JUDDMONTE HEADS TBA AWARDS

The Thoroughbred Breeders' Association Awards,

which recognize Britain's top movers and shakers in the bloodstock industry, named its winners yesterday. Prince Khalid Abdullah's Juddmonte Farms was awarded the Queen's Silver Cup as leading British-based flat breeder, based on the successes of Group 1 winners Powerscourt (GB) (Sadler's Wells) and Quiff (GB) (Sadler's Wells). The Silver Cup is based on most prize money won in Britain and Ireland from horses based in the United Kingdom. It marks the third year in a row that Juddmonte walks away with the award.

Cheveley Park Stud was awarded the BBA Silver Cigar Box for their stallion Pivotal (GB), the leading Britishbased stallion in terms of earnings. The ill-fated Dubai Millenium (GB) earned the Tattersalls' Silver Salver as the leading freshman sire, narrowly outpacing Diktat (GB) with 10 individual winners and earnings of £255,378--including G1 National S. winner Dubawi (Ire). The H J Silver Salver award went to Kirsten Rausing's Alouette (GB) as Broodmare of the Year. The 14-year-old gray is responsible for 1999 and 2000 G1 Champion S. winner Alborada (GB) (Alzao) and her full sister Albanova (GB), a three-time Group 1 winner in Germany this year. Lord Derby's Stanley House Stud was given the TBA Silver Rose Bowl award in recognition of the achievements of Ouija Board (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}), whose 2004 season included victories in the G1 Irish and Epsom Oaks, as well as the GI Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf. Another top female, Attraction (GB) (Efisio {GB}), was lauded as the first filly to complete the English and Irish 1000 Guineas double. Her breeder, Duke of Roxburghe's Floors Stud, will receive the Flat Special Merit Award. The awards will be presented at the TBA Awards' Dinner at the Churchill Hotel Tuesday, Jan. 11, when the winners of two special awards for contributions to the British breeding industry will be announced.

MEINER RECOLTE TAKES JAPAN'S FUTURITY

Previous G1-Jpn Asahi Hai Futurity winners, including Eishin Preston in 1999 and Grass Wonder in 1997, used the 1600-meter event as a stepping stone to an end-of-year juvenile title, and Sunday afternoon at Nakayama, Meiner Recolte (Jpn) (Chief Bearhart) laid claim to a possible two-year-old championship with a convincing two-length score in track record time. Far back in eighth as Sapporo Nisai S. winner Stormy Cafe (Jpn) (Admire Vega {Jpn}) carved out solid early fractions, the bay mounted his challenge in deep stretch and overpowered his foe late, winning by two widening lengths. Favored Peer Gynt (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), winner of the G2-Jpn Daily Hai, settled near the back early, and rallied late, but didn't have his usual turn of foot and had to settle for third."Since the first time I rode [Meiner Recolte] in the morning, I have been dreaming about winning a major race like this," said winning jockey Hiroki Goto. Meiner Recolte graduated in his career debut at Fukushima before adding Niigata's Dalia Sho Aug. 14. Completing the hat trick with a victory in the G3-Jpn Niigata Nisai S. Sept. 5, the colt's winning streak ended with a lackluster fifth last time out in the G2-Jpn Keio Hai S. at Tokyo Nov. 13.

dem or broadband. The fickle finger of fate was at its most capricious during one stormy day in Kentucky in 1986, when lightning killed Jacques Wertheimer's Gold River. While it's regrettable that any horse should be killed by lightning, it hardly seemed believable that this incident's

random victim should be a young mare of Gold River's truly exceptional talents. Having taken on the colts and beaten them in three

Group 1 contests, Gold River earned the right to rank alongside the similarly ill-fated Triptych and Detroit as one of Riverman's most remarkable daughters. Victories in the 1980 Prix Royal-Oak over 1 15/16 miles and the Prix du Cadran over 2 1/2 miles established her credentials as a top-notch stayer, but Gold River revealed another facet to her talents when she defeated the French Derby winner Bikala in the 1981 Arc.

Stars of tomorrow grabbing the spotlight today...

Gold River no doubt owed some of her stamina to her dam Glaneuse, who defeated the colts to take the G1 Gran Premio del Jockey Club over a mile and a half in Italy on her final appearance. Glaneuse, like Gold River, only lived long enough to produce four foals, but two of them--Gracious and Gold River--appear in the pedi gree of Alexander Goldrun, who has maintained her family's tradition of defeating the males, this time in the CX Hong Kong Cup.

Gold River's name appears in the third generation of Alexander Goldrun's pedigree, as the dam of the three-year-old's paternal grandsire, Goldneyev. This son of Nureyev was the last of Gold River's four foals, all sired either by Northern Dancer or by one of his best sons.

The combined achievements of these four foals make one wonder what Gold River might have achieved, had she lived. Her first foal Chercheur d'Or, a Group 3winning son of Northern Dancer, was rated 120 by Timeform; her second, the Nijinsky filly Riviere d'Argent, produced three stakes winners including the Group-2 winner Silver Fun; and her third, the Lyphard filly Riviere d'Or, won the G1 Prix Saint-Alary before producing Gold Splash, a Group-1 winner at two in France and at three in England.

Goldneyev, for his part, became a stakes winner in the Prix Yacowlef on his debut at two and finished second in the French 2000 Guineas. Unfortunately, this big horse managed only one appearance after the Guineas and retired to the Wertheimer family's Haras de Saint-Leonard-des-Parcs in 1990. I am guessing that he suffered from the same moderate fertility as Nureyev, as he had only 104 foals of racing age by the time his best son, Alexander Goldrun's sire Gold Away, retired at the end of 1999. That was also the year that one of Goldneyev's daughters, Gold's Dance, was represented by the Wertheimer brothers' Group 1-winning filly Goldamix (Criterium de Saint-Cloud). *Caulfield cont. p4*

Gold Away started his stallion career at Haras du Quesnay at the bargain price of 20,000 francs (later to become \in 3,000), but would almost certainly have merited a higher fee had he been by a more fashionable sire. A group winner at two, three and four, he had finished second four times at Group-1 level, including twice in the Prix du Moulin.

The Wertheimer brothers supported Gold Away in his first season, but their loyalty to him didn't pay off when they consigned 11 in-foal mares to Tattersalls' December Sales at the end of 2000.

This consignment achieved such acceptable prices as 870,000, 700,000 and 520,000 guineas for mares in foal to Rainbow Quest, Danehill and Barathea, but the two mares in foal to Gold Away were the cheapest of the batch, with Bubbling Heights fetching 22,000 guineas and Renashaan 30,000.

Would-be buyers of Renashaan probably didn't even notice that her Gold Away foal carried two lines to Glaneuse, who ranks as Renashaan's fourth dam.

Renashaan's third dam, the Habitat mare Gracious, did very well as a broodmare without quite matching the achievements of her half sister Gold River. She produced two group winners in France in the miler Gay Minstrel and Alexander Goldrun's third dam Greenway, who was one of the fastest French two-year-olds of 1980. As many as five of Gracious' daughters have bred stakes winners, the most notable--apart from Greenway--being Gracious Lassie, who produced the Group 1-winning French juveniles Oczy Czarnie (Prix de la Salamandre) and Glaieuil (Criterium de Saint-Cloud).

Greenway's descendants are as varied as one might expect of a mare from the same family as Gold River. At one end of the distance scale is her fast son Way West. At the other is her grandson Royal Rebel, twice winner of the Ascot Gold Cup over 2 1/2 miles. Greenway's grand-daughter Renashaan fell somewhere between these two extremes, winning a Listed race over a mile and putting up creditable efforts over a furlong or two further.

As a stakes-winning daughter of Darshaan--a highly prized sire of broodmares--Reneshaan was very well bought by Dermot Cantillon for 30,000 guineas. Buyers may have been deterred by the record of her first four foals of racing age, which included nothing of note, but she also had a yearling colt by Machiavellian which quickly salvaged her reputation. Named Medecis, he was good enough to finish second in both the French 2000 Guineas and the Prix de la Foret before taking up stud duties in Ireland Alexander Goldrun has shown herself to be even better than Medecis. She too was second in one of the



Alexander Goldrun winning the G1 Prix de l'Opera France-Galop photo Guineas contests--the Irish 1000--and she is wonderfully tough. After making her debut in the March of her two-year- old season, she has been kept pretty busy ever since. To her credit, her two Group 1 successes have come on her 14th and 15th appearances and she is a fine advertisement for her sire. Gold Away hasn't found

it easy to maintain the type of popularity which resulted in a first crop of 47 foals. There were only 30 in his second crop and 18 in his third, but Alexander Goldrun and fellow group winner Clifden surely have restored demand for his services.



ROARING FEVER TO QUESTROYAL Stakes winner **Roaring Fever** (Storm Cat--Pennant Fever, by Seattle Slew), a full brother to MGISW Raging Fever and GSW Stormin Fever, has been retired and will stand the 2005 breeding season at Questroyal Stud in New Hampton, New York. The four-year-old son of Storm Cat will be syndicated and will stand for a fee of \$5,000. A homebred of Edward P. Evans, Roaring Fever won his career debut at Saratoga at two, then finished second in the GIII Cowdin S. two starts later. Stakes-placed as a three-year-old, he ran second in a pair of Grade III races this term before taking the Alysheba S. at the Meadowlands Oct. 29 in his penultimate start. He retires with four wins from 19 starts and earnings of \$219,655.
