused on "a concerted and continuous effort to address the sport aspect of our business....and a concerted and continuous effort to gain market share from other forms of gaming."

McAlpine went on to address other industry issues, including the impact that state regulation has on the industry. "We've got barriers to success and we're not screaming from the rooftops, 'change, change, change'," McAlpine commented as he analyzed the industry's overwhelming focus on state and local markets. In response, MEC plans a regulatory reform approach that also includes selling the horse racing product for the appropriate price.

"We're in the entertainment business, the market should set the price," McAlpine said, adding, that the role of government is to protect, "but not protect one industry player from another." Before closing, McAlpine addressed the topic of slot machines at racetracks, stating that they are part of the solution, but are not the entire answer.

"As [governments] give, they can take away," he said. "We can't just build our foundation and business model on this form of revenue."

For the future, MEC is focused on two key forces: fiscal responsibility and partnerships. "I can assure you that we at MEC strongly believe--what's good for our industry is good for MEC," said McAlpine. In closing, McAlpine offered a challenge to each audience member. "Think about vision. Think about your part in the vision. Be passionate, and embrace change."

#### Technological Advances on the Way...

Panel moderator Dan Luciano, president and general manager of American Greyhound Racing Inc., opened the discussion by emphasizing the impact technology has had on the industry. Luciano suggested that we can't predict how many other technological advancements will come along that will help racing, but signs point to quite a number of them.

Two companies on the cutting edge of technology were well represented during this panel discussion. The first to take the floor was TVG, represented by President Ryan O'Hara. During his presentation, O'Hara addressed the two-pronged market competition that horse racing faces as it competes within both the television and wagering markets. To ensure success in both markets, TVG relies on technological advancements. As O'Hara said, "Technology is vital. We try to stay on the cutting edge." However, TVG does not focus completely on technology. They also remain committed to customers. O'Hara added, "We worry about television and consumers."

TVG continues to initiate changes to make its products "more consumable." In 2004, the focus was on improvement of its television product. In 2005, TVG is committed to the advancement of its website and the launch of iTV, which is a form of interactive television that allows customers to wager and view race schedules and odds on their television.

The discussion then moved on to Paul Siegel, who serves as vice president of Global Cyber Licensing LLC. Siegel's focus was "using the Global Positioning System to provide perfect regulation of remote wagering." GPS is currently used by many casino gaming websites as a way to track the actual location of bettors, but has yet to be implemented by any horse racing account wagering websites. Siegel added that the benefits of adopting the GPS system include the ability to port to the internet, to provide defense of existing operations, and to support situations where sub-state divisions are required.

#### NTRA's Six-Year Plan...

To build momentum for the future, members of the National Thoroughbred Racing Association provided audience members with information about the organization's strategic plan for the next six years. D.G. Van Clief Jr., commissioner and chief executive officer of the NTRA, kicked off the session by presenting the organization's strategic goals, which include making racing a top-ten sport in America, growing pari-mutuel handle to target levels and utilizing the NTRA's convening authority to bring the industry's major organizations together. Keith Chamblin, senior vice president of Marketing and Industry Relations, presented the NTRA's marketing objectives and tactics for the next six years. The NTRA's main marketing goal is to "transform increased interest into active participation," said Chamblin. Horse racing has seen a growth of 28.2 percent for fans in the 12-24 age bracket, which is higher than any other sport. To help maximize that interest, the NTRA is proposing an expansion of the number of major race days [Triple Crown races and the Breeders' Cup] from four to 14. Along with that expansion, other marketing tactics proposed include enhanced TV coverage, maximization of public relations assets, use of interactive resources, leveraging sponsors, creative tactical advertising and promotion and more national wagers tied to the major race days. Overall, Chamblin called "edutainment," or an effort to teach casual fans about handicapping, a key ingredient.

Greg Avioli, who serves as the organization's president and chief operating officer, provided the audience with information about the NTRA's involvement with federal regulation, including NTRA's Political Action Committee and other legislative agendas that the organization will pursue throughout 2005. NTRA is committed to protecting the industry's position as the only form of legal internet gambling.

To close this year's Symposium, Van Clief said, "We do believe the prospect of growth is real." However, he reminded the audience about the importance of internet wagering, calling it "vital to our growth, both domestically and internationally."

After training Thoroughbreds for 45 years, Jimmy Picou plans on calling it a career after saddling Big Apple Daddy (Precise End) in Sunday's Damon Runyon S. at Aqueduct. "I feel a little bad, but it's the right thing to do," the 70-year-old said of his decision. "It's time to do something else." In 1954 Picou retired as a jockey and became an assistant trainer for Walter Kelley. Picou started his own stable in 1960 and won his first race as a trainer at Aqueduct in 1960. "I've been around a long time, but it doesn't feel that way," Picou commented. "My career feels like it's gone by in a blink of an eye. It's amazing. I'm very appreciative of the owners that supported me and the horses that I trained." In 1981, the conditioner scored one of his biggest wins in the GI Travers S., defeating eventual three-year-old champion Pleasant Colony with Willow Hour. "We bought Willow Hour as a yearling and winning the Travers might have been the most exciting race of my career," he added.



#### **Record-Breaking Juvenile Entered at Hollywood:**

**Fusaichi Samurai** (Fusaichi Pegasus), purchased for a record \$4.5 million by Fusao Sekiguchi at the Fasig-Tipton Calder two-year-olds in training sale in February, makes his career debut in the fourth race at a Hollywood Park today. "He's a different type of horse than Fusaichi Pegasus," said trainer Neil Drysdale, who also trained the 2000 Kentucky Derby winner. "This horse is very straightforward. He is a tall horse, a little leaner than Fusaichi Pegasus." The dark bay colt has been working well for his debut, posting a :47 1/5 four-furlong move at Hollywood Dec. 1.
