

**SELLERS RETIRES** Jockey Shane Sellers has officially announced his retirement from race riding. The 38-year-old piloted more than 4,000 winners in a career marked by several comebacks from serious injuries. Sellers, who had been outspoken about the issue of insurance coverage for jockeys injured on the racetrack, had not ridden in a race since Oct. 2 at Hoosier Park. The Louisiana native made the decision to retire following the annual meeting of the Jockeys' Guild in Irving, Texas Dec. 7, when he felt that the insurance situation would not be resolved in a timely enough manner for him to resume riding. "After going to this year's [Guild] meeting, we all know [Guild chief executive officer Dr. Wayne Gertmenian] and his team will win this war," Sellers said in a press release from the Guild. "Unfortunately, it won't happen overnight, and he told us that when he stepped in. Old management set us back 25 years. To win this war, we're going to lose some soldiers, and I choose not to be one. Thank God I'm able to literally walk away and not lose everything because of a spill. I've given my heart and soul to this game and this industry for 23 years. I'm not going to lose my kids' future for a \$45 jock mount." Sellers rides into the sunset with 4,070 career victories from 23,795 mounts and earnings of \$123,041,486. Among his biggest wins were Breeders' Cup victories aboard Buck's Boy (Turf, 1998) and Countess Diana (Juvenile Fillies, 1997) as well as the 2004 GI Blue Grass S. aboard The Cliff's Edge.

## Laurel Opening Delayed:

The winter meet at Laurel Park, which had been tentatively scheduled to open Dec. 26, has been delayed due to weather, ground-water drainage problems and additional issues with the foundation of the new track. It is now expected that the track will open for training Dec. 26, with the meet starting Jan. 22. Racing will continue at Pimlico through Jan. 17. "We are just days away from finishing this project in regards to the dirt track," said Jim Gagliano, executive vice president of racing operations for the Maryland Jockey Club. "We remain convinced that the short-term inconveniences, while considerably burdensome, will be outweighed by the greater good in the long run." The track was originally scheduled to open in early October, but trainers stabled at Laurel only have the option of jogging their horses in the shedrow. Magna Entertainment Corp., which operates the MJC, picks up the cost of shipping horses to Bowie for workouts. Horsemen have been vocal in their criticism of the progress of the track renovations and have continued to express their concerns. "It's likely this track will fall apart," Richard Hoffberger, president of the Maryland Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association, told The Blood-Horse. "The project has been flawed from the beginning. Virtually anything that could go wrong has gone wrong." Ted Malloy, who built the track at Palm Meadows and at the newly renovated Gulfstream Park, was hired by Magna to oversee the project. He countered, "I promise you I won't leave here and give you a track that's not safe. I know what a good racetrack is. I'm trying to give you the best."

#### **CHANNEL 4 LAUNCHES EXCHANGE**

British television broadcaster Channel 4 Racing has entered the world of sports betting by creating an online betting exchange. It was developed by 4Interactive, the interactive division of Channel 4, in partnership with Betdag, the world's second largest exchange operator. Available via the Channel 4 website www.channel4.com/racing, the exchange will provide a live betting service to registered users and is launched on the back of a number of recent initiatives, including re-launching the website and the broadcast of interactive camera angles during live racing. Dave Kerr, the station's Head of Sport, said: "At a time when the future of horseracing on Channel 4 is uncertain we are actively pursuing ways to generate additional commercial return from the sport and a betting exchange is a logical way of achieving this. It is a further addition to the comprehensive service that we already provide punters." Betdaq's Rob Hartnett added, "Exchanges have dramatically improved the way that many dedicated bettors enjoy their involvement with sports betting. This partnership with Channel 4 will bring the concept to an even broader audience and further hasten the growth of a sector that has risen from nothing to an estimated annual turnover in excess of £2 billion per annum in four short years." Betting exchanges differ from regular bookmakers in that they provide a facility for individuals with a different opinion on the outcome of an event to come together and bet against each other. The exchange sits at the centre of every transaction, and acts as facilitator and stakeholder. It settles the bets in favour of whoever has won and charges a small commission from the winnings of each customer
