SOARING FREE AT THE SOVEREIGN AWARDS

Soaring Free (Smart Strike) was the star of a big show for Sam-Son Farms at the Sovereign Awards Friday night at the Wyndham Bristol Place Hotel in Toronto, Ontario. The Sam-Son homebred's outstanding campaign, highlighted by victory in the GI Atto Mile, earned him titles of Horse of the Year and Champion Turf Horse, Also represented by Champion Three-Year-

Old Filly Eye of the Sphynx (Smart Strike), Sam-Son was honored with awards for both Outstanding Breeder and Outstanding Owner. It was the fifth straight Sovereign Award in the Breeder category for perennial powerhouse Sam-Son, and their eighth overall Owner award. Both Eye of the Sphynx and Soaring Free

were trained by Mark Frostad. A Bit O'Gold's exploits earned his dam Annasan (Corporate Report) recognition as Outstanding Broodmare. The 10-year-old mare had previously produced stakes winner Arco's Gold and stakes-placed Adjalah, both by Gold Fever, from three foals to race.

MISWAKI DIES Miswaki (Mr. Prospector--Hopespringseternal, by Buckpasser), pensioned from stallion duties in August, died yesterday at Walmac Farm due to the infirmities of old age. The 26-year-old stallion was a leading sire and broodmare sire. "Miswaki was the last of the big three who put Walmac on the map," said Walmac President emeritus John T L Jones Jr. "First Alleged, then Nureyev and now Miswaki have passed on. We were certainly fortunate to have one like him and can only hope to have another one as good someday in the future." Miswaki won the G1 Prix de la Salamandre, was second in the G1 Prix Morny and third in the G1 Dewhurst S. as a two-year-old in 1980. He retired to Walmac in 1982 and has 97 stakes winners to date, including nine champions in five countries and Grade I winners in the U.S., France, Japan, Australia, Italy and Ireland. Miswaki is the only stallion to sire a Breeders' Cup Classic winner, Prix de l' Arc de Triomphe winner and Japan Cup winner. This season he was represented by Irish 2000 Guineas winner Bachelor Duke. Daughters of Miswaki have produced 112 stakes winners.


