CHAMPION AZERI RETIRED

Azeri (Jade Hunter--Zodiac Miss {Aus}, by Ahonoora (GB)), North America's all-time leading female earner, has been retired from racing. The six-year-old mare, bred by the late Allen Paulson, was campaigned by the Paulson Living Trust run by his son Michael. Azeri began her career under the tutelage of Laura de Seroux,

for whom she won the 2002 GI Breeders' Cup Distaff and 2002 and 2003 editions of the GI Apple Blossom H. She also captured the 2002 GI Santa Margarita Invitational H. and back-to-back renewals of the GII Clement L Hirsch H., GI Vanity H. and GI Milady Breeders' Cup H. She was named champion older mare of 2002 and 2003 and was Horse of the Year in 2002. After missing the 2003 Breeders' Cup with a tendon injury, Azeri was taken out of train-

ing, but resurfaced in 2004 under the care of trainer D. Wayne Lukas. This season, the consistent chestnut won a third Apple Blossom, as well as the GI Go For Wand H. and GI Overbrook Spinster. In the final start of her career, the champion ran a respectable fifth against the boys in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. First or second in 21 of 24 starts, Azeri retires with 17 victories and earnings of \$4,079,820. "Champion horses like Azeri are what every owner and breeder of these magnificent animals strives for and I have been very blessed and fortunate to have campaigned this exceptional horse," Michael Paulson said in a statement. "I am very excited about her prospects as a broodmare and look forward to the opportunities of seeing her foals with their mother's champion qualities." Breeding plans have not been released.

AMERICATAB, YOUBET TO TAKE MAGNA

SIGNAL The online wagering services America Tab and Youbet.com have reached a deal with Magna Entertainment Corporation that will allow the sites to begin taking wagers for Magna-owned tracks, including Santa Anita Park, Gulfstream Park, Golden Gate Fields, and Pimlico Race Course. The two organizations had previously failed to reach an agreement with Magna, which pulled all of its signals from AmericaTab in late 2003 and allowed Youbet access to only two of its tracks. Some angry handicappers, who viewed the move as an effort by Magna to steer business to its own site, Xpressbet.com, began a boycott of Magna's tracks. "This is great for everyone involved, and it marks a renewed spirit of cooperation in the industry," said AmericaTab's Charlie Ruma. "This is good for the industry and to the horseplayer who wants a full selection of tracks to wager under one account." 
