Buckpasser headed the North American broodmare sire table three times in the 1980s, and his daughters have ensured that his name will live on by producing such noted stallions as Miswaki, El Gran Senor, Seeking the Gold, Woodman and Private Account (as well as the likes of Touch Gold, Polish Precedent, Slew o'Gold, Mining, Easy Goer, Try My Best, Wavering Monarch, With Approval and Polish Numbers).

Now history seems to be repeating itself through Miswaki. This thoroughly dependable stallion has yet to establish a secure male line, although this could be changed by Rossini, who made such a bright start with his first European runners this year, and Bachelor Duke, a very well-connected classic winner who will stand his first season in Ireland in 2005.

If Miswaki is to find lasting fame--and I think he will-it is going to be via his broodmare daughters, who have over 100 stakes winners to their credit. Among these stakes winners are several colts which already ensure that Miswaki's name is in no danger of fading away.

Two stallions out of Miswaki mares--Daylami and Dr Fong--had Group 1 winners among their first three-yearolds this year, with Daylami being responsible for the Irish Derby winner Grey Swallow and Dr Fong for the Prix Saint-Alary heroine Ask For The Moon.

Talkin Man, a less well-known stallion out of a Miswaki mare, has been put on the map by the exploits of Better Talk Now, who followed up his win in the GI Sword Dancer Invitational with an even better victory in the Breeders' Cup Turf.

There are also several other very promising stallions out of Miswaki mares waiting in the wings, including Galileo, the brilliant dual Derby winner who did so well with his first yearlings at this year's sales, and Daylami's outstanding half-brother Dalakhani. However, all these stallions face a hard task if they are to match the achievements of the 14-year-old Hernando, who is out of Miswaki's group-winning daughter Whakilyric.

Arvada, winner of Saturday's GII La Prevoyante H., ranks alongside Sulamani, Samando and Songerie as one of four group/graded winners this year for the Lanwades Stud stallion. It is well worth adding that Samando--winner of the G2 Prix de Royallieu on the Arc weekend--is one of only 28 foals in Hernando's 2001 crop and that Songerie--winner of the G3 Prix des Reservoirs--is one of only 34 foals in his 2002 crop.

In fact there are only 283 foals in his first six crops, so his 10 group winners--which include two winners of the French Derby--represent 3.5 percent of his output and his 22 stakes winners equate to nearly eight percent. These figures are highly respectable considering that Hernando's fee was never higher than 8,000 guineas in those first six years.

Although Hernando's connections have done their best to remind breeders that four of his six stakes successes were gained at around a mile and a quarter, breeders unfortunately tend to think of him as a stayer, largely because he is a son of the stamina-packed Niniski. With a fast two-year-old by Miswaki as his dam, Hernando has more speed in his make-up than his sire but I fear that he will always face a struggle to maintain his popularity with breeders, in much the same way that Niniski did.

Although his excellent results in 2002, when Sulamani led a team of six stakes winners, resulted in a book of 98 mares in 2003, demand for his services fell a little this year, when he covered 70 mares. It is going to be interesting to see how Hernando fares in 2005, when he will be in direct competition with his son Sulamani.

Sulamai, a wiry individual, enters stud at a fee of £7,000, compared to Hernando's £12,000. But breeders should remember that the best is likely still to come from Hernando, who looks guaranteed a very rewarding 2007. Commercial breeders who use him in 2005 could have a very saleable product for the '07 yearling sales.

Arvada was racing for the 16th time when she won the La Prevoyante, but there should still be plenty of miles left in her. Hernando raced until he was five and her dam, Lalindi, was seven when she made the last of 50 appearances. Lalindi's seven wins were gained from nine to 16 furlongs, despite being bred primarily for speed. Her sire, Cadeaux Genereux, was a champion sprinter in Europe and her dam was the nine-furlong winner Soemba, by the versatile General Assembly.

Lalindi was sold for only 10,500 guineas as an in-foal seven-year-old in 1998, but that was before her halfsister Sumoto pulled off a remarkable Group 1 double with sons Compton Admiral (1999 Coral-Eclipse) and Summoner (2001 Queen Elizabeth II S.). I wouldn't want to bet against the courageous Arvada becoming a Grade I winner for this tough family before she is done.



(Aus) (Jade Robbery), a half sister to dual G1 Melbourne Cup winner Makybe Diva (GB), made a successful start to her racing career, winning her maiden at first asking Sunday at Cranbourne. The three-year-old filly, also trained by Lee Freedman, was slow into stride, but finished strongly to win by two lengths at the country track, some 45 minutes southeast of Melbourne. "It's generally too early to tell what they'll end up doing, but I like it when they win their first start because they usually do it on raw ability," the conditioner told Melbourne's The Age newspaper. "She's lightly framed, so we'll just play it by ear at the moment," he continued. "She's a nice filly and certainly has a bit more speed than her half sister, but we won't push her." Valkyrie Diva came to Freedman at the same time as Makybe Diva after their previous trainer David Hall chose to go to Hong Kong.
